## ORDER

On September 1, 2021, this court entered an order removing counsel for respondents and directing respondents, within 30 days, to retain new counsel and cause counsel to enter an appearance or to inform this court that they wish to proceed pro se. Respondents have filed their responses. Respondents Floyd Wayne Grimes, Elizabeth Grimes, Victoria Jean Halsey, Jalee Arnone, and Peter Arnone all assert that they intend to proceed pro se.

Respondent WBG Trust has filed a motion for an indefinite extension of time to secure counsel. The motion is granted as follows. NRAP 26(b). WBG Trust shall have 30 days from the date of this order to retain new counsel and cause counsel to enter an appearance on its behalf. If WBG Trust fails to retain counsel within 30 days, the trust may not file documents in this appeal. See NRAP 46A(b)(2); Salman v. Newell, 110 Nev. 1333, 1336, 885 P.2d 607, 608 (1994); State v. Stu's Bail Bonds, 115 Nev. 436, 436 n.1, 991 P.2d 469, 470 n.1 (1999) (neither business entities nor trusts may appear or file documents without counsel).
