

ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO STAY ISSUANCE OF REMITTITUR

Appellant has filed an “emergency” pro se motion to stay the remittitur pending application to the Supreme Court of the United States for a writ of certiorari.¹ The motion is granted. See NRAP 41(b)(3). Issuance of the remittitur is stayed until November 30, 2022. If the clerk of this court receives written notice by November 30, 2022, from the clerk of the United States Supreme Court that appellant has filed a petition for a writ of certiorari, the stay shall continue in effect until final disposition of the certiorari proceedings. If such notice is not received by November 30, 2022, the clerk shall issue the remittitur.

It is so ORDERED.
