### IDENTIFICATION:

The client is an 18-year-old Caucasian man admitted to Lake's Crossing Center per order committing the defendant to Lake's Crossing Center for the conduct of a competency evaluation pursuant to the provisions of NRS 178.415 issued by the Fourth Judicial District Court, Elko County, Nevada, Department 2.

Accompanying documents including a copy of Pleadings occurring in the Justice Court, a copy of the Criminal Complaint specifying a count of Open Murder, Declaration of Probable Cause and additional elements of discovery.

### **HISTORY:**

The client specifies that his arrest occurred on March 6, 2011, and that his charge was Open Murder with a Deadly Weapon. He specifies legal representation by John Olson of Reno, Nevada, and Jeff Kump of Elko, Nevada. He recalls attending a seventy-two hour hearing resulting in the referral for a competency evaluation as specified.

If convicted of the criminal charge the client understands that the possible sentence could include "twenty-five to life without parole or twenty-five to life with parole or nine years on death row".

The client is aware of the specific primary participants in adjudication and provides the following definitions:

Judge—"figures out the stories and the evidence and listens—tries to put the stories...decides what to do";

Jury-"twelve people who decide guilty or not guilty".

Defense attorney-"proves me innocent and gets me the least sentence";

Prosecuting attorney—"tries to get me the most time";

Evidence—"stuff like property".

Further, the client understands that the decision for trial by judge versus trial by jury is made by "me and my attorney".

He also suffered injuries to his legs; he describes no history of fracture.

Surgical history: A "tumor/calcium deposit" was removed from his right ulna (date unspecified). Additionally, as a toddler/small child he received plastic surgery for repair of severe chin lacerations suffered in an accident in which his father was playing with him with a tricycle/toy vehicle.

He has participated in extracurricular recreational activities such as football, riding dirt bikes and building hot rods with his father.

### **VOCATIONAL HISTORY:**

The client denies fulltime employment. He has worked "helping a friend with his shop", and has vocational skills with metal fabricating, "welding, plasma cutter".

### SOCIAL HISTORY:

The client is unmarried and has no children. He was engaged. He indicates that his flancé is a codefendant.

### **FAMILY HISTORY:**

Father, age 43, is considered well.

Mother, age 37, is considered well.

The client has one sibling, a 19-year-old brother, who graduated high school and is employed.

### MENTAL STATUS:

General appearance: The client presents as a taller-than-average, approximately 6 foot 5 Inch, 200 pound Caucasian male appearing his approximate chronologic age. He wears a thin moustache. There is no gross indication of physical disability.

Speech is characterized with normal latency and duration of utterance with variable spontaneous comments. Enunciation is clear. Tempo is moderate.

Affect is cooperative, pleasant, and suggests candor.

Mood: "I have high hopes...I don't want everybody drug through it (adjudication)...I think the charges can be changed because I was just there."

Sleep: "Pretty good."

Intellectual function: "The client is appropriately oriented to date, place, person, and situation. He is able to quickly and accurately calculate a simple algebra problem, story division problem and money change problem. He inaccurately estimates 37 nickels in \$ 1.35., however, accurately specifies twenty nickels in a dollar and four quarters in a dollar.

He accurately recalls three unrelated words immediately and following a tenminute interval.

Comparing similarities:

Apple/Orange: "They're food and consumable."

Differentiating word pairs:

Poverty: "Physical state without money or food." Misery: "An emotional state such as sad and stuff." Character: "A trait a person has...personality."

Reputation: "Something a person has for what they do or what they've done."

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### SUMMARY AND FORMULATION BASED ON ASSESSMENT AND CLINICAL INTERVIEW:

The client is an 18-year-old man with criminal charge admitted for evaluation of competency for adjudication as referenced. He is able to specify the criminal charges, discuss succinctly the primary participants in the adjudication process, and is aware of his legal representation.

He provides a benign history of prior legal entanglement, substance abuse or psychiatric evaluation or treatment.

The client acknowledges a moderate achievement in educational experience, noting that he was interrupted in his senior year with the arrest and instant event.

Mental status review is characterized by no indications of compromise of cognitive function. Concreteness of abstract though interpretation is considered representative of the level of formal educational achievement acquired.

### **IDENTIFICATION:**

Kody Cree Patten is an 18-year-old Caucasian male admitted to Lake's Crossing Center for an evaluation of his competency to proceed with adjudication by the Fourth Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Elko, per NRS 178.415. He is charged with Open Murder, (Including First Degree Murder and All Lesser Included Offenses) with the Use of a Deadly Weapon, a Felony.

### LIMITS OF CONFIDENTIALITY:

Mr. Patten was informed of the limits of confidentiality pertinent to this court-ordered evaluation of competency. He was informed that all information gathered in this facility could be used to support findings of competency provided to the court. He was further advised that the final reports would be provided to the court, the defense attorney's office, and the district attorney's office. He appeared to understand these limits of confidentiality and agreed to be interviewed.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Background information was obtained from the client and his clinical chart, and has not been independently verified. Mr. Patten said that he was born in Logan, Utah, and moved to Wendover, Utah when he was a young child. He was raised by his biological parents who remain married to one another. He appeared to have enjoyed his childhood; he said that he worked with his father who was an airport supervisor and fire chief for seven years. He has one older brother. He indicated that prior to his arrest he was living with his fiancée and her family. He has never been married and has no children. His relationship with his father has apparently been somewhat contentious at times, and has included both verbal and physical altercations. He has been pleasantly surprised that his father has been very supportive of him during recent events.

This client was scheduled to graduate from high school on June 3, 2011. He planned to enter the Marine Corps hoping to be assigned to the infantry and to sniper school. He described himself as a "history buff" with interests in the holocaust and "big political monsters." Mr. Patten had no academic difficulties, but was suspended on numerous occasions for fighting. When asked about his employment history he stated that he had worked at a grocery store and a hardware store, in addition to the positions with his father cited above.

Mr. Patten said that he drinks one beer on rare occasions; he denied using any lilicit drugs. He reported no current medical problems, although he said he had broken numerous bones due to racing dirt bikes. He denied any mental health history, and was unaware of any family members suffering from psychiatric disorders. He said that his recent arrest is his first, and denied any detentions as a juvenile.

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# MENTAL STATUS EXAM AND BEHAVIORAL OBSERVATIONS:

Kody Cree Patten is a tall, slender Caucasian male whose appearance is consistent with his chronological age. He was appropriately dressed and groomed. Mr. Patten was alert and oriented during the evaluation interview. No deficits were noted in his immediate, recent, or remote memory, and he was easily able to concentrate and attend to the content being discussed. Based on his vocabulary, fund of general knowledge, and capacity for abstract thought, his intelligence level is estimated as being within the Average range of cognitive ability.

This client was cooperative with the evaluation, making good eye contact and responding to all questions and tasks presented to him. His rate, volume, and articulation of speech were all within normal limits, with no pressured speech, neologisms or other unusual verbalizations. Mr. Patten's thoughts were logical, coherent and goal-directed. He expressed his thoughts and ideas without difficulty. He described his mood as "kind of mellow," adding that sometimes he has "bad thoughts" which he described as thinking about the possibility that he and his fiancée may serve time in either jall or prison, and the fact that due to recent events he lost his "best friend." Throughout the interview, Mr. Patten's affect was calm and matter-of-fact even when discussing events that most people would find highly disturbing.

Mr. Patten neither endorsed nor exhibited hallucinations, paranola, depressive symptoms or mania. In short, there was no evidence of any type of major mental illness. During his hospitalization at Lake's Crossing Center he has followed rules and restrictions, and has been cooperative with staff members. He socializes with select peers, and has displayed a bright affect. On one occasion he and a peer were observed taunting another client; when directed to cease he did so. He has participated in activities offered by staff members.

ABILITY TO COMPREHEND CHARGES AND UNDERSTAND LEGAL PROCESS:

This client's understanding of his charge and legal proceedings is considerably more thorough and sophisticated than is typically seen in criminal defendants. For example, when asked to name his charge he replied "Open Murder—Capital, First Degree, Second Degree, or Manslaughter—with a Deadly Weapon." He then cited the specific penalties he could receive if convicted of each of these

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charges. He provided a rational description of the events leading to his arrest, and he was aware of the pleas available to him. For example, he said that a person who pleads Guilty is telling the judge that they actually committed the crime of which they are accused, adding that if the Guilty plea was part of a plea bargain that they are only admitting to actions contained in the bargained charge. Mr. Patten reported that with a Not Guilty plea the person is not guilty of the crime. He added that "sometimes you go in and you plead Not Guilty if you're guilty of part of it but not all, so they're going through [a process] to prove it." He provided accurate descriptions of the roles of courtroom participants, and was cognizant of the adversarial nature of the criminal justice system. Mr. Patten was familiar with the concept of probation, as well as the process of plea bargaining. In short, his understanding of his charge and knowledge of the criminal justice system is already sufficient to ensure fair adjudication proceedings. He is capable of learning any additional material that might prove helpful in the development of a reasonable defense strategy.

# ABILITY TO ASSIST COUNSEL IN OWN DEFENSE:

Mr. Patten knows his attorneys' names, and said he has met both of them. He expressed confidence in their ability to help him resolve his legal difficulties. It appears that he has paid close attention to their analysis of and suggestions about his case, and he is willing to help them in any way he can. He has exhibited the ability to participate in reciprocal conversation across time and situation, and he has no difficulty sorting through problems in a logical and rational manner. He has expressed flexibility in considering various legal strategies. When asked what he could do to help his defense attorneys, he replied "tell the truth, give them the information they need, answer their questions to the best of my ability, and be cooperative." He is aware of appropriate courtroom decorum, which he described as "be respectful, listen to everything that's going on, and when the judge enters you're supposed to stand up." He anticipates no difficulty comporting his behavior to such standards.

# SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

Kody Cree Patten is an 18-year-old Caucasian male admitted to Lake's Crossing Center for an evaluation of his competency to proceed with adjudication by the Fourth Judicial District Court of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Elko, per NRS 178.415. He is charged with Open Murder, (Including First Degree Murder and All Lesser Included Offenses) with the Use of a Deadly Weapon, a Felony. He has been evaluated at this facility for almost two weeks.

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He has not exhibited symptoms of any mental disorder that could interfere with his competency to proceed with adjudication.

Mr. Patten knows what he has been charged with and that his alleged offense is a felony. He understands courtroom procedure and knows the roles played by the judge, the defense attorney, the district attorney, and jury. He understands that his offense could lead to some length of incarceration. He has been thinking about possible legal strategies, as well as the pleas available to him. He said he feels that he can work productively with his attorneys.

It is this evaluator's professional opinion that Kody Cree Patter has demonstrated the ability to understand the nature of the criminal charge against him, to understand the nature and purpose of the court proceedings, and to aid and assist his counsel in his defense at any time during the proceedings with a reasonable degree of rational understanding. It is recommended that he proceed with the standard adjudication process.

### **IDENTIFICATION:**

Kody Patten is an 18-year-old, never married, Caucasian male who was admitted to Lake's Crossing Center on the above date. He is charged with Open Murder, (Including First Degree Murder And All Lesser Included Offenses) With The Use Of A Deadly Weapon. The client was referred pursuant to NRS 178.415 by Department II In The Fourth Judicial District Court Of The State Of Nevada, In And For The County Of Elko.

The client was informed of the purpose of the evaluation and the limits of confidentiality. He voluntarily agreed to participate in the interview.

The information for this social history report was obtained from an interview with the client and a review of the chart.

The client informed that he was born in Logan, UT and has lived in Wendover for the past 14 years. He said that he has one older brother and that both of his parents reside in Wendover. 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### **HEALTH HISTORY:**

Mr. Patten denied any current medical problems. He said that he has had a "lot of broken bones" in the past related to accidents while racing "dirt bikes". He denied any past significant head injuries but said that he has had stitches on his head in the past and that his brother had hit him in the head with a shovel on one occasion. The client expressed that he had spinal meningitis "a couple of times" when he was about six years of age and added that this condition has long since been resolved.

### MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT:

The client denied any history of mental health issues or treatment. He was unaware of any family history of mental illness. He denied any past suicide attempts.

### ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE HISTORY:

Mr. Patten expressed that he drinks beer "once in a while" but denied any problems with alcohol. He denied any past street drug use.

### RELIGIOUS/SPIRITUAL BACKGROUND:

Mr. Patten stated that he participates in the LDS faith.

The client denied having ever served in the military but said that he was accepted into the U.S. Marine Corps and was to begin his military service after graduation from high school.

# FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The client denied any current income.

### LEGAL HISTORY:

Mr. Patten denied any past arrests but did allude to having performed community service after his parents called the police because he was intoxicated.

# ASSESSMENTS AND DISCHARGE PLANNING:

The client was pleasant and cooperative during the interview. He presented with moderate hygiene and appeared his stated age. The client was alert and oriented to person, place, time, and situation. The client described his mood as "good" and his affect appeared within normal limits. Mr. Patten denied any hallucinations or delusions. His thought process appeared intact. He denied any history of mania or depression. The client denied any current thoughts of self harm.

The client's primary strengths at this time appear to be that he has been cooperative while at this facility and his report that his family is supportive of him.

Due to the serious nature of the charges and the likelihood that the client will be involved in the criminal justice system for the near future, no discharge plan has been formulated at this time.
