*ORDER GRANTING MOTION AND REGARDING TRANSCRIPT
REQUEST FORM*

The motion for an extension of time to file the opening brief is granted. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Appellant shall have until September 28, 2022, to file and serve the opening brief and appendix. Given the length of this initial extension request, no further extensions shall be permitted absent extraordinary circumstances and extreme need. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Counsel's caseload normally will not be deemed such a circumstance. *Cf. Varnum v. Grady*, 90 Nev. 374, 528 P.2d 1027 (1974). Failure to timely file the opening brief and appendix may result in the imposition of sanctions.

This court notes that although counsel for appellant states that she requested additional transcripts prior to filing the instant extension motion, no supplemental transcript request form has been filed in this court. Appellant shall have 7 days from the date of this order to file, in this court, a file-stamped transcript request form regarding the additional transcripts. *See* NRAP 9(a)(3). Failure to timely file the supplemental transcript request form may result in the imposition of sanctions.

It is so ORDERED.
