ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE


Appellant has filed an appeal from an "Order Upholding Commissioner's Recommendation for Order to Set Evidentiary Hearing on Motion." Preliminary review of the docketing statement and the documents submitted to this court pursuant to NRAP 3(g) reveals a potential jurisdictional defect. Specifically, it appears that the district court has not entered a final written judgment adjudicating all the rights and liabilities of all the parties. Lee v. GNLV Corp., 116 Nev. 424, 996 P.2d 416 (2000); KDI Sylvan Pools v. Workman, 107 Nev. 340, 810 P.2d 1217 (1991); Rae v. All American Life & Cas. Co., 95 Nev. 920, 605 P.2d 196 (1979). In its order, the district court merely directs the parties to set an evidentiary hearing on a petition to revoke letters testamentary and to revoke probate; it does not resolve the substantive issues of the petition. This court has jurisdiction to consider an appeal only when the appeal is authorized by statute or court rule. Brown v. MHC Stagecoach, LLC, 129 Nev. 343, 345, 301 P.3d 850, 851 (2013) (this court may only consider appeals authorized by statute or court rule). No statute or court rule provides for an appeal from an interlocutory order directing that an evidentiary hearing be held.

Accordingly, appellant shall have 30 days from the date of this order within which to show cause why this appeal should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. Failure to demonstrate that this court has jurisdiction may result in this court's dismissal of this appeal. The deadlines for filing documents in this appeal shall be suspended pending further order of this court. Respondent may file any reply within 14 days from the date that appellant's response is served.
