ORDER DENYING MOTION

Petitioner Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) has filed a motion to associate attorney Michael A.F. Johnson of Arnold & Porter Kaye Scholer, LLP, pursuant to SCR 42. Attached to the motion is a verified application, certificates of good standing from the District of Columbia Court of Appeals and Supreme Court of Virginia, and a statement pursuant to SCR 42 from the State Bar of Nevada. The Rule 42 statement of the State Bar of Nevada indicates that Mr. Johnson has applied to appear in Nevada courts 8 times within the past 3 years.¹ In addition, he has filed an application to appear simultaneously in another matter.

¹Two of these applications were denied.

In the absence of special circumstances, repeated appearances by any person pursuant to SCR 42 shall be cause for denial of a motion for leave to associate. SCR 42(6). It is presumed that more than 5 appearances by an attorney under the rule in a 3-year period is excessive. SCR 42(6)(a). Having considered the affidavit attached to the motion to associate and the procedural posture of the petition, this court is not convinced that FHFA demonstrates good cause and special circumstances warranting an appearance in excess of the limitation. See SCR 42(6)(b). Accordingly, the motion is denied.

It is so ORDERED.
