

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

After a bench trial, the district court entered a decision in favor of plaintiffs, ruling that CCSD violated Title IX and that plaintiffs' substantive due process rights guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment were violated. Defendant appealed from the decision and judgment and the subsequent attorneys' fees award. See Docket Nos. 73856 and 74566.

1 The Supreme Court entered its published opinion reversing  
2 the district court's decision on both claims and remanding for addi-  
3 tional findings on the Title IX claim. Following remand, the district  
4 court again awarded each plaintiff damages in the amount of  
\$200,000 and attorney fees and costs in the amount of \$470,418.75.

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
