*ORDER REINSTATING BRIEFING*

Pursuant to NRAP 16, the settlement judge has filed a report with this court indicating that the parties were unable to agree to a settlement. Accordingly, we reinstate the deadlines for requesting transcripts and filing briefs. *See* NRAP 16.

During the pendency of the settlement proceedings, court reporter Constance Eisenberg filed a notice indicating that copies of the transcripts for proceedings conducted on December 21, 2020, had been prepared and delivered. And respondent/cross-appellant (respondent) has filed a certificate stating that she will not be requesting any transcripts. If appellant/cross-respondent (appellant) intends to cite to transcripts that have not yet been prepared and filed in the district court, appellant shall, within 14 days from the date of this order, file and serve a transcript request form in compliance with NRAP 9(a). Otherwise, appellant shall, within the same time period, file a notice indicating that no additional transcripts will be requested.

Appellant shall have 90 days from the date of this order to file and serve the opening brief and appendix on appeal. In preparing and assembling the appendix, counsel shall strictly comply with the provisions of NRAP 30. Respondent shall have 30 days from service of appellant's

opening brief to file and serve a combined answering brief on appeal and opening brief on cross-appeal. Appellant shall have 30 days from service of respondent's combined brief to file and serve a combined reply brief on appeal and answering brief on cross-appeal. Finally, respondent shall have 14 days from service of appellant's combined brief to file and serve a reply brief on cross-appeal, if deemed necessary. *See* NRAP 28.1.

It is so ORDERED.
