

ORDER SCHEDULING PUBLIC HEARING AND REQUESTING PUBLIC COMMENT



On May 19, 2021, James W. Hardesty, Chief Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court, filed a petition requesting that the Nevada Supreme Court consider creating a Commission to Study Best Practices for Virtual Advocacy in Nevada's Courts.

The Nevada Supreme Court will conduct a public hearing on the petition on Monday June 28, 2021, at 4:00 p.m. in the Nevada Supreme Court Courtroom, 408 East Clark Avenue, Las Vegas, Nevada. The hearing will be videoconferenced to the Nevada Supreme Court Courtroom, 201 South Carson Street, Carson City, Nevada.
