And the customer -- we -- wanted to switch some numbers to us -- port numbers to us. And Patricia replies to him we -- we moved already two numbers, 301 -- 301-725-5665 and so on. For -- for you to submit one more number, 401-418-8422, you must have three lines with us. If you like us to port additional number, 301 blah, blah, blah, I'm sorry -- to the Joy Phone, please add additional line to your service and pay the porting fee for authorize us one time \$20 porting fee and \$1.95

Q Now, setting that aside, you lived with the woman, you dated her, you married her. On the date of signing the prenuptial agreement, what was her level of fluency in English?

A It was just like any -- any other employee at the company on a business side or on a personal side.

- Q Well, I mean, I -- I have taken her deposition.
- A Right.

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Q And I would say that I wouldn't think she's totally fluent but I think she knows everything --

A Well she have an accent. She have an accent and she always did. And it's something that she probably will always have. When she's nervous, when you were giving her deposition, her English was worse because she was nervous but when she's not nervous, she's very proficient in -- in language. Actually to my knowledge, she speaks seven different languages. So her English when I met her was not as good as when we signed the agreement, but by working at the

company on daily basis, she communicated with all clients, employees, myself, and my parents only in English. So her proficiency in English was very good by the time she signed the agreement.

And then once we -- we fill that out, we printed it. And then we took it to the third floor, which was a mortgage company, and we got it signed and notarized.

- 17 | Q And no affiliation between them and your wife?
- 18 A To my knowledge.
 - Q And now I want to -- and then having signed that, they completed that task, correct?
 - A Yes, sir.
 - Q And there's still another six weeks that pass between August 13 of 2008 and you're getting married to Patricia on September 26th of 2008?

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2	Q And in the interim, you heard her say she didn't
3	know when you moved and she said you moved before you signed
4	the agreement.
5	A I think she's go ahead.
6	Q Where were you physically located when you signed
7	the prenuptial agreement, LLL?
8	A We were physically located in Fort Lauderdale, but
9	the move did take some time. So just to to what she's
10	referring to, the final move was obviously before we we got
11	married, but there was a few months that we actually moved. I

He is, if not, the pre -- one of the half a dozen most prominent family law lawyers in Atlanta, Georgia, but there's no prejudice to the Plaintiff except for the natural fact that -- that he's giving testimony and a report that's three pages long that details his points.

And I discussed with you in my opening statement my recognition. And -- and when you look at the case law with regard to lawyers serving as experts, they're always permitted to testify about facts and ultimate facts and there is of course the dividing line as to and not invading the province of the Court, but that's left to you.

But I -- as I announced it at the opening of the statement, I'm sensitive to that and you won't find me trying to evade that. I -- I have great confidence in you and so the -- the -- I'm not going to trifle with the Court, but I do think it's important because it's an area of law that does not based upon the statutes -- and that's why it's important, Georgia law does not have -- not only does it not have the Uniform Premarital Act like we do in Nevada, it doesn't have a statute that speaks to prenuptials. Prenuptial law in Georgia has evolved by cases dramatically changing in 2005 with the Malon (ph) Georgia Supreme Court case. So that's why I think it would be of --

THE COURT: Well, let --

MR. JIMMERSON: -- aid to the Court.

THE COURT: -- let -- let me ask. Is -- is

Counsel's objection -- objection more to the timing of the report? It's not to the potential receipt by the Court of expert --

MS. MENTZEL: Well --

He was disclosed May 15th of 2017 and Defendant's amended discloses of expert witnesses and docs, we literally -- we -- we've never even had a chance to talk to this man, go over this report. He states conclusions of fact in his report.

MR. JIMMERSON: Right.

MS. MENTZEL: There's actually a new case law in Colorado that came out.

THE COURT: Well -- well, hang on. Before we get into that, because, I mean, we're starting to -- to get into some of the legal nuances and arguments and I -- and I'd rather -- I want to make sure we use our time effectively to -- to get the factual evidence into the record. And -- and I can make determinations at a later time in regards to additional testimony. And -- and obviously, I'll need some clarification on exactly when the notice was provided of the expert witness's designation. I --

MR. JIMMERSON: I'm quoting you for what I was told by Ms. Brewer and I know that he was retained in that time period, so.

THE COURT: And I -- and I understand as well. I've had the chance to read the briefs that have been submitting by the parties and that's also included the -- the opportunity for the Court to -- to pull cases that have been cited in your respective briefs and I -- I recognize some of those. Your briefs reference a lot of the same cases from Allen to Cher to Alexander and I've had a chance to review those cases as it --

MR. JIMMERSON: May I --

THE COURT: -- pertains to the application of Georgia law. There may be some assistance to the Court in hearing from someone who practices in Georgia recognizing that we're perhaps more familiar. I'm more familiar with the application of the Nevada statutory scheme. Do you have something, Mr. Jimmerson?

MR. JIMMERSON: Yes, I do. March 1 of 2017, the disclosure of Shiel Edlin, Page 3 of the Defendant's disclosures of expert witnesses and documents, right on the space right there.

MS. MENTZEL: And I still believe Your Honor -
MR. JIMMERSON: Excuse me, but could I have at least
an acknowledgment that --

THE COURT: Well, listen.

MR. JIMMERSON: -- there's a misstatement --

If it becomes -- there is -- I'm going to defer on ruling on the admission of any exhibit based on the timeliness objection that you've raised, but it -- it doesn't appear to apply to the potential expert appearing to testify as it relates to --

MS. MENTZEL: Your Honor, we haven't even had a chance to go through the report and retain our own expert. This is also in the time line where we received about 12,000 documents, I believe. So it's the course of getting dumped on. Our expert report getting dumped on I believe 17 binders of documents to that -- to that effect. So it's looking at a

point where even if we're looking at allowing expert report in or testimony, I don't believe the timeliness, because you have to file -- or you have to disclose your expert -- expert -- is it 20 days or 60 days? 60 days after the disclosure of the financial disclosure form you have to list your expert witness. I do not believe that had occurred in this place, Your Honor.

Second of all, you're required to provide the report for the expert. We don't even know what this man is going to say. I believe it's 60 days prior to the -- I mean, close of discovery, surely, not less than one business day prior to your trial.

THE COURT: Well, listen. And -- and I -- I don't want to spend much more time on this. This was set in a very unique fashion as it relates to the pre -- prenuptial agreement because both parties indicated this is a desi -- a desired to have this litigated sooner rather than later. So it was not necessarily set in the normal course of the proceedings of this case. In fact, as I recall yesterday and today originally were scheduled as trial dates on the custody issue. At -- at par -- at both parties' request, I moved the -- the custody aspect of this case and utilized today's date and yesterday's date for purposes of -- of the trial of the prenuptial agreement.

And so again, that familiar -- familiarity, excuse me, familiarity of speaking to the same person, it wasn't so much that she spoke better more than I understood better if that makes any sense. I -- I don't know how to describe it. I -- I -- when you're talking to somebody especially face-to-face, you get to understand facial expressions and, you know, other things other than the actual word. So -- and -- and because we had multiple -- many conversations, when she might have said something, I could fill in -- you know, she missing or word or saying the wrong word, I -- I understood though what she was trying to say.

- Q And she would go back and forth to Brazil, correct?
- A Yes.
- Q Okay. Did you guys write to each other?
- A We did. We used a chat program. We used also emails. That would be how we wrote to each other.
