APPELLANT MUDDY VALLEY IRRIGATION COMPANY'S PARTIAL JOINDER IN SOUTHERN NEVADA WATER AUTHORITY'S LIMITED OBJECTION TO THE COURT'S OCTOBER 14, 2022 ORDER SETTING BRIEFING SCHEDULE

Appellant MUDDY VALLEY IRRIGATION COMPANY ("MVIC"), by and through its counsel, STEVEN D. KING and DOTSON LAW, hereby files this partial joinder to the Southern Nevada Water Authority's Limited Objection to the Court's October 14, 2022, Order Setting Briefing Schedule. MVIC specifically joins in the objection to the order modifying caption and setting briefing schedule ("Scheduling Order") insofar as it does or may be interpreted as limiting MVIC's right to seek review on appeal.

The District Court issued two orders intending to resolve the various petitions for judicial review of Order 1309. The first issued on April 19, 2022 vacated Order 1309 but failed to address the MVIC petition. The second, addendum and clarification, was issued by the District Court on May 13, 2022 and dismissed the MVIC petition. That ruling dismissing MVIC's petition appears irreconcilable to the determination within the same order granting SNWA's petition on the same point.\(^1\) MVIC filed its Notice of Appeal on May 26, 2022 seeking review of both District Court orders.

Like SNWA, absent a modification to the Court's Scheduling Order, MVIC would appear to be precluded from seeking review

of certain aspects of the District Court's orders. This would result in no opportunity to review the dismissal of its petition or opportunity to address the due process and erroneous conflict determination which MVIC contends deprives it of critical property rights. Like SNWA, MVIC is not aligned with the State Engineer's office as to those topics.

Additionally, MVIC anticipates that there may be language in the opening brief which the State Engineer and/or SNWA wish to include in support of legal and factual positions or which assume or implicate legal and factual positions

related to the Lower White River Flow System ("LWRFS") and particular its boundaries and/or extent, which MVIC will likely not wish to join. Consequently, MVIC also requests clarification that any party directed to file a joint brief may identify, by footnote or otherwise, portions of the joint brief to which they do not agree or from which they wish to abstain and not have the legal or factual position attributed to them.

With regard to the best way to address the due process and legal issue of the conflicts determination which appears inadvertently omitted from this October 14th Scheduling Order, MVIC suggests that should be included and allowed as part of a separate answering brief addressed under part 2B of the Scheduling Order.
