ORDER

Pursuant to NRAP 29, proposed amici Public Funds Public Schools (PFPS), the American Civil Liberties Union of Nevada (ACLU), and the Washoe Education Association (WEA) have filed a motion for leave to file an amicus curiae brief in support of respondents. Proposed amici explain that they are entities experienced in and dedicated to advocating for and on behalf of public school children and access to public schools, including expertise with respect to the issues of vouchers. It appears an amicus brief may be warranted. See Ryan v. Commodity Future Trading Comm'n, 125 F.3d 1062, 1063 (7th Cir. 1997) (explaining that an amicus brief is appropriate where "the amicus has unique information or perspective that can help the court beyond the help that the lawyers for the parties are able to provide). Accordingly, the motion is granted.


