

*ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR LIMITED REMAND*

This is an appeal from a decree of divorce. Respondent has filed a motion to remand this matter to the district court so that it may grant respondent's motion for relief from the decree.<sup>1</sup> Attached to the motion is a file-stamped, March 21, 2022, district court order certifying the district court's intention, upon remand, to grant respondent's motion to set aside the decree and reopen discovery. Cause appearing, the unopposed motion is granted. NRAP 12A(b). This matter is remanded to the district court for the limited purpose of allowing the district court to proceed as stated in its March 21, 2022, order. The briefing schedule in this appeal is suspended pending further order of this court.
