11	POINTS AND AUTHORITIES			
12	Appellant is requesting to stay briefing to permit him to file a Huneycutt			
13	motion in the district court which, if successful, would render the appeal moot.			
14	Requests for relief must be made by motion absent another way prescribed by			
15	rule. See NRAP 27(a)(1).			
16	As the appeal is pending, the district court generally has no jurisdiction to			
17	enter orders granting motions—it may generally only state how it is inclined to			
18	rule; however, the district court may der	ny motion while	an appeal is pending.	
19	See Huneycutt v. Huneycutt, 94 Nev. 79, 5	575 P.2d 585 (19	78); see also Foster v.	
20	Dingwall, 126 Nev. 49, 53, 228 P.3d 453, 455-56 (2010).

1	Here, Appellant opines that a Rule 60(a) motion (and perhaps for other
2	similar relief) in the district court might be fruitful, more cost effective, save
3	judicial resources, and moot out the appeal if the relief is granted. Counsel for
4	Appellant was not trial counsel. The more Counsel reviews the record and has
5	discussed the issue with Appellant, the more clear it is that a Rule 60(a) motion
6	is the better vehicle for relief.
7	Appellant asserts that ninety (90) days should be sufficient to file the
8	motion, have it opposed, to file a reply, have the district court make a ruling, and
9	to have the order entered. Should the matter take less time or more time based
10	on the district court's calendar, Appellant shall so notify the Court.
11	CONCLUSION
12	Accordingly, the Court should stay briefing to permit a Huneycutt motion
13	in the district court which, if successful, would render the appeal moot.
