





*ORDER DENYING MOTIONS AND DIRECTING  
ISSUANCE OF THE REMITTITUR*

Appellant has filed pro se motions that appear to ask (1) that this court direct the district court to provide him with copies of certain documents and (2) for the appointment of counsel. The motions are denied.

On August 9, 2022, this court entered an order granting appellant's motion to stay issuance of the remittitur pending application to the Supreme Court of the United States for a writ of certiorari. The order stated that if no notice was received by November 30, 2022, from the clerk of the United States Supreme Court that appellant had filed a petition for a writ of certiorari, the clerk should issue the remittitur. To date, no notice has been received from the clerk of the United States Supreme Court. Accordingly, the clerk shall issue the remittitur forthwith.
