

ORDER TO TRANSMIT PRESENTENCE INVESTIGATION REPORT

On March 25, 2022, this court issued an order granting appellant's motion to transmit the presentence investigation report to this court. The order instructed the district court clerk to transmit the presentence investigation report by April 8, 2022. To date, the presentence investigation report has not been transmitted to this court. Accordingly, the district court clerk shall have 7 days from the date of this order to transmit to the clerk of this court a copy of the presentence investigation report (district court case number 21-CR-00908) in a sealed envelope. See NRAP 30(b)(6); NRS 176.156(5) (providing that except for specific disclosures authorized by NRS 176.156(1)-(4), a presentence investigation report is "confidential and must not be made a part of any public record"). Failure to comply with this order may result in the imposition of sanctions. See NRAP 11(d)(1).

It is so ORDERED.
