GUILTY PLEA MEMORANDUM

- I, BRENDAN DUNCKLEY, understand that I am charged with the offense(s) of: COUNT I. LEWDNESS WITH A CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF FOURTEEN YEARS, a violation of NRS 201.230, a felony; or in the alternative, COUNT II. ATTEMPTED SEXUAL ASSAULT, a violation of NRS 193.330, being an attempt to violate NRS 200.366, a felony.
- I desire to enter a plea of guilty to the offense(s) of 2. COUNT I. LEWDNESS WITH A CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF FOURTEEN Y COUNT II. violation of NRS 201.230, a felony; or in the ATTEMPTED SEXUAL ASSAULT, a violation of NRS 193.330, being an attempt to violate NRS 200.366, a felony, as more fully alleged in the charge(s) filed against me.

- 3. By entering my plea of guilty I know and understand that I am waiving the following constitutional rights:
 - A. I waive my privilege against self-incrimination.
- B. <u>I waive my right to trial by jury</u>, at which trial the State would have to prove my guilt of all elements of the offenses beyond a reasonable doubt.
- C. I waive my right to confront my accusers, that is, the right to confront and cross examine all witnesses who would testify at trial.
- D. I waive my right to subpoena witnesses for trial on my behalf.

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I further understand the charge(s) against me and that the elements of the offense(s) which the State would have to prove beyond a reasonable doubt at trial are that on March 10, 2007, or thereabout, in the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, I did, as to Count II. willfully, and unlawfully attempt to subject JESSICA H. to sexual penetration against the victim's and/or under conditions in which I knew or should have known that the victim was mentally or physically incapable of resisting or understanding the nature of the my conduct, to wit, fellatio at 1675 Sky Mountain Drive, #827, Reno, Washoe County, Nevada..

- 5. I understand that I admit the facts which support all the elements of the offenses by pleading guilty. I admit that the State possesses sufficient evidence which would result in my conviction. I have considered and discussed all possible defenses and defense strategies with my counsel. I understand that I have the right to appeal from adverse rulings on pretrial motions only if the State and the Court consent to my right to appeal. In the absence of such an agreement, I understand that any substantive or procedural pretrial issue or issues which could have been raised at trial are waived by my plea.

I believe that entering my plea is in my best interest and that going to trial is not in my best interest.

Mr. Dunckley understands that the consequences of his plea of guilt to Count I is that he may be imprisoned for a period of life in the Nevada Department of Corrections with parole eligibility after ten years and that he is not eligible for probation unless he satisfies NRS 176.139, which certifies that he is not a high risk to reoffend based upon current standards, and a psychiatric or psychological evaluation to be completed pursuant to NRS 176A.110. He also could be subject to a \$10,000 fine, and he understands that he'll be under lifetime supervision.

He also understands the consequences of his plea

of guilty to Count II, which is set forth in the Guilty Plea Memorandum, that he would be -- could be imprisoned for a period of 2 to 20 years in the Nevada State Prison, and he's also not eligible for probation unless he satisfies the same psychosexual and psychological evaluations as set forth in Count I.

In exchange for his plea of guilty, Your Honor, the State and counsel and Mr. Dunckley have agreed to recommend the following:

The State will be free to argue for an appropriate sentence. The State will not file additional criminal charges resulting from the arrest in this case and/or will refrain from pursuing additional and/or transactionally-related offenses, including all counts filed and dismissed in Reno Justice Court, Case No. 2007-033884.

He understands that in entering his plea to

Count I, it is a legal fiction, pursuant to the plea

negotiations, to allow him to avoid the more serious

charge of sexual assault in the original Count I, and this

also allows him the opportunity to qualify for probation,

which would otherwise be unavailable.

That language and the language that was part of the guilty-plea memorandum was not included in the presentence report. I want to make the Court aware of the fact that probation in both of these charges is available in this case. While the laws have changed since the period of time when the charge one began, it does not allow probation any more. So I would like the Court to take that into consideration.

Other than that, we have no other corrections, Your Honor,

THE COURT: Okay. You may proceed with argument.

MR. O'MARA: Okay. First, I would like to introduce and have admitted two documents. One document is a letter from a Leslie Dietsche (phonetic), if I may approach. Let me grab the other document.

THE COURT: Why don't you grab everything, and the Clerk will mark it all at one time.

MS. VILORIA: I have seen a copy of these, Judge.

MR. O'MARA: There is also another copy from Eng 1 2 Counseling setting forth information about Mr. Dunckley's 3 clinical contact with Steven Eng as a sexual offender. THE CLERK: Exhibits A and B marked. 4 5 (Exhibits A and B were marked for identification.) 6 THE COURT: Okay. Exhibit A is a report from Eng 7 Counseling, and there is no objection to its admission so I will admit it. And Exhibit B is a letter from Alamo Casino and no 8 9 objection so I will admit that. 10 (Exhibits A and B were admitted into evidence.) 11 MR. O'MARA: Your Honor, in regards to the Eng 12 Counseling, which is Exhibit A, you will notice that there are 13 numerous attendances by Mr. Dunckley for sexual-offender 14 counseling. He had individual sessions on March 3, 26 and 15 April 29th of this year. He goes on to group attendance with Mr. Eng on 4/23. 16 17 You notice how the 4/30 has an absence? That was because he 18 went to his individual counseling the day before. Those are the 19 dates in which he did not attend group attendance because it was 20 the same week. 21 Mr. Dunckley informed me the 6/12 was a work 22 emergency. He basically went on a weekly basis to Eng 23 Counseling. 24 What we are going to ask for today, Your Honor, is

that you not follow the recommendations of the Parole and Probation and actually award or not award but grant Mr. Dunckley the opportunity to be on probation for both of these charges.

One of the reasons is that when we were going through negotiations in the settlement, that was one of the main reasons to give him the opportunity. As you recall about five months ago when we were in here during the change of plea, we set it out five months to give him an opportunity to go to these counseling sessions.

From the letter, you can see he started his counseling sessions prior to the entry of the guilty-plea memorandum which I believe was done on the 6th of March. He went religiously to those counseling services.

He is really taking hold and finding out what is making him do these bad things. He is trying to take responsibility for his actions. I believe these therapy sessions are working toward making him a better person and someone who will be, at least, someone who will be a benefit to our society.

As you can see from the letter from the Alamo Casino, Mr. Dunckley has been a good person to his employers and other people with regards to stepping up and doing things when not everybody would do it with regards to helping and cleaning the floor and things like that when there was a broken pipe when he

wasn't required to do that. I think there are good things involved that we need to look at in that regard.

Also, I have today Mr. Dunckley's mother in law who would like to make a statement. Her name is Pam McFerren M-c-f-e-e-r-e -- I apologize. M-c-f-e-r-e-n. And she would like to make a statement, Your Honor, to the Court to ask for probation as well.

THE COURT: You want her sworn, Ms. Viloria?
MS. VILORIA: No, ma'am.

THE COURT: You can come forward and stand next to Mr. O'Mara.

MS. MCFERREN: I'm Brendan's mother in law, Pam. I have known him for eight and a half years. He and my daughter have quite a special relationship. He has four children, two by a previous marriage. He is the soul provider of his home, his family. That includes with my daughter, his wife, their two children, my grand children. And, also, child support for his first two children by a previous marriage.

He also has helped me financially as well as physically when I have needed help off and on over the years.

I have noticed the counseling that Brendan is getting has been very effective. I have noticed when he comes back from his meetings with his counsellor, he is a lot more calm. His demeanor is a lot more calm. As calm as you can be under these

1 kind of circumstances. I believe it has been effective with 2 him. 3 I feel that he really should continue with that, and 4 it's been very helpful so far. 5 And I would like to ask for probation for him and the 6 continued counselling so that he can be with his family which is 7 a very important thing. As you know, families don't stick together too much in 8 9 these times. And it's very important especially to those little 10 boys. 11 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. 12 MR. O'MARA: Your Honor, in going over, it's true Mr. Dunckley has four children, 10, 9, 7 and 3 which is set forth in 13 the presentence report. I think, you know, we have heard a lot 14 15 today in other cases and things like that. I think in this case 16 it really is true that this is really a sad case for everyone 17 involved. 18 It's not only sad for the two victims that Mr. 19 Dunckley committed these crimes against, but it is also sad for 20 the kids and his wife that are now going to have to deal with 21 these types of situations. And in light of these four kids, he 22 does have child support he needs to continue. 23 I think that in this case we really have to think 24 outside the box in sentencing. And it comes down to a lot of

this coming from -- one of these cases is really old. And there is a whole different type of sentencing structure at this point in time. And now we are looking at a sentencing structure in this system where we are looking at these cases differently.

I think if we look outside the box and really say how can we properly make sure that Mr. Dunckley takes responsibility for his action and so-called punishment for the crimes he committed but also give him the opportunity to rehabilitate himself and provide for those people so that other people, like his kids and wife, are not victimized by his behavior. I think his mother in law said it really well, in fact, when he takes these therapy classes he is a different person.

Sometimes that's what people need. They need control over their lives such as a probation to tell them they need to go to probation and have a job and do these things. And I think when we jump to the conclusion, lef's throw this person away, put him in jail for the rest of his life, if we do that, then we are not helping anybody in this case.

I think that if we look at Mr. Stivensen's (phonetic) recommendations, it talks about he specifically, in bold letters, says Mr. Dunckley does not represent a high risk to re-offend sexually. He goes on to say Mr. Dunckley presents as a positive candidate for treatment.

Treatment process with Mr. Dunckley, treatment should

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be the process with Mr. Dunckley. He recognizes the need for intervention. I think that assessment is correct. I think if we allow Mr. Dunckley to be on probation, he will get the treatment he needs.

There are certain recommendations that I think are clearly appropriate in this case, Your Honor, and will help do what we need to do to take care of the punishment of Mr. Dunckley as well as rehabilitate him so these incidents do not occur.

Those recommendations are set forth on page six of his I would like the Court to consider those as well. report.

Your Honor, the report says Mr. Dunckley is not applicable to probation. He does not have a high risk to offend, so he does qualify for probation.

If the Court is inclined to do some type of jail term in this-- prison term in this thing, we ask that you really do think outside the box and give him an opportunity to prove himself, even in prison.

There are two counts. We can suspend the first count of the ten-year maximum and hold that over Mr. Dunckley's head to allow him the opportunity to go into prison and do something with his life and get himself out in a few years instead of ten years when his kids basically are grown up and past their teenage years.

I think probation -- we are requesting you allow probation in this case, but if you do not find probation is appropriate, we do ask that you, at least, give him the opportunity to go to prison on maybe one count. Hold the other count above his head and sentence him according to the sentence of probation which is two to five years on Count II, Your Honor.

I think Mr. Dunckley's statement at the back page really sums it up about how remorseful he is and he did is want an opportunity to be with his kids, pay his child support and move forward and take responsibility of the two incidents that caused him to be put in this position.

With that, I respectfully request that you allow for probation.

THE COURT: Ms. Viloria?

MS. VILORIA: Judge, first of all, I want to state that paragraph 11 of the guilty-plea memorandum allows me to discuss with you any counts that were dismissed or any other cases that were charged or uncharged which were either dismissed or not pursued by the State at the time of sentencing. That's important because you need to realize here who you are sentencing today.

Hopefully today is going to be the end of Brendon Dunckley and what we have to deal with him.

This has been ten years of inappropriate conduct, ten

years of sexual attacks mostly on young woman who were 12 years old or mentally ill and intoxicated cultivating into the final account with the stranger attack with a woman who was .226 that the defendant saw walking down the street, drunk and falling down.

We did craft this creative plea bargain so this defendant could have the right to posture himself to ask the Court for sentencing. That's what he required before he came to you and admitted his conduct and entered his plea of guilty.

The Court needs to know that your concern and the State's concern are that the community have to be safe. And if Brendon Dunckley is given probation, it will not be.

The factual corrections that I need to make on the presentence investigation report in page six on March 21, 2007 when -- this is omitted so I'm just adding it in. When the detectives went to talk to Brendon Dunckley and he denied he had done anything, nothing happened, and when he ultimately changed, yes, he performed fellatio on me as a way of thanking me for getting her back in the apartment, that only came about after the detectives said to him why are we going to find her DNA on your penis?

The original story that this defendant crafted to police is that while she was laying there unconscious she started to throw up and he reached into your mouth to clear her

tongue and follow that had gone to the bathroom and touched his penis while urinating and that would be the story of why you have DNA.

This defendant is sophisticated in the sense that he uses his wife as an alibi during the attacks so his wife is brought into the picture where she says, I was on the phone with him the whole time. There is no way this could have occurred. What the full investigation showed is there was a few minutes where he said I need to call you right back in about five minutes and the rape happened and he called his wife back. It wasn't a true alibi.

This has been ten years. That's important for you to know. There are not two victims, there are three. Jessica H. Laura S, and also Ashley.

What concerns me is when you look at the evaluation that that Dr. Stivensen (phonetic) reports, everything is on self-admitted conduct. And Dr. Stivensen (phonetic) sort of congratulates the defendant by that saying, Look, he came forward with all these other incidents of sexual conduct. But he calls Ashley 14 years old at the time when we all know she was 12.

He is not being forthcoming, and the Court needs to recognize that because Dr. Stivensen (phonetic) didn't say he is a low risk to re-offend. He deemed him a moderate risk to

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re-offend. And that's based on the self-given information from this defendant.

Judge as a parent -- from the recitation of all the facts you see on everything, and, basically, how we ended up solving the ultimate case is because the detectives and law enforcement have been on this defendant's tail for years.

The defendant avoided any type of prosecution because of the victims he has chosen.

Ashley V. is in prison right now. A good part of it is because she turned to drugs and alcohol as being molested by this defendant when she was little girl.

We created this allegation or this plea bargain so that this defendant could ask you for probation, but the Court needs to acknowledge Jessica, our last victim, is the one who is a complete stranger to this defendant, didn't know anything, literally woke up on her back in the floor of her apartment right by the door with him shoving his penis in her mouth.

He comes to you today and brings witnesses to say he is a good provider. We need to think about his children. We can't put him in prison. I ask you one question, why wasn't he thinking of that when he was trolling for his next sexual assault victim?

Things have finally caught up with him, and that's why we are here today. And the Division has appropriately asked the

Court to give him life in prison with the possibility of parole after ten years.

I do recognize following the day of this plea bargain, and I would note for the Court not a day sooner, that the day after he entered his plea of guilty he began his sex offender treatment.

And the Court is concerned as is the State whether or not all of this is posturing himself for some sort of beneficial sentence or a good outcome for you today.

The reality is I have looked at the evaluation, and there are a couple things in there that are alarming to me and I want to point them out to you.

Beginning at page seven, the paragraph under perception of victim impact. One of the things that Dr. Stivensen (phonetic) noted that Mr. Dunckley believed both victims were harmed—again, there were three victims—as he described taking their since of security away inside, however, was limited and somewhat superficial.

On page 11, Judge, it says, In considering the risk scales along with clinical judgment, Mr. Dunckley is estimated in the moderate range for sexual re-offense risk. Clinical judgement elevated risk is there due to re-offense behaviors occurring over an elapsed time and involved with an offense against a stranger.

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His promiscuous and impulsive sexual lifestyle places him at greater risks for further allegations and charges. is evidence of being indiscriminate in regards to victim selection, meaning, his modus operandi is not limited to a particular victim, type, age or preference.

The fact that an evaluator would put that in there shows you the level of gravity of danger of this defendant. my concern is that the community is flat at risk.

He also states on page 12 under the amenability to treatment and prognosis, the second full sentence, He, being Brendan Dunckley, does not present as an antisocial or defiant, though, there may be some resistance to treatment upon the realization of a longer-term process.

Why that is important, Judge, is if this defendant is, in fact, doing a posturing to present walk the walk and do all he needs to do to present good in Court today, then anybody, any woman, whether it's a/12 year old or 28 year old that comes within his way is a risk.

The State cannot risk that, Judge. The community cannot risk that.

This defendant has shown himself to be deserved a grant of a prison sentence. The life in prison is appropriate.

He should be commended for the effort he has made, and that's why when the Division recommends a concurrent sentence on

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the attempted sexual assault charge, it could be appropriate here. I think the Division has short sold that count a little bit because that's, really, the more egregious count. The whole sexual assault nature of this should not be a two to five sentence. It should be a 20-year sentence.

This defendant deserves to go to prison and life time supervision and everything else that the Division recommends is appropriate.

I just am concerned, frankly, Judge that nobody get caught up on focussing on the children that are involved in this Those are all people that should have been thought of before this defendant decided to act on his impulse and attack and escalate in violence. What's happened over the years, Judge, every time he has raped somebody or inappropriately touched someone and gotten away with it, he has gone up to the next level.

The 12 year old is a friend of the family. A little girl who befriended his wife who then became his victim number There were victims in between there. Including the Laura, the mental-health victim. We couldn't pursue the case because of her mental-health issues. She was all part of this final case where once we ended up getting the allegations with this defendant with Jessica and we started seeing a pattern of conduct, similarity in defenses, every single time his statement

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was to the law enforcement was, Yes, I shouldn't have sex with this girl. It was bad judgment. And he just for years and years, for ten years, has been able to get away with it to the point where he is escalating where he is trolling where he sees drunk women falling down drunk on the street, he formulates the thought in his mind, followed her in the house, and in a very opportunistic and predatory manner attacked her. That deserves ten years in prison, minimum.

MR. O'MARA: If I can just respond to a few things before Mr. Dunckley addresses the Court.

> THE COURT: Okay.

MR. O'MARA: First of all, there is no evidence whatsoever that this charge caused Ms. Ashley -- I'm not sure what her last name is. Ashley to go into drugs and use alcohol and that's why she is in prison. There is no evidence of that. And I understand that the D.A. wants to paint a huge horrible picture of Mr. Dunckley and--

THE COURT: I won't consider that argument.

MR. O'MARA: It is also important that her description of what happened on that night by Jessica was not as that she woke up on her back past out. Her description in the Justice Court when she testified was that she was standing up and she made the affirmative step of walking toward Mr. Dunckley to perform the fellatio.

В

This just goes to the point of the D.A. not having all the facts and telling you different stories. It has nothing to do with Mr. Dunckley not taking responsibility of his action.

The Court should be aware that is the testimony.

Also, in regards of him going to counseling, it was done before the guilty plea was entered into which was March 6th. His counseling started on March 3rd.

I want the Court to be aware that Mr. Dunckley was charged with those allegations against the individual Laura.

Laura did not show up at the preliminary hearing even though the District Attorney said she was more than willing to be there and they contacted her. We went—we had three or four hours of testimony over in the Justice Court. She still did not show up.

It's disingenuous for the District Attorney to say it was because of her mental stability, and we don't know or have any documentation showing she had any mental stability. To place that on Mr. Dunckley, it's inappropriate to bring up in the sentence.

MS. VILORIA: Objection. I absolutely made a representation as an officer of the Court as to that being the issue. And you are allowed to think about her.

Mr. Dunckley refers to her throughout the report to Dr. Stivensen (phonetic). She is the one who he attacked on the hood of a car who he claims was consensual but he put his penis

in her mouth. 2 I don't why we are acting like she is not a victim. 3 She did not show up at the prelim. We did not go forward with 4 that, and it is because of her mental-health issues. I am 5 making that -- and he knows that based on all the discovery 6 I don't know why he is saying that's disingenuous. 7 It's not. It's the facts of the case. MR. O'MARA: Well, we will let that stand. With 8 9 what-- if that's what she understands, that's what she understands. 10 Does it make a difference? 11 THE COURT: 12 MR. O'MARA: It doesn't. I'm just trying to set forth --13 THE COURT: Your client has admitted to the behavior 14 with her? 15 MR. O'MARA: Yes, my client has admitted to the two 16 17 charges that are involved in this case. But I just wanted to 18 make the Court away of those three or four different things so 19 we know what we are dealing with regards to thinking outside of 20 the box in this case to figure out some type of sentencing that is appropriate which will allow for the punishment for the 21 crimes that were committed as well as allow for the 22 23 rehabilitation and acknowledgment of trying to get Mr. Dunckley back into society and being a productive part of your society 24 -20

instead of just saying, We are trying to give you probation. 2 And let's see what we can do. And go out there and get some type of treatment and go from there. We will come to 3 4 sentencing. We will take that into consideration. I would like to introduce another document in that 5 6 regard. It's an e-mail between myself and Ms. Viloria that 7 really talks about --MS. VILORIA: I'm going to object. This is outside 8 9 the context of negotiations. This is not appropriate for 10 sentencing. I'm going to object. He was doing this because 10 that's what was asked of him--THE COURT: I don't think that's her statement. 11 12 statement was talking about the whole period of time he has been 13 in counseling, whether or not it was going to last indefinitely or whether or not he was posturing prior to sentence. 14 15 MS. VILORIA: That's right. MR. O'MARA: We have made a circle of where we are 16 17 going in that regard, and that is fine, Your Honor. 18 With that, Your Honor, again, I request probation in this is, and I will let Mr. Dunckley address the Court. 19 20 THE COURT: Okay. We have four days credit for time served. 16 17 THE COURT: Thank you. Mr. Dunckley, the law affords you an opportunity to be 18 19 I have read your written statement. Do you have 20 anything you would like to say at this time? 21 THE DEFENDANT: Your Honor, the State is doing their I moved to Reno in the Spring of 2000. The allegations 22 23 were made against me from 1998. I took the plea as opposed to going to trial to 24

1 prevent the victims from pursuing further. 2 Ms. Viloria states that I made the comment of saying 3 that the victim Ashley was 14 because of the time that I had known her, which was the summer of 2000 when I met her, she 4 5 indicated to me that she was 14. As a matter of fact, when we 6 met, she indicated she was 17. Upon finding out later her true 7 age, myself and my wife stopped contact all together with her. 8 It doesn't change the fact of what I did. 9 Posturing, whatever it may be called, I took the deal 10 as opposed to going to trial because I wanted to prevent any further harm to the victims. 11 12 I can't say I know what they are going through because I can't. 13 It's not my place to assume I know what they feel. Being a father is the most important thing to me in the world. And knowing I'm a horrible example kills me more than anything you can punish me with, Your Honor. I ask that I be given the chance to show my children that people can make differences in their life and make a change.

I pride myself that when my wife was pregnant I never missed a single doctors appointment. I never missed an appointment. I'm a dad through and through. Somewhere along the line, I lost that. I disrespected my family and more importantly I disrespected my family.

I love my family more than anything in the world. I took this deal to prevent any further harm for them and for the victims. I just ask to have the opportunity, if it's possible, to continue to be a part of my children's life.

My wife didn't have a father growing up, and all she ever wanted was a husband and a father to raise her children.

I'm the sole provider of my family. I have two children who I owe money to, and I try being a single income household and single income father, it is hard to get money to them. I try and keep stable employment, and when I'm getting laid off or working, I'm always working.

Your Honor, all I ask is for the opportunity to show

that I can do better. And I can be better at this. I screwed up, and I admit the fact I made mistakes and I hurt people. I want to prove that it won't happen again. And if it does, which I pray it never will, because I'm getting treatment every week. I'm keeping support with the people I need support from. I have medication to deal with my inability to make correct calm decisions as opposed to being spontaneous.

I don't know what more I can say to Your Honor.

I throw my heart to you to allow me to be a part of my children's lives, and I understand the fact I have hurt people. But at the same time, the last five months have been such an awakening to see why I allowed myself to do that and why I felt it was okay to disrespect my bonds of my marriage and my children who I brought into this world.

They don't deserve what I put them through, but that's something I will have to deal with the rest of my life and so will the victims.

I ask you give me the opportunity, Your Honor, to be there and to prove that there is good. And I can make a difference. And I can be productive to society and a benefit. I learned so much from the victim impact panels and counseling. It's something I want to pursue further to help people who are in that situation. They need me to be the dummy to beat up, I have no problem with that either. But I just ask that you give

me that opportunity, Your Honor, to prove that I can do this and not just the five months that I proved I can stay out of trouble and make my appointments and meetings and go above and beyond but continued to be allowed to do that, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Mr. Dunckley, perhaps your plea would have more resonance with me with regard to the issue that you had with the friend of the family, even though it was a very young girl, and even though you argue you thought she was 17, I have heard that many times. That argument for treatment if it was an isolated incident may well resonate with me.

However, the latest victim. I'm not talking about the victim in between you are not charged with. I'm very concerned with your latest victim. I agree with Mrs. Viloria. I don't think that the sentence is recommended even by the Division is appropriate given your behavior.

You picked someone you didn't know, and you committed a sexual assault on her.

I know you pled to something that allows for a lesser offense, but it does not allow for probation.

It is the order of this court you pay \$25
administrative assessment fee, \$150 in DNA testing fees. I
think you have already submitted to a DNA analysis test. So you
won't have to submit again, but you also will have to pay the
\$950 in psycho-sexual fees.

Risk of Dangerousness to the Community: In considering the risk scales along with clinical judgement, Mr. Dunckley is estimated in the moderate range for sexual reoffense risk. Clinical judgement elevated risk due to reoffense behaviors occurring over an elapsed period of time, and involved an offense against a stranger. Furthermore, his promiscuous and impulsive sexual lifestyle places him at greater risk for further allegations/charges. There is no evidence of being indiscriminate in regard to victim selection, meaning his modus operandi is not limited to a particular victim type, age or preference.

It is the opinion of this evaluator that Mr. Dunckley <u>DOES NOT REPRESENT A HIGH RISK TO REOFFEND</u> SEXUALLY based on current standards for assessment (NRS 176a.110)

<u>Identification of Risk Population</u>: Based on historical information, response to inventories, self reported arousal and objective measures of sexual interest, the identifiable risk population is varied, and can include adult females who are strangers, and under age youth whom he has access to, or had developed a relationship with. Much younger children do not present as an immediate risk, in that there is no evidence of sexual interest in younger children.

Amenability to Treatment: Mr. Dunckley presents as a positive candidate for treatment, based on his willingness to openly discuss and explore the factors related to the referral offense; primarily his disclosure of his sexual offense history. He does not present as antisocial or defiant, though there may be some resistance to treatment upon realization of a longer term process. Although there may be some minimization and presence of cognitive distortions that support and maintain the behaviors, these issues can be addressed in the treatment process with Mr. Dunckley. Mr. Dunckley recognizes the need for intervention, and reported having initiated treatment to date.

VI. OFFENSE SYNOPSIS

Count. II

On March 10, 2007, officers of the Reno Police Department were dispatched to a residence on Sky Ranch in reference to a disturbance call which involved a woman screaming in the caller's background. Upon arrival, officers observed a large group of people standing in front of an apartment building and a female setting on the curb of the road crying hysterically. The female was stating she had been sexually assaulted. One of the bystanders advised the officers the defendant, Brendan Dunckely, was the person the female had accused of the assault.

Officers contacted the defendant who was setting in a white van. Upon being questioned, the defendant advised the officers he had been driving through the parking lot on his way home when he observed the crying female stumbling in the parking lot. Mr. Dunckley related the female appeared intoxicated and he had stopped to assist her. He went on to state the victim appeared intoxicated and he continued to watch her as she fell on a stairway. He had then parked his van and gone to assist the victim up the stairs and into her apartment. As he and the victim reached her apartment he had asked her if she had a key and she replied that she did not. The victim then fell against the door of her apartment and it opened. The victim then fell to the floor onto a pile of clothing. The defendant reported the victim was unconscious at this point and he administered a sternum rub and checked her pulse. This action awoke the victim and he had asked her what her name was and how much alcohol she had consumed. Mr. Dunckley reported the victim had spoken to him and then again lost consciousness. He again rubbed her sternum and she awoke and began screaming at him and asking him who he was. The defendant reported he was on his cell phone speaking with his wife at the time of the occurrence and she had told him to leave the area. He had then left the victim and as he did the victim began to follow him and eventually attacked him. Mr. Dunckley stated he then went to the parking lot of the complex and asked an unidentified male to assist him. He related he was able to get away from the victim and went to his van where he ended the phone conversation with his wife and call the Reno Police Department non emergency number to report the incident. In checking the defendant, officers observed a red mark on his neck area.

Officers then spoke with the victim who reported she was arguing with her boyfriend and had decided to go for a walk. As she was walking to her apartment she noticed she was being followed by a van driven by a male who wanted her to get in the van. She had declined his offer and continued walking. The next thing she recalled, was waking up with the male who was driving the van attempting to force his penis in her mouth. She advised the officers that she had bitten the males penis at least four times when he had his penis in her mouth. Due to the victims apparent intoxication, an officer administered a PBT which revealed a blood alcohol content of .226%. At this point, officers requested the defendant submit to swabs of his penis for DNA analysis and also requested he submit to a visual inspection of his penis for injuries. The defendant was compliant with the officers' request. No visible injuries were noted to the defendant's penis.

As a result of the report, an investigation ensued and on March 12, 2007, the detective assigned recalled a prior sexual assault investigation in 2005 where defendant Dunckley was listed a suspect. The detective noted similarities in the two cases in that both victims had been drinking excessively and Mr. Dunckley was extremely cooperative with officers. In both instances, the defendant had been on the phone with his wife at the time of the reported offenses.

On March 19, 2007, the detective met with the victim in this offense and she was questioned. The victim reported she had been drinking and had become involved in an argument with her boyfriend. She had left her boyfriend's location and was walking back to her apartment when she noticed she was being followed by a van. She recalled going up the stairs to her apartment. She then entered her apartment and when she turned around, Mr. Dunckley was standing in her apartment's open doorway. She related the defendant had then told her to perform oral sex and believing she had no recourse, she complied. The victim stated she had bitten the defendant's penis when he put it in her mouth. At this time the detective collected an oral swab from the victim for comparison purposes.

On March 21, 2007, the defendant was contacted at his residence. When questioned, the defendant related the same information he had provided to the original responding officers. The detective then asked the defendant how the victim's saliva had ended up on his penis. Mr. Dunckley then advised the detective that when the victim had awoken the second time, she had removed his penis from his pants and performed oral sex upon him. The defendant stated he knew this was wrong and stopped the victim. He reported the victim had become angry and attacked him. The detective then requested the defendant respond to the police department on March 22, 2007, for an additional interview. The defendant complied and when questioned on this occasion, he reported the sexual contact with the victim on March 10, 2007 was consensual. Mr. Dunckley related he had observed the victim staggering while walking in the parking lot of the apartment complex. He had offered her a ride and asked her if she was ill. The victim had told him she had an argument with her boyfriend and continued walking toward an apartment staircase. She then fell on the stairs and the defendant parked his van and assisted the victim to her apartment. When they reached her apartment door, the victim knocked it open and fell on the floor. The defendant saw that the victim was unconscious and woke her up. At this point, the victim put her arms around him and became affectionate. He then backed away from the victim and she again passed out. He woke her a second time and on this occasion the victim removed his penis from his pants and said she wanted to thank him. She then passed out again. When the victim awoke the third time, the defendant reported she looked "possessed." She then accused him of raping him and he left her apartment. The detective asked the defendant how the victim managed to get his penis out of his pants if she was too intoxicated to stand up and he responded that it was a "bad judgement call." The defendant was reminded of the similarities in this case with the prior report which listed him as a suspect where the victim reported being forced to perform oral sex upon him while she was intoxicated and he responded that it was just a "stupid judgement call." When the victim came onto him, he made a "split second mistake." Upon conclusion of the interview, the defendant was arrested and booked accordingly.

Count. I

During the course of investigating Count II, the detective interviewed several other females who had contact with the defendant in the past. During the course of the interviews, the detective was advised of the name of a female who had been sexually abused by the defendant when she was a child. Further investigation revealed this victim was presently incarcerated in the Nevada Department of Corrections.

On March 29, 2007, the detective traveled to this victim's place of incarceration and she was interviewed. Upon being questioned, this victim reported that when she was twelve years of age, she and another juvenile female had gone with defendant Dunckley and his wife to the Atlantis Casino for dinner. After the dinner, the victim had mentioned to the defendant that she had never been in an elevator which allowed the view of the Reno area. This victim reported she and the defendant had entered an elevator alone. As the elevator ascended, the defendant pushed her into a corner of the elevator and put his hand down her pants.

This victim related a second encounter with the defendant and stated it had occurred when Mr. Dunckley was driving her to her residence. She reported at the time she was twelve years of age and was living with her parents near Longley Lane. The victim stated that upon arrival in the parking lot of her parent's apartment complex, Mr. Dunckley had parked his vehicle and had begun kissing her. She stated the defendant had sexual intercourse with her in his vehicle. The detective asked the victim if the act was forced upon her and she stated it was not, however, she stated "but I was only twelve years old." The victim went on to relate the defendant had told her not to say anything about the incident and that he would "teach her stuff." After the assault, the victim stated she avoided any further contact with the defendant. After receiving this information, the detective attempted to locate the defendant at his residence but was unsuccessful. On March 30, 2007, the defendant responded to the Reno Police Department where he was taken into custody and booked accordingly.

X. CONCLUSION

The Division acknowledges the Instant Offense will constitute the defendant's first felony convictions. However, his conduct in the case before the Court displays a disturbing pattern of predatory behavior which has been ongoing for an extended period of time. In Count II, the defendant observed an opportunity to take advantage of the victim's intoxicated state and sexually abuse her in her own residence. When discovered, Mr. Dunckley attempted to fabricate a scenario which appeared to be believable to the responding officers. He was aware the victim's level of intoxication would cloud her memory and make it difficult for officers to obtain a coherent statement. When initally contacted by officers, he presented himself as a concerned citizen who was only attempting to assist an incapacitated female. During his assault, Mr. Dunckley attempted to establish an alibi by calling his wife while he is in the company of, and sexually abusing the incapacitated female. When questioned by authorities, the defendant provided several versions of events, however, he eventually acknowledged sexual contact with this victim. In Count I, the defendant created a scenario where he groomed a twelve-year-old female over a period of time, utilized his friendship with her parents, and then sexually abused her on two occasions. According to the psychosexual evaluation, the defendant presents as a moderate risk for reoffense. He is determined not to represent a high risk to reoffend based upon a currently accepted standard of assessment. It appears the defendant has invested an inordinate amount of time and planning and executing his aberrant behavior and considerable thought as to his responses if and when confronted by authorities. When his conduct before and during commission of the offenses was scrutinized by the investigating officer, his premeditation became apparent. Taking these factors into consideration, the Division cannot view the defendant as an appropriate candidate for a period of community supervision. Therefore, the following is submitted for the Court's consideration.

REASON FOR REFERRAL/PRESENTING INFORMATION:

Mr. Dunckley is a 31-year-old Caucasian male charged with Lewdness With a Child under the Age of Fourteen Years, a violation of NRS 201.230, and Attempted Sexual Assault, a violation of NRS 200.366; both felony charges. Mr. Dunckley entered a guilty plea in Washoe County District Court, Reno, Nevada to both charges on March 4th, 2008 and sentencing is scheduled for August 5th, 2008. In regard to the lewdness charge, the guilty plea memorandum states that "on or between August 14th, 1998 and August 13th, 2000, or thereabouts, Mr. Dunckley did willfully and unlawfully commit a lewd or lascivious act upon or with the body of (identified victim), a female child under the age of fourteen years at the time that the said act was committed, in that he engaged the victim in sexual intercourse in Reno, Washoe County, Nevada, and/or put his hand down her pants to fondle her genital area in an elevator at the Atlantis Hotel and Casino, Reno, Nevada with the intent of

arousing, appealing to, or gratifying the lust, passions, or sexual desires of himself or the child". Regarding the attempted sexual assault charge, the memorandum stipulates that "on March 10th, 2007, he attempted to subject (identified second victim) to sexual penetration against the victim's will, and /or under conditions in which he knew or should have known that the victim was mentally or physically incapable of resisting or understanding the nature of the conduct, to wit, fellatio in Reno, Nevada". The victim in the first offense is identified as an acquaintance, and records indicate she was 12 to 14 years old during the time frame identified in the guilty plea memorandum. The second victim was an adult female, identified as a stranger to Mr. Dunckley. He was arrested March 20th, 2007 for the attempted sexual assault charge. He was detained, posted bail the same day and was released. He was arrested again on March 30th, 2007 on the lewdness charge. He was detained for about twelve hours. At the time of both arrests, he was residing in Reno, working for a parking control company. Mr. Dunckley was married, living with his wife and two young sons. He continues to reside in Reno, with his family, and is employed in the construction industry. Two other females made allegations that Mr. Dunckley had sexually assaulted them. He is not charged from those allegations. He admitted to consensual sex with one of the individuals in 2005, and denied sexual behaviors with the other. The person whom he admitted consensual sex occurring with was an acquaintance, whom he identified as eighteen years old at the time. Mr. Dunckley has no history of prior convictions, or arrests, for sexual offense behaviors.

This is a preliminary risk assessment aimed at developing an estimation for sexual reoffense risk. Static and dynamic factors determined by research to be associated with adults were considered. The overall estimation for reoffense risk is based on these factors. Clinical judgement is incorporated in the process, resulting in a "clinically adjusted actuarial risk assessment." The overall goal of the evaluation is to provide information as to whether the offender represents a high risk to reoffend sexually based on currently accepted standards of assessment.

SOCIAL HISTORY:

Background Information

Mr. Dunckley is a 31-year-old Caucasian male who was born in Carmel, New York, to James and Linda Dunckley. His parents have been married over 33 years, and reside in three places; California, New York, and China. He has a twin brother who resides in China, and an older sister in New York. He had another sister who died in a car accident at age 17. Brendon lived with his family to age 17. His parents owned some nursing homes in New York. Neither parents is reported to have a criminal history, or history of substance abuse. He described stability in family life, and he was always in the care of his parents. He was raised primarily in the Hudson County area of New York. He did not account for a history of physical or sexual abuse, violence or exposure to significant risk factors during his youth. Mr. Dunckley felt his relationship with his parents was close, and the primary trauma was associated with the death of his sister, when he was 21. He described his sister's death as traumatic for the family, stating, "It destroyed the closeness, and separated us". His relationship with his parents became strained following the death of his sister. Mr. Dunckley stated his parents also opposed his decision to stop practicing the Jehovah Witness religion at age 20. He currently has minimal contact with his parents, claiming his religious changes, and problems with their not accepting his relationship with his first wife. His parents are aware of his current legal situation.

Mr. Dunckley completed high school in New York and attended the Culinary Institute of America to become a chef. He graduated from that program in 1999 in Hyde Park, New York. Mr. Dunckley married his first wife Jenny in 1997. They were both twenty years old. They have a ten year old son and nine year old daughter. They met while both were attending the culinary institute, and moved to the Fresno, California area for employment after they completed their training. They divorced in 2000, which he attributed to problems managing work and family life. They have shared custody of their children, though she has primary physical custody. Post divorce, he developed a relationship with a neighbors' sister, Morgan. The moved to Reno for employment in January 2000. He has lived in the Reno area since. Mr. Dunckley and Morgan married in 2001, and have two sons, ages seven and three. They plan to continue the marriage per Mr. Dunckley. His wife does not work outside the home.

Educational Background

Mr. Dunckley graduated high school in 1994 in New York. He described himself as an average student who was an "underachiever". He attained an associates degree from the Culinary Institute of America in 1999. He has no formal education beyond that.

Military History

Mr. Dunckley has not been in the military.

Employment History

Mr. Dunckley is currently employed by Northern Nevada Construction Company, in the disaster management unit. He has been there for five months. For two years previous, he worked in parking control, and from 2000 to 2005 he was employed as a chef at various local hotel/casinos. His current employer is aware of the charge against him.

Substance Abuse History

Mr. Dunckley did not account for significant use of alcohol or substances in his history.

Previous Mental Health Treatment

Mr. Dunckley was diagnosed in March 2008 with obsessive compulsive disorder, and ADHD. He is taking Welbutrin, and participating in outpatient therapy in Reno, with Stephen Ing, MFT, in response to the referral offense.

Legal History

Mr. Dunckley reported no arrest history as a juvenile. As an adult, he was charged in 2005 with petty larceny. He claimed the charge came about when his child, whom he was pushing in a stroller, had taken a DVD from a store shelf unbeknownst to Mr. Dunckley. He was cited, and fined. The referral charges are his only additional arrests as an adult.

Significant Medical History

Mr. Dunckley experienced multiple concussions while participating in hockey during his youth. He did not account for recurring problems associated with those injuries, and reports to be in good health overall.

Relationship History

Mr. Dunckley has been married twice. He married Jenny in 1997, and divorced in 2000. They have a ten year old son, and nine year old daughter, who live primarily with their mother in California. He married his second wife, Morgan, in 2001. They have two sons, ages seven and three. They live together in Reno.

Available Support/Primary Interests

Mr. Dunckley identified his immediate family, spouse, and mother in law as his primary support, along with his employer. His interests include cooking, tennis, roller balding, and spending time with family and a few close friends.

CLINICAL INTERVIEW/ACCOUNT OF REFERRAL OFFENSE/SEXUAL HISTORY

Mental Status

Brendon Dunckley is a 31-year-old Caucasian male who was interviewed in an outpatient setting. He arrived on time and participated in a positive manner. He is of moderate build and height. His memory appears to be intact with no evidence of impaired judgment or thinking. Mr. Dunckley was oriented to person, place, time and situation and affect was appropriate to content. He maintained good eye contact and intellectual functioning appears to be within the average range. He did not account for a history of substance abuse. Mr. Dunckley denied suicidal ideation or interest in absconding. He understood the charges against him.

The purpose and scope of the assessment was explained to Mr. Dunckley. Some of the risks and benefits associated with the evaluation were reviewed. He read and signed an informed consent to participate in the evaluation with results to be forwarded to the State of Nevada, Division of Parole and Probation.

Synopsis of Referral Offense

Mr. Dunckley admits to sexual behaviors with an under age female. The police reports indicated she was 12 to 14 years of age. He admits to two instances that involved fondling and intercourse, and claimed both instances were in 2000, when she was 14. The police reports indicate they took place between 1998 and 2000. Mr. Dunckley was 24 at the time, and claimed he was not aware of her age. He admitted to sexual behaviors with a 24 year old female, identified as a stranger to him, occurring in March 2007. He admits to engaging her in fellatio, while she was under the influence of substances.

Onset/Progression of Referral Offenses

Mr. Dunckley provided his account of both offenses. He claimed to have met the younger victim, in 2000, when she would have been about 14 years of age. Mr. Dunckley claimed she "accidentally" dialed his cell phone number, and his wife spoke with her. From the initial conversation, he claimed he and his wife developed a friendship with her, and her girlfriend. He claimed they also met their parents. He claimed this occurred about eight years ago, in 2008. Mr. Dunckley stated the other younger female called Mr. Dunckley's wife for a ride, as the younger female who was not the victim, and Mr. Dunckley's wife were both pregnant. He stated, "they had the cravings for fast food, so we took them". Mr. Dunckley stated he thought both of the younger females were about 17 years old, and he described a friendly relationship with them. The non-victim 14 year old also made allegations that Mr. Dunckley had fondled her when she was 12 or 13, which he denied, and was not charged.

He stated within a month of meeting them, "I was driving A.(victim in referral offense) home and she was very flirtations, so was I, in 2000. We ended up having sex in my car. Her and the other girl had spent the night at our house". He reported a second instance of sexual behaviors with her.

He stated they were in an elevator at a local hotel-casino alone and he put his hand down her pants. He denied force during both instances, and said she was probably 14 at the time, but he thought she was 17. In her statements to law enforcement, she did not account for force, threats or bribes. Mr. Dunckley stated, "I can't remember what I said to her" prior to the acts occurring. He said he learned she was 14 within a couple weeks of the second instance, from one of her friends. Mr. Dunckley said he admitted the behaviors to his wife within a couple months. He described her as "upset and hurt". He denied additional sexual behaviors occurring with the under age female, however, two of her friends made allegations, which Mr. Dunckley denied and is not charged. Mr. Dunckley said once he realized her age, he had no further contact with her. He was not clear how the allegations surfaced, and was not made aware until after his arrest in March 2007 in the second charge. He believed the offense against the under age youth was reported after one of her friends accused him of sexually assaulting her in August, 2005. He admitted to sexual behaviors with her, stating she was 19. He described intercourse occurring, and she alleged force. The case was closed as the investigator concluded there were inconsistencies in her statements, making the force aspect difficult to prove.

The second charge came about from an incident on March 10th, 2007 that involved a 24 year old female, identified as a stranger. Mr. Dunckley gave the following account of that incident: "On March 10th, 2007, while coming home (he was driving his car) I passed a person staggering on the side of the street who was drunk and falling all over the place. I turned my car to make sure she was okay and safe. My wife was on the phone with me and I followed the woman to an apartment complex, where she fell while going up the stairs to the second floor. It was then that I got out and helped her up. I asked her what her name was. I asked if she knew where she was. Had she done any drugs, and she said weed. I asked how much she had to drink, and she said a lot. I helped her to her to feet and asked which apartment was hers and she pointed and I helped her to the door. I asked if she had a key or it anyone was home. She said her boyfriend was and swatted the door handle and it popped. I then turned to leave. I heard a thud and turned around and saw the door was ajar from her feet. I ran to the door and yelled her name with no response. I entered the apartment and turned her over onto her back. She was not breathing. I saw she was aspirating so I swept her mouth to clear the airway and applied a sternum rub to revive her. She came to and started to cry and talk about slippers and how she lost them and her boyfriend was going to be mad. I told her it was ok, and they were right next to her. All the while the door was still open. She passed out again and I rubbed her again. This time she started to cry again on my shoulder and I put my hand on the shoulder and said it was going to be okay. She then started to be affectionate towards me and I let her. She undid my pants and slid her hand in and took out my penis and proceeded to perform oral sex on me saying is this okay. I said yes at first then realized this was wrong and stopped her and got redressed (just my zipper), and started to leave. She freaked out and stated to yell rape, rape. I got out and called the police to come. All this took place in about 2-5 minutes. Shortly after, the police arrived." He stated he gave the same account to the investigator. He denied use of force, but said he was aware she was under the influence. The police report identified her blood alcohol content at .23. Mr. Dunckley felt he used poor judgement in allowing the sexual behavior to occur. The police report indicated she made statements that she had bit his penis aggressively. His penis was examined by investigators, and no bruising was found.

Mr. Dunckley admitted during this evaluation to having intercourse, and fondling an under age female. He believed when the behaviors occurred she was 14 years of age, and he was 24. At the time, he thought she was about 17. He also admitted to having an adult female, who was intoxicated and/or under the influence beyond her ability to consent, engage in fellatio against him on one occasion. He admitted being accused of sexual assault in 2005 by a 19 year old female acquaintance. He admitted to having intercourse with her one time, and described the act as consensual. He is not charged for that instance.

Additional Sexual Offense History

Mr. Dunckley did not account for additional sexual offense behaviors, or sexual relations with under age youth beyond what has been reported.

Sexual History

Mr. Dunckley did not report having been sexually victimized. His first sexual experience was at age 19 with an adult female. He did not report sexual experiences with males. Since age 18, he estimated having over twenty different annual reports with males. estimated having over twenty different sexual partners. He did not report sexual relations with prostitutes. He has viewed some adult pornographic material on the Internet, which he described as occasional. He did not report a history of deviant sexual behaviors.

Cognitive Distortions/Motivational Factors to Referral Offense

From an acute perspective, Mr. Dunckley was in a situation that allowed opportunity to act on sexual arousal with an under age youth, and a person under the influence of substances. He acted impulsively, exhibiting problems with regulation of arousal, and may have approached the situations from an entitled perspective. Prevailing factors are linked to ongoing relationship challenges, divorce, blended family challenges, history of impulsivity, history of promiscuity. He viewed both victims in the referral offense as cooperating. He stated, "Had I known how old the first victim was I wouldn't have done it. The second one was me being stupid".

Perception of Victim Impact

Mr. Dunckley believed both victims were harmed, as he described having taken their sense of security away. Insight, however, was limited and somewhat superficial.

RESULTS OF INVENTORIES/TESTS

On the Burns Depression Checklist which screens for endorsement of symptoms generally associated with depression, Mr. Dunckley's overall responses point to the presence of some symptoms generally associated with depressed mood. The moderate symptoms were a sense of guilt, indecisiveness, poor self image, appetite changes, sleep changes, loss of libido. Symptoms occurring somewhat included sadness, discouragement, low self esteem, inferiority, and loss of

motivation. He denied suicidal impulse on this scale.

On the Sex Offense Self Report Inventory, he described the referral offenses as "sexual intercourse with a minor in 2000 in my car. She was 14. Attempted sexual assault, I allowed a drunk woman to perform oral sex and I knew better". He denied additional sexual offense behaviors, and indicated he was 100% responsible for the offenses, writing "I was the adult and the sober one. They did not deserve any of it, nor did they ask to be treated so". He wrote the primary reason for the offenses was "Very poor judgement and impulsivity".

Abel Assessment for Sexual Interest Questionnaire Mr. Dunckley completed the Abel Assessment for Sexual Interest Questionnaire which summarizes a self reported history of sexual behaviors and experiences, and sexual health concerns. There are also scales that screen for sexual fantasies/arousal, cognitive distortions, social desirability, a danger registry and self reported history of accusations, arrests and convictions for sexual offense behaviors. Mr. Dunckley did not complete the objectively measured sexual interest category, in that he has no substantiated history of sexual behaviors involving prepubescent children (there is some question about the age of the first victim, as she may have been as young as 12). In regard to self reported history of deviant sexual behaviors, Mr. Dunckley reported a history of sexual affairs, on ten occasions, from age 21 to 30. This is described as sexual relations with someone outside his primary relationship. He identified his partners as adult females, and claimed no recurring fantasies of such behaviors. He did not report additional deviant sexual behaviors, including use of pornography or having sexually molested a child. There were no additional sexual health concerns identified, and he did not indicate having been the victim of sexual abuse. On the sexual behaviors and fantasies scales, he reported no arousal to any of the behaviors listed, though his responses were neutral to the following: exposing himself in a public place; masturbating in public without being seen; fetishes; frottage; voyeurism; writing obscene notes; sexual affairs; sex with adults who are strangers; phone sex; use of pornography and Internet sexual materials. He reported sometimes having fantasies about having sexual affairs, and sex with strangers. He denied sexual arousal to, or sexual fantasy about touching a child. On the Cognitive Distortion Scale which screens for attitudes tolerant of sexual behaviors with children, Mr. Dunckley scored in the 8% range which is well below the range to be considered problematic, and does not indicate attitudes tolerant of adults engaging in sexual behaviors with children. On the Social Desirability Scale, which measures a persons unwillingness to admit to any violation of common social mores, such as impatience, or feelings of anger, he scored in the 50% range which is a problematic score, but not a high score. There is some indication of problems with attempts at responding truthfully to others regarding topics unrelated to sexual deviance. The Danger Registry did not yield any concerns, as he did not self report attraction to, fantasies about, or sexual interest in children since he turned 18 years of age. To the question about sexually molesting a child, Mr. Dunckley indicated he has been accused, has sexually touched a child, but the child was a willing participant. He reported two investigations or arrests and no convictions for a sexual crime.

CLINICAL IMPRESSIONS/ESTIMATION OF REOFFENSE RISK/RECOMMENDATIONS

Clinical Impressions

Mr. Dunckley is a 31-year-old Caucasian male charged with Lewdness With a Child under the Age of Fourteen Years, a violation of NRS 201.230, and Attempted Sexual Assault, a violation of NRS 200.366. Mr. Dunckley entered a guilty plea in Washoe County District Court, Reno, Nevada to both charges on March 4th, 2008 and sentencing is scheduled for August 5th, 2008. The guilty plea memorandum states that on or between August 14th, 1998 and August 13th, 2000, or thereabout, Mr. Dunckley did willfully and unlawfully commit a lewd or lascivious act upon or with the body of (identified victim), a female child under the age of fourteen years at the time that the said act was committed, in that he engaged the victim in sexual intercourse in Reno, Washoe County, Nevada, and/or put his hand down her pants to fondle her genital area in an elevator at the Atlantis Hotel and Casino, Reno, Nevada with the intent of arousing, appealing to, or gratifying the lust, passions, or sexual desires of himself or the child. The plea further stipulates that on March 10th, 2007, he attempted to subject (identified second victim) to sexual penetration against the victim's will, and /or under conditions in which he knew or should have known that the victim was mentally or physically incapable of resisting or understanding the nature of the conduct, to wit, fellatio, in Reno, Nevada. The victim in the first offense is identified as an acquaintance, and records indicate she was 12 to 14 years old during the time frame identified in the guilty plea memorandum. The second victim was an adult female, identified as a stranger to Mr. Dunckley. He was arrested March 20th, 2007 for the attempted sexual assault charge. He was detained, posted bail the same day and was released. He was arrested again on March 30th, 2007 on the lewdness charge. He was detained for about twelve hours. Two other females made allegations that Mr. Dunckley had sexually assaulted them. He is not charged from those allegations. He admitted to consensual sex with one of the individuals in 2005, and denied sexual behaviors with the other. The person whom he admitted consensual sex occurring with was an acquaintance, whom he identified as eighteen years old at the time. Mr. Dunckley has no history of prior convictions, or arrests, for sexual offense behaviors.

Mr. Dunckley admitted during the evaluation to having intercourse against, and fondling an under age female. He believed when the behaviors occurred she was 14 years of age, and he was 24. He also admitted to having an adult female, who was intoxicated and/or under the influence beyond her ability to consent, engage in fellatio against him on one occasion. He admitted being accused of sexual assault in 2005 by a 19 year old female acquaintance. He admitted to having intercourse with her one time, and described the act as consensual. He is not charged for that instance.

In considering both acute and prevailing or stable dynamic factors, from an acute perspective, Mr. Dunckley was in a situation that allowed opportunity to act on sexual arousal with an under age youth, and a second person several years later, who was under the influence of substances. He has demonstrated problems with regulation of emotions and impulsivity in general, and more specifically, sexual arousal. His sexual history points to a promiscuous lifestyle, that may have reinforced a sense of entitlement in regard to sexual behaviors. Feeling or thinking from an entitled perspective when it comes to sexual behaviors makes it easier to dismiss cues from others, thereby diminishing empathy. Prevailing factors are linked to ongoing relationship challenges, divorce,

blended family challenges, history of impulsivity, and a promiscuous lifestyle. He viewed both victims in the referral offense as cooperating. He stated, "Had I known how old the first victim was I wouldn't have done it. The second one was me being stupid". The younger victim from the offense several years ago was an acquaintance, whom Mr. Dunckley and his wife had developed a relationship, along with some of her friends. The second victim was a stranger. The second instance which occurred in March, 2007, was against a woman who was under the influence, with a blood alcohol level over .20. Mr. Dunckley was aware of her state, and acted opportunistically, using the situation to his advantage under the guise of being helpful.

Opportunity to Reoffend Sexually

Mr. Dunckley engaged in sexual behaviors with an under age youth, several years ago. She was an acquaintance. He self reported two instances, one led to intercourse, and a second incident involved fondling her in a public place (elevator). He has no substantiated history of sexual behaviors with other under age youth, though there have been allegations. Opportunity for recurrence is evident, based on his being in the community, which creates access to other under age youth. The second instance involved a stranger, and creates high risk for reoffense opportunity, as there is evidence that his modus operandi is not limited to acting out sexually against only individuals he is familiar with.

AXIS I: V61.21 Sexual abuse of a child, perpetrator; 302.9 paraphilia nos

AXIS II: Deferred AXIS III: none

AXIS IV: Current legal charge, relationship challenges

Reoffense Risk

The risk assessment process is a preliminary estimation for reoffense risk that is strengthened when factors related to sexual reoffense risk for adults are considered. The strongest evidence of factors characteristic of sexual reoffense risk come from follow-up studies that compare the recidivism rate of offenders with certain characteristics. No single risk factor is sufficiently related to recidivism that it can be used on its own, therefore evaluators need to consider a range of risk factors. The strongest predictors of sexual reoffense recidivism are variables related to sexual deviance, such as deviant sexual preferences as determined by physiological/objective measures, prior sexual offenses, early on sexual offending history and the diversity of sexual crimes (Hanson, 1997). The single strongest predictor has been determined in various studies to be sexual interest in children based on objective measures, and expressed intent to commit a sexual crime. Measures of criminal lifestyle are also significantly related to sexual recidivism. Response to treatment is another factor when considering risk assessment. The most well established risk factors are static, such as prior sexual offenses and dynamic risk factors (acute and stable). The acute factors are those which are immediately associated with the offense, such as being intoxicated and experiencing arousal in the presence of a child. Stable dynamic factors are those which occur over a longer period of time, such

as mood disorder, deviant sexual interest, and alcoholism.

In considering these factors, Mr. Dunckley self reports arousal to adult females, though he victimized an under age female. There is no legal or self reported information of continued sexual interest in under age females. He has admitted to multiple sexual relations outside his primary relationships, often with people he does not know well. He has a sexual history of promiscuity and impulsivity, which may often leave him in very risk, dangerous, if not illegal sexual situations. He did not report sexual arousal to, or fantasy about sexually touching a child since he turned 18 years of age. The primary concern is two sexual offense related charges, against two victims, in which the behaviors were spread out over a seven year time frame. The second offense involved a stranger, which presents greater risk to the community from a safety and prevention management perspective, though there is no evidence of overt force; the act occurred while she was intoxicated.

On the RRASOR, which provides a reasonable baseline for sexual reoffense risk, but does not include a complete evaluation of the risk factors for recidivism, he was in the low range. His raw score was one, and studies of individuals at five and ten-year follow-up that scored in this range showed recidivism rates of about 7% at five years and 11% at ten years. The lone factor that registered a point was: the victim was not related to him.

The Static 99 is an enhanced version of the RRASOR which incorporates a few more factors: prior sentencing dates; convictions for non-contact sex offenses; index non-sexual violence; prior non-sexual violence; relationship status. The added factors elevated risk slightly, to the moderate-low range based on: unrelated victim; stranger victim.

In considering the risk scales along with clinical judgement, Mr. Dunckley is estimated in the moderate range for sexual reoffense risk. Clinical judgement elevated risk due to reoffense behaviors occurring over an elapsed period of time, and involved an offense against a stranger. Furthermore, his promiscuous and impulsive sexual lifestyle places him at greater risk for further allegations/charges. There is evidence of being indiscriminate in regard to victim selection, meaning his modus operandi is not limited to a particular victim type, age, or preference.

It is the opinion of this evaluator that Mr. Dunckley <u>DOES NOT REPRESENT A HIGH RISK</u> TO REOFFEND SEXUALLY based on current standards for assessment (NRS 176a.110)

Risk Population

Based on historical information, responses to inventories, self reported arousal and objective measures of sexual interest, the identifiable risk population is varied, and can include adult females who are strangers, and under age youth whom he has access to, or has developed a relationship with. Much younger children do not present as immediate risk, in that there is no evidence of sexual interest in younger children.

Amenability to Treatment/Prognosis

Mr. Dunckley presents as a positive candidate for treatment, based on his willingness to openly discuss and explore the factors related to the referral offense; primarily his disclosure of his sexual offense history. He does not present as antisocial or defiant though there may be some resistance to treatment upon realization of a longer term process. Although there may be some minimization and presence of cognitive distortions that support and maintain the behaviors, these issues can be addressed in the treatment process with Mr. Dunckley. Mr. Dunckley recognizes the need for intervention, and reported having initiated treatment to date.

Recommendations

In the event that Mr. Dunckley is not incarcerated, placing him under the supervision of the probation department would ensure compliance and cooperation with recommendations. If he is released to the community, the following recommendations are respectfully submitted:

- 1. Mr. Dunckley should be directed to participate in sexual offense specific treatment. Ideally a treatment program that provides individual, group and family-based intervention would be suitable for this situation. Generally speaking, sexual offense specific treatment will focus on: dynamic factors related to the offense behaviors; denial; consequences for the offender; identification of motivating factors; identification/confrontation of the sexual offense cycle and strategies for interrupting the pattern; recognition of cognitive distortions associated with sexual offense behaviors; victim impact; relapse prevention; social and communication skill building; healthy relationship development; strategies for managing emotions/physiological states including sexual arousal; and, victim restitution. Treatment progress reports will reflect such components as having been addressed, while providing measurements for progression through treatment, or lack thereof.
- 2. Mr. Dunckley should not have access to younger pre-teen or early teenage females, especially if alone or unsupervised. There is no evidence that his children are at risk, however, the family needs to be informed of risk factors, and actively participate in the treatment process (contingent upon consent). A period of electronic monitoring, combined with limited driving opportunities may help reduce reoffense opportunities, as he participates in treatment.
- 3. Mr. Dunckley should be directed to complete a comprehensive substance abuse evaluation, and adhere to recommendations.
- 4.It is recommended that treatment and progress reports are made available on a regular basis to the probation department. Treatment may also include continued sexual interest screening and maintenance/disclosure polygraph assessments. Random searches of his residence by the supervising probation department further enhances environmental controls and compliance with treatment and probation terms. Failure to comply with such terms should be considered an immediate risk factor, and responded to expeditiously by the court.

Level of risk does not reflect the harm or trauma associated with the sexual offenses for the victims. Failure to comply with external controls may elevate risk. Studies have shown that those who are noncompliant with terms of probation or treatment contracts demonstrate higher recidivism rates. This is a preliminary estimation for sexual reoffense risk and risk may change based on identification of new factors and lack of adjustment to the stable dynamic factors associated with the offense. This evaluation is time limited.

On August 20, 2005, at approximately 2323 hours, Officer BELLINGER and I (CLARK) responded to Washoe Medical Center ER on report of a sexual assault that occurred between 2100-2200 hours. Upon arrival Officer BELLINGER and I contacted ER nurse HUGHES, Cyndi who said that the victim was an eighteen year old female who would be located in ER room #28. HUGHES told us she is complaining of throat and vaginal pain. HUGHES examined the victim's throat and she reported no injuries visible. Officer BELLINGER and I then contacted victim SEXTON, Lura and her mother MCGREW, Teresa (SEXTON, Lura initially reported the last name of MCGREW to officers).

Victim SEXTON, Lura reported the following to me at Washoe Medical Center:

At approximately 2100 hours SEXTON and her roommate JAMES, Kelly, were at the Bluffs Apartment complex, 4050 Gardella Ave Reno, NV, to visit co-workers MABUS, Amber and SCOGGIN, Tela, who live at the above address in apartment #1411. SEXTON and JAMES were walking through the parking lot and SEXTON saw an old friend only identified as Brendan. SEXTON used to be friends with Brendan 4 years ago and has only seen him once in the last four years. (SEXTON saw Brendan on Friday August 19, 2005, at approximately 2100 hours at the 7-11 convenient store located on Parr Blvd. SEXTON spoke with Brendan and gave him her phone number. Brendan told Sexton he would call her later.)

Brendan spoke with SEXTON in the parking lot and asked SEXTON to go for a drive and talk with him, as he had just gotten off of work. SEXTON agreed but told Brendan she could only be gone for ten minutes as she was at the Bluffs to visit friends. SEXTON got into Brendan's small older blue two door car and they drove through the complex. While driving Brendan asked her how she was doing, what she has been doing lately, and where she was currently working. Brendan drove the car off the pavement onto a dirt road into the hills from the Bluffs Apartment complex.

Brendan stopped the car an unknown distance from the two signs notifying vehicles that the pavement is ending. As soon as SEXTON told Brendan she was working at Hippity Hop Learning Center, Brendan grabbed her throat with his right hand (squeezed her neck) and her hair with his left hand. SEXTON started pushing Brendan away and slapping him on the arms and face.

Brendan then got out of the vehicle, opened the passenger side door, grabbed SEXTON's hair on the back of her head and started to pull her out of the vehicle. SEXTON said she was grabbing onto the side of the car trying not to be pulled out. As Brendan pulled SEXTON out of the passenger side of his vehicle, she lost her balance and fell onto the ground. SEXTON got up on her feet and Brendan grabbed her hair again telling her to take off her pants. SEXTON told Brendan "no, I am not going to take off my pants." Brendan pushed her towards the hood on the front end of the vehicle, on the passenger side and unbuckled her belt, unbuttoned and unzipped her pants. SEXTON was slapping and pushing Brendan as he was unbuckling and unbuttoning her pants. SEXTON repeatedly told Brendan to stop and leave her alone. SEXTON said she was extremely scared and kept saying "no" and "stop". Brendan then pulled her pants and underwear to her knees. Brendan bent SEXTON over the front hood on the passenger side of his vehicle. Brendan then grabbed SEXTON by the hair on the back of the

head and pushed her head on the hood of the vehicle. Brendan inserted his penis into her vagina and proceed to have intercourse from behind SEXTON. Brendan was not using a condom and ejaculated inside of SEXTON's vagina. After Brendan pulled his penis out of SEXTON, she pulled up her underwear and pants. Brendan then opened the passenger side door and told SEXTON to get in.

Brendan drove SEXTON to the area where he met her and as she was getting out of the vehicle said "I will give you a call later, whore", and drove off.

SEXTON then entered apartment # 1411, and saw MABUS, who asked what was wrong. SEXTON did not answer her and poured a shot of Vodka and ingested it. SEXTON then went out onto the balcony to smoke a cigarette with MABUS. SEXTON then told MABUS what had happened. SEXTON tried calling her parents but they did not answer the phone. SEXTON then tried calling her brother-in-law COLE, Richard, who answered the phone. COLE took SEXTON and MABUS to Washoe Medical Center and contacted SEXTON's parents.

SEXTON stated that she does not know Brendan's last name or where he works. SEXTON described Brendan's a white male in his late twenties; 5' 9" or 5'10", medium build, brown hair to his ears (average man's hair cut), wearing black pants, and a white or gray short sleeve t-shirt. SEXTON did not observe any scars or tattoos on Brendan. SEXTON knew Brendan from four years ago, as an acquaintance of her former friend, ANTHONY, Michelle (775-825-0281), with whom she no longer associates.

SEXTON was still wearing the clothing that she had on during the assault. SEXTON did not shower, bathe, or clean herself. However, SEXTON does not recall if she went to the bathroom. SEXTON agreed to submit to a SART exam. Sgt. RULLA, who had responded to Washoe Medical Center and was advised of this case, made the appropriate notification. Officer BELLINGER and I transported SEXTON and her mother MCGREW to the Northern Nevada Medical Center at approximately 0033 hours.

While at Northern Nevada Medical Center, I continued my interview with SEXTON, and she additionally reported the following:

SEXTON has been sexually active in the past and it has been approximately a year since she last had sexual intercourse. SEXTON was sexually assaulted when she was thirteen years old. SEXTON knew that Brendan ejaculated inside of her because she felt a wet sticky substance that she identified as semen run down her leg and on the inside of her underwear. While Brendan was having intercourse with SEXTON he was talking to her calling her a "bitch" and "whore." Brendan commented a couple of times saying "you are my little girl, you like this don't you, whore." SEXTON fought Brendan by pushing and slapping his arms and face. SEXTON and Brendan did not have any mouth to mouth, or mouth to genital contact. Brendan did not insert any of his digits into SEXTON's vagina or anus. Brendan did not touch SEXTON's breasts. SEXTON reported the assault lasted less than a couple of minutes but "seemed like forever."

On August 21, 2005, at approximately 0100 hours victim advocates SCHWEBER, Erin and HSU, Mindy arrived at Northern Nevada Medical Center. SCHWEBER and HSU met with me and notified me that SART nurse ENGEL, Denise would be arriving shortly for the exam. SCHWEBER and HSU contacted SEXTON's parents and then took SEXTON to the SART exam room. I asked SCHWEBER to notify ENGEL that the clothes needed to be collected for evidence.

On August 21, 2005 at approximately 0114, Officer HEGLAR attempted to locate the crime scene and was unable to identify an exact location. Officer HEGLAR responded to the Bluffs Apartment complex, 4050 Gardella Ave # 1411 Reno, NV, to obtain written statements from MABUS and SCOGGIN.

MABUS' written statement reported the following:

MABUS, SCOGGIN, JAMES, and SEXTON were hanging out at apartment # 1411. JAMES and SEXTON decided to leave for a few minutes at approximately 2100 hours. SEXTON returned to apartment # 1411 an hour later (approximately 2200 hours) alone and it appeared to MABUS that SEXTON had been crying. SEXTON told MABUS that she was in shock and couldn't talk about what happened. A few minutes later SEXTON calmed down and told MABUS that she saw her friend Brendan. Brendan picked SEXTON up at the above location and asked her to go somewhere, SEXTON agreed to go. Brendan took SEXTON to the hills by MABUS apartment. SEXTON told MABUS that Brendan had choked her and demanded that SEXTON take her pants off. SEXTON

said that she took off her pants because Brandon was choking her. Brendan then bent SEXTON over and raped her. SEXTON told MABUS that she told Brandon not to touch her. MABUS hugged SEXTON and asked her what she wanted to do. SEXTON told MABUS to call the police and she wanted to go to the hospital. SEXTON's brother-in-law came to pick up SEXTON and MABUS, to drive them to the hospital.

SCOGGIN's written statement reported the following:

SEXTON and some friends went to Taco Bell and when they came back to the apartment Brendan was in the parking lot. SEXTON got into the Brendan's car and SCOGGIN asked SEXTON where she was going. SEXTON told SCOGGIN that she was going to put a boot on a car. Approximately an hour later SEXTON returned to apartment #1411 crying. SCOGGIN asked SEXTON what happened. SEXTON said that Brendan had choked and raped her. SEXTON told SCOGGIN that she repeatedly told Brendan no, but he did not listen. SCOGGIN then told SEXTON she was going to go to the hospital. Brendan came back at approximately 0100 hours to take a car boot off of another friend's (not identified) car. SCOGGIN asked Brendan what he did to SEXTON and Brendan stated "Nothing." SCOGGIN said Brendan was driving a four door blue Ford passenger car.

On August 21, 2005, at approximately 0148 hours Officer BELLINGER and I responded to 800 Redfield Park Way #104, to follow up with ANTHONY, Michelle, to attempt to identify Brendan. Officer BELLINGER and I questioned ANTHONY who said she did not have any friends named Brendan. As Officer BELLINGER and I were leaving in the patrol car ANTHONY approached and said her father reminded her that she used to hang out with a DUNCKLEY, Brendan. ANTHONY said that she had not spoken with DUNCKLEY for about a year and half. DUNCKLEY would be about 29 years of age and was a chef at the Eldorado at the time. ANTHONY said that DUNCKLEY used to live in an apartment off of Plumas street.

Officer BELLINGER ran a NAMS check on DUNCKLEY, Brendan which came back with an address on 4412 Baker Lane # D Reno, Nevada. The DMV check showed that DUNCKLEY was the registered owner of a four door Ford Taurus with Nevada plates of 199 SDR. Officer BELLINGER and (drove by the above address to attempt to locate the vehicle. The above vehicle was not at the above address at that time.

At approximately 0227, Officer BELLINGER and I responded to Rosewood Park Apartments #364, 4500 Mira Loma Drive, Reno, NV to follow up with JAMES who witnessed SEXTON leave with Brendan.

JAMES, Kelly reported the following:

SEXTON told JAMES that Brendan was a security guard at the Bluffs. SEXTON saw Brendan the night before and he told her he was doing security, and that he and SEXTON needed to finish what they started a long time ago. SEXTON and JAMES were walking in the parking lot of 4050 Gardella Ave Reno, NV to visit MABUS and SCOGGIN. SEXTON and JAMES saw Brendan who was an old friend of SEXTON. Brendan walked up said "what's up," gave SEXTON a hug, asked for a kiss, and SEXTON gave him one. Brendan asked SEXTON to come with him to put a boot on a car. SEXTON told JAMES she would be back shortly. JAMES left the complex to go home about five minutes later. Brendan was wearing a dark blue or black shirt with security printed on it. Brendan is about 30 years old and was wearing black pants. Brendan was driving a light blue car early 90s.

At approximately 0319 hours Officer BELLINGER and I responded back to 4412 Baker Lane # D Reno, Nevada, to see if the vehicle registered to DUNCKLEY had returned. Upon arrival we saw the four door light blue Ford Taurus with Nevada plates 199 SDR parked in the parking lot. Officer ALLEN arrived at the above address to watch the vehicle as Officer BELLINGER and I drove JAMES by the car to identify it as belonging to Brendan. JAMES stated that is not Brendan's car.

At approximately 0417 hours Officers BELLINGER, ALLEN and I contacted DUNCKLEY at 4412 Baker Lane # D Reno, Nevada. DUNCKLEY stated that he was working at the Bluffs Apartment complex putting boots on cars. DUNCKLEY said that he was at the complex at different times throughout the day and night of August 20-21, 2005 between the hours of 0800 until 0200 hours.

DUNCKLEY initially reported the following:

DUNCKLEY knows SEXTON and saw her that evening, but he just spoke with her. SEXTON got into his car to go put a boot on a car. DUNCKLEY and SEXTON went to another part of the apartment complex talking for

approximately 15-20 minutes and he dropped her off at approximately 1900 hours. DUNCKLEY went back to the Bluffs apartment complex to remove a boot from a car approximately 0100 hours. DUNCKLEY was approached by some people and was asked what did you do to SEXTON? DUNCKLEY said "Who?" "Nothing," and then left the area.

DUNCKLEY asked us if we could continue the conversation somewhere else because his wife was in the apartment. We then relocated to the parking lot, behind DUNCKLEY's car.

DUNCKLEY reported the following at his car:

While in the car SEXTON was flirting with DUNCKLEY making sexual advances toward him. DUNCKLEY parked his vehicle on a dirt road above the Bluffs apartment complex. DUNCKLEY refused her advances at first. DUNCKLEY and SEXTON started kissing mouth to mouth. SEXTON unbuckled her belt, unbuttoned her pants, and put DUNCKLEY's hand in her underwear. SEXTON then began touching DUNCKLEY on his groin. For an unknown amount of time SEXTON and DUNCKLEY kissed and touched each other.

SEXTON then asked DUNCKLEY to get out of the vehicle and come with her. SEXTON and DUNCKLEY exited the vehicle. SEXTON removed her pants and underwear. DUNCKLEY and SEXTON then engaged into consensual sexual intercourse (penis to vagina). SEXTON said "she enjoyed the outdoors at night and it felt like she was being raped." When DUNCKLEY and SEXTON finished having sexual intercourse, she said "she felt like she was torn in half having been a year and half since the last time." SEXTON told DUNCKLEY "Now I can say I did it on a hill." DUNCKLEY took her back to her friend's apartment and she gave him a kiss on the cheek before exiting the vehicle.

DUNCKLEY said he received an unknown number of calls throughout the night (from 775-230-0757) from an unknown person, threatening him with physical violence and accusing him of assaulting SEXTON.

I offered DUNCKLEY the chance to speak with a detective to tell his side of the story. DUNCKLEY was advised he was not in custody. DUNCKLEY agreed to speak with Detectives. DUNCKLEY also signed the attached permission to search waiver for his vehicle.

Sgt. RULLA was advised of the developments of the case and notified on-call sex crimes detective, SALTER. Officer BELLINGER advised Detective SALTER, Sgt. BRADSHAW, and Detective ARMITAGE of the case telephonically. At approximately 0624 hours Detective BROOME arrived at 4412 Baker Lane # D Reno, Nevada, and was briefed by Officer BELLINGER. DUNCKLEY agreed to go with Detective BROOME to his office for a voluntary interview. Detective ARMITAGE attempted unsuccessfully to locate SEXTON for a second interview. See Detectives' reports for additional details.

Officer BELLINGER and I stood by with the vehicle until FIS arrived. At approximately 0653 hours, WCSO FIS Crime lab technician SANDERS, Tracy arrived to process it and collect evidence. See SANDERS' report for further.

I booked the recorded tape of the conversation I had with DUNCKLEY in Reno Police Department evidence.-NFD-

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On August 21, 2005, Detective Salter and I were assigned as the on call Sex Crimes Detectives. At approximately 0530 hours, Detective Salter advised me that Patrol officers were investigating a possible Sexual Assault that had occurred the night before. Detective Salter requested that I respond to the 4400 block of Baker lane and meet with Patrol Officers Bellinger and Clark. Detective Salter was called to investigate another crime.

When I arrived at the Baker address I did meet with officer Bellinger who advised me of the following: On August 21, 2005 at approximately 2323 hours officers Bellinger and Clark had been dispatched to Washoe Medical Center regarding a possible Sexual Assault. When the officers arrived the met with Lura Sexton, an 18 year old adult female. Lura reported that she met a male the night before, who she had known previously, at the Bluffs apartments. The male was working parking enforcement in the complex. She told the officers that the suspect, now identified as Brendan Dunckley asked her if she wanted to take a ride. The victim apparently did get into the suspects vehicle. She said that the suspect drove to a dirt area at the end of Gardella near the Bluffs apartments. She stated that the suspect exited the vehicle walked around to the passenger side of his vehicle and grabbed

her by the hair and pulled her from the car. She said the suspect forcibly removed her pants, turned her around and forced penile/vaginal intercourse to ejaculation. The victim reported that the suspect continued to pull her hair and at one point choked her during the assault. After the assault the suspect drove the victim back to the complex, where the victim was attending a party and dropped her off. The victim later reported the assault to friends, who in turn transported her to Washoe Medical Center.

Officers Clark and Bellinger transported Laura to the Northern Nevada Medical Center for a SART examination. The victim did not know the suspects last name, however follow up investigation done by officers Clark and Bellinger led them to 4412 Baker Lane #D, where they contacted suspect Dunckley.

The suspect was apparently cooperative and did admit to having sex with the victim, however insisted that not only was the sex consensual, but Lura was the aggressor. The suspect provided permission to search his vehicle and agreed to meet with detectives for an interview. The suspect lives at the Baker address with his wife and children. His wife is now aware of the accusations.

I introduced myself to suspect Dunckley and asked if he did agree to meet for an interview. He said that he did and wanted to cooperate. I asked the suspect if he would ride with me to the Sex Crimes Office, as his vehicle was an issue at this point. He agreed. Officers Bellinger and Clark remained with the vehicle until F.I.S. arrived for processing.

SUSPECT INTERVIEW: Dunckley, Brendan 8-21-05 0800

I did transport suspect Dunckley to the Sex Crimes Office for an interview, which was recorded on both video and audio tape. I began the interview by reminding Dunckley that he was not under arrest and was free to leave at any time.

I asked Dunckley how he knew the victim. The suspect stated that he has known Laura since she was about 13 years old. He said that they were just acquaintances. He said that he has run into her a couple of times over the years. I asked if he and the victim ever had any sort of relationship before. He said that they had not that he was sort of a big brother to her.

Dunckley stated that he was at the 7-11 on Parr Blvd on Friday August 19,05 getting gas when the victim and a friend drove into the parking lot. She said that the victim hugged him and said that she loved him. Dunckley said that he happened to be talking to his wife at the time, who asked who he was talking to. Dunckley said that his wife knew Laura also, so he put his wife on the phone with her. The suspect said that Laura and her friend drove away a short time later. He said that Laura was blowing kisses at him as they drove away.

The suspect said that the following night he was working at the Bluffs apartments, doing parking enforcement, booting illegally parked cars and writing warning notices when he again ran into Laura. The suspect said that he asked how she was. Dunckley said that Laura told him that she needed to talk to him. The suspect said that he drove to the dirt area just South of the complex with the victim. Dunckley said that as they were driving off, Lura's friends were teasing them about going to have sex. He said that Laura was making sexual comments to him. I asked about those comments. He said that Laura told him that she always had a crush on him and that she was 18 now and was legal. He said that they began to kiss and touch each other. He said that the victim pulled down her pants and he began rubbing her vaginal area, while she rubbed his penis. He said that the Laura preformed fellatio on him. The suspect said that they agreed to have intercourse, but the victim did not want to have sex in the car. He said that Laura told him that she wanted to have sex outside and that she had a rape fantasy. Suspect Dunckley said that he told Laura that he did not have a condom. He said that Laura told him that he did not need one, as she could not get pregnant. The suspect said that they walked down the dirt road a short distance from his vehicle. He said that he brought a towel with him. The suspect said that he stopped at one point and laid the towel down. He said that the victim told him "not here" and continued to walk down the road. The suspect later said that the victim told him that they were still too close to the apartments. He said that they stopped in the road a little further down the road. He said that he again laid down the towel, but the victim told him that she did not want to lay on the ground because of the rocks and bugs and wanted him to play out, the rape fantasy with her. He said that Laura told him that she wanted him to grab her by the throat and have sex with her from the rear.

Suspect Dunckley said that he and Laura removed their pants and had sex standing up in the road. He said it was dark and thought it was about 2130 hours. I asked if he did grab the victim by the throat. Dunckley said that he did put his hand on her throat initially but did not squeeze or hurt her in any way. I asked if there was any hair pulling. He said there was not. The suspect said that after he ejaculated, the victim made the comment to him that she had not had sex in about a year and a half and felt like he "broke her in two". He said that Laura told him that she was glad that he was the one who "took her cherry again" after all that time. Dunckley said that he was concerned with the comment that she felt like she was "broke in two" and asked Laura was going to say that he hurt her. He said that she told him no. The suspect said that he drove Laura back to the complex where the party was, which we now know was apartment 1411 and dropped her off. The suspect said that Laura told him that they could meet later and continue what they started at her house. He said that she told him that she lived on Mira Loma.

The suspect said that he went back to work doing his parking enforcement. He said that later that night he put a boot on a black Jeep that was parked in the handicap zone in front of apartment 1411. He said that later that night he got a call from a female who wanted the boot removed. Dunckley said that the fee for removing the boot is \$80.00. When he arrived back at the apartment, Dunckley said that the female that he had seen Laura with the day before asked him what he did to T.L., which is what Lura's friends apparently call her. The female told Dunckley that Laura was at the hospital, that when she came back and started drinking again, disclosed that he had raped her. Dunckley said that he asked the girl for Lura's cell phone number, so he could call her. The suspect said that the female gave him Lura's cell phone number (379-0712). Dunckley said that he called the number but it went to voice mail. Dunckley said that he removed the boot from the Jeep, without charge as he did not want any more problems.

Dunckley said that later that night he received several calls from a male, calling from (230-0757) threatening him for sexually assaulting Laura and that he was going to get a boot in the head. Dunckley said that he feels that the females were using the threat of a rape charge to get out of paying for the booting.

Suspect Dunckley said that he has heard that Laura has accused her step father, her mothers boyfriend and her sisters boyfriends of Sexual Assault in the past. He said that Laura is an alcoholic at 18 years old and has been treated for mental issues in the past.

I requested that suspect Dunckley provide me with a saliva swab for DNA comparison. He agreed after signing a consent form. I also requested that the suspect show me where he and Laura had sex. He also agreed to this. I ended the interview in the Sex Crimes Office a short time later.

I drove the suspect to the area of the Bluffs apartments. The suspect directed me to the end of Gardella street where the road turns to dirt. There were several cars parked in this dirt area, which is near the South end of the apartments. Dunckley pointed at a gold Isuzu in the East portion of this dirt area, where he said he parked with Laura. The suspect said that this is where they kissed and touched each other and where the victim preformed feliatio on him.

Dunckley directed us down the road, approximately 200 yards from the street. There was a Taco Bell paper cup in the road. Dunckley said that this cup was Lura's. He said that she was drinking some kind of alcohol from the cup, but was not drunk, and threw the cup there. He pointed to a spot off the side of the road, approximately 25 yards from the cup, where he initially spread the towel. He then directed us another 30-40 yards down the road where he said they had sex. Detective Armitage followed the suspect and I to the Bluffs apartments. She photographed the area and the cup, which I collected, with a digital camera.

I asked the suspect to show me where the apartment was, where he picked up Laura. He identified that apartment as #1411. I then drove the suspect back to his apartment on Baker Lane. The suspect removed his log from his vehicle and provided me with the information on the jeep that was parked in front of apartment 1411 earlier. The license number he provided me was Nevada 758 SUR on a black jeep.

Detective Armitage attempted to reach Laura via telephone for a follow up interview. She was unable to reach Laura at either her home number or her cell phone.

When officer Bellinger first contacted Detective Salter, she felt that Laura was somewhat mentally delayed. I

asked the suspect if he knew of any mental problems with Laura. He said that she had been treated at West Hills for some sort of problem at one time and was an alcoholic, who becomes very depressed when she drinks. He said that he did not think that she was mentally challenged at all. Detective Armitage also spoke with the SART nurse, who did not feel that Laura was mentally challenged either.

Numerous attempts by both Detective Armitage to reach Lura have gone unanswered, until August 24,05 when I received a call from Lura's mother, Teresa. Teresa said that she has been trying to convince Lura to call me. Teresa said that her daughter is "special needs" and is traumatized by the incident and does not want to talk about it. She said that she has no doubt that her daughter was sexually assaulted. I explained to Teresa that without Lura's cooperation I would not be able to do a proper investigation and get to the truth. She said that she understood and would keep trying to talk to Lura.

I did receive a copy of the SART examination report. There were some genital injuries noted as well as scratch marks on the upper portion of Lura's left arm. There was also an abrasion noted on her lower back. As reported by the patrol officers, there were no marks or reddening reported to Lura's throat or neck and none noted by the SART nurse.

When I did not receive any calls from Lura I contacted her at work. She agreed to met me on Tuesday September 6,05. I talked to Lura briefly as she started crying. I asked her how far into the dirt the suspect drove before stopping. She said that it was not very far past the pavement, just before it dropped down hill. From this description it appears this is where the suspect described he parked his vehicle, before they walked away from it. I told Lura I would talk to her further on Tuesday. Lura called back a short time later and asked if we could meet today. I made arrangements to meet Lura at 1230 hours in the Sex Crimes Office. Lura arrived with her father at approximately 1446 hours.

VICTIM INTERVIEW: 8-31-05 1447

began the interview by telling Lura that it was important that she be completely honest with me, that what she has told anyone else was her business. I asked Lura how long she has known Brendan. She said that she met him through her friend Michelle when she was 12 or 13. She said that she hung out with him for two weeks and has not seen him until the other night. I asked her to tell me about seeing him the other night. Lura said that she was really drunk on Friday night. She said that she went to 7-11 with her friend to get ice. She said that Brendan ran up and gave her a hug. She said he was talking to someone on a cell phone. Lura said that they exchanged phone numbers and went their separate ways. I asked Lura if she remembers talking to Brendan's wife on the cell phone. She said that she was really drunk and could have. Lura remembered the wife's name.

The following night, Lura said that she was again at her friend's apartment on Gardella, when she saw Brendan again. Lura said that Brendan asked if she wanted to go with him to talk. Lura said that she agreed. Lura said that one of her friends made a comment that they were going to have sex. Lura said that Brendan told the friends that she was like his little sister and it was not like that. Lura said he told Brendan that she had to be back in ten minutes. I asked if she went with Brendan to boot a car. She said that she heard that is what he does, but Brendan did not mention it that night. Lura described how they drove onto a dirt road and stopped. She said that Brendan was asking her random questions, what she was doing now and things. She said that she told Brendan, that she had to go talk to Kelly, her friend before she left. Lura said that Brendan went to kiss him and she pushed him back. She said that Brendan grabbed her throat and asked if she liked it like that. Lura said that she told him no. Lura said that Brendan would not let go. I asked if she had trouble breathing. She nodded yes. Lura said that she does not know of she blacked out and it went fast. She said that he had her outside of his car and pulled down her pants. Lura said that Brendan kept saying grose things. I asked what he said. She said that Brendan asked her if she used to think about him and masturbate when she was a little girl.

I asked Lura if she ever knew Brendan to be violent when they knew each other earlier. She said no. I asked if he ever came on to her before. She said that they were all drunk and she thinks he did when she was 13. She could remember no other details about this.

I asked Lura if she had any health problems. She said that she was an epileptic. She said that she occasionally has seizures and takes medication. Lura said that she also had thyroid cancer when she was younger. I asked if she took birth control pills. Lura said that she is not fertile. She said that she had so many miscarriages that she

has too much scar tissue. I asked Lura these questions as Brendan told me during his interview that Lura told him she could not get pregnant so they did not need to use a condom.

Prior to my interview with Lura I took digital photos of the area where Brendan showed us this incident occurred. I showed Lura the photos and asked her to show me where this occurred. Lura pointed to the area where we found the Taco Bell cup. Brendan pointed to an area further down the road. I asked Lura if they ever got out of the car and walked down the hill. She said that they did not. I asked Lura if she was drinking from a Taco Bell cup. She said that she was.

I asked Lura again if she knew that Brendan was security for the complex and booted cars. She said that she heard it "on the street" a couple of days ago after but insisted that she did not know what he did, prior to that. Brendan told me that he asked Lura if she wanted to go with him to boot a car. Lura's friend Tela Scoggin reported that Lura told her the day before, that Brendan was working security at the complex and was wearing a shirt that had "Security" written on it. Tela also reported that Lura told her that she was going with Brendan to boot a car that night. I told Lura that Brendan had received threats on his phone after he booted a car belonging to someone at the party she was attending. Lura said that she did not know anything about that. The suspect told me during his interview that he thought that the reason for all this is so they did not have to pay for the booting.

I told Lura that Brendan is not disputing having sex with her. I told her that Brendan said that the sex was consensual. I told Lura that after talking to her, much of what Brendan said she actually confirmed. Lura started crying and said that she told Brendan no. I asked if she ever told Brendan that she was not able to have children. She said that everybody knows. I reminded Lura that she has not seen Brendan for five years. She said that it might have come up. I asked Lura how that would come up in conversation. She did not know.

I asked Lura how long before the assault had it been since she had consensual sex. She said a year. I asked how Brendan would know that. She did not know. I explained to Lura that these things created problems. That I was able to confirm many of what Brendan has told me after talking to her and her friends. I told Lura that what she was accusing Brendan of was extremely serious and asked if she wanted to change anything that she has told me. I told Lura that this would remain between her and I. Lura said that if her story is not good enough, then that is the way it is, but what she said is the way it happened. I told Lura that these things would likely come out in court. Lura said that she had a second job that she needed to go to.

Before she left I asked Lura about her web site on myspace.com. I told her that there were some things that were not very flattering to her. She said that was a joke she played on her ex-boyfriend. I asked Lura if she remembers towels in the car. She said that there was one on her seat.

I told Lura that if she remembered something else, or wanted to correct something that she said that she could call me. I ended the interview shortly thereafter. I walked Lura out to meet with her father waiting outside the interview room.

DETAILS CONTINUED:

Several days after the interview I received a call from Lura's father. Mr. Mcgrew asked why the suspect was not yet arrested, given that there were genital injuries to her daughter and sperm present. I told Mr. Mcgrew that given his daughter was an adult and I would not discuss our entire interview, that he should discuss that with Lura. I did tell Mr. Mcgrew that the fact that there was sex was not disputed, just wether it was consensual. I also asked Mr. Mcgrew if Laura was a heavy drinker. He said that she has a drink sometimes. I told him that Laura told me that she drinks quite a bit. He said that she did not know if she drank a lot or a little. Mr. Mcgrew told me that although his wife refers to Laura's problems as "special needs", she was actually very retarded. I told him that I did not get that impression when I interviewed her, that she seemed able to understand and respond to all my questions. He insisted that Laura did not know right from wrong when it came to some things.

Much of what suspect DUNCKLEY reported to me during his interview I have been able to confirm, both with witness before the reported crime and after talking to the victim in this case.

The victim initially reported that after driving to the dirt area of Gardella the suspect grabbed her by the throat almost immediately, then ran to the passenger side of the vehicle, pulled her out removed her pants and raped her. Although she complained of neck pain, there was no bruising or even reddening to her throat observed by

doctors, nurses or the reporting officers. The suspect stated that he did put his hand on her throat but did not squeeze at Lura's request as she had a "rape fantasy". The suspect reported that they agreed to have sex and even told the victim that he had a condom. He said that Lura told him that she could not get pregnant and he did not need a condom. The victim confirmed that she was told by doctors that she could not conceive. The suspect said that after the consensual sex the victim told him that she felt like he "broke her in two", because she had not had sex in over a year. The victim told me during the interview that she has not had consensual sex in over a year. It is difficult to understand the victim's explanation that these things could have just come up in casual conversation. When met by the reporting officers, Lura provided little information as to how to find the suspect. She said that she did not know where he worked and did not know that he was booting cars in the complex. The suspect stated that he told the victim what he did and asked her to with him to boot a car. This was confirmed by Lura's friend Tela.

l also located a web page for Lura on a free web site used by many young people, myspace.com. On that site indicates that she is a bi-sexual female who likes to smoke, drink and have sex and joined another site called "one night stands" for people who are looking for one night stands. I talked to Lura about this site. She said that it was a joke for an ex-boyfriend. On the login page, if it is accurate shows that Lura was last on the site on August 28,05.

On September 7,05 I re-interviewed the suspect via telephone. I asked if he was certain that he did not drive further down the road. Suspect Dunckley stated that the walked down the road and did not have sex near the car. He stated that Lura wanted to have sex outside as part of her fantasy. I reviewed the story with Dunckley, who only added that there was no way he could have removed Lura's clothing, because they were so tight and the reason they engaged in foreplay in the car prior to walking down the hill was Lura's idea. He said that Lura told him that she needed to loosen up since it had been so long since she had sex.

Another unusual aspect of the victim's version of what occurred, was that the suspect committed such a violent sexual assault, when he knew that Lura's friends had seen him drive away with her and knew that he worked in the complex and would be able to find him. The suspect also knew where the victim lived. The suspect reports that the victim told him where she lived so they could have sex again.

CONCLUSIONS:

Given the inconsistencies in the victim's statements, I do not believe that the District Attorney's office would be able to charge or successfully prosecute the suspect for Sexual Assault. There are no other witnesses to the sex, which is not disputed by the suspect. The physical evidence only confirms that there was in fact sexual contact. The suspect's version of what occurred has not changed. The victim has altered her story somewhat since talking with officer Bellinger which she blames on alcohol or possibly blacking out. I am subsequently forced to closed this case as unable to prove, either that a crime occurred or that the victim fabricated a crime.

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REFERENCE CASE: 07-9446 Sexual Assault Arrest

On March 12,2007 I began an investigation into the above listed Sexual Assault, where the suspect was listed as Dunckley, Brendan. During that investigation I learned that many of the details in the 2007 case were similar to this case where Dunckley was also listed as a suspect. This case was suspended in 2005, the reasons are detailed in the investigation follow up. Dunckley was arrested on March 22, 2007 for the 2007 case, after which I began attempting to locate Lura Sexton the victim in this case. I learned that she was living in Yerington Nevada and I obtained a phone number. I contacted Lura on March 22, 07 and told her that I wanted to re-visit her case, explaining that there were similarities to a case that I was now investigating. Lura told me that she moved to Yerington partially because she feared the suspect. She has since moved on with her life and now has a child and is preparing to marry. Lura agreed to meet with me and assist in this investigation. She said that she was being truthful about what happened to her in 2005.

On March 27, 2005 I again contacted Lura and asked if she would participate in a taped phone interview. She agreed and was aware that the conversation was being recorded on audio tape.

PHONE INTERVIEW: Lura Sexton 3-27-07

I explained to Lura that I was investigating another case involving Brendan Dunckley. I asked if I could go over some of the points that caused difficulty in the previous case. I asked Lura to be honest with me about what occurred. I told Lura that in her case, Dunckley told me that he offered to use a condom during their "consensual" sexual encounter, however you told him that would not be necessary because you could not get pregnant. I told Lura that when we talked initially she told me that because of some miscarriages and illness that she could not get pregnant. I asked how that would come up in a conversation. Lura said that the night before her assault when she encountered Dunckley at the 7-11 they talked about him having another child. She said that she mentioned then that she could not get pregnant. Lura also said that Brendan was always talking to a mutual friend, Michelle Anthony. Lura explained that she met Brendan and his wife through Michelle when she was about 12 years old.

I told Lura that another thing that came up was that came up was that Brendan said that you said that the sex was great because you had not had sex for about a year. I told her that I believed that she also told me that it had been some time since she had sex and I thought that was also unusual to come up during a sexual assault. Lura said that she was dating someone at the time and she does not remember saying that.

I asked Lura if she had made previous reports of sexual assault involving other family members. Lura said that there was an allegation about her sister's boyfriend that was handled between the families. She said that she was also the victim of a Statutory Sexual Assault and the suspect went to prison. She said the suspect's name was Richard Rarick. I did locate a 2001 Sparks arrest of Richard Rarick for Statutory Sexual Assault.

I told Lura that Dunckley said that she had been treated for some mental issues. I asked if that was true. I asked Lura if she was treated for alcoholism. She said she drank but she was not an alcoholic.

I told Lura that I remembered that someone said that one of her friends make the comment as she drove away with Brendan was that they were going to have sex. Lura said that she does not remember that. I later found in

my investigative follow up, that Lura was the one who told me that she heard someone say that. She does not remember that now.

Lura said that after she was sexually assaulted by Dunckley she was extremely depressed for some time. She has since had a child and is engaged to be married. I asked Lura if she gave Dunckley her phone number. She said that she gave it to him the night before at the 7-11 and that was more for his wife Morgan not him.

I asked Lura if she remembered oral sex with the suspect that night. She said that she does not remember that. I asked Lura where the suspect said he was going when she went with him. She said Dunckley was going to boot a car. She said that he drove directly to the dirt lot behind the complex and had no intention on going to boot a car. Lura said that she asked Dunckley what he was doing. She said that the suspect tried to kiss her and she pushed him off. She said that he grabbed her neck and his phone rang. Lura said that he let her go. When he finished the phone call he grabbed her again then went around to the other side of the car, pulled her belt off removed her from the car, pulled down her pants and sexually assaulted her. She said that after it happened Dunckley asked if it was good for her. Lura said that she told him no. She said that the suspect was calling her names like Stut and Whore and wanted her to call him daddy when he was sexually assaulting her.

I asked Lura about her My Space site at the time. She said that she has never had anything directly on her site about one night stands. She thought it might be a link but she does not have that on her site. Lura said that she remembers talking to the DA about that. She said that there was a story about her and her friend Ashley being in a mental institution. Lura said that this was a joke by a friend relating to a school project.

I asked Lura if she had been drinking that night. She said that she had. Lura said that she went to the hospital that night after she told her friend what happened. I asked Lura if she was drunk that night. She said that she was not drunk but had been drinking. I asked Lura why she thinks the suspect sexually assaulted her. Lura said that she has never told anyone, but when she was 13 she and her friend Michelle Anthony stayed at Brendan and Morgan's house and they woke to find Brendan trying to touch them. I asked what she meant by trying to touch them. Lura said that Dunckley was trying to put his hand down her pants and trying to dry hump her friend. Lura said that was the last time before the assault that she had anything to do with Dunckley. Lura said that Michelle is currently in prison in Las Vegas for drug problems. Lura said that when this happened with Dunckley she and Michelle were not friends and she thought at one time that Michelle might have put Dunckley up to the assault.

I asked Lura if she has heard of Dunckley touching anyone else. Lura said that Michelle's daughter who was 5 at the time disclosed that Brendan touched her. Lura said that Michelle told her that Brendan has some daughters that he has touched in the past as well. Lura said that Michelle would know much more. Lura said that she would cooperate any way she could, however she does not want Dunckley to know where she lives under any circumstances. I ended the interview shortly thereafter.

DETAILS CONTINUED:

I have subsequently removed Lura's current address from the Tiberon Entry and will retain that information in the case file and make it available to the District Attorney in person. On March 28, 07 I made arrangements with the Warden at the Women's Prison in North Las Vegas Nevada to interview Michelle via telephone. I was only allowed to talk to her briefly on March 28, 07 which continued on March 29, 07. Both interviews were recorded on audio tape.

WITNESS INTERVIEWS: Michelle Anthony 3-28,29-2007

I asked Michelle permission to audio tape the interview she agreed. I told Michelle that I was looking into Lura's 2005 Sexual Assault and told her that Lura gave me some information and asked her to confirm this. I told Michelle that Lura told me that when she was 12 or 13 she woke to find Brendan trying to touch her and you. Michelle said that she remembered that but thought they were 16 or 17. I asked Michelle if anything else ever happened between her and Brendan. Michelle said that when she was 12 she was sleeping with Brendan and his wife and Brendan fondled her vagina at night. She said that Brendan told her not to tell. In a subsequent phone call with Michelle, she told me that she was lying next to Morgan and Dunckley reached over his wife to fondle her. I asked if anything else ever happened. Michelle said that her daughter told her when that someone was touching her vagina. She said that Brendan and Morgan were babysitting for her at the time. Michelle said that

her daughter would not tolerate the CARES exam and the report went no where. I asked Michelle if anything else happened, if Brendan ever exposed himself or anything. Michelle asked me if this would go to court. I told her it might at some point. She said yes. At this point Michelle had to stop the conversation for a count at the prison. Her Case Worker assured me that she would call back the following day.

Michelle's case worker did facilitate a second phone call on March 29, 2007. I again asked Michelle for her permission to record the conversation. Michelle was very hesitant and said that the information that she had involved a friend of her's. Michelle said that this friend was possibly sexually assaulted by Dunckley when she was 12 years old. Michelle said that her friend told her that Dunckley may have had sex with her when she was 12 years old in a parking lot off of Neil Road, when Dunckley drove her home. She said that her friend was also incarcerated and she did not want to cause problems for her. I reminded Michelle about her experience with Dunckley and her friend Lura's experience with Dunckley. Michelle said that her friend's name was Ashley Vanderby and she was incarcerated at the Silver Springs Correctional Camp. I ended the interview shortly thereafter.

VICTIM INTERVIEW: Ashley Vanderby 3-29-2007

I contacted the Silver Springs Women's Camp and made arrangements to talk to Ashley Vanderby. I explained to Ashley my investigation and asked her permission to record the conversation. She agreed. I told Ashley that Michelle hesitantly told me that she might have had a sexual encounter with Brendan Dunckley. Ashley said that she like Michelle and Lura did hang around Morgan and Brendan when she was younger. Ashley said that when she was 12 years old she, Michelle Lura, Dunckley and his wife went to dinner at the Atlantis Casino. Ashley said that she made the comment after dinner, that she has never been in the elevator that looked out over Reno. Ashley said that Dunckley took her into the elevator alone. Ashley said that Dunckley pushed her into a corner and put his hand down her pants. She did not tell anyone. On another occasion Ashley reported that Dunckley drove her home. She said that at the time she was 12 years old and lived with her parents off of Longley Lane at the Bristlepoint apartments. Ashley said that Dunckley pulled over in the parking lot and started kissing her. She said that they then had sex. I asked Ashley if she was forced to have sex. Ashley said that she never said that it was forced, she said" but I was 12 years old." She said that she staved away from Dunckley after this happened. Ashley said that she was sexually active at the time, but she did not plan on having sex with the suspect. Ashley said that she remembers that Dunckley told her that he wanted to teach her stuff and not to tell anyone. I asked if Dunckley used a condom. She said that he did not. Ashley said that she only had sex with Dunckley the one time. I ended the interview shortly thereafter.

DETAILS CONTINUED:

At the beginning of my interview with Dunckley in the 07-9446 Sexual Assault, Dunckley told me that he taiked to his wife and she knows everything and is upset but has forgiven him as she forgave him in this case. After listening to the Defendant's Jail calls after the 3-22-07 arrest, it is apparent that Morgan does not know that Dunckley has changed his story from a fabrication by the victim to a consensual sexual encounter. I also spoke with Detective Dixon with Special Investigations, who interviewed Dunckley regarding the business license for the booting company he now works for. Detective Dixon informed me that Amanda Brothwell, a 25 year old female actually holds the license for the booting company, however Dunckley spoke the majority of the time during the interview. Detective Dixon felt that Dunckley was somewhat manipulative in the interview.

Given the new information learned in the 07-9446 investigation and additional witnesses I drove to suspect Dunckley's residence on High Plains drive to place Dunckley under arrest for this Sexual Assault. Dunckley had posted bail for the 2007 case. Although I could see movement in the residence there was no answer. I phoned Dunckley who said that he was in a meeting and would meet me later. Shortly thereafter I received a call from Joel Barber a local attorney who advised that he represented Dunckley and did not want me to talk to him. I prepared an attempt to locate and distributed it to patrol officers, who attempted to locate Dunckley on March 30, 2007 to no avail. Detective Lopez contacted Joel Barber and advised him that we were seeking Dunckley to arrest him for the 2005 Sexual Assault. At approximately 1600 hours, Dunckley walked into the R.P.D. main station and surrendered himself. Detective Lampert facilitated the arrest.

On April 2, 2007 I monitored defendant Dunckley's phone calls from 911 Parr. In those calls Dunckley was clearly

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On Saturday, March 10, 2007 at around 1900 hours, Officer Millsap and I responded to 1645 Sky Mountain Drive regarding an unknown type of disturbance. Dispatch advised that they received multiple calls of a woman screaming and the call taker could hear an extreme disturbance in the background.

Upon arrival I was hailed by a large group standing in front of building #8. I noticed a female sitting on the curb crying hysterically. As I approached, bystanders said the female was saying that she was sexually assaulted. One of the bystanders pointed to a white van and told me the driver was the person she was accusing of this.

I made contact with a male who identified himself as Brendan Dunckley. Brendan told me the following: He was on his way home from work when he noticed the female (later identified as Jessica Hambrick) stumbling in the roadway. Brendan said she appeared intoxicated and he feared for her safety because she kept stumbling into the roadway.

It should be noted that Brendan was on the phone with his wife and told her what was happening. Brendan approached Jessica and asked if she was ok. Jessica said she was walking home. Brendan told her he was going to follow her home to make sure she gets there without getting hurt.

As Brendan followed her she continued to stumble into the roadway. Once they got near the mail boxes at the front entrance, Jessica fell into the mail boxes and onto the ground. Brendan continued to watch her as she began to walk up a flight of stairs. While on the stairs Jessica fell again.

At this time Brendan parked his van in front of building #8 and got out to help Jessica. Brendan helped her up the stairs and assisted her as she walked to apartment #827. Once at the door Brendan asked if she had a key. Jessica said no and fell into the door and it opened. Brendan began to walk away and Jessica collapsed landing face down in a pile of cloths.

Brendan saw that she was unconscious so he gave her a stemum rub and checked her pulse. Jessica came to and he began asking questions such as, her name, how much she drank, etc? Jessica replied by saying, "Three

Jessica again lost consciousness and Brendan again rubbed her sternum. This time when she came to she had a totally different facial expression and began screaming "Who are you?" Brendan was still talking to his wife on the phone. His wife told him to leave and he began to walk away.

Brendan walked away and as he got to the parking lot Jessica again approached him and began hitting him. Brendan saw a man in the parking lot and asked for his help. A second man approached them and said he was Jessica's boyfriend. Brenda was able to get away from her. He then went to his van hung up with his wife and called the RPD non-emergency number.

Brendan had at least one noticeable red mark on his neck. Brendan allowed me to check the call history on his phone. I noticed a call to "Morgan" around 1900 hours, then a call to 334-2677 (COPS) and then one more call to "Morgan." Brendan's phone did not provide the duration of the call.

I then tried to interview Jessica and recorded it on a digital voice recorder. She was hysterically crying and in broken statements told me the following. Jessica was arguing with her boyfriend and she decided to go for a walk. As she was walking back to her apartment a male approached her in a van and tried to get her in the car. Jessica said no and walked away. While walking home the van followed her.

The next thing she remembered the same male was forcing his penis into her mouth. Jessica said she didn't know what to do so, she bit his penis. Jessica said she bit it at least four times on the shaft. I asked Jessica if she bit it hard enough that she thought it would leave a visible injury and she adamantly said yes.

While talking to Jessica I noticed a strong odor of alcohol and she appeared intoxicated. Officer Alaksa responded with a PBT. Jessica registered a .226% BAC.

Also on scene was Jessica's boyfriend, Emiliano Tapia. Officer Millsap interviewed Emiliano and he told Officer Millsap the following: Emiliano and Jessica have been dating for 6 years. They were in an argument earlier today and Jessica left. A while later Jessica's brother brought her home and said he drove her because she was too intoxicated to drive.

Jessica told Emiliano that she did not want to be at the house and so she left. A few minutes after she left Emiliano went to look for her. He thought she was still in the parking lot so he stayed in that area looking for her. 10 to 15 minutes later Emiliano heard Jessica yelling. When he approached she was surrounded by 4 to 5 men who were trying to calm her down. Jessica told Emiliano that she was rapped and he stayed with her until the police arrived.

Officer Leonard also responded and began canvassing for witnesses. The only witnesses we could locate all noticed the incident as Jessica was yelling at Brendan in the parking lot. Officer Leonard obtained written statements from the witnesses. Brendan also provided a written statement.

Sergeant Sevcsik was advised of the incident and responded to our location. Sergeant Sevcsik spoke to Brendan and obtained permission to inspect his penis for any sign of injury as well as a DNA swab of his penis. Sergeant Sevcsik also contacted Brendan's wife, Morgan Dunckiey. Morgan said she was on the phone with Brendan during this incident and was able to give details that supported this. Officer Leonard later met with Morgan and obtained a written statement from her.

Once I was advised of this I began to approach Brendan and he said something to the effect of let's get this done. Officer Millsap and I walked with Brendan to the men's rest room in the front office. Brendan had no visible injury to penis shaft, head or base. Brendan allowed me to photographs his genital area to document this.

Brendan also voluntarily provided a DNA swab. I watched as Officer Millsap saturated the cotton swab with tap water. Officer Millsap handed the swab to Brendan. Brendan rubbed the swab on the shaft, head and base of his penis. Brendan then handed the swab to Officer Millsap. Officer Millsap then placed the swab into a cardboard container. Officer Millsap also took a second cotton swab and obtained a control sample of the tap water. Officer Millsap placed the control sample in a separate cardboard container and then labeled the two boxes.

On March 10, 2007 I was assigned as the on call Sex Crimes Detective. At approximately 2000 hours I received a phone call from Sergeant Sevcsik, who advised that he and other patrol officers were investigating a possible Sexual Assault. Officers responded to 1675 Sky Mountain as a result of several phone calls advising that a female was screaming. Once on scene the officers met with Jessica Hambrick, a 23 year old adult female who was very intoxicated, and her boyfriend Emiliano. Emiliano told the officers that he and Jessica had an argument and Jessica had left their apartment and went to her brothers. Her brother drove her home because she was too intoxicated. The two apparently continued to argue and Jessica walked outside to take a walk. After about 10 or 15 minutes Emliano left the apartment to look for her.

Jessica reported that she was walking back to her apartment when a male driving a white van approached her and asked her to get in the van. Jessica said No, and continued walking to her apartment. She noticed the van continued to follow her. Jessica did make it into her apartment and at some point realized that the male who was in the van was forcing his penis into her mouth. Jessica said that she bit the suspect who then fled the apartment. Jessica pursued the suspect screaming for help.

The suspect, Brendan Dunckley was on scene and told officers that he observed Jessica staggering in the street near her apartment. He said that he asked the victim if she was OK and told her that he would follow her to make sure she got home. Dunckley said that he saw the victim fall in the apartment complex parking lot and again on the stairs. He said that he exited his van and assisted her into her apartment. He said that Jessica opened her door and again, fell down. Seeing that the victim was unconscious he gave her a "stemum rub: and checked her pulse. The victim woke then fell unconscious again. Again he woke the victim who began screaming and trying to hit him. Dunckley said that he was still on the phone with his wife who told him to walk away. This prompted the neighbors to exit their apartment and Emiliano to approach when he heard the screaming.

The responding officers looked at Dunkley's cell phone call history and saw a call to Morgan his wife at 1900 then a call to the non emergency number for R.P.D. then another call to Morgan. Officers spoke to Morgan who said that she did hear things consistent with Dunkley's version of events. The officers also asked the victim to take a Preliminary Breath test which registered a .226 BAC.

Sergeant Sevcsik advised me that the suspect was very cooperative and his wife supports his story. Since the suspect was so cooperative I asked Sergeant Sevcsik to ask the suspect if he would show them his penis to check for injuries and obtain penile swabs to confirm his story. The suspect did consent to the swabs and was subsequently released.

On Monday March 12, 2007 I reviewed this case and learned that the suspect in the case was Brendan Dunckley. I investigated a Sexual Assault in 2005 where Dunckley was listed as a suspect. I noted several similarities in this report and in the 2005 investigation. Both victims had been drinking excessively; the suspect was extremely cooperative and happened to be on the phone to his wife at some point when he was with the victim. Both victims were reported by the suspect to be the aggressor and the suspect portrayed himself as somewhat of a victim. Both cases the suspect had a somewhat bizarre explanation for what occurred.

I contacted the victim in this case via telephone and made arrangements to meet her in the Sex Crimes office for an interview. That interview was both video and audio recorded.

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VICTIM INTERVIEW: March 19, 2007 0930

I asked Jessica if she was clear about what happened that day. She said that she was. Jessica said that she was looking around the apartment for her boyfriend. When she turned around the suspect was standing there and told her suck his dick. She said that she did not know what to do so she did it. Jessica said that when she got his penis in her mouth she bit it. Jessica said that the suspect took off. Jessica said that she chased the suspect and was yelling. She said that the guys outside took him down. I told Jessica that the suspect was cooperative with the police and that they asked him to take his pants down, which he did and they did not see any signs that he had been bitten. I told Jessica that we also obtained a DNA sample from his penis.

With the police and that they asked him to take his pane.

I lasked Jessica if she drinks a lot, since her BAC was so high. Jessica said that she had drunk quite a bit in the past. I asked if she remembers where she was going. Jessica said that she and her boyfriend got in a fight and she left. When she was coming back she noticed someone was following her. I asked if she has ever had black outs when she drank. She said that she has forgotten things. I asked if she has ever accused anyone of something when she was drunk and found out later that she was mistaken. She said no. I asked if she remembers the suspect helping her up the stairs. Jessica said that she climbed the stairs by herself and he was not helping her. Jessica said that many times she will not close the door all the way when she goes into her apartment. I asked Jessica if she was sure that she bit the suspect. She said that she was positive. Jessica said that the suspect had an erection and when she bit his penis the suspect's penis shriveled up and she could not bite anymore. I asked if she remembers anything unusual about the suspect's penis. Jessica said that she kept her eyes closed. I had earlier asked Jessica if she remembers if the suspect's genital area had hair. Jessica said that she thought it might have been shaved.

I told Jessica that this was a difficult case at face value because of the over cooperation by the suspect and her intoxication level. I told her that I was familiar with a similar case involving this suspect. I asked Jessica if she was willing to testify against the suspect. She said that she was. I told Jessica that she needed to be very honest with me and tell me anything that she thought would be important.

Jessica has since moved from her apartment and is living with her father. Her boyfriend has moved back to Oklahoma and has asked Jessica to move there. I asked Jessica if the suspect made any threats or just told her to suck his dick. She said that he just told her but there was no place for her to go because he was between her and the door. Jessica said that when the suspect ran out she followed yelling and two guys tackled the suspect. Jessica said that she ran over to him and tried to hit the suspect. She said that she was acting crazy she said that she thought that nothing like this would happen to her. She said that she thought she was too strong. I ended the interview shortly thereafter. I asked Jessica if she would provide me with a Buccal Swab for DNA comparison purposes. She did provide two saliva swabs which were subsequently booked into evidence and a Lab requesting comparison with the penile swabs from the suspect, was forwarded to the Washoe County Crime Lab. I ended the interview shortly after.

DETAILS CONINTUED:

I left several phone messages for suspect Dunckley requesting that he contact me for an interview. He did not return the messages. On March 21, 2007 I drove to the suspect's residence and observed him drive into the garage. I activated my digital recorder and knocked on the door. Dunckley answered the door and recognized me from the previous investigation. He invited me in and we talked in the living room. I asked the suspect about what happened with the girl on Sky Mountain. Dunckley relayed the same story that he told the police. I asked Dunckley to tell me how the victim's saliva ended up on his penis. I reminded him that we optained penile swabs. Dunckley told me that the victim came on to him and reached into his pants. I told him that I was talking about the victim's saliva. Dunckley became uncomfortable talking with his wife in the other room. I asked if he wanted to walk outside and talk.

Once we walked outside Dunckley told me that the story was basically the same except when he woke the victim up the second time she unzipped his pants, removed his penis and began performing fellatio on him. He said that he realized what he was doing was wrong and stopped. He said that the victim went crazy and started chasing him. I told Dunckley that I wanted to talk to him in my office the next day, as I had an appointment to meet with a juvenile suspect in the same area on a different case. Dunckley agreed to meet me the next day at 1000 hours.

Suspect Dunckley did meet me in the Sex Crimes office on March 22, 07 at 1000 hours. That interview was both video and audio recorded.

SUSPECT INTERVIEW: Dunckley, Brendan 3-22-07 1000

I thanked Dunckley for coming down. He said that he was trying to put what happened last time behind him. He said that he makes poor judgment calls. I told the suspect that I did not disagree. I told the suspect that he was not under arrest and was free to leave. He said that he knew. Dunckley said that he told his wife what happened. He said that his wife Morgan asked if he did something stupid in two minutes. He said that he told her yes. Dunckley thought it was about two minutes that he was not on the phone with his wife.

Dunckley said that he was going to put it all on the table. He said that what happened was consensual. I told Dunckley that given the last allegations and these new ones his wife must be patient. He said that she was.

I asked Dunckley where he first saw Jessica. He said that he was driving on Sky Mountain when he saw her. I asked what he was driving. He said his van. I asked what color it was. He said white. He said that he saw the victim stagger and fall into the street. Dunckley said that he was talking to Morgan who advised him to keep an eye on her but not contact her. I asked if he had a conversation with Jessica prior to the apartment. He said that he asked her if she was ok. I asked if he offered to give her a ride. He said that he did, but then he realized that his wife was not in the car so he told himself no. Dunckley said that he asked Jessica if she was ok and how much she had to drink. He said that the victim told him that she and her boyfriend had a fight and that she did not know where he was and that she lost her slippers. Dunckley said the victim then started walking towards her apartment.

Dunckley said that the victim started up the stairs then takes a "header" and falls on the stairs. He then corrected himself saying that she stumbled on the stairs. Dunckley said that he parked his van and helped her to her apartment. He said that he knocked on her door to see if anyone was home and asked the victim if she had any keys. Dunckley said that victim said it was open and swatted the door knob an opened the door. He said that the victim went inside and fell and was not responsive. Dunckley said that he checked on her and the victim woke up. When she woke up she put her arms around him and started to become affectionate. Dunckley said that he backed away and the victim passed out again. He said that he rubbed her chest, her sternum and again the victim woke up. Dunckley said that the victim pulls at his zipper, pulls out his penis and said that she wanted to thank him. He said that she passed out again. Dunckley said that he has trouble with his boxers in that his penis is always hanging out of his boxers so it was easy for her to access his penis. When the victim woke the third time, the suspect said it was like she was possessed and she started asking who he was and looking mad. Dunckley said that he got out of there and the victim followed him outside yelling that he raped her.

I asked Dunckley why he did not tell the police that night this story. He said that he has this crazy girl yelling at him and her boyfriend smelled like Marijuana. I asked if he thought that we would not find her DNA on his penis. He said that he thought we would. I told Dunckley that I still do not understand how the victim was able to get his penis out of his pants against his will since she apparently could not stand up. He said that it was a bad judgment call. Dunckley said that he did not resist for a split second. He said that I could ask his wife that he really does not prefer fellatio. Dunckley said that it does not do anything for him. I told Dunckley that if I remember right the girl in the last investigation also gave him a blow job. He said that he understands that but it was just a stupid judgment call.

I told Dunckley that this was a strange story, that he did not know if the boyfriend was in the apartment. He said that is why he was banging on the door. Dunckley said that the victim did not know what was going on. I told Dunckley that the neighbors did not see his version of what happened that he said the door was open, but the victim and neighbors say that he walked in and closed the door. Dunckley said that he was at the door with the victim. Dunckley said that the door did close and he saw her foot in it so he did open the door to help the victim. I asked the suspect why he did not call the police and tell them that there was someone hurt in the apartment. He said that he should have 911 on speed dial. Dunckley said that he does not want to have anything to do with people anymore. I asked again why he did not tell the police that night what happened. Dunckley said that the victim was hitting him and he was just trying to help. I told him that he drew his wife into this as well, as he did the last time. Dunckley said that honestly he is the first to admit that he gets himself into situations and makes

poor judgment calls. He said that he is not some serial rapist. I told him that he took advantage of this woman when she was drunk. Dunckley said that was his one rule that he never takes advantage of a woman when they are drunk. I told him that he did in this case. He said that she took advantage of him.

I told Dunckley that he could not have it both ways, that he either took advantage of this girl because she was intoxicated and came on to him. Or he followed her to her apartment because she was so drunk and was the perfect victim. Dunckley said that he could see my point and he was cooked either way. He said that he for just a split second made a mistake when she came on to him. He said that he told himself not to do anything else. I told Dunckley that he then lied to the officers. He said that it was a stupid judgment call.

Lasked Dunckley about the last investigation when the girl was drunk. I told him that I do not see any improvement in his judgment. I told Brendan that I had some issues with his stories and I was placing him under arrest. I explained that we either have an unable to consent Sexual Assault or an out and out enter her apartment and Sexually Assault. I placed the suspect in handcuffs at this point.

Dunckley asked if it would make any difference if he told me that the victim was trying to show him her breasts and she lifted up her shirt and she had a band aid on her left breast. I told him no. Dunckley said that this was beyond a bad judgment call. Dunckley remained in the interview room until the transport unit arrived to transport Dunckley to the Washoe County Jail. I entered the interview room to fill out the booking form. Dunckley said that I had no intention on letting him walk out of here. I reminded Dunckley that he walked away the last time I interviewed him. He agreed. I explained that I wanted to get both sides of the story before deciding if there would be an arrest.

DETAILS CONTINUED:

After Dunckley was transported I revisited the 2005 case involving Dunckley and noted several similarities detailed above. I requested that the Sex Crimes Secretary make some phone calls and attempt to locate the victim in that case. More to follow no further at this time..
