A That's correct.
Q I want to direct your attention to January 26th of 2020. Were you working on that day?

A Yes, I was.
Q And on that day do you recall having a call out to Sunset Park in reference to a car that had been taken from some individuals in the park?

A Yes.
Q And specifically do you recall responding
to a parking lot near Eastern Avenue within Sunset Park?
A I did not respond to Eastern Avenue, that was my sergeant.

Q Did you eventually respond to that scene though?

A I responded to the end location where the vehicle crashed.

Q Okay. As part of your -- so let me back up just a moment. As part of your response, you're within the park perimeter; is that fair to say?

A When we got the call I was in route.
Initial contact was made by Sergeant Barnhart at the park.

Q And so after Sergeant Barnhart, who I assume also works for the Park Police Department?

A Correct.
Q After he makes contact does he advise you of the situation within the park?

A Yes.
Q And as part of that do you then work to set up a perimeter around that park?

A At that time it was called out that it was a red Mazda vehicle that was taken. There was two Southeast Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department officers that were also responding with me. They
located the car first.
Q So you get details that there's a red Mazda that's been taken; is that right?

A That's correct.
Q And are you at that point then looking for that particular vehicle?

A That's correct. That's what I was doing around the area of Sunset Park.

Q At some point you're advised that that vehicle has been located?

A Correct.
Q And where was that vehicle located?
A I would have to refer to my report but I believe it was located off of Pecos near Sunset.

Q Okay. Is that near Sunset Park?
A Yes.
Q Would it refresh your recollection to take a look at your report as to the location?

A It would.
Q Do you have a copy of the report with you?
A I do.
Q I'll let you take a look at that and then once you're done reading it let me know if that refreshes your recollection.

A It was located on Pecos Road near Russell

Road near a Taco Bell that was there.
Q Did you respond to that area?
A I was responding to that area, yes.
Q When you come into contact with the vehicle is it occupied?

A When I came in contact with the vehicle it had already crashed into the cul-de-sac that it was in.

Q So you did not -- there were no individuals in that car if I'm understanding that correctly?

A By the time I saw it they had already fled from it.

Q Right, by the time you saw it.

Q So when you actually see the vehicle it has
crashed?

A I didn't see much, I was just listening to details of the call because we had the air unit and LVMPD K-9.

Q Were there other officers as well that had been part of this perimeter?

Q Did you become aware that there had been a silver Honda Accord within that perimeter?

A I was.
Q And at some point that silver Honda Accord had been stopped?

A That's correct.
Q Now, do you remember coming into -- well, let me ask you this. So after this silver Honda Accord is stopped, do you still stay within that same perimeter
spot you were at?
A I did.
Q And at any point did you end up leaving that perimeter spot to return to the park?

A I'm sorry, could you state that last part?

Q And did you have an opportunity to come into contact with anyone who was in the vehicle?

A Yes, ma'am.
Q And did you come into contact specifically with two individuals that were located in that vehicle?

A Yes.
Q When you came into contact with those individuals, did you eventually also ask the victims Tristan and Karen to take a look at those individuals?

A Yes.
Q And I am going to show you what has been marked as Grand Jury Exhibit Numbers 3 and 5. If you can take a look at those photographs and tell me if you recognize them.

A I recognize both subjects being occupants of that car.

Q So this is in relation to the two occupants
these victims?

A Yes, we conducted a one-on-one.
Q And so that sort of is where you have a potential suspect and they're looking at that individual in person to determine if they're involved in the particular incident?

A Yes, ma'am.
Q When you conducted the one-on-one with Mr. Abasta, is he identified by either of the victims?

A No, he is not.
Q So he was not identified as being one of

A I do.
Q And where were you on Hacienda?
A It was right at the intersection with Morris.

Q Okay. And that's located in Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada?

A Correct.
Q What were you doing in that area?
A I was riding my bike.
Q Okay. Did you also have a backpack with you?

A Yeah, I did.
Q While you were riding your bike do you ever remember coming into contact with a silver sedan?

A Yes, I got intersected right at that

Q When that happens do you turn to look at the car?

A For a brief moment because the passengers came out of the car so it didn't give me time to, you know, really look at the vehicle.

Q When you first see the car do you see the front of the car or the back of the car?

A The front.
Q So it sort of comes right at you as you're coming at it?

A Correct.
Q And you said that there were passengers that got out of the vehicle; is that right?

A Yes.
Q Where did they get out of the vehicle from?
A The driver's side door and the rear door on the left.

Q Okay. So is that like behind the driver's seat?

A Correct.
Q So you're describing two individuals that get out of that vehicle?

A Yes.
Q Can you describe for the members of the

Grand Jury like what did those two individuals look like?

A Hispanic, light skin, about five-eight, about my same height, short hair.

Q And would you describe both of them in that same way or which one are you talking about?

A Yeah, I would describe both of them in the same way. It's really hard for me to recall or remember their faces.

Q How quickly did this happen?
A In a matter of minutes. Everything happened within two minutes.

Q Okay. So fair to say it happens pretty quickly, this car comes up to you, two people jump out?

A Correct.
Q You remember specifically the driver and the person in the passenger seat behind the driver?

A Say it again.
Q The driver and the person in the passenger, in the back seat passenger on the driver's side.

A Yeah, correct.
Q When they get out of the car do they come over to you?

A Yes.
Q What happens when they come over to you?

A I don't recall exactly what their words were but I understood that they may rob me so I got off my bike because I thought that's what they wanted but --

Q Were they kind of -- so you said you don't remember the exact words but were they sort of asking for your property?

A In a way I guess you could say they were.
Q Did you notice whether either one of them had a weapon?

A The one on the rear door came out with a rifle.

Q And you've just made sort of a, I don't know, like two-foot and a half long gesture?

A Yeah, about this big probably.
Q And you mentioned it's a rifle?
A Correct.
Q Is that a yes?
A Yes.
Q And is he pointing this at you when they're sort of talking to you about your bike and your property?

A Yeah, the guy with the weapon came on this side while the other one went on my left side so I had both of them on each side of me.

Q So you have the passenger with the rifle on

your right side and the driver on your left side?
A Correct.
Q And they're both coming towards you?

A They kept the weapon pointed at me. The other one tried to punch me in the face.

Q Is that the driver?

A No, the one with the gun was on the rear seat and then the driver was the one who tried to punch me.

Q Okay. So the driver tried to punch you?
A Correct.
Q And what happens when he tries to punch you? Does he hit you?

A He missed.
Q What happens after that?
A After that is when -- I thought that the rifle was fake, that it was a BB gun probably, so I grabbed the barrel and tried to pull it out.

Q Were you able to pull that gun away from the passenger?

A $\quad$ No.
Q After you tried to pull the gun away, what is the next thing you remember happening?

A After that I run to the house because I knew the people that live there.

Q Okay. So I'm going to back up for just a moment. You're sort of struggling over this rifle with the passenger?

A Yeah.
Q Is the driver still right there next to you?

A Uh-huh.
Q Are they trying to take your property?
A No.
Q Okay. Are they still making comments to you about taking your property?

A Yes.
Q Do you remember the gun going off?

## DR. LISA GAVIN,

having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

## EXAMINATION

BY MS. CANNIZZARO:
Q Good morning, Dr. Gavin. How are you currently employed?

A I'm a forensic pathologist medical examiner at the Clark County Coroner's office here in Las Vegas.

Q And how long have you been employed with the coroner's office?

A A little over ten years, almost 11.
Q Can you describe for the members of the Grand Jury any training or experience and education you have to prepare you for your position as a medical examiner?

A I went to medical school at the University

of Connecticut School of Medicine. I did a pathology residency at Hartford Hospital in Connecticut. I did a surgical pathology fellowship at Hartford Hospital in Connecticut. I did a forensic pathology fellowship at the Office of the Medical Investigator in New Mexico and then I came here to Clark County. I have a license to practice medicine in the State of Nevada and I'm board certified in anatomic pathology and forensic pathology.

Q In your job as a medical examiner do you regularly conduct autopsies?

A Yes.
Q And with an autopsy what is your general process by which you conduct an autopsy?

A Generally we'll do an investigation of the body at the scene where the body is identified. That usually is done by one of our coroner investigators. If the scene is deemed suspicious then that body will be placed into a body bag and that body bag will be sealed. The sealed body bag will then be transported to our office where the seal is then photographed in tact and then broken.

At that time we go through a process of photographing and documenting kind of in a layer by layer method where whatever the decedent is clothed in at the time we'll take photographs of them in that way.

Then we'll remove clothing, take photographs of the body as it is. Then we'll clean the body, take photographs of the body clean. And then we'll identify any kind of evidence of injury that's on the external surfaces of the body, take photographs of that and then we'll begin doing our documentation of those injuries and then proceed to the internal examination, which people commonly think of as the autopsy, where we start to open up the body and open up the head to examine the internal organs and look for any type of evidence of injury and/or pathology.

In addition to that we may be taking specimens for additional testing or we may put organs for consultation purposes and, for example, the brain may be submitted for neuropathology or something of that nature.

Q I want to direct your attention to January 15th of 2020. Did you have an opportunity to conduct an autopsy on the person who had been identified as Kevin Farnsworth?

A Yes.
Q When Mr. Farnsworth came into your office, did you go through that same process by which you just described, conducting an autopsy?

A Yes.

Q I want to talk a little bit about what you observed externally on Mr. Farnsworth. Can you describe for the members of the Grand Jury your external findings for Mr. Farnsworth?

A He had a gunshot wound of his back slash chest area. He had some abrasions, scrapes present on his face as well as some scrapes present on the back of his hand and on his knee. And then he had evidence of an exit gunshot wound as well.

Q When you say evidence of an exit and entrance of the wound, were you able to make a determination as to the direction of that particular gunshot wound?

A Yes, the entrance of the gunshot wound was at the back portion of the chest and then the exit was at the anterior aspect of the chest, the front of the chest.

Q So we're talking about then a gunshot that came through the back and out of the front of the chest?

A That is correct.
Q You mentioned that Mr. Farnsworth also had some scrapes or abrasions on his hands and his knee. Would that be consistent with someone who had fallen on the ground face forward?

A He also has abrasions on his face and those
would be consistent with him collapsing forward. He actually also has a fractured tooth as well which again would be consistent with him falling forward.

Q Were you also able to do an internal examination on Mr. Farnsworth?

A Yes.
Q And what were your findings with respect to the internal investigation for Mr. Farnsworth?

A The path of the bullet went from his back through one of his ribs in the back causing a fracture, through his left lung, both lobes of the lung, then exited out the front of his chest near the sternum.

Q As a result of those particular injuries, would Mr. Farnsworth have had difficulty breathing?

A Yes. Also he had approximately two liters of blood present within his left chest cavity.

Q And that blood that's present in his chest cavity, what was that a result of?

A From the gunshot wound of the lungs.
Q Okay. So he was also bleeding at the time when this gunshot wound occurs?

A Internally, yes, uh-huh.
Q Would you expect for someone who has this type of injury to be able to continue to keep walking around for a long period of time?

A Not for a long period of time. I have seen individuals where they've actually been shot in their heart and have progressed several feet before they actually collapse, so it would not be unusual for him to progress a few feet and then collapse as well.

Q So it would be consistent if he had gone a short distance before finally collapsing?

A Yes.
Q Were you also able to make a determination regarding the cause and manner of death of Mr. Farnsworth?

A Yes.
Q And what was your determination regarding the cause of death?

A He died of a gunshot wound of the back slash chest.

Q And what about the manner of death?
A Homicide.
MS. CANNIZZARO: I have no further questions for this witness. Do any members of the Grand Jury have questions?

A Currently I'm employed as a forensic scientist in the firearms detail with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department in the forensic laboratory.

Q How long have you had that position?
A I've had that position for approximately two years.

Q And do you have any training or experience or education that has prepared you for that particular
position?
A I do. I attended UNLV and graduated in 1999 with a bachelor of science in biology. I then hired on with the police department in January of 2000 and I started with the Crime Scene Investigations unit where I was a senior crime scene analyst for approximately 18 years. In July of 2018 I was promoted to the forensic laboratory as a forensic scientist trainee in the firearms detail. I completed my training in approximately 18 months and I began my independent casework with the unit in January of this year.

During my training I received extensive training on firearm functionality, the history of firearms, ammunition, ammunition components, microscopic comparison, instrumentation, things that relate directly to the comparison work that I now perform.

Q Now, fair to say that you are able, in the course of your job duties, to compare cartridge casings to particular firearms?

A Yes.
Q Okay. And so you would, in that instance, there would be a sample cartridge fired from the firearm and then compared to a casing that may have been found on a scene?

A Correct. I create, if I have the firearm
available to me, I perform test firing on that firearm and then I use the cartridge cases that were produced to compare directly to the fired cartridge cases that were recovered from the scene.

Q Would it be fair to say that each firearm sort of leaves a unique mark on a casing?

A They leave, in many instances they leave different tool marks on different areas of the fired cartridge case, yes.

Q And is that what you're comparing when you're talking about comparing those two?

A Yes.
Q Now, are you also able to sometimes compare actual bullets, so the piece of metal that comes out of the cartridge to a firearm?

A I am, yes.
Q Is that always something that you're able to find a match for? I guess I wouldn't say match but you're able to compare.

A We are able to compare those, yes.
Q Now, I want to direct your attention to a couple of reports that you had completed for this particular case. Have you had an opportunity to review those reports for your testimony today?

A Yes, I completed one comparison report for

Q When you arrive are you briefed on the scene as it exists at the time of the call?

A Yes, I am.
Q Was it your understanding that there were two individuals in a car who noticed the body lying on the side of the road?

A Yes.

Q Did you in fact attempt to do that in this case?

A We did the night of and pretty much for the following two weeks we canvassed the whole area and obtained video surveillance and talked to people in the area.

Q So you were looking for any video that might have something that could be pertinent to this case?

A Yes.
Q The night of the event you do not locate a suspect?

A No, we do not.
Q And so part of your investigation includes that canvass for video surveillance; is that right?

A Yes.
Q Now, were you able to obtain some video surveillance that actually showed a minivan in the area?

A We did, from Donner Pass and Stagecoach area, residences right there.

Q When you reviewed that video surveillance
initially, did you conduct an investigation as to whether that minivan was involved in this incident?

A We did.
Q Were you able to find -- were you able to come up with any conclusion as to whether that minivan was involved in this incident?

A We were. That video activated shortly after 9:00 o'clock showing the minivan arrive and park. There was no video, it was just a snippet. It was a small time frame video. We were not able to see when the minivan left. So later on when we were able to get video surveillance from Lost Trail and Stagecoach, we could determine the minivan left only, like I believe it's less than a minute after it arrived.

Q Okay. So initially when you get the video this minivan could have been involved but you needed that additional video surveillance?

A Correct.
Q And once you obtained that additional video surveillance you determined that that minivan did not stay on scene for any significant amount of time?

A No, he was gone long before the time of the call of the shooting.

Q Okay. Now, did you also receive some video surveillance or reports from nearby residences,
businesses and individuals that there had been a black male adult seen crossing the street at Warm Springs?

A We did. After we did the press release and contacted some people in the area, I believe there was at least three separate tips of seeing a male in the area around that time.

Q Now, were you also able to make a determination as to whether he was involved in this incident?

A We were. From video surveillance we were able to determine that the exact time that the shot was fired was at 2123 so 9:23 p.m. We got video surveillance from farther west on Warm Springs that shows the male that they originally described walking down the street and it was at least six minutes before the shooting occurred.

Q So he was actually not in that area at the time the shooting occurs?

A Correct.
Q But you had received some information that there was someone walking on Warm Springs?

A Yes.
Q And you were able to rule that individual out?

A Correct.
