If 17 the scene is deemed suspicious then that body will be 18 placed into a body bag and that body bag will be sealed. 19 The sealed body bag will then be transported to our 20 office where the seal is then photographed in tact and 09:20:36 21 then broken. 22 At that time we go through a process of 23 photographing and documenting kind of in a layer by 24 layer method where whatever the decedent is clothed in 25 at the time we'll take photographs of them in that way. 09:20:51
