COME NOW, Defendants Ferrellgas, Inc. ("Ferrellgas"), Mario Gonzalez ("Gonzalez"), and Carl Kleisner ("Kleisner"), by and through counsel of record, and hereby file this Supplemental Brief in Support of Motion to Allow a Rule 35 examination.

MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

I. INTRODUCTION

It is undisputed that Plaintiff has put his mental condition at issue, that Plaintiff concedes Defendants are entitled to a psychological examination, and that Plaintiff alleges memory and concentration issues.

Defendants do not believe the Discovery Commissioner authorized supplemental briefing on the issue of the scope of the examination. Regardless, Plaintiff's Supplemental Brief is improper in that it seeks a determination from this Court as to the cause of Plaintiff's current mental condition. The Discovery Commissioner already found that loss of memory and confusion are neurological issues and/or conditions that merit allowing a Neuropsychological examination. Furthermore, Plaintiff's Supplemental Brief seeks to deny Defendants the opportunity to have an Independent Medical Examination to determine Plaintiff's mental condition, and the cause of any alleged injuries.

Defendants seek an Order compelling Plaintiff to attend a Rule 35 mental examination because the parties agree that Plaintiff has put his mental condition at issue in this litigation, but the parties could not reach an agreement to stipulate to the scope of the mental examination.

Defendants seek to conduct both a psychological and neuropsychological examination of Plaintiff because even though Plaintiff claims that his neurological issues (loss of concentration and memory issues) result from a psychological condition (PTSD), they are nevertheless well-recognized neurological symptoms that warrant a neurological as well as psychological examination as to their origin. The Parties met and conferred on this issue, and Plaintiff could not provide sufficient assurance that this litigation did not include claims for

neurological issues. As such, Defendants could not withdraw their request to have a Rule 35 mental examination that covered both psychological and neuropsychological components.

Defendants are not medical experts and do not make any allegations regarding Plaintiff's condition. Rather, Defendants seek a Rule 35 examination that encompasses the purview of all allegations Plaintiff makes in this matter.

II. <u>ARGUMENT</u>

A. Plaintiff Has Made His Mental Condition an Issue of the Case, Such that Defendants Should be Allowed Both a Psychological and Neuropsychological Examination

Defendants seek to determine the status of Plaintiff's mental condition, and whether this incident caused those conditions. Defendants seek a two-day neuropsychological examination because their retained expert, Dr. Lewis Etcoff, has advised that the same is necessary to evaluate Plaintiff's medical condition, and the assertions Plaintiff makes. Plaintiff's Rule 16 disclosures and recent medical records demonstrate Plaintiff alleges neuropsychological issues in this case. Plaintiff asserts issues with attention and memory, and seeks to preclude Defendants from evaluating any explanations other than the one proffered by Plaintiff's counsel.

By way of specific example, Plaintiff's counsel identified Dr. Michael Elliott as having evaluated Plaintiff for, *inter alia*, "difficulty focusing and following conversations/trains of thought." *See Plaintiff's* 10th supplemental 16.1 disclosures attached hereto as Exhibit A; *See also* Plaintiff's 12th supplemental 16.1 disclosures attached hereto as Exhibit B. Plaintiff's counsel stated that Dr. Elliot's expected testimony will include diagnoses for (1) anxiety due to known physiological condition; (2) generalized anxiety; and (3) encounter for *screening for traumatic brain injury*. *Id* (emphasis added). Plaintiff's counsel identified that Dr. Elliot's testimony will include Plaintiff's treatment plan including *Formal neuropsychological testing*, *pending evaluation by a neurologist*. On September 16, 2020, Plaintiff advised Dr. Elliot that he had accomplished his goal of making an appointment with a neurologist. *See* Exhibit B at pg. 22 Bates Numbered Green 1244.

In short, Defendants have requested a psychological and neuropsychological mental examination of Plaintiff because Plaintiff's papers and medical records raise those issues in this case.

Defendants have requested Dr. Etcoff provide a more detailed explanation of the scope of the neurological examination necessary to evaluate the nature and extent of Plaintiff's alleged cognitive problems. Dr. Etcoff advised that the earliest his office can provide the requested explanation is the morning of December 10, 2020. Defendants will provide the Discovery Commissioner, and all counsel, the explanation upon receipt.

The Pleadings and Papers filed by Plaintiff, and signed by Plaintiff's counsel pursuant to Rule 11, have multiple assertions regarding both psychological and neuropsychological allegations. The Court should not preclude Defendants from conducting both a neuropsychological and a psychological examination of Plaintiff.

Plaintiff acknowledges that he has put his mental condition at issue such that the Court should Order a Rule 35 mental examination. However, Plaintiff improperly seeks to preclude Defendants from conducting a full and fair evaluation of Plaintiff's condition.

B. Determining Whether Plaintiff Has Memory Loss and Cognitive Impairment and Whether Those Symptoms Are Caused by PTSD or Something Else is The Reason Defendants Need to Conduct a Rule 35 Examination

There is no dispute that Plaintiff alleges memory loss, difficulty with cognition, and short-term memory issues. Defendants' seek a neuropsychological and psychological Rule 35 examination of Plaintiff to evaluate those allegations. Defendants have retained Dr. Etcoff to evaluate Plaintiff's mental condition, through neuropsychological and psychological testing, and opine as to what mental issues Plaintiff suffers from, and whether those issues are related to the incident.

Plaintiff seeks to have this Court find that PTSD is the sole cause of the memory and cognitive issues, which Plaintiff alleges in this case. The Court's inquiry should be limited to whether Plaintiff claims memory and concentration issues as part of this case. If so, the Court

should Order a Rule 35 examination that allows for a full and fair evaluation of Plaintiff's condition, and any underlying causes.

Finally, the Discovery Commissioner has already ruled Defendants can choose their own Rule 35 Examiner, yet Plaintiff also improperly asks the Court to force Defendants to retain a different expert.

III. **CONCLUSION**

The Parties agree that the Court should Order a Rule 35 examination. There is no dispute that Plaintiff is alleging concentration and memory issues. As such, Defendants respectfully request an Order allowing Dr. Etcoff to conduct a reasonable and necessary Rule 35 Examination on March 2 and 3, 2021 to evaluate Plaintiff's mental condition.

Who Will Follow This Notice

This notice describes the privacy information practices followed by our employees, staff and other office personnel. The practices described in this notice will also be followed by the staff you consult with by telephone (when your provider from our office is not available) who provide "call coverage" for your provider.

Your Health Information

This notice applies to the information and records we contain about your psychological well-being, treatment and services that you receive at this office.

We are required by law to provide you with this notice. It will tell you about the ways in which we may use and disclose health information about you and describes your rights and our obligations regarding the use and disclosure of that information.

How We May Use And Disclose Health Information About You

Treatment

We may use health information about you to provide you with psychological treatment or services. We may disclose health information about you to psychologists, psychiatrists, physicians, nurses, office staff and other health care personnel who are involved in providing health care services to you.

For instance, your health information may be shared with your primary care physician, medical specialists and members of your treatment team, mental health services providers to whom you are referred, and other similarly situated health care personnel involved in your treatment.



- For Specific Government Functions. We may disclose your health information for military, national security, prisoner, and government benefit purposes. History of Present Illness:

Joshua Green describes the location to be medial Patient reports severe headaches since his accident. Difficulty focusing and following conversations/trains of thought. Patient states location as medial, radiating from the center of his head...

The quality of pain is described as aching, constant, sharp, radiating pain and a severity / intensity level of 4 out of 10 Severity varies depending on stress/exhaustion levels, mood...

Assessment:

Patient was assessed in a 60 minute clinical interview to determine current and prior levels of functioning. impact on activities of daily living and to determine if further neuropsychological testing is required.

Mr. Green is a 38 year old Caucasian male who self describes as "Driven and hard working." He reports starting several restaurants throughout his career as a chef and is currently managing the kitchen for a new restaurant that he started last year. Besides the complex tasks involved in starting businesses and running a high volume kitchen, he has a history of being able to schedule workers, track and maintain inventories, as well as submit billing and paperwork to various vendors. Since Mr. Green's accident and injury, he has been unable to complete his work responsibilities in a timely and efficient manner. He reports struggling with constant headaches that are exacerbated while at work. He also reports difficulties with memory and following a train of thought, an essential skill in his line of work. Since his accident and injury, Mr. Green reports several difficulties when using grills. He states he is now "afraid" of grilling, and avoids the use of gas grills when possible, which is preventing him from taking full advantage of his chef and restaurateur skills. He stated he is losing confidence in himself, and is concerned that he will not be able to continue his career.

Mr. Green's symptoms and behaviors are consistent with patients that have suffered brain trauma through a blast injury. Memory loss, headaches, and the personality changes he describes are indicators of a possible

traumatic brain injury. Though there are also several confounds that may be impacting his symptoms. Mr. Thompson has a diagnosed learning disability, he has a history of seizures, and he was in a major car accident in the past. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that Mr. Green be referred for an brain MRI to determine if he has lesions or anomalies that are consistent with traumatic brain injuries due to blast shockwaves. These results will help determine if Mr. Green should receive a full neuropsychological evaluation to then determine severity of injuries, impact on current and future levels of functioning, as well as to guide treatment recommendations and support services.

Chief Complaint: Cognitive and Emotional Deficits following accident on 6/18/2018

Subjective:

Client shared that he is recovering gradually. He notes continued physical ailments including pain in his hands and chronic headaches. He reports having to have decreased his work load due to limited capacity after accident. He reports strong connection to his Rabbi and spirituality, as well as having received support from a shaman. Since accident he has made some progress emotionally and notes that he had changes his priorities to focus more on relationships. However, he reports that he still has flashbacks to the accident, especially whenever he sees flames. He also reports waves of depression which are very noticeable and cause him to withdraw form relationships and engagements temporarily. Further he reports difficulty with cognition and short term memory. Specifically he reports issues with recall and notes that he frequently looses his train of thought. He reports that attempts to manage symptoms through social support as well as through use of cannabis to manage pain and anxiety.

Objective:

At time of session, client had just awoken and appeared mildly disheveled, but the appointment was early in the day and this was not too abnormal. His attitude was calm and cooperative throughout session. He did not demonstrate any abnormal beahaviors or psychomotor changes. His speech was WNL. Affect appeared mood congruent. Mood appeared euthymic, and at times mildly depressed. His thought processes appeared goal-directed and logical. He did not demonstrate any maladaptive or abnormal thought content. Perception seemed normal. Memory concentration appeared distractible, and congruent to his report of short term memory and cognitive impairment.

Assessment:

Assessment was provided via telehealth (video call) due to COVID 19 restrictions. Client presents with symptoms of anxiety, depression and trauma, including flashbacks. He reports difficulty with ADLs due to symptoms including impaired ability to work as well as impaired mood and relational functioning.

In his spare time the patient enjoys team sports, individual sports, sporting events, movies, and television.

Developmental History:

At the time of his delivery he was premature. As a child the patient was somewhat happy and recalls that he was rarely ill. As a teenager he was somewhat happy and remembers being healthy. Before age 18 he had close friends with whom he could discuss nearly anything. He has more than one such friend now.

He is not aware of childhood problems with toilet training or with learning to sit up, crawl, stand, walk, talk, feed himself, or dress himself. He does, however, report a childhood problem with enuresis. He does not report any childhood fears or phobias. He remembers that before age 13 he frequently had accidents, was short-tempered, and was a show-off. He recalls lying frequently.

He does not report a history of being sexually molested, running away from home, having suicidal preoccupations, or attempting suicide as a child or teenager. He reports no unusual eating habits as a teenager.

He recalls physically maturing later than most of the boys he knew. He felt that he could discuss nothing about sex with his parents. He began dating at the age of 18 or younger. the first time he had heterosexual intercourse he reportedly felt happy and nervous. Currently, he enjoys sexual intercourse a great deal.

Family of Origin:

Patient was raised by his natural parents. He does not report having any brothers or sisters.

He reports that his mother loved him too much and gave him enough time and attention. He recalls that he could always talk to his mother about problems. He claims that his mother did not criticize him even when she should have. He reports that his mother always praised him for his accomplishments. She was reasonably strict and allowed him little freedom. His mother usually punished him when he misbehaved. To punish the patient psychologically, his mother would take away privileges.

He reports that his father loved him and gave him enough time and attention. He was always able to talk to his father about problems. He has experienced more than four anxiety or panic attacks that were situation-specific. No phobias were mentioned. He denies having had unwanted, repetitive thoughts or having performed repetitive acts. He reports having experienced peculiar tastes in food or drink at least twice. He has experienced a highly stressful

situation with prolonged consequences including intrusive memories and avoidance of certain situations. His current sleep pattern is characterized by trouble falling asleep. He reports having used mental health services or counseling for a problem that was not primarily related to alcohol or drug use.

Assessment:

Assessment was provided via Telehealth and in person with patient due to COVID-19 protocol. Dates of service comprising this report include 5/15/20 and 5/20/20, as well as impressions from follow-up treatment sessions on 7/1/20 and 9/1/20.

Patient presented with complaints of cognitive and emotional deficits following accident. A formal psychological evaluation was performed which consisted of an initial interview, as well as the MMPI-2-RF, MCMI-IV, and P3.

Patient's scores on instruments yielded valid profiles on across all three instruments and indicate that Mr. Green gave his best effort. However, the instruments also suggest that Mr. Green may be underreporting his symptoms and that interpretation of his results may need to be modulated upward to more accurately reflect his present psychological functioning. Continued treatment and follow-up psychological testing is recommended to further analyze the severity of his stress injury.

Clinical interview and test data indicate that Mr. Green meets DSM-5 diagnostic criteria for: Unspecified Trauma and Stressor Related Disorder (F43.9); Anxiety Disorder, Unspecified (F41.9); Unspecified Mild Neurocognitive Disorder (R41.9).

Further evaluation and testing is required to rule out the present of Posstraumatic Stress Disorder (F43.1), as well as rule out Mild Neurcognitive Disorder due to Traumatic Brain Injury (G31.84). Formal neuropsychological testing is recommended to assess Mr. Green apparent cognitive deficits.

It is evident that Mr. Green has suffered a post-traumatic stress injury due to the accident. As a consequence, Mr. Green may require long-term support and be susceptible to further trauma as a result.

10	examination. It is still contested the scope of the examination, and

13	DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: But am I incorrect that
14	there was a separate physical examination?
15	MR. PFAU: Yes. There have not there has not been a
16	physical examination requested
17	DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Oh, okay.
18	MR. PFAU: or noted. Yes.
19	DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: All right. Then I misspoke
20	I apologize.
21	All right. Okay. So what I think is still at issue is well,
22	why don't you tell me if you guys have been able to resolve
23	anything or what we what is further remains to address in this
24	matter?
25	MR. SILVA: Gregorio Silva on behalf of Ferrellgas.

I think the main [indiscernible; audio cut out] resolved is whether or not Defendants get to do any neuropsychological examination of Plaintiff based on his complaints of loss-of-memory, concentration issues.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Okay. All right. And anything you want to speak on as to that, Mr. Pfau?

MR. PFAU: Yes, Your Honor. Thank you.

So one of the things we requested in our last hearing was an opportunity to brief this issue. Because, again, our -- Josh Green, the plaintiff in this case, is suffering from PTSD and is having memory and concentration issues as a result. The question is what kind of testing is going to be done so that those types of issues can be properly evaluated? And a neuropsychological examination is not the proper type of examination to determine whether or not he's properly suffering or is he actually suffering from memory or concentration issues due to PTSD?

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Right. And as I recall -MR. PFAU: There was a question --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: As I recall last time, it was posed that if the plaintiff was willing to stipulate to remove neurological conditions at issue in this litigation, then Mr. Silva would withdraw the request for the neuropsych Rule 35 exam.

What happened with regard to that? I mean, it was not clear last time we met which -- whether just a psychological or a neuropsych was warranted in this case. If you want to withdraw the

neuropsych issues, then we can certainly limit it to that scope.

So where are we at with regard to that?

MR. PFAU: So this is Matt Pfau for the plaintiff.

We did discuss that, and I made it clear again, similar to what I did in the hearing, that there are -- we are not claiming any traumatic brain injury, that he is not going to see a neurologist, he is not getting any testing related to a traumatic brain injury.

So the only injury we are claiming would be related to PTSD. And any --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: But you're also claiming cognitive difficulties related to the PTSD?

MR. PFAU: Yes, Your Honor. And so -- that's why -- the reason for the briefing. We provided a lot of medical journals and articles that --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Right.

MR. PFAU: -- do correlate those two issues together. One thing that I did do and there was a helpful affidavit just recently served this morning, I asked the defense for the type of testing they're proposing. Because I do agree that there is probably some reasonable testing that needs to be done related to memory issues, his concentration issues.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Sure.

MR. PFAU: But if they are neuropsychological in nature, they're not, one, going to be -- not going to be within the proper scope.

So I wanted to see what type of test they were proposing. They did provide us some information, though helpful, not specifically very clear, because they -- the affidavit stated there was a face-to-face memory test battery, but not identifying what this test actually is or what it's testing for. And also a computer-based memory test. And if it's computer-based, there's got to be some sort of a written examination, so just identify what that examination is, so we can see if it's testing properly for memory or concentration issues related to PTSD and not to a traumatic brain injury.

Anyway, we just want to make sure that whatever tests are performed --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Well, there's certainly -- MR. PFAU: -- are appropriate.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: There may be some overlap, Mr. Pfau, in what those need to be, under the circumstances.

MR. PFAU: Yes, there --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Because you are claiming cognitive difficulty related to the PTSD.

MR. PFAU: Yes, there may be some overlap. But what's been identified so far hasn't identified whether there is overlap or if they are purely just neuropsychological examinations. With the exception of one that they did identify, the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory, that test has nothing to do with PTSD. And it

is specifically a test to identify schizophrenia, social introversion, hypochondria, depression, hysteria. It is not a test that would be specifically related.

So Plaintiff's proposal is where -- I think we're getting closer. I -- my goal, really, is just make sure that this is a properly narrowly focused testing that's done. And if we can get some additional information from the defense on the additional testing they are proposing, I know that there is a call set up for us sometime soon here, I just saw some e-mails on that just recently. And possibly we can have some additional conversation.

But I guess my --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: So are you asking for more time to discuss this before I make a decision?

MR. PFAU: Yes, Your Honor, I am. Because, again, a couple of days ago I asked for them for the testing. They did provide some testing. I think we're getting closer. We just -- I just want to evaluate what testing they're proposing and as long as they're -- it's reasonably related to PTSD and we can show that, then that's fine.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Okay. So who on behalf of the defendants would like to address the request for additional time to review the testing that is to be completed?

MR. SILVA: Your Honor, Gregorio Silva on behalf of Defendant Ferrellgas.

So Plaintiff's counsel is saying that the memory and

concentration issues are only related to the PTSD, but that's not the point of the independent medical examination. The independent medical examination is to allow Defendants' doctor to fully evaluate Plaintiff's mental condition, that he can come to his own determination as to whether or not the plaintiff has these conditions and whether or not they're related to the accident at issue in this case.

I have discussed -- and I am not a medical doctor, so I cannot, you know, tell you one way or another with any certainty that these tests are the tests -- I'm sorry. I've discussed what Plaintiff has put in his 16.1 disclosures, what's referenced in the medical records that have been produced by Plaintiff with Dr. Etcoff and these are the tests that Dr. Etcoff advises that need to be completed to evaluate and examine Plaintiff's mental condition.

So I don't think discussing further really resolves anything, because Plaintiff is trying to pigeonhole the Defense into accepting that PTSD is the only possible cause of these allegations, and Defendants are requesting the opportunity to examine Plaintiff's mental condition so that they come to a determination on their own as to what Plaintiff's --

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: So you're saying that there may be an alternate reason for these alleged deficiencies?

MR. SILVA: Absolutely, Your Honor. Mr. Green testified that he had a general life anxiety just immediately before this incident. And he's -- his psychologist is claiming general anxiety

disorder as one of the items that he's going to be testifying regarding and has evaluated Plaintiff for. So yes, there is a whole lot of other things Joshua Green's life, other than this one incident, that could have a relationship to his memory and concentration [indiscernible; audio cut out], including his past -- you know, his long medical history with epilepsy and using medical marijuana to treat that. He was diagnosed with a learning condition. His medical records with Dr. Elliott reflect that his financial condition, generally, is a pretty big stressor on his life.

So yes, there are a lot of alternate possibilities that could be the cause of this memory and concentration issue. And Defendants need the opportunity to conduct a full valuation of Plaintiff's mental condition [indiscernible; audio cut out] examination of Plaintiff's mental condition to be able to make this determination independent of what Plaintiff is trying to pigeonhole this case to be.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: All right. Under the circumstances, Mr. Pfau, I agree with Mr. Silva's position. I think that Dr. Etcoff, as an expert, should be allowed to do the testing that he believes is proportional to understanding the current medical status and mental status of this plaintiff. I think that he should be able to inquire into the history of this plaintiff's medical history for the last five years, and his medical history for the same conditions and body parts for 10 years back, specifically, if they're permanent-type injuries.

 And as well as determine whether he has a history of any mental diagnosis previous to this incident, as well, and whether or not he's ever been diagnosed with any mental deficiencies or cognitive defects.

I think whether or not you think Dr. Etcoff is the appropriate expert to be able to perform this testing or render opinions in this case is that's an issue for a *Hallmark* motion, a Motion in Limine brought before the district court judge. So I don't have a problem with Dr. Etcoff inquiring into the past medical history, as long as it's within five years prior to the accident or if it's a specific condition that preexisted or predated that time. I would allow him to go back 10 years on those specific injuries or conditions.

I think one issue that was still at -- one matter that still at issue was the audio recording and the observer being present during the examination under NRS 52.380. And I've said this many times, there's a clear conflict between NRCP 35 and NRS 52.380. But I think that under the circumstances of the status of the law in the state of Nevada, I am going to follow NRS 52.380, because I do think it affects a substantive right and substantive issues that warrant protection of having the observer and the IO recorder in place. I think there's good cause for that.

As far as the purported violation being commented on at a time of trial, I think that that's better addressed -- that seems like an advisory opinion. I think that's better addressed if there's actually

a -- something inappropriate or something that's a violation, if it actually occurs. I think that that can also be handled, once the reports are issued, by way of a Motion in Limine for determination by the district court judge.

So I am going to grant the Motion to Compel the Rule 35 exam based on what's been stated, with the limitations that are in place, as I've referenced. Anything anyone would like to add?

MR. SILVA: Your Honor, Gregorio Silva for Defendant Ferrellgas.

But Dr. Etcoff has advised that he's willing to make himself available for a teleconference with Plaintiff's counsel if we feel that's necessary. So if Mr. Pfau believes that he needs further information on what the tests are, then I would request that he, you know, call my office and discuss scheduling. Whether or not Defendants will agree or -- I guess, setting a teleconference with all counsel and to discuss the issue of whether Defendants will agree to allow him to have some of that conversation with Dr. Etcoff or, you know, we can pass on the information that Mr. Pfau believes is still needed.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Okay. And I think that's certainly appropriate. And so the Motion to Compel the Rule 25 exam has been granted. If that conversation goes forward and there is something that's raised that was not addressed at this point, that Mr. Pfau needs to bring back before me on a Motion for Protection, certainly we can -- if everyone can agree to that, I can

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24 25 certainly hear that point as well.

MR. PFAU: Your Honor, this is Matt Pfau.

I would ask that if we can put in the order that the defense clarifies these other points that -- they submitted an affidavit today, there are some tests that were very vaguely described. We just add to the order that they do provide me what the testing will be, so that we can flush those issues out if -- and if there are any issues, then we can address those.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Okay. I think that's appropriate to add in there. I'm going to ask Mr. Silva to prepare the report and recommendation. Please include that -- please include the modification that Mr. Pfau has requested and circulate that to all counsel for their review as to form and content.

MR. SILVA: Your Honor, may I address that last point of Mr. Pfau's?

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Is this Mr. Silva?

MR. SILVA: Gregorio Silva on behalf of Ferrellgas. Yes.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Yes, go ahead.

MR. SILVA: So I object to that, because it wasn't something that Plaintiff ever put in his briefing. There may be a reason that it makes sense to preclude Plaintiff's counsel from knowing what these examinations are.

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: I think that -- I think it appropriate, Mr. Silva, for Plaintiff's counsel to be given a list of the testing that is anticipated during -- or that Dr. Etcoff intends to

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conduct during the evaluation. I am going to allow the examination to go forward. I am going to allow Dr. Etcoff to conduct a neuropsychological evaluation. Dr. Etcoff needs to identify what he envisions doing as part of his evaluation. That needs to be given to Mr. Pfau at least two weeks prior to the examination. And then, if at that point, other things are triggered that need to be addressed by the Court, they can be brought back before me.

But I've already said that if Dr. Etcoff can indicate, well -you know, a good-faith reason as to why he believes this testing is necessary, you know, I'm certainly going -- in the absence of other evidence, I'm going to defer to his expertise on the issue.

MR. SILVA: Thank you, Your Honor.

One point of clarification. We had submitted a previous report and recommendation and there's been some e-mail correspondence about setting a teleconference regarding that one that was on the same motion before the continued hearing. You want us to submit one report and recommendation for both the November 19th hearing and today's hearing, or a separate –

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Separate.

MR. SILVA: -- report and recommendation?

DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER: Separate. And if you need a conference call on that, if you can't agree to the language as to form and content, then you need to set a conference call up with me through my office.

MR. SILVA: Thank you on that clarification.

REPORT and RECOMMENDATIONS

Date of Hearing: November 19, 2020

Time of Hearing: 9:00 a.m.

1. FINDINGS

- 1. Defendants filed a Motion to Compel a Rule 35 Exam.
- 2. Defendants seek an Order compelling Plaintiff to appear for a Rule 35 mental examination.
- 3. Plaintiff Joshua Green admits that he has made his mental condition an issue of this case since he is alleging suffering from PTSD as a result of the explosion.
- 4. Plaintiff Joshua Green requests that he be allowed to have an observer present and make an audio recording of any Rule 35 examination.
- 5. Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure 35 precludes an observer from attending a neuropsychological, psychological or psychiatric examination.
- Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure 35 preclude any observer from interfering, obstructing, or participating in any Rule 35 examination.

- 7. Nevada Revised Statute 52.380 provides the right to have an observer attend a mental or physical examination, but precludes an observer from participating in or disrupting a mental or physical examation.
 - 8. There is a clear conflict between the language of NRCP 35 and NRS 52.380.
 - 9. The Court is tasked with reading NRCP 35 in conjunction with NRS 52.380.
- 10. The Court finds that under NRS 52.380 Plaintiff will be allowed to have an observer present during any psychological or neuropsychological examination in this matter.
- 11. The Court finds that under NRS 52.380 Plaintiff will be allowed to make an audio recording of any psychological or neuropsychological examination in this matter.
- 12. A Rule 35 mental examination regarding psychological issues or neuropsychological issues is somewhat more involved than what would be allowed for a physical examination.
 - 13. Plaintiff has put his past mental and physical condition at issue in this litigation.
- 14. The Court will not limit Defendants' examiner from inquiring generally into Plaintiff's pre-incident mental condition, but the examiner can only discuss treatment for Plaintiff's mental health treatment for the five years prior to the incident.
- 15. The Court will not limit Defendants' examiner from inquiring generally into Plaintiff's pre-incident physical condition.
- 16. The Court will not limit inquiries by Defendants' examiner into Plaintiff's current conditions, symptoms, and complaints that are issue in this litigation.
- 17. The Court will not preclude Defendants' examiner from inquiring if Plaintiff has a past or current history of an inability to focus.

- 18. The Court will not preclude Defendants' examiner from inquiring if Plaintiff has a history of memory issues.
- 19. The Court will not preclude Defendants' examiner from inquiring if Plaintiff had any prior mental conditions.
- 20. The Court will not preclude Defendants' examiner from inquiring generally about Plaintiff's life before the incident including education, work and training.
- 21. The Court will allow Defendants' examiner to ask questions that are reasonably part of neuropsychological evaluation.
- 22. The Court will not allow Defendants' examiner to conduct a second deposition regarding liability related to the incident.
- 23. With regard to the incident, the Court will allow Defendants' examiner to question Plaintiff regarding what occurred on the day of the incident from the time of the flash fire forward.
- 24. Plaintiff's counsel contends that Plaintiff is not claiming neuropsychological injuries or a traumatic brain injury as a result of this incident.
- 25. Defendant argues that Plaintiff's Rule 16.1 disclosures and medical records do not align with the contentions of Plaintiff's counsel regarding neurological injuries and a traumatic brain injury allegation.
 - 26. The Parties dispute what type of Rule 35 examination is warranted in this case.
- 27. If Plaintiff is claiming a loss of focus and memory loss, the Commissioner will allow a neuropsychological examination.

RECOMMENDATIONS

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that Defendants' Motion to Order an NRCP 35 Examination is GRANTED in part and DENIED in part.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Plaintiff shall be Ordered to appear for a Rule 35 examination at the office of Dr. Lewis Etcoff.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Plaintiff be allowed to have an observer present during the Rule 35 examination pursuant to NRS 52.380.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Plaintiff be allowed to have an audio recording made of the Rule 35 examination pursuant to NRS 52.380.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Defendants' examiner shall be allowed to inquire into Plaintiff's mental condition before the incident, and Plaintiff's general physical condition before the incident. The examiner may inquire as to Plaintiff's medical treatment for the five years prior to the incident.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Defendants' examiner shall be allowed to inquire into Plaintiff's life events prior to and after the incident.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Defendants' examiner shall be allowed to inquire into Plaintiff's mental and physical condition since the incident occurred.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that Defendants' examiner shall be allowed to inquire into Plaintiff's history with regard to inability to focus and memory issues.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that the parties shall appear before the Discovery Commissioner on December 10, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. to resolve the issue of whether Plaintiff is alleging neurological issues related to this incident.

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DISCOVERY COMMISSIONER

The Discovery Commissioner met with counsel and discussed the issues noted 1 2 above.
