ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

This is an appeal from district court orders (1) denying a motion for reconsideration of a third-amended order on a motion to adjudicate an attorney lien and (2) denying a motion for an order to release client funds in excess of a judgment and require production of the complete file. Initial review of the docketing statement and documents before this court reveals a potential jurisdictional defect with respect to the appeal of the latter order.

Appellants represent in their docketing statement that the order is appealable as a final judgment. "[A] final judgment is one that disposes of all the issues presented in the case, and leaves nothing for the future consideration of the court, except for post-judgment issues such as attorney's fees and costs. *Lee v. GNLV Corp.*, 116 Nev. 424, 426, 996 P.2d 416, 417 (2000). The order does not appear to resolve any claims asserted in the case. Indeed, appellants represent that all claims against all defendants were previously fully adjudicated in the district court. Thus, the order does not appear to be a final judgment appealable under NRAP 3A(b)(1). And there can not be more than one final judgment in an action.

Alper v. Posin, 77 Nev. 328, 331, 363 P.2d 502, 503 (1961) *overruled on other grounds by Lee v. GNLV Corp.*, 116 Nev. 424, 996 P.2d 416 (2000).

Accordingly, appellants shall have 30 days from the date of this order to show cause why this appeal should not be dismissed in part. Respondents may file any reply within 14 days of service of appellants' response. Failure to demonstrate that this court has jurisdiction may result in the dismissal of this appeal in part.

Briefing of this appeal is suspended pending further order of this court.

It is so ORDERED.
