

ORDER GRANTING MOTION

Appellant's motion for an extension of time to file the opening brief is granted. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Appellant shall have until May 16, 2022, to file and serve either (1) an opening brief that complies with NRAP 28(a) and NRAP 32 or (2) an informal brief for pro se parties on the form provided by the clerk of the court.¹ Given the length of this initial extension request, no further extensions shall be permitted absent extraordinary circumstances and extreme need. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Failure to timely file the brief may result in the imposition of sanctions, including dismissal of this appeal. NRAP 31(d).

Respondents need not file a response to any brief filed by appellant unless directed to do so by this court. NRAP 46A(c).
