

ORDER TO FILE BRIEF

On November 4, 2021, this court entered an order consolidating these appeals and directing appellant, who is proceeding pro se, to file and serve either (1) an opening brief that complies with NRAP 28(a) and NRAP 32 or (2) an informal brief for pro se parties by December 6, 2021. The order cautioned that failure to comply could result in the imposition of sanctions, including the dismissal of these appeals. To date, appellant has failed to comply or otherwise communicate with this court.

Appellant shall have 14 days from the date of this order to file and serve either (1) an opening brief that complies with NRAP 28(a) and NRAP 32 or (2) an informal brief for pro se parties. Failure to comply with this order may result in the dismissal of these appeals as abandoned.
