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#### STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Issue: The district court abused its discretion at sentencing. The district court failed to consider the individualized circumstances of Stephen Allen Frederick or articulate a rational for imposing the maximum sentence.

#### STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Stephen Allen Frederick plead guilty to one count of transporting a controlled substance, a category C felony, in violation of NRS 453.321 and NRS 193.130. AA, p. 11.

The district court sentenced Stephen Allen Frederick to a minimum term of twenty-four months and a maximum term of sixty months in the Nevada Department of Corrections. The sentence ran consecutive to a sentence imposed in CR 20-7199. AA, p. 17.

Stephen Allen Frederick appeals. AA, p. 20.

#### STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

Stephen Allen Frederick plead guilty to one count of transporting a controlled substance, a category C felony, in violation of NRS 453.321 and NRS 193.130. AA, p. 11.

At the sentencing hearing, Stephen Allen Frederick apologized. AA, p. 33. Stephen Allen Fredrick was humble. AA, p. 33. Stephen Allen

p. 33. Stephen Allen Frederick was thankful and grateful. AA, p. 33. Stephen Allen for treatment and drug court. AA, p. 37.

Pursuant to NRS 193.130, Stephen Allen Frederick faced a potential sentence of a minimum term of twelve to a maximum term of sixty months in the Nevada Department of Corrections. AA, p. 12.

Stephen Allen Frederick was eligible for probation. AA, p. 12.

The district court rejected Stephen Allen Fredericks imploration. The district court sentenced Stephen Allen Frederick to the maximum sentence permitted by law – a minimum of twenty-four months and a maximum term of sixty months in the Nevada Department of Corrections. AA, p. 17, p. 41. The district court ordered the sentence to run consecutive to a sentence imposed in CR 20-7199. AA, p. 17; AA, p. 41.

### **SUMMARY OF ARGUMENT**

The conviction should be reversed. The matter remanded for a new sentencing hearing where at the district court should consider individualized circumstances in mitigation and articulate a rational for the sentence.

#### **ARGUMENT**

The district court sentenced Stephen Allen Frederick to the maximum sentence permitted by law – twenty-four months and a maximum term of sixty months in the Nevada Department of Corrections. AA, p. 17, p. 41.

Without comment. AA, p. 17; AA, p. 41.

The district court abused its discretion and violated fifth amendment guarantees of due process. The district court failed to follow the public policy of the State of Nevada.

The eighth amendment's cruel and unusual punishment clause prohibits both torturous and disproportionate sentences. *See <u>U.S. v. Lai,*</u> 944 F.2d 1434, (1991), *citing <u>Solm v. Helm,</u>* 463 U.S. 277, 284 (1983).

Although trial judges are accorded unfettered discretion in sentencing defendant, the 9<sup>th</sup> circuit insists on individualized sentencing that takes the individual as well as the crime into account. See <u>Lai</u> citing <u>U.S. v. Borrero-Isaza</u>, 887 F.2d 1349, 1352 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir.1989); <u>United States v. Brady</u>, 895 F.2d 538 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1990): <u>United States v. Barker</u>, 771 F.2d 1362 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1985).

The people of Nevada have declared that sentencing policies should embody fairness and opportunity. NRS 176.0131(1). The people of Nevada have declared that a continuum of sentencing options should be available with community programs for diversion and supervision of

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offenders. NRS 176.031. The people of Nevada have declared that strategies to reduce crime should involve prevention, treatment, health and labor. NRS 176.0131(1).

#### CONCLUSION

The matter should be reversed for a new sentencing hearing where at the district court is commanded to articulate the rationale behind the district court's decision to ignore public policy and impose a maximum sentence rather than grant probation and treatment<sup>1</sup>.
