CHAIRPERSON LALLI: So just to beat this dead 6 7 horse, Mr. Hooge, based upon your comments, provided 8 the -- there is some resolution one way or the other 9 with respect to fees and costs, it's the State Bar's position that Mr. Wike should be reinstated? 10 11 MR. HOOGE: Yes. 12 CHAIRPERSON LALLI: Okay. Thank you. All right. Mr. Wike, I'm going to turn it 13 14 over to you to address the panel on any matter you see fit, understanding, I think, guite clearly what 15 16 Mr. Hooge's position is on your reinstatement this 17 morning. 18 So I'm going to turn it over to you to present 19 whatever you want to present in whatever detail you 20 want, taking as much time as you need. 21 THE PETITIONER: Thank you. 22 Basically, I'm just going to follow the exhibits that I've submitted so that I make sure that I 2.3 support my burden of proof on this case. 24 25 Exhibit 1 was initially the mentor agreement.

Mr. Hooge and I agreed that I've complied with the 1 2 mentoring agreement, that I've provided that and that I was being mentored by Brad Mainor during this time. 3 So we have agreed that I've complied with that 4 5 portion. So we took Exhibit 1 out. 6 Exhibit 1, also -- I'm sorry, Mr. Hooge? 7 Yeah. I -- I just wondered if we MR. HOOGE: 8 should swear in Mr. Wike and just consider this his 9 testimony so we can put it on the record. 10 THE PETITIONER: I believe I was already 11 sworn. 12 Oh. You were already sworn? MR. HOOGE: 13 Okay. Sorry. CHAIRPERSON LALLI: We swore him in right at 14 15 the beginning. 16 MR. HOOGE: Gotcha. 17 THE PETITIONER: Thank you. 18 And in those, the mentoring agreement 19 documents, I provided two quarterly statements, and 20 they identify the Abacus legal tracking software for all of the distributions to the clients. And that's 21 22 what Mr. Hooge has commented on. That it appears that 2.3 I, let's just say, have become more proficient in personally monitoring all of the transactions out of 24 25 the client trust account. So I wanted to point that

out. 1 2 The next exhibit was Exhibit 2, and those were initially my tax returns. I don't think anybody wants 3 4 to read tax returns. So I'm -- Mr. Hooge and I agreed to withdraw those. 5 But I do want to put it into the record that 6 7 in 2019, I had adjusted gross income of negative 8 \$37,083. And in 2020 I had adjusted gross income of 9 negative \$4,541. The significance of that is to show the detrimental effect that the administrative costs 10 11 and fees are imposing upon me and, basically, my 12 current financial position in support of being reinstated without paying those costs upfront. 13 14 And as we've all discussed here, Mr. Hooge and 15 I, previously, if we have to do a payment plan, I'm 16 open to that. I'm not against it at all. But the one 17 concern that I have is whether I will be violating 18

bankruptcy law by my doing it. Because I don't want to turn around and get reinstated and be in violation of the law in the same breath by agreeing to a repayment plan.

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So that's the legal issue, and I -- I don't know the answer to that. And as Mr. Hooge indicated, states are divided on it. These were clearly administrative costs -- fees and costs. They weren't a

penalty. They weren't restitution. There was no money 1 2 involved for that. So looking at the case law, it's undecided and I don't know how it will be ultimately 3 But, I do want to say that, if it's a 4 5 condition to reinstatement, when it goes up to the 6 Supreme Court or through this panel and the Supreme Court gives its blessing that it doesn't violate 7 8 bankruptcy law, I'm happy to do it. I just don't want 9 to turn around and violate the law the second I get 10 reinstated. So that's my concern and that's my only 11 concern. 12 Other than that, Mr. Hooge and I, over the past year, I think, we've discussed a repayment plan 13 14 multiple times. So that's where we are and that's the 15 purpose of the bank statements is to support the ruling 16 in the Shoen case that I'm hoping to be reinstated 17 without complying with the payment of those costs in 18 advance. 19 Number 3 was originally just my mortgage 20 statement. Again, it contained personal information. We decided to take that out. 21 22 I'm currently about seven months behind in my mortgage which is under deferment. I quess the 23 pandemic has some benefits, but they've put me in a 24 25 deferment program. So I'm technically not currently

- 1 behind, but as soon as it comes out of deferment, it's
- 2 going to be approximately seven months behind in my
- 3 mortgage. So I will have that burden in addition to
- 4 | any other financial burdens that I have.
- 5 And I think we did stipulate to No. 4 --
- 6 Exhibit No. 4. That is the case number for my
- 7 | bankruptcy filing. Just proof that I filed in support
- 8 of the financial hardship argument.
- 9 Exhibit No. 5 is Brad -- the affidavit of Brad
- 10 | Mainor in support of my petition for reinstatement.
- 11 | I've known Brad for approximately 20 years. I was
- 12 | originally with Mainor & Harris law firm when I met
- 13 | Brad, and Brad was then hired by his dad, Randy Mainor,
- 14 | and Brad came onboard.
- 15 And Brad and I worked together on several
- 16 things throughout that time. And then in about 2002, I
- 17 | went off on my own, but Brad and I maintained personal
- 18 | contact throughout all of these years. And we're not
- 19 close friends, meaning, we don't go to the lake
- 20 | together or we don't do things together, but we stay in
- 21 | communication regarding legal issues and we'll call
- 22 each other for advice or for support throughout these
- 23 | 20 years.
- Brad had agreed to be my mentor when this
- 25 | issue came up that we needed a personal injury mentor.

Brad didn't even hesitate. He said, "Absolutely." And 1 I've been in contact with Brad's office almost on a 2 daily basis. And so I'm hoping to, once reinstated, 3 probably work with his firm just on a temporary basis 4 5 until I can get my own practice going. I don't know 6 how that will qo. 7 But his affidavit indicates that he finds me 8 as a person of honesty and integrity and competent to 9 practice law, as my background --The panel may not know my background, but I 10 11 practiced construction defect litigation, complex 12 litigation for multiple years, and I handle, let's just say, sophisticated cases, difficult cases. One case 13 14 went on for over ten years. I invested several million 15 dollars of my own money into it and that is why, when 16 it went south, that's why my financial hardship began. 17 So just for background purposes, someone may have had a 18 question of how I got in such a financial situation. 19 The next exhibit is Exhibit 6. It's from a 20 paralegal that I've worked with for over 20 years --21 well, I think we've known each other since 2003. 22 it's not quite 20 years. Her name is Tammi Littleman. She has been a paralegal here in Las Vegas for about 2.3 24 25 years, I think, but well before I became an 25 attorney, and she has worked with many attorneys over

But I employed her both part-time and 1 the years. 2 full-time throughout the last 18 years, and Tammi is a person of impeccable integrity. She's a great 3 paralegal and she supports my reinstatement and she 4 indicates in this exhibit that she finds me honest and 5 6 having the integrity to continue practicing law. 7 Exhibit 7 is a similar item. It's just a 8 letter from Jennifer Lovell, who was a legal assistant 9 to me for 18 years, and she basically says the same That she finds me of high work ethic and the 10 11 type of practice that I was in demands that. 12 demands attention to detail. And she finds me to have the character, honesty and integrity to also practice 13 law to be reinstated. 14 Number 8 are basically my most recent CLE 15 16 certificates just to show that I've kept up with the 17 law. I think there is 14.25 credits there. It's in 18 the petition, the exact number. I didn't include a 19 summary in front of these. But it complies with 20 Nevada -- my CLE requirements for Nevada last year and, 21 of course, California and D.C. 22 Exhibit 9 is the Affidavit of Compliance that 2.3 I filed with the Supreme Court of Nevada. That is the 24 first one on March 12, 2020. It shows the list of 25 clients that I informed of my suspension. It also

- 1 | includes certified mailing receipts from the U.S.
- 2 | Postal Service showing that I actually sent them out
- 3 | certified mail.
- And Exhibit 10 is a similar item. It is the
- 5 | notice -- Affidavit of Compliance filed on October 20
- 6 of 2020 -- October 22, 2020. I apologize. And it is
- 7 | backed up again with -- its certified mailing to all of
- 8 | the people that I was required to notify, the courts,
- 9 the clients, basically, everybody that was required to
- 10 be notified.
- 11 Exhibit 11, although the certificates of
- 12 | mailing are in the other section, Exhibit 11 is simply
- 13 | the notice to the California State Bar which included a
- 14 | copy of the order which is required to be provided in
- 15 | compliance with Supreme Court Rule 116. And -- and, as
- 16 | well as the District of Columbia, I included the
- 17 | first-class tracking receipts because they identify
- 18 where the mail was sent. And there is one to D.C. and
- 19 one to California in there.
- The Exhibit 12 is the order from the Ninth
- 21 | Circuit indicating that I have agreed to a concurrent
- 22 | reciprocal suspension in -- in accordance with the
- 23 Order of the Supreme Court of Nevada. And the next
- 24 page is the same very similar order from United States
- 25 District Court, District of Nevada. And, again, I

- 1 didn't oppose any of those suspensions. I just agreed
 2 to it.
- And then Exhibit 13 is a copy of the 3 certificate of good standing from the D.C. Bar. 4 5 sent it directly to me. Unlike the next page, which is the receipt from the California State Bar, on their 6 7 website they actually asked who I want it to be sent 8 So I actually had it sent to, I believe, Dawn or 9 Dan at the State Bar of Nevada, and they received that, 10 and I saw something acknowledge -- oh. It's their
- 12 State Bar of California.

 13 I've never really practiced in either of those

 14 states. So I've -- I wouldn't have any disciplinary

Exhibit C, the Certificate of Good Standing from the

15 hearings in those states at all.

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- And then Exhibit 14 was, basically, more compliance with the letter of investigation sent to me by Ms. Meeks of the State Bar of Nevada. She requested some additional information. I had a civil suit from a contractor regarding an HOA that I represented that was ultimately settled. They named both me and the HOA as basically defendants in it. And that was ultimately settled.
- 24 And then there was under 15, which is also 25 part of that letter of investigation, the information

- 1 | they requested. I did have a judgment against me by a
- 2 | copier lease company. We had a dispute regarding a
- 3 copier. The company that was handling it here no
- 4 | longer handled it, and then it went to Ohio, whatever.
- 5 | But, basically, that was satisfied -- ultimately
- 6 satisfied. The judgment was satisfied and the case was
- 7 dismissed.
- 8 Exhibit No. 16 is an affidavit of Charlie Luh.
- 9 | Charlie Luh is an attorney who over the past 20 years
- 10 | I've opposed. He has basically been a defense attorney
- 11 | and I've been a plaintiff's attorney on complex
- 12 | construction defect litigation cases.
- 13 And I've gotten to know Charlie very well over
- 14 | the years. Again, we're not friends. We don't hang
- 15 out together. We don't have a drink together. I don't
- 16 | think we've ever had a drink together or done anything
- 17 | like that or done anything outside. But we talk about
- 18 | complex issues. We've had several trials against each
- 19 other. And, again, you can read the affidavit for
- 20 | yourself, but Mr. Luh found -- finds me a good zealous
- 21 | attorney for my clients and that I'm prepared, when I
- 22 | go to court, and that he believes that I possess the
- 23 | honesty and integrity to be reinstated to the practice
- 24 of law and he supports that reinstatement.
- 25 | Similarly, Exhibit 17 is an affidavit of Craiq

Again, he is an insurance defense attorney or 1 Slater. 2 he was in my work with him. I don't know exactly what he's doing right now. But I've known Craig for over 3 ten years. And, again, he's an opposing counsel on the 4 other side of the table in complex litigation cases. 5 6 And he, again, finds that I'm a zealous advocate for my clients. I handle complex litigation cases, and that 7 8 I, you know, strive to put my clients' interests first 9 and that he also believes that I possess the honesty 10 and integrity to be reinstated to the practice of law. 11 In the -- I've included in my second 12 supplement in support of petition for reinstatement the response to the letter of investigation from -- that 13 14 was sent to me by Ms. Meeks. I don't know if that was 15 required to be in the exhibits, but I was happy to 16 include it in here as Exhibit 18. 17 There's nothing more that I need to add 18 because I believe I've touched base throughout all of 19 the exhibits because that second supplement refers back 20 to the exhibits that we just spoke about -- or that I 21 had just spoke about. 22 Exhibit 19 is -- is a third supplement for the 23 petition, which is basically -- it just -- it's just a 24 court document for identifying that I filed the 25 supporting affidavits. And the fourth supplement is

the Declaration of Clark Seegmiller. 1 2 Clark, actually -- I worked in the same law firm with Clark, which was, again, Mainor & Harris 3 about in 2001 or around there -- 1999 to 2002, and 4 5 Clark and I have handled several cases together and, in 6 fact, Clark has come in and participated in trials with me in prosecuting the cases in these complex litigation 7 8 cases. 9 So Clark, again, respects my work. He finds me to zealously represent my clients and that I -- and 10 11 believes that I have the honesty and the integrity to 12 continue -- or to be reinstated to the practice of law. Mr. Wike, just with 13 CHAIRPERSON LALLI: 14 respect to Exhibit No. 20, I did want to make a record 15 that Ms. Faust has sent that out and I have received 16 it. 17 So I'm going to presume that the other panel 18 members have received it also unless they indicate to 19 the contrary. 20 So I just wanted to put that on the record and 21 you can continue. 22 THE PETITIONER: Thank you. Well, lastly -- well, as the last issue, I'm 23 24 not sure if -- if I'm clearing -- or I'm not sure if 25 paying the administrative costs are going to violate

In effect, it would be preferring the bankruptcy law. 1 2 one creditor over the other. And you can't do that in bankruptcy and I realize that. Because of that law 3 allows the discharge of administrative costs, I believe 4 it would violate bankruptcy law and it would be 5 6 disfavored as more or less a debt that was discharged 7 and now being used as a penalty as a condition to 8 reinstatement. 9 Dan is absolutely correct. There's no case 10 law in Nevada on that issue. The Legislature may change the discharge of those administrative costs in 11 12 Nevada one day, but to date they have not done so, and without them doing so, such as they've done so in 13 California, it's difficult to know how the Supreme 14 15 Court of Nevada is going to rule on the issue. 16 I have no problem -- as I've repeatedly said, 17 I have no problem getting into a payment plan, one that 18 I can afford. It may have to extend beyond a 19 probationary period. I don't know what my current 20 income situation will be once I begin practicing again, 21 but I would point out that I was initially suspended 22 for two years, all of which was stayed except for three 2.3 So that basically meant that I was not practicing for three months. Then I came back and I 24 25 had practiced for six months.

So I think the right amount of time would be 1 2 six months off of the 24, but I'm happy to work with Mr. Hooge or with the Supreme Court or the panel on 3 getting that information, because I believe I've 4 practiced for six months after initially being 5 suspended for three. I will have to look at those 6 dates more carefully, but I'm sure that that's 7 8 something that Mr. Hooge and I can look at just by 9 using a calendar and agree to some type of payment plan 10 if that is what the Supreme Court is going to require as a condition and that they find that I will not be 11 12 violating the bankruptcy law in doing so. 13 Lastly, I would like to say that, you know, I 14 appreciate the State Bar's direct response to this. Ι 15 appreciate their efforts in working with me to make 16 sure I get right back on the correct track. I think 17 I'm there. They'll still be monitoring me for a period 18 of time after this is all over. But, so far, I've been 19 complying, and I'm hoping that the panel will recommend 20 reinstatement. 21 Thank you. 22 CHAIRPERSON LALLI: Thank you, Mr. Wike. 23 I'm going to ask, Ms. Kingsley, do you have 24 any questions? 25 You're muted.

             In the petition for reinstatement, I cited the
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Shoen case on page 5, which was a case that involved an 1 attorney who had not complied with paying the costs 2 prior to filing the petition for reinstatement, and the 3 Supreme Court found that making that a condition for 4 5 reinstatement is more of a penalty and is disfavored. 6 So in the Shoen case, they allowed the 7 reinstatement without the payment of costs. And that's 8 the position of the Supreme Court right now is that by 9 conditioning reinstatement on the payment of costs, 10 it's serving as a penalty. And so that's why I cited the Shoen case. I probably should have touched on that 11 12 more. But in -- in the Shoen case, the Supreme Court 13 14 stated -- cited to the case of State Bar of Nevada 15 versus Claiborne recognizing that the purpose of 16 attorney discipline is to protect the public, the 17 courts and the legal profession, not to punish the 18 attornev. And they use that citation for the position 19 that requiring the payment of -- because in that -- in 20 that -- in the Shoen case, the panel dismissed the 21 petition because the costs weren't paid, and it was a 22 conditioned proceeding. 23 Supreme Court said "no." You -- the 24 conditioned proceeding is a punishment. And, 25 therefore, reinstatement could still be heard and the

payment of those costs, if it's a condition of 1 2 reinstatement, is a penalty, which is disfavored. 3 And so, in that case, in the Shoen case, they did grant reinstatement, and I believe they worked out 4 5 a payment plan. And the reasoning behind it is so that 6 the attorney can become gainfully employed, make some money and pay those costs. And that was the logic 7 8 behind the Supreme Court's ruling, which to me makes 9 sense. 10 Thank you. 11 MR. FREER: And one follow-up question just 12 real brief. How do you think 116, subsection 5, plays into 13 the Supreme Court's determination of whether or not the 14 15 costs would be dischargeable? 16 THE PETITIONER: Forgive me. I didn't cite 17 116 for 5, but if you give me just a second, I'll pull 18 it up. 19 MR. FREER: And while you're looking at that, 20 I'll just expedite it by keying you in on the language 21 that I'm looking at. 22 Quote, Reinstatement shall be conditioned upon 23 the attorney's payment of costs of the proceeding. 24 THE PETITIONER: Well, I think that that's

exactly what we just discussed, the -- the Shoen case.

25

In that case, the Supreme Court ruled that conditioned 1 2 reinstatement upon the payment of those costs as a condition precedent is a penalty and that then it's no 3 longer basically a condition precedent, but the Supreme 4 5 Court may state that it does not violate the bankruptcy 6 law and that I need to enter into a repayment program with the State Bar. 7 8 And so I believe -- and I'm happy to do that 9 if that's what the Supreme Court says. My only 10 concern -- my only concern -- this wouldn't be an issue 11 if I didn't file for bankruptcy. 12 My only concern is whether I'm going to be violating the bankruptcy law. 13 I spoke with my bankruptcy attorney briefly on this issue, and he says, 14 15 "I don't think they can do it because it is a 16 dischargeable debt under Nevada law. If it wasn't 17 dischargeable, then they could make you pay it." So 18 I -- frankly, I don't know what the answer is. 19 And the Supreme Court, as Dan said -- or 20 Mr. Hooge said, the Supreme Court hasn't ruled on it. 21 So I'd like to know how they would decide the issue at 22 this point. So I think it's going to be left up to 2.3 them ultimately. But I do want to say that, if they 24 decide on the payment plan is the correct legal avenue, 25 I'm fine with it. We'll go make it happen one way or

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the other.

And then there in the rule it also --7 8 there is a minimum of 2,500. So no matter what the 9 costs are, it's going to be 2,500. So most likely, in this case, it's going to 10 fall underneath the 2,500. And so it's going to be 11 12 just the minimum, which is 2,500. And he's going to get credit for the thousand. And, so, ultimately, for 13 14 this case, this hearing itself, he's going to owe whatever -- on top of the stuff for the previous two 15 16 cases, he's going to owe another 1,500, most likely. 17 And -- and so that -- that should be a 18 condition of reinstatement regardless of the 19 bankruptcy, because that -- this actual hearing wasn't included in the bankruptcy. This is a new hearing and 20 21 a new disciplinary proceeding. And so that -- you 22 know, he should get credit for the 1,000. He'd still owe the 1,500, and that should be a condition of his 23 24 reinstatement no matter what, in my opinion. 25 Going back to the 2,500 -- or 25,000, let

me -- I'm going to hurry and get those submitted to 1 Kristi, and then I move to admit those so that the 2 panel can take a look at those, if that's all right. 3 CHAIRPERSON LALLI: Mr. Wike, do you have an 4 objection to that? 5 6 THE PETITIONER: No, not at all. 7 And I would like to add that I agree that the 8 current costs of this hearing and the petition wouldn't 9 be affected by the bankruptcy. 10 CHAIRPERSON LALLI: Understood. Thank you. 11 So then we'll allow you to do that, Mr. Hooge, 12 to send some statement with respect to costs, and those would be received into evidence when -- when they come 13 14 across. 15 MR. "Upon his reinstatement, in 9 addition to any conditions recommended by the reinstatement panel" -- so that's you -- "Wike will be 10 11 subject to the remainder of his stayed suspension from 12 Docket No. 79305" -- which is the 24-month suspension that was stayed for all but three months -- "and will 13 14 be subject to the conditions of that stayed suspension, 15 which is the financial reporting, quarterly reporting, 16 having a mentor, and reviewing the -- reconciling the 17 financial books of the IOTA account." 18 So when you read it like that, it says, "Wike 19 will be subject to the remainder of his stayed 20 suspension." So the way I interpret that is remainder 21 of the stayed suspension is the 21 months, because he 22 was suspended for 24 months with the all but 90 days. 2.3 So I don't -- I don't read that as him getting 24 any credit for actual suspension or having that run. 25 think it's very black and white. It says "will be

subject to the remainder of his stayed suspension." 1 2 I think it's very clear that the 21 months is required in addition to any conditions recommended by this 3 So I think, obviously, this panel can add to 4 5 that, but, certainly, it shouldn't be less than that. Okay. CHAIRPERSON LALLI: 6 Thank you.  - We do believe that as a condition of his reinstatement within a 24-month period, Mr. Wike will be responsible for approximately \$20,138.15 of fees and costs related to the discipline proceedings contained in Exhibit D.  - Our reason for including this position or this condition, rather, really has little to do with whether

The panel believes 3 4 that the payment of these costs is a necessary and 5 required condition that Mr. Wike wants to regain 6 admission for the practice of law in the State of And irrespective of the length of his 7 Nevada. 8 probation, the probation that is remaining, the panel 9 believes that he should have 24 months to pay those 10 costs. 11 With respect to the amount to be paid, the 12 panel believed that that should be left to the State 13 Bar and to Mr. Wike to work out an agreeable payment 14 schedule, whether that means that Mr. Wike is required 15 to pay less upfront and more later on based upon his 16 income, it's our position that those specifics would be 17 worked out by the State Bar of Nevada. 18 Finally, we believe that during this 24-month 19 period, his probation would be extended to that 20 24-month period.
