

**ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
AND SUSPENDING BRIEFING**

This is an appeal "from the Order Clarifying Order For Dismissal Entered June 21, 2021." This court's review of this appeal reveals a potential jurisdictional defect. Specifically, no statute or court rule provides for an appeal from an order clarifying order. *Castillo v. State*, 106 Nev. 349, 352, 792 P.2d 1133, 1135 (1990). To the extent that appellant's appeal is in regard to the order of dismissal entered on June 21, 2021, the notice of appeal was untimely filed. NRAP 4(b); NRS 34.575(1); NRAP 26(a); NRAP 26(c). "[A]n untimely notice of appeal fails to vest jurisdiction in this court." *Lozada v. State*, 110 Nev. 349, 352, 871 P.2d 944, 946 (1994). Accordingly, appellant shall have 21 days from the date of this order to show cause why this appeal should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. Respondent shall have 14 days from the filing of any response to file any reply.

The deadlines for filing documents and the briefing of this appeal are suspended until further order of this court.

It is so ORDERED.
