12 Initial contact was made by Sergeant Barnhart at the
13 park.

14 Q And so after Sergeant Barnhart, who I
08:45:20 15 assume also works for the Park Police Department?

16 A Correct.

17 Q After he makes contact does he advise you
18 of the situation within the park?

19 A Yes.

08:45:27 20 Q And as part of that do you then work to set
21 up a perimeter around that park?

22 A At that time it was called out that it was
23 a red Mazda vehicle that was taken. There was two
24 Southeast Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department
08:45:41 25 officers that were also responding with me. They

08:45:45 1 located the car first.

2 Q So you get details that there's a red Mazda
3 that's been taken; is that right?

4 A That's correct.

08:45:51 5 Q And are you at that point then looking for
6 that particular vehicle?

7 A That's correct. That's what I was doing
8 around the area of Sunset Park.

9 Q At some point you're advised that that
08:45:59 10 vehicle has been located?

11 A Correct.

12 Q And where was that vehicle located?

13 A I would have to refer to my report but I
14 believe it was located off of Pecos near Sunset.

08:46:11 15 Q Okay. Is that near Sunset Park?

16 A Yes.

17 Q Would it refresh your recollection to take
18 a look at your report as to the location?

19 A It would.

08:46:19 20 Q Do you have a copy of the report with you?

21 A I do.

22 Q I'll let you take a look at that and then
23 once you're done reading it let me know if that
24 refreshes your recollection.

2 Q Did you respond to that area?

3 A I was responding to that area, yes.

8 Q So you did not -- there were no individuals

9 in that car if I'm understanding that correctly?

21 A So the two Southeast officers were giving

22 directions of travel when the two occupants fled. I

23 took a street that was -- we started to set up a

24 perimeter. I took a street that was just west of the

08:47:25 25 crash location, so we set up an immediate perimeter

08:47:28 1 around the whole area.

2 Q Okay. So you're actually setting up a
3 perimeter in order to locate anyone who had fled from
4 the vehicle?

08:47:35 5 A That's correct.

6 Q As part of that you are stationed at this
7 particular street?

8 A Correct.

9 Q What do you see happen while you're
08:47:41 10 stationed at this particular street?

11 A I didn't see much, I was just listening to
12 details of the call because we had the air unit and
13 LVMPD K-9.

14 Q Were there other officers as well that had
08:47:53 15 been part of this perimeter?

16 A Correct, yes.

17 Q Did you become aware that there had been a
18 silver Honda Accord within that perimeter?

19 A I was.

08:48:01 20 Q And at some point that silver Honda Accord
21 had been stopped?

22 A That's correct.

23 Q Now, do you remember coming into -- well,
24 let me ask you this. So after this silver Honda Accord
08:48:11 25 is stopped, do you still stay within that same perimeter

08:48:16 1 spot you were at?

2 A I did.

3 Q And at any point did you end up leaving
4 that perimeter spot to return to the park?

08:48:22 5 A I'm sorry, could you state that last part?

6 Q At any point did you end up leaving that

9 Q Okay. So your job was just to stay at that

13 Q Now, did you ever have an opportunity to
14 also interview an individual by the name of James Waylon

17 Q And was he, to your understanding, an
18 individual who was taken from that silver Accord?

19 A Yes.

21 him his Miranda rights?

24 indicate to you that he understood them?

17 down. He was still denying it.

18 Q Okay. Eventually you take him to the Clark
19 County Detention Center; is that correct?

21 Q Do you then speak with him again once you
22 get to the detention center?

23 A That is correct.

24 Q Did you readvise him of his Miranda rights?

18 Q The one without the gun?

19 A No, the one with the gun was on the rear

09:09:59 20 seat and then the driver was the one who tried to punch

21 me.

22 Q Okay. So the driver tried to punch you?

23 A Correct.

24 Q And what happens when he tries to punch

09:10:07 25 you? Does he hit you?

09:10:09

1 A He missed.

2 Q What happens after that?

3 A After that is when -- I thought that the
4 rifle was fake, that it was a BB gun probably, so I

5 grabbed the barrel and tried to pull it out.

6 Q Were you able to pull that gun away from
7 the passenger?

8 A No.

9 Q After you tried to pull the gun away, what
10 is the next thing you remember happening?

14 moment. You're sort of struggling over this rifle with

17 Q Is the driver still right there next to

12 EXAMINATION

13 BY MS. CANNIZZARO:

14 Q Good morning, Dr. Gavin. How are you
15 currently employed?

09:19:11

16 A I'm a forensic pathologist medical examiner
17 at the Clark County Coroner's office here in Las Vegas.

18 Q And how long have you been employed with
19 the coroner's office?

09:19:20

20 A A little over ten years, almost 11.

21 Q Can you describe for the members of the
22 Grand Jury any training or experience and education you
23 have to prepare you for your position as a medical
24 examiner?

09:19:32

25 A I went to medical school at the University

09:19:35 1 of Connecticut School of Medicine. I did a pathology
2 residency at Hartford Hospital in Connecticut. I did a
3 surgical pathology fellowship at Hartford Hospital in
4 Connecticut. I did a forensic pathology fellowship at
09:19:49 5 the Office of the Medical Investigator in New Mexico and
6 then I came here to Clark County. I have a license to
7 practice medicine in the State of Nevada and I'm board
8 certified in anatomic pathology and forensic pathology.

9 Q In your job as a medical examiner do you
09:20:05 10 regularly conduct autopsies?

11 A Yes.

12 Q And with an autopsy what is your general
13 process by which you conduct an autopsy?

14 A Generally we'll do an investigation of the
09:20:18 15 body at the scene where the body is identified. That
16 usually is done by one of our coroner investigators. If
17 the scene is deemed suspicious then that body will be
18 placed into a body bag and that body bag will be sealed.
19 The sealed body bag will then be transported to our
09:20:36 20 office where the seal is then photographed in tact and
21 then broken.

22 At that time we go through a process of
23 photographing and documenting kind of in a layer by
24 layer method where whatever the decedent is clothed in
09:20:51 25 at the time we'll take photographs of them in that way.

09:20:53 1 Then we'll remove clothing, take photographs of the body
2 as it is. Then we'll clean the body, take photographs
3 of the body clean. And then we'll identify any kind of
4 evidence of injury that's on the external surfaces of
09:21:05 5 the body, take photographs of that and then we'll begin
6 doing our documentation of those injuries and then
7 proceed to the internal examination, which people
8 commonly think of as the autopsy, where we start to open
9 up the body and open up the head to examine the internal
09:21:20 10 organs and look for any type of evidence of injury
11 and/or pathology.

12 In addition to that we may be taking
13 specimens for additional testing or we may put organs
14 for consultation purposes and, for example, the brain
09:21:37 15 may be submitted for neuropathology or something of that
16 nature.

17 Q I want to direct your attention to
18 January 15th of 2020. Did you have an opportunity to
19 conduct an autopsy on the person who had been identified
09:21:50 20 as Kevin Farnsworth?

21 A Yes.

22 Q When Mr. Farnsworth came into your office,
23 did you go through that same process by which you just
24 described, conducting an autopsy?

09:22:01 25 A Yes.

09:22:01

1 Q I want to talk a little bit about what you
2 observed externally on Mr. Farnsworth. Can you describe
3 for the members of the Grand Jury your external findings
4 for Mr. Farnsworth?

09:22:10

5 A He had a gunshot wound of his back slash
6 chest area. He had some abrasions, scrapes present on
7 his face as well as some scrapes present on the back of
8 his hand and on his knee. And then he had evidence of
9 an exit gunshot wound as well.

09:22:30

10 Q When you say evidence of an exit and
11 entrance of the wound, were you able to make a
12 determination as to the direction of that particular
13 gunshot wound?

09:22:41

14 A Yes, the entrance of the gunshot wound was
15 at the back portion of the chest and then the exit was
16 at the anterior aspect of the chest, the front of the
17 chest.

18 Q So we're talking about then a gunshot that
19 came through the back and out of the front of the chest?

09:22:54

20 A That is correct.

21 Q You mentioned that Mr. Farnsworth also had
22 some scrapes or abrasions on his hands and his knee.
23 Would that be consistent with someone who had fallen on
24 the ground face forward?

09:23:06

25 A He also has abrasions on his face and those

09:23:09 1 would be consistent with him collapsing forward. He
2 actually also has a fractured tooth as well which again
3 would be consistent with him falling forward.

4 Q Were you also able to do an internal

22 Q At some point were you also taken to a
23 residence nearby?

24 A Yes. It was --

10:00:34 25 Q When you were taken -- sorry.

10:00:35 1 A It was right there. They were very close
2 to where they were.

3 Q Okay. When you're taken to this residence,
4 do officers ask you if you would be able to identify the
10:00:46 5 suspects?

6 A Yes.

7 Q When you are asked to do that, do they also
8 indicate to you that they may have caught the suspects
9 but it might not be the same people?

10:00:56 10 A They said they, basically like they had
11 somebody that fit all the descriptions that I gave them

13 Q They did not tell you that you absolutely
14 had to identify someone though, did they?

9 on Grand Jury Exhibit Number 19?

14 Q And it says could not identify her face,
10:03:52 15 subject that was in passenger front was definitely
16 female in dark clothing?

18 Q Can you describe that person?

19 A Well, the first person that came at me, he

21 Q Okay. Do you also remember him having a
22 long-sleeve shirt on?

23 A I don't.

24 Q Okay. But you remember him having a mask

1 A Yes.

2 Q Is this like a bandana?

3 A I don't know what a bandana is. He had
4 like a handkerchief.

5 Q Okay. Is that like covering his nose and
6 mouth?

7 A Yes, mouth.

8 Q When this male approaches you, what happens
9 as he comes over to you?

10:16:24

10 A He hits me and he demanded the key to the
11 golf cart so I resisted. He tried to take my phone. So
12 when he couldn't, you know, accomplish that he went back
13 to his vehicle and then another person got out of the
14 vehicle. Then both of them went back into the vehicle

10:16:58

15 and then they tried to run me over. I ran. You know,
16 to save myself I jumped over some bushes. I hurt my
17 right hand and also my knee. I was able to call the
18 security guard that's on property and I also called the
19 police.

22 A Well, he tried to hit me.

21 Metro as well.

23 also had experience in the field processing to lift for
24 fingerprints?

10:44:58

25 A Yes.

10:44:58 1 Q Okay. And you are not a fingerprint
2 examiner and you don't compare fingerprints to known
3 prints?

4 A Correct.

10:45:06 5 Q I want to talk a little bit about
6 February 3rd of 2020. Were you eventually involved in
7 processing a Glock 17 that was recovered on that day?

8 A Yes.

10:45:24 9 Q Now, you did not specifically recover that
10 particular firearm; is that right?

11 A Correct.

12 Q And that would have been a Glock 17
13 9-millimeter?

14 A 9-millimeter.

10:45:30 15 Q And do you recall it having serial number
16 RNG788?

17 A Yes.

10:45:41 18 Q When you were able to conduct an
19 investigation regarding that firearm, did you actually
20 process it for fingerprints?

21 A I did.

22 Q And were you able to gather any
23 fingerprints from that firearm?

24 A I was not.

10:45:48 25 Q When you process for fingerprints do you

10:45:50 1 examine the whole firearm, magazine? Can you describe
2 that for the members of the jury?

3 A Yes. You look at the firearm and magazine
4 to see if you actually see any fingerprints. In cases
10:46:01 5 where we're going to take for DNA we actually swab the
6 firearm for DNA first, and if we see a fingerprint we
7 won't swab for DNA where the print is so that we don't
8 wipe the fingerprint off.

9 Q This particular firearm, were you able to
10:46:16 10 observe any visible fingerprints?

11 A There was one on the exterior left slide.

12 Q Were you able to recover that?

13 A No, I was not.

14 Q Now, in your training and experience with
10:46:24 15 fingerprints, if another individual has sort of touched
16 that firearm, would that compromise any fingerprints on
17 the firearm?

18 A Yes.

19 Q Is that one of the reasons why you
10:46:34 20 sometimes are not able to recover fingerprints from a
21 particular item?

22 A Yes.

23 Q You mentioned that there was, you saw sort
24 of a fingerprint on this particular firearm but you
10:46:44 25 weren't able to recover it. Why is that?

10:46:48 1 A Because the slide actually had a lot of
2 texture to it, so if you think about like walls how they
3 have bumps and texture in the wall, if there's too much
4 texture on it it won't be able to lift the fingerprint
10:46:57 5 because the ridges of your print won't set over where
6 those bumps are, the texture.

7 Q And that was the case in this particular
8 instance?

9 A I believe so, yes.

22 A I've had that position for approximately
23 two years.

24 Q And do you have any training or experience
10:50:27 25 or education that has prepared you for that particular

2 A I do. I attended UNLV and graduated in
3 1999 with a bachelor of science in biology. I then
4 hired on with the police department in January of 2000
10:50:43 5 and I started with the Crime Scene Investigations unit
6 where I was a senior crime scene analyst for
7 approximately 18 years. In July of 2018 I was promoted
8 to the forensic laboratory as a forensic scientist
9 trainee in the firearms detail. I completed my training
10:50:59 10 in approximately 18 months and I began my independent
11 casework with the unit in January of this year.

12 During my training I received extensive
13 training on firearm functionality, the history of
14 firearms, ammunition, ammunition components, microscopic
10:51:19 15 comparison, instrumentation, things that relate directly
16 to the comparison work that I now perform.

17 Q Now, fair to say that you are able, in the
18 course of your job duties, to compare cartridge casings
19 to particular firearms?

10:51:35 20 A Yes.

21 Q Okay. And so you would, in that instance,
22 there would be a sample cartridge fired from the firearm
23 and then compared to a casing that may have been found
24 on a scene?

10:51:46 25 A Correct. I create, if I have the firearm

10:51:48 1 available to me, I perform test firing on that firearm
2 and then I use the cartridge cases that were produced to
3 compare directly to the fired cartridge cases that were
4 recovered from the scene.

10:51:59 5 Q Would it be fair to say that each firearm
6 sort of leaves a unique mark on a casing?

7 A They leave, in many instances they leave
8 different tool marks on different areas of the fired
9 cartridge case, yes.

10:52:14 10 Q And is that what you're comparing when
11 you're talking about comparing those two?

12 A Yes.

13 Q Now, are you also able to sometimes compare
14 actual bullets, so the piece of metal that comes out of
10:52:24 15 the cartridge to a firearm?

16 A I am, yes.

17 Q Is that always something that you're able
18 to find a match for? I guess I wouldn't say match but
19 you're able to compare.

10:52:34 20 A We are able to compare those, yes.

21 Q Now, I want to direct your attention to a
22 couple of reports that you had completed for this
23 particular case. Have you had an opportunity to review
24 those reports for your testimony today?

10:52:50 25 A Yes, I completed one comparison report for

10:52:53 1 this case.

2 Q Okay. And in that comparison, what
3 specific items were you asked to compare?

4 A I was asked to examine a Marlin model 925
10:53:03 5 .22 caliber long rifle which included a magazine with
6 that. I was also asked to examine a fired cartridge
7 case as well as a fired bullet.

8 Q Okay. Now, we're going to talk a little
9 bit about the Marlin long rifle. That was a .22?

10:53:21 10 A It's a .22 long rifle.

11 Q And that was a rifle that had been
12 recovered by detectives, that's not something you do?

13 A Correct.

14 Q That's a piece of evidence you review?

10:53:32 15 A Correct.

16 Q And then you mentioned there was also a
17 Super-X .22 long rifle cartridge case that was examined
18 as well?

19 A Correct.

10:53:41 20 Q And then there was one bullet that was also
21 asked to be compared to that particular rifle?

22 A Yes.

23 Q And what was the result of your findings in
24 comparing the firearm, the long rifle, to the casing
10:53:55 25 that was recovered?

10:53:56 1 A In my comparison of the cartridge case to
2 my test fires that I created from that rifle, I
3 identified the cartridge case that was recovered from
4 the scene as having been fired in the Marlin 925 .22
10:54:09 5 long rifle.

6 Q So that casing that you were asked to
7 compare that was impounded was compared with the test
8 casings from that same rifle and you found that that
9 casing that was recovered was fired from that rifle?

10:54:21 10 A That's correct.

11 Q Now, with respect to the bullet that was
12 recovered, were you able to conduct an examination
13 regarding that bullet?

14 A Yes.

10:54:29 15 Q And what was the result of your findings
16 with respect to that examination?

17 A When I compared the fired bullet from the
18 crime scene, the evidence bullet, to my test fires that
19 I created using the rifle, I was not able to
10:54:41 20 conclusively identify or eliminate that bullet as having
21 been fired from that rifle.

22 Q And why is that?

23 A There are several factors that go into an
24 inconclusive. There just were not enough marks,
10:54:55 25 individual microscopic marks present on the evidence

10:54:58 1 bullet that enabled me to conclusively identify or
2 eliminate it. It did share similar general rifling
3 characteristics as those that were produced from the
4 rifle, meaning it was the same caliber, similar caliber,
10:55:12 5 they had the same number of lands and grooves with the
6 same direction of twists. The lands and grooves, the
7 measurements were approximately the same as well as the
8 type of rifling. They were all the same. It was very
9 consistent across. However, the individual marks were
10:55:30 10 so limited on the evidence bullet I was not able to
11 render an identification or a conclusion.

12 Q Okay. And so does that -- that's something
13 that you, sometimes that's the determination that you
14 make, that you can't make a comparison because of
10:55:47 15 limited information?

16 A Correct.

17 Q Fair to say when you're given items to
18 compare, you're not making an assumption before you
19 actually conduct the investigation or the examination I
10:55:57 20 guess is a better word?

21 A Correct. I don't make any assumptions as
22 to whether it belongs -- whether it was fired from that
23 particular firearm or not, I base that solely on the
24 observations that I make during my examination.

10:57:01 25 Q Now, had you ever done also an examination

10:57:04 1 regarding a Glock model 17 9-millimeter?

2 A I don't recall specifically. If you have a
3 record I can refresh my memory.

4 Q Yes. Would it refresh your recollection to
10:57:15 5 take a look at the report?

6 A Yes, please.

7 Q I'll give you a moment to take a look at
8 this report.

9 A Okay.

10:57:47 10 Q And did that refresh your recollection as
11 to an examination regarding a Glock model 17?

12 A Yes.

13 Q And that would have been serial number
14 RNG788?

10:57:57 15 A Correct.

16 Q Did you also compare that to a Sig
17 9-millimeter cartridge case?

18 A Yes, I did.

19 Q And the same process by which you would
10:58:06 20 test fire a cartridge case or you would have a test
21 fired cartridge case and compare it to the cartridge
22 case that was recovered from the Sig?

23 A Correct.

24 Q And did you do that in this particular
10:58:15 25 instance as well?

10:58:16 1 A Yes, I did.

2 Q And did you find that that cartridge case
3 had been fired from that same Glock 17 pistol?

4 A I did, yes.

10:58:27 5 MS. CANNIZZARO: I have no further
6 questions for this witness. Do any members of the Grand
7 Jury have any questions?

8 THE FOREPERSON: No questions?

6 recovering evidence and documenting all of that?

7 A Yes.

8 Q And how long have you been employed with
9 the Henderson Police Department?

11:02:44 10 A Since October of 2016.

11 Q I want to direct your attention to
12 January 14th of 2020. Were you called out to the scene
13 of a suspected homicide out in Henderson near Valle
14 Verde and Warm Springs?

11:03:01 15 A Yes.

16 Q When you arrived on scene, what does the
17 scene look like when you get there?

18 A When I arrived detectives and patrol
19 officers were already there. There was the decedent on
11:03:14 20 the sidewalk. There was also a car stopped. I believe
21 a witness that had found the decedent was still on scene
22 when I arrived as well.

23 Q So fair to say when you arrive on a scene
24 you're not usually the first responding officer there?

11:03:30 25 A Correct. When I respond it's stabilized.

11:03:33 1 Q When you arrive are you typically briefed
2 by the officers who are there?

3 A Yes.

4 Q And in that briefing do you often get a
11:03:40 5 walk-through of what they believe to be the crime scene?

6 A Yes.

7 Q Now, you obviously listen to what they've
8 briefed you on but do you also make your own independent
9 observations?

11:03:51 10 A Yes.

11 Q So while that's informative it's not, I
12 guess it's not a final decision as to what you're going
13 to examine?

14 A Exactly.

11:03:58 15 Q Would it be fair to say you base your
16 examination on what you actually find on a scene?

17 A Yes.

18 Q When you arrive on this date you mentioned
19 that there was a decedent who had been identified on
11:04:09 20 sort of the side of the road; is that right?

21 A Yes.

22 Q Was this a sidewalk area?

23 A Yes, he was on the sidewalk.

24 Q And from where the decedent was, did you
11:04:18 25 happen to notice any other evidence that was pertinent

11:04:22 1 to your investigation at that time?

2 A Yes.

3 Q What specifically did you notice in that
4 scene?

11:04:29 5 A There was a cartridge case that was located
6 west of the decedent. So the decedent was on the
7 sidewalk that was located on the north side of Warm
8 Springs Road. So further up Warm Springs, west on Warm
9 Springs, there was a cartridge case laying on the ground
11:04:48 10 and there were also a few drops of blood between the
11 cartridge case and the victim.

12 Q Those few drops of blood between the
13 cartridge case and the victim, would that be consistent
14 with somebody who might have been bleeding and going in
11:05:00 15 that direction?

16 A Yes.

17 Q So going from where the cartridge case had
18 been recovered towards where the decedent was ultimately
19 located?

11:05:08 20 A Correct.

21 Q The cartridge case, this is what is
22 expelled from a firearm after it's been fired?

23 A Part of it, yes.

24 Q Okay. The other part is sort of the actual
11:05:17 25 metal bullet?

11:05:18 1 A Right, the actual projectile, yes.

2 Q Are you familiar with recovery of cartridge

3 casings?

4 A Yes.

11:05:24 5 Q And did you in fact recover this cartridge

6 case?

7 A I did.

8 Q Do you remember it being a Sig 9-millimeter

9 Luger casing?

11:05:30 10 A It was Sig 9-millimeter Luger +P was the

11 headstamp on it, yes.

12 Q And so that's all on the outside of that

13 particular casing?

14 A Correct, on the base of the cartridge case.

11:05:40 15 Q Were you able to impound that particular

16 casing?

17 A I did, uh-huh.

18 Q And that would be so that eventually a

19 forensic scientist could examine it?

11:05:48 20 A Correct.

21 Q And did you also take swabs from the blood

22 that you mentioned finding on the sidewalk?

23 A Yes, I took two swabs from an area of the

24 drops of blood.

7 of 2020. Did you become involved in an investigation
8 from February 2nd of 2020?

9 A Yes, I did.

11:09:48 10 Q You were not there, fair to say, on
11 February 2nd of 2020?

12 A That's correct, I was not there that day.

13 Q Would this involve an individual by the
14 name of Pasqual Abasta?

11:09:57 15 A Yes.

16 Q When you were assigned to this
17 investigation did you understand that there were
18 allegations that his grandson had threatened him with a
19 firearm?

11:10:06 20 A Yes.

21 Q When you looked into this particular
22 instance were you also asked to then conduct a follow-up
23 interview with Mr. Abasta?

24 A Yes, I was.

11:10:18 25 Q And would that have been in March of 2020?

11:10:21 1 A Yes.

2 Q So it was sometime after that initial
3 event?

4 A Yes, it was after.

11:10:25 5 Q But you had received information that
6 Mr. Abasta reported having been threatened with a
7 firearm by his grandson?

8 A Yes.

9 Q Okay. And his grandson, was that an
11:10:34 10 individual identified as Eric Abasta, Jr.?

11 A Yes, it was.

12 Q When you interviewed Mr. Abasta, did you
13 record that interview?

14 A Yes, I did.

11:10:44 15 Q Okay. Was it you and another detective?

16 A Yes, it was.

17 Q So you and Detective, would it be Detective
18 Stafford?

19 A Yes.

11:10:53 20 Q Go to interview Mr. Abasta. When you
21 interview him does he agree to talk with you about the
22 incident on February 2nd?

23 A Yes, he does.

24 Q When he interviewed with you, did he
11:11:05 25 indicate to you he had had a Super Bowl party at his

11:11:08 1 residence?
2 A Yes.
3 Q And would that have been at 4331 East
4 Rochelle?
11:11:11 5 A Rochelle, yes.
6 Q When he had that party, did he also
7 indicate there were a number of family members present
8 as well?
9 A Yes, he did.
11:11:19 10 Q And would that have included an individual
11 by the name of Curtis Abasta?
12 A Yes, Curtis Abasta.
13 Q And then also Eric Abasta, Jr.?
14 A Yes.
11:11:26 15 Q When you spoke with Pasqual about this
16 particular incident, do you recall him telling you that
17 there had been a disagreement between Curtis and Eric?
18 A Yes.
19 Q And did he also tell you that he refers to
11:11:40 20 Eric and the family generally refers to Eric as Junior?
21 A Junior, yes.
22 Q Did he mention to you that he then spoke
23 with Junior about the disagreement with Curtis?
24 A Yes.
11:11:51 25 Q Did he ever tell you that he asked Eric to

11:11:53 1 leave?

2 A He did, yes.

3 Q And did he tell you at some point he sort
4 of took Eric by the wrist and tried to escort him out of
11:12:02 5 the house?

6 A Yes.

7 Q Did he also indicate to you that at some
8 point Eric did walk outside of the house?

9 A Yes.

11:12:07 10 Q Did he ever tell you that he then went out
11 to his garage and opened it up like to the front of the
12 house?

13 A Yes, Pasqual did.

14 Q Do you remember him telling you that when
11:12:17 15 he did that that he saw Eric with a firearm?

16 A Yes, he did.

17 Q Do you remember him telling you that he saw
18 Eric take the firearm out of his vehicle?

19 A Yes.

11:12:26 20 Q Do you remember him saying that Eric
21 actually had the firearm down by his side while he was
22 carrying it?

23 A Yes.

24 Q Do you remember Pasqual telling you that
11:12:35 25 Eric had actually racked the slide back and cocked the

11:12:39 1 gun?

2 A He definitely had the gun down by his side.

3 Q Okay.

4 A I can't recall offhand if he said he racked
11:12:55 5 it back or if he cocked it back, the specific term what
6 he said but --

7 Q Do you remember him saying something about
8 him pulling the slide back?

9 A Yes, something along those lines.

11:13:05 10 Q After he said that Eric pulled the slide
11 back, do you remember him giving you details about Eric
12 taking some steps towards him?

13 A Yes.

14 Q Do you also remember him indicating that he
11:13:15 15 grabbed a firearm from inside of his house?

16 A Yes.

17 Q And that he actually had that firearm on
18 his person when he went back out to the garage?

19 A That's what he told me, yes.

11:13:24 20 Q Did he also tell you that Eric then went
21 into his car and sort of drove up and down the street a
22 few times before finally leaving?

23 A Correct, yes.

24 Q That was an interview that you conducted
11:13:35 25 with Pasqual back in March; is that right?

11:13:38 1 A Yes.

2 Q Okay. Now, as part of your investigation
3 in this particular incident, did you also become aware
4 of a firearm that had been recovered on February 3rd of
11:13:47 5 2020?

6 A Yes, we were.

7 Q And was that firearm recovered near that
8 Rochelle address?

9 A Yes, it was. It was very close to it.

11:13:58 10 Q Now, you also did not recover that
11 particular firearm?

12 A I did not, no.

13 Q But you had had some information about that
14 firearm at the time that you became involved in this
11:14:08 15 investigation?

16 A Yes, I was.

17 Q I'm going to show you Grand Jury Exhibit
18 Number 30. Do you recognize the area that's depicted in
19 this exhibit?

11:14:15 20 A Yes.

21 Q We talked a little bit about that 4331 East
22 Rochelle address. Do you see that depicted on this map?

23 A I do.

24 Q And then, to your knowledge, there was a
11:14:26 25 firearm that was recovered from Rochelle and Sar --

11:14:32 1 A Sabadell.

2 Q Sabadell Street which is just nearby; is
3 that right?

4 A Yes.

11:14:38 5 Q And that's depicted in this map as well?

6 A Yes, it is.

7 Q And again, the firearm was recovered the
8 day after Pasqual mentioned that Eric had left his
9 residence?

11:14:50 10 A That's correct.

11 Q I'm going to show for the members of the
12 Grand Jury Grand Jury Exhibit Number 30. And I think,
13 Detective, we were just talking about this area that is
14 depicted. And here there is a mark for 4331 East

11:15:05 15 Rochelle Avenue. Is that the same address that we've
16 just been talking about with respect to the February 2nd
17 incident?

18 A Yes, the same address.

19 Q And then this area here where the red pin
11:15:16 20 is is approximately the area where you understand that
21 firearm was recovered from?

22 A Yes, in that area, correct.

23 Q That is a very -- well, that is not -- let
24 me see. Let me ask you a different question. How would

11:15:27 25 you describe those two locations in relation to one

11:15:29 1 another?

2 A I remember being out front of the 4331 East
3 Rochelle and you could see like the highway and I knew
4 it was somewhere in that area. I'd say just looking at
11:15:41 5 it I'd estimate it maybe 300 yards away, probably
6 shorter than that but very close with respect to that
7 address.

8 Q So not right next to the house but down the
9 street?

11:15:53 10 A Down the street.

11 Q You can see where that is from where that
12 house is?

13 A Oh, yes, absolutely.

14 Q Now, did you also become involved in a
11:16:08 15 search of an address at 3667 Hollycroft in North Las
16 Vegas on April 20th of 2020?

17 A Yes.

18 Q Okay. Were there other detectives also
19 searching with you?

11:16:25 20 A There was.

21 Q Fair to say that it's generally you and
22 other detectives were looking for various items of
23 evidence?

24 A Correct, usually numerous detectives
11:16:33 25 assist.

11:16:36 1 Q And fair to say someone will usually
2 document the items that are found?

3 A Correct.

4 Q Now, as a result of that search -- well,
11:16:43 5 let me ask you this. That address, whose address is
6 that?

7 A I believe that is Eric Abasta's mother's
8 address.

9 Q Would that be Mary Ann Espinoza?

11:16:57 10 A Mary Ann Espinoza, yes.

11 Q And when you searched that address did you
12 and other detectives ultimately find a number of items
13 of evidence?

14 A Yes, we did.

11:17:06 15 Q Specifically there was a 9-millimeter
16 casing found?

17 A Correct.

18 Q And do you also recall finding two
19 9-millimeter ammunition inside of that residence?

11:17:17 20 A I did not find it but it was found. It was
21 documented in the report, yes.

22 Q And you were part of that whole search and
23 documenting it; would that be fair to say?

24 A Yes.

11:17:25 25 Q And then there was also a letter found,

11:17:27 1 again not something you found but a letter that was
2 found inside that residence as well?

3 A Correct.

12 content that exists in the phone?

14 A I was looking for any information that was

18 messages and video as well as location data and other

19 items that are stored within the memory of the phone.

10 date of February 2nd of 2020; is that correct?

17 Q Were you also able to review some text

3 she was identified as having been a sister of some sort?

9 or Dad was also talking about how it was not appropriate

11 A Yes.

12 Q Were you also able to search for some
13 additional messages with an individual by the name of
14 Mama?

11:26:22 15 A Yes.

16 Q And that would have also been on
17 February 2nd of 2020?

18 A Correct.

19 Q Those messages also contained some
11:26:31 20 conversation about how the police had been called out to
21 the family residence?

22 A Yes.

23 Q Were there also messages between Mr. Abasta
24 and an individual named Mason Arney?

11:26:47 25 A Yes, there were.

11:26:48 1 Q Now, he was not identified as Mason Arney
2 in Mr. Abasta's phone; is that correct?

3 A Correct.

4 Q He was identified as E. Goon, G-O-O-N?

11:26:58 5 A Yes.

6 Q And to your understanding was Goon also a
7 nickname that Mr. Arney used?

8 A Yes, it is.

9 Q When there was a conversation between
11:27:08 10 Mr. Abasta and Mr. Arney, do you recall there being
11 reference to an incident at a family residence and the
12 police being called?

13 A Yes.

14 Q The reference to police was specifically
11:27:17 15 using the number 12; is that correct?

16 A Yes. Usually one two is how it's said
17 but --

18 Q Okay, sorry. One two, and that's typically
19 a reference to police officers?

11:27:30 20 A Yes.

21 Q Now, did you also recover some messages
22 between Mr. Abasta and Mr. Arney regarding the need for
23 Mr. Abasta to get, quote, another Glock?

24 A Yes.

11:27:50 25 Q And there was a conversation about whether

11:27:52 1 they knew a plug who could get them firearms; is that
2 right?

3 A Correct.

4 Q A plug is what?

11:27:58 5 A A plug is kind of street terminology for an
6 individual who is a supplier or seller of something,
7 usually illegal items. Most common references are for
8 drugs and guns.

9 Q So this would be somebody who is sort of
11:28:10 10 selling firearms to individuals, not through like a
11 licensed dealer?

12 A Correct. It is a reliable source for
13 illegal commerce.

14 Q And specifically Mr. Abasta was referencing
11:28:22 15 another Glock?

16 A Yes.

17 Q To your knowledge, there was a firearm that
18 had been recovered after the incident with Eric Abasta's
19 family that was a Glock specifically?

11:28:36 20 A Yes.

21 Q Would that have been recovered the day
22 following that incident?

23 A Correct.

24 Q Now, were you also able to take a look at
11:28:45 25 some messages between October of 2019 and January of

11:28:49 1 2020?

2 A Yes.

3 Q And would that have been with an individual
4 who had been identified as Gunner MSP?

11:28:56 5 A Yes.

6 Q Were you able to associate the nickname
7 Gunner with an individual by the name of Nash Hosier?

8 A Yes.

9 Q That's H-O-S-I-E-R.

11:29:06 10 A Yes.

11 Q Now, was Mr. Abasta, in those text
12 messages, talking with Mr. Hosier about needing to buy a
13 Glock handgun?

14 A Yes.

11:29:14 15 Q And was there also a photograph included in
16 those messages that appeared to be a Glock handgun?

17 A Yes.

18 Q And would that have been consistent with a
19 Glock 17 that was recovered from that East Rochelle
20 area?

11:29:30 21 A Yes, it was.

22 Q And that would have again been the day
23 after the incident with Pasqual Abasta at the family
24 house?

11:29:37 25 A The messages with Gunner were prior to.

11:29:40 1 Q Yes, sorry, let me rephrase that question.
2 The Glock that you mentioned it being consistent with,
3 the photograph, so the photograph was consistent with a
4 Glock 17 that was recovered on February 3rd, the day
11:29:52 5 after the incident at the family house?

6 A Yes, it was.

7 Q You can't say for sure that photo of that
8 particular firearm is in fact the same gun that was
9 recovered?

11:30:00 10 A No. The serial number was not visible.

11 Q You would need something like that in order
12 to make that direct comparison?

13 A Yes.

14 Q So at best you can say these two appear to
11:30:09 15 be consistent?

16 A Yes.

17 Q But cannot make a specific determination
18 about that firearm?

19 A That's correct.

21 with Mr. Hosier and Mr. Abasta were occurring between

24 Q And that was regarding the purchase of a

2 Q Now, were you also able to view other
3 messages between other unknown individuals in
4 Mr. Abasta's cell phone?

6 Q And this would have been after the
7 February 2nd incident at the family house?

9 Q Were these conversations also involving
11:30:53 10 Mr. Abasta looking for additional Glock 17s?

11 A Yes.

12 Q And he specifically mentioned Glock 17s in
13 that?

14 A Yes, several times.

16 and that was after this particular incident at the
17 family residence?

18 A Yes.

19 Q Now, I'm going to show you, Detective, some

13 appear to be the messages with the individual by the
14 name of Erica?
11:33:00 15 A Correct.
16 Q And fair to say there are several photos
17 that depict those messages in this packet?
18 A Yes.
19 Q I'm going to show for the members of the
11:33:09 20 Grand Jury Grand Jury Exhibit Number 27. And are these
21 the photos of the text messages with Genesis Munoz?
22 A Yes.
23 Q And this is identified, she's identified
24 here as Prime Genesis?
11:33:23 25 A It's Prima.

11:33:24 1 Q Sorry, Prima Genesie.

2 A It's Spanish for cousin which she's his

3 cousin.

4 Q And Grand Jury Exhibit Number 28, fair to

11:33:36 5 say these are the messages between Mr. Abasta and

6 several other individuals regarding the purchase of

7 firearms?

8 A Yes.

9 Q Okay. And these are from a number of

11:33:47 10 different individuals, not a specific person?

11 A Correct.

12 Q I'm going to show you Grand Jury Exhibit

13 Number 24. Are these the same photographs from the text

14 with Angie or Dad who is identified here as Dad in

11:34:05 15 parenthesis?

16 A Yes.

17 Q Grand Jury Exhibit Number 23, are these

18 fair and accurate depictions of the those same text

19 messages with the individual identified as Mama?

11:34:20 20 A Yes, they are.

21 Q Grand Jury Exhibit Number 22, are these

22 fair and accurate depictions of the text messages with

23 Mason Arney?

24 A Yes.

11:34:29 25 Q And he here is identified as E. Goon; is

11:34:32 1 that right?

2 A Correct.

3 Q And then finally Grand Jury Exhibit Number
4 21, are these fair and accurate depictions of the text

11:34:41 5 messages between Mr. Abasta and Gunner MSP?

6 A Yes.

7 Q And that's identified on this photo as
8 well; is that correct?

9 A Correct.

11:34:51 10 MS. CANNIZZARO: Ladies and gentlemen of
11 the Grand Jury, I will just note with respect to these
12 aforementioned exhibits, that to the extent there is
13 mention of any other actions or to the extent that there
14 may be reference to prior incidences, they are not

4 that evening?

11:40:47 5 A I was called out to the intersection of

8 Q And what was the nature of the call for
9 service that evening?

11:40:58 10 A It was a man had been shot, a dead body
11 call.

12 Q Well, let me show you first Grand Jury
13 Exhibit Number 29. Do you recognize the area that is
14 depicted in this map?

11:41:15 15 A Yes, I do.

16 Q And you're familiar with that area?

17 A I am.

18 Q And does that depict the same area in which
19 you were called out to?

11:41:22 20 A Yes, it is.

21 Q Now, if you could -- well, can you mark
22 just the area where you initially responded to?

23 A Uh-huh.

11:41:45 24 Q I'm going to publish for the members of the
25 Grand Jury Grand Jury Exhibit Number 29. Now,

11:42:03 1 Detective, you marked this area here with this X on Warm
2 Springs and that's by that Donner Pass Road?

3 A Correct. Donner Pass is on the north side,
4 the north road that intersects with Warm Springs right
11:42:15 5 there.

6 Q Okay. And that sort of connects to Lost
7 Trails, Bluffs Drive and Stagecoach?

8 A Correct.

9 Q Fair to say that's like a little
11:42:24 10 neighborhood area?

11 A Yes.

12 Q When you respond, what is the scene like as
13 you arrive?

14 A Well, the scene is blocked off from Valle
11:42:31 15 Verde to Arroyo Grande, basically that whole side of the
16 road. Patrol cars and everything around. There is a
17 male's body laying just to the east of that X on the
18 north side of Warm Springs on the sidewalk.

19 Q When you arrive are you briefed on the
11:42:52 20 scene as it exists at the time of the call?

21 A Yes, I am.

22 Q Was it your understanding that there were
23 two individuals in a car who noticed the body lying on
24 the side of the road?

11:43:04 25 A Yes.

11:43:05 1 Q And when they stopped it appeared that that
2 individual had been shot?

3 A Correct.

11:43:12 4 Q They then called for police assistance; is
5 that correct?

6 A Yes, that's correct.

7 Q And so when you arrive they're sort of
8 securing the scene and are conducting an investigation
9 as to what is present at the time?

11:43:20 10 A Yes.

11 Q Were CSAs also called out to the scene?

12 A They were.

13 Q Now, as part of your investigation, you
14 were able to identify the individual on the sidewalk as
11:43:29 15 Kevin Farnsworth?

16 A That's correct.

17 Q Okay. Did he also have identification on
18 his person?

19 A No, he did not.

11:43:36 20 Q But you were eventually able to identify
21 him?

22 A Yes.

23 Q And come into contact with his family to
24 help identify him as well?

11:43:43 25 A Yes.

11:43:43 1 Q As part of your investigation would it be
2 common to obtain video surveillance from any of the
3 nearby residences?

4 A Yes.

11:43:51 5 Q Did you in fact attempt to do that in this
6 case?

7 A We did the night of and pretty much for the
8 following two weeks we canvassed the whole area and
9 obtained video surveillance and talked to people in the
11:44:04 10 area.

11 Q So you were looking for any video that
12 might have something that could be pertinent to this
13 case?

14 A Yes.

11:44:11 15 Q The night of the event you do not locate a
16 suspect?

17 A No, we do not.

18 Q And so part of your investigation includes
19 that canvass for video surveillance; is that right?

11:44:20 20 A Yes.

21 Q Now, were you able to obtain some video
22 surveillance that actually showed a minivan in the area?

23 A We did, from Donner Pass and Stagecoach
24 area, residences right there.

11:44:30 25 Q When you reviewed that video surveillance

11:44:33 1 initially, did you conduct an investigation as to
2 whether that minivan was involved in this incident?

3 A We did.

11:44:41 4 Q Were you able to find -- were you able to
5 come up with any conclusion as to whether that minivan
6 was involved in this incident?

7 A We were. That video activated shortly
8 after 9:00 o'clock showing the minivan arrive and park.
9 There was no video, it was just a snippet. It was a
11:44:57 10 small time frame video. We were not able to see when
11 the minivan left. So later on when we were able to get
12 video surveillance from Lost Trail and Stagecoach, we
13 could determine the minivan left only, like I believe
14 it's less than a minute after it arrived.

11:45:16 15 Q Okay. So initially when you get the video
16 this minivan could have been involved but you needed
17 that additional video surveillance?

18 A Correct.

19 Q And once you obtained that additional video
11:45:26 20 surveillance you determined that that minivan did not
21 stay on scene for any significant amount of time?

22 A No, he was gone long before the time of the
23 call of the shooting.

24 Q Okay. Now, did you also receive some video
11:45:40 25 surveillance or reports from nearby residences,

11:45:45 1 businesses and individuals that there had been a black
2 male adult seen crossing the street at Warm Springs?

3 A We did. After we did the press release and
4 contacted some people in the area, I believe there was
11:45:59 5 at least three separate tips of seeing a male in the
6 area around that time.

7 Q Now, were you also able to make a
8 determination as to whether he was involved in this
9 incident?

11:46:12 10 A We were. From video surveillance we were
11 able to determine that the exact time that the shot was
12 fired was at 2123 so 9:23 p.m. We got video
13 surveillance from farther west on Warm Springs that
14 shows the male that they originally described walking
11:46:30 15 down the street and it was at least six minutes before
16 the shooting occurred.

17 Q So he was actually not in that area at the
18 time the shooting occurs?

19 A Correct.

11:46:39 20 Q But you had received some information that
21 there was someone walking on Warm Springs?

22 A Yes.

23 Q And you were able to rule that individual
24 out?

11:46:45 25 A Correct.

11:46:47 1 Q Now, you mentioned that there was also a
2 press release done?

3 A Yes.

4 Q When was that press release done?

11:46:56 5 A The initial one of the actual shooting
6 occurred the night of and then the 15th they followed up
7 with it and then on the 22nd we did a press release
8 asking for video surveillance or if any witnesses in the
9 area remember seeing anything.

11:47:13 10 Q So initially there were details released to
11 the media on the night of the shooting regarding the
12 shooting?

13 A Yes.

14 Q And then it sounds like there was,
11:47:19 15 subsequent to that, several other media stories or
16 information that was put out to the public?

17 A Correct.

18 Q Was this in an attempt to help locate
19 information to identify the suspects?

11:47:29 20 A Yes, it was.

21 Q Now, you mentioned that at the point that

9 Q Can you describe for the members of the
11:48:04 10 jury what that video surveillance shows?

11 A So the first video surveillance, it's audio

13 off and that's at the corner of Stagecoach and Donner
14 Pass, on the north corner of those. Shortly after that,
11:48:24 15 at the end of Stagecoach turning north onto Lost Trail
16 there's two residences there and then a farther one
17 north all the way at the end of Lost Trail and Bluffs.
18 There's a house there that also picked up the vehicle.

21 neighborhood?

23 Q Now, you were able to pull that video and
