FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Tatiana Leibel was born and raised in Russia in the former Soviet

Union. She immigrated to the United States in 1992 and thereafter married Harry

Leibel. On February 23, 2014, Harry died of gunshot wounds inflicted by a Circuit

Judge revolver action carbine that he owned. Tatiana was accused, tried, and

convicted by a jury of second degree murder with use of a deadly weapon in 2015.

NRS 200.030, NRS 200.010(1), NRS 193.165. The Nevada Supreme Court

affirmed her conviction on direct appeal, and she now pursues a timely

postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus. NRS 34.726. This

supplemental petition incorporates the claims raised and argued by Tatiana in her

pro se petition.

A postconviction habeas petition challenges the constitutionally mandated effectiveness of the petitioner's trial representation. "In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right...to have the assistance of counsel for his defense." *U.S. Const., Amend. VI.* Postconviction jurisprudence mandates that to obtain relief, the petitioner must demonstrate both that counsel's performance fell below an objective standard of reasonableness, and that but for

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counsel's errors, there is a reasonable probability the outcome of the trial would have been different. Warden v. Lyons, 100 Nev. 430, 432-33, 683 P.2d 504, 505 (1984); State v. Love, 109 Nev. 1136, 865 P.2d 322 (1993); Strickland v. Washington, 466 U.S. 668 (1984). In this case, Tatiana's experience meets both Strickland standards. To obtain an evidentiary hearing on her claims, Tatiana must raise specific claims supported by facts not belied by the record, that if true would entitle her to relief. See Mann v. State, 118 Nev. 351, 354, 46 P.3d 1228, 1230 (2002) (internal quotations omitted) ("[This court] has long recognized a petitioner's right to a post-conviction evidentiary hearing when the petitioner asserts claims supported by specific factual allegations not belied by the record that, if true, would entitle him to relief."). Tatiana submits that she meets these standards.

The sixth amendment mandate of effective assistance of counsel requires that a criminal defense attorney do three basic things for her client at trail: that she ensure clear communication with the client in the preparation and investigation of the case; and that she put on necessary and favorable evidence and challenge unfavorable evidence. See ABA Criminal Justice Standards for the

Defense Function, III Lawyer-Client Relationship, 4-3.1, 4-4.1 (4th Ed.); Nevada Supreme Court Indigent Defense Order, ADKT 411 (2008). Trial counsel for Tatiana failed in these obligations: in sum, counsel failed to insure clear communication, and failed to present existing favorable evidence or to challenge inadmissible and unfavorable evidence.

PÉR SE VIOLATIONS OF TATIANA'S RIGHT TO CONSTITUTIONALLY EFFECTIVE ASSISTANCE OF COUNSEL

I. Failure to Provide Translation and Interpretation Services for Critical Attorney-Client Conferences

In Nevada, criminal defendants who do not understand the English language have "a due process right to an interpreter at all crucial stages of the criminal process." *Ton v. State*, 110 Nev. 970, 971, 878 P.2d 986, 987 (1994).

Trial counsel and the court hired interpreters for Tatiana for her trial, and throughout the trial jurors, counsel, and the court observed her with a bulky headset over her ears. Significantly, however, trial counsel did not use an interpreter for critical attorney-client meetings. Tatiana speaks English with a very heavy Russian accent that some people find difficult to understand. Her grasp of grammar, syntax, and vocabulary are similarly challenged. In addition, she has reported to postconviction counsel that she found conversation with trial counsel to

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be difficult for her. Specifically, their conversation regarding whether she should testify or not was cursory and abrupt. There was no discussion regarding the pros and cons of testifying. She relayed to postconviction counsel that trial counsel simply told her that if she testified, she would go to prison for the rest of her life. Although she did obtain a degree from UNR, she remains uncomfortable reading and writing in English, and was unable to prepare a written statement to law enforcement at the time of Harry's death. (See attached Exhibit A.) Moreover, her ability to communicate regarding complex legal issues is limited both by her English language skills and by the nature of her upbringing. Tatiana is a native Russian, and was raised in the former Soviet Union, under the powerfully authoritarian Soviet regime. These facts bear uniquely on her ability to communicate effectively with her trial counsel, especially about complex issues. Any assurances she made either to the police, counsel, or the court that she could communicate freely in English were fundamentally unreliable both because of a person's innate reluctance to admit shortcomings and because Tatiana's upbringing in an authoritarian state instilled in her a fear of authority and a disinclination to question, to object, or to voice her own ideas and opinions.

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A cursory review of the transcripts (See attached Exhibit B) of her interrogation by Douglas County investigators Garren, Chrzanowski, and Hubkey demonstrates Tatiana's language limitations. She clearly does not follow the statements or arguments coming at her, she is not fluid in her sentence structure or vocabulary, and her answers do not respond appropriately to the deputies' questions. In fact, counsel should have filed a motion to suppress the interview because of the obvious inaccuracies and unreliability of Tatiana's language.

Trial counsel's failure to provide translation and interpretation at attorney-client meetings violated Tatiana's sixth amendment right to effective counsel in two ways. First, it frustrated her ability to communicate with her counsel and to assist in her own defense. Without an interpreter, trial counsel failed to ensure that all interactions were understood and clear between herself and her client. Tatiana was also therefore unable to make a fully informed decision about whether or not to testify at trial – a decision that was crucial to the presentation of evidence and ultimately to her defense. Tatiana has no criminal history that would preclude her from testifying, and all other things being equal, the jury and the defense could have benefitted from her testimony and presence on

the stand. The simple fact that trial counsel knew an interpreter was necessary at all stages of court proceedings – including the preliminary hearing, trial, and sentencing - shows that an interpreter should have been present at all attorney-client interactions.

There was no reason not to have an interpreter present to make sure Tatiana understood the conversations with her lawyer. NRS 50.0545(1) provides that "[a]n interpreter must be appointed at public expense for a person with a language barrier who is a defendant or a witness in a criminal proceeding." And statutes such as NRS 7.135 provide that an attorney can be reimbursed for the costs of hiring an interpreter, so as to implement the sixth and fourteenth amendment rights of defendants to effective assistance of counsel, an adequate defense, and to due process and a fair trial. See, e.g., Widdis v. Second Judicial District Court, 114 Nev. 1224, 968 P.2d 1165 (1998) (holding that even defendants who have retained private counsel are entitled to reasonable defense service at public expense if they are indigent and show a need for the services). Trial counsel had no reason not to use NRS 7.135, NRS 34.750, and NRS 34.780 to hire a Russian interpreter for all meetings to ensure that all communications were completely mutually understood.

of specific legal training, Tatiana was unable to fully communicate with trial counsel. The attached transcript of her eight-hour interrogation by the police after Harry's death reveals her limitations. An attorney with whom the client cannot communicate is almost no attorney at all. The question of whether or not to testify is profoundly important, especially in a case like this one - by not putting Tatiana Leibel on the stand an opportunity to humanize her to the jury was missed, and she had no chance to tell her story to the jury that was trying her. It was crucial that Tatiana understand the consequences of not testifying. Having a trained interpreter only for court proceedings left Tatiana uninformed about the proceedings and unable to participate meaningfully in her own defense in violation of her sixth amendment rights.

Because of her limited ability to speak and understand English and her lack

II. Failure to Notice the Critical Trajectory Witness for the Defense

In this case, Harry Leibel suffered two gunshot wounds from a carbine, (a short-barreled rifle). Witnesses testified regarding bullet holes in the couch, the wall, and of course, Harry's body. The critical determinative issue was whether Harry's death was a suicide or a homicide. Dr. Omalu testified for the defense that

Harry's death was an atypical suicide. *Trial Transcript, February 4, 2015, p.23*. Matthew Noedel testified for the State regarding the bullet trajectories and concluded that it was more likely that Harry did not shoot himself: "I think the best explanation is that Harry Leibel did not shoot himself. . . . It creates much easier logistics if someone else delivered the shots, . . ." *Trial Transcript; January 30, 2015, p.100*. Noedel's conclusion, however, was far from beyond a reasonable doubt. Accordingly, defense counsel's paramount obligation was to demonstrate for the jury that the trajectory of the projectiles involved and the mechanics of how the weapon was operated supported a conclusion that Harry could have shot himself.

Counsel called retired Washoe County forensic scientist David Billau, who testified first about crime scene investigation, trace evidence, fingerprint analysis, and extensive cross-contamination of the scene by the first responders. Trial counsel clearly then expected to go on and have Mr. Billau testify regarding the bullet trajectories, measurements, and the staging of the couch in the room, as consistent with Harry having fired the gun himself. But counsel failed procedurally to notice Billau as a trajectory witness, and therefore, the court barred

his testimony on trajectory, limited him to review of the crime scene photographs from which he was unable to draw conclusions, and the jury had no forensic information from which to draw a conclusion of suicide. See Trial Transcript, February 2, 2015; pp.73-75, 84-87.

Defense: Based on your review of the reports and evidence available in this case, were you able to reach and conclusions concerning trajectory?

State:

Objection, Your Honor, as we discussed.

Court:

Ms. Brown, I think that's outside the scope of the

notice.

Defense:

I don't think so, Your Honor. If there's . . .

Court:

It's not allowed.

Defense:

Excuse me?

Court: It's not allowed. You may be able to rephrase that question but that question is not allowed.

Id. at p.84.

This failure to properly notice Billau, or to preserve his ability to present his research or opinion on a critical material issue, cannot be construed as a "strategic decision" on counsel's part. *See Howard v. State*, 106 Nev. 713, 722, 800 P.2d 175, 180 (1990) *(citing Strickland, 466 U.S. at 691, 104 S.Ct. at 2066-67); State v.*

Meeker, 143 Ariz. 256, 693 P.2d 911, 917 (1984) (strategic decisions are "virtually unassailable"). The simple fact that trial counsel called Billau expecting to present favorable trajectory evidence that would contradict Noedel's testimony establishes that counsel knew his testimony was critical to the defense, and the failure to notice him for the trajectory evidence was simply counsel's error in procedure. This is per se failure of constitutionally effective assistance and was per se harmful to the defense.

ADDITIONAL ERRORS OF COUNSEL THAT PREJUDICED THE DEFENSE

I. Failure to Move to Suppress Tatiana's Statements to Police

When an ineffective assistance claim is based upon counsel's failure to file a motion to suppress evidence allegedly obtained in violation of the fourth amendment, the prejudice prong is established by a showing that the claim was meritorious and that there was a reasonable likelihood that the exclusion of the evidence would have affected the result of a trial. *Kimmelman v. Morrison*, 477 U.S. 365, 375 (1986).

Given Tatiana's obvious language difficulties demonstrated throughout eight hours of examination, especially in the face of the aggressive questioning by the

 deputies, with no interpreter assisting, it is certainly reasonable that the court would have granted a motion to suppress. *See, e.g., United States v. Heredia-Fernandez*, 756 F.2d 1412, 1415 (9th Cir.1985) (confirming that "language difficulties may impair the ability of a person in custody to waive [his Miranda] rights in a free and aware manner"). In addition, the State relied on the transcript during trial to emphasize alleged inconsistencies in Tatiana's statements, and because she did not testify, she had no way to rebut the alleged inconsistencies.

There is no way to prove demonstrably that one single change in the conduct of the trial, such as suppressing Tatiana's statements, would absolutely have made all the difference. But the evidence of Tatiana's guilt was by no means overwhelming. Given the weakness of the State's evidence overall, suppression of the transcripts could well have made a difference in the outcome. *Cf. Big Pond v. State*, 101 Nev. 1,3, 692 P.2d 1288, 1289 (1985 ("[w]e cannot say without reservation that the verdict would have been the same in the absence of error"); (*Kirksey v. State*, 923 P.2d 1102 (1996) ("If the issue of guilt or innocence is close and if the state's case is not strong, [error] will probably be considered prejudicial.").

II. Failure to Retain, Hire, or Call Necessary Experts

Apart from the instances of per se ineffectiveness discussed above, counsel's multiple other errors caused harm to the defense's case and failed to inform the jury of important evidence of an affirmative defense or rebut the State's case.

Counsel failed to introduce favorable evidence, failed to keep out unfavorable evidence either by objection or motions in limine, and failed to cross-examine effectively. Specifically, she failed to retain, notice, and call experts whose testimony would have been critical to the defense of Tatiana.

A. Failure to Present Trajectory Evidence

Counsel's failure to properly notice David Billau for trajectory evidence is compounded by the fact that the defense had no one who could respond to Noedel's testimony. Noedel concluded that Harry had not shot himself, and the jury was left with that. The defense failed to present any evidence regarding how the Circuit Judge carbine gun worked, no defense witness explained important measurements, its trigger mechanism, or its unusual cylinder barrel and offset. It was incumbent on the defense to give the jury a basis for concluding that Harry Leibel could have shot himself and how he could have done so, and they failed.

B. Evidence of Harry's Drug Use

The record reveals Harry's chronic use of marijuana and indicates that he tested positive at the time of his death. Trial counsel should have made sure the jury understood how his use of marijuana would have affected both his physical and mental health. Harry's marijuana source, Chris Hedrick, would have informed the jury of Harry's physical pain issues, his use of marijuana, and his emotional deterioration over year prior to his death. (*See attached Exhibit C*.)

Trial counsel also failed to retain or call a drug expert to address the longand short-term effects of marijuana intoxication, including triggers as to underlying
mental health issues such as depression and psychosis, and how marijuana may
lead to suicidal ideation or to reckless and impulsive behavior. Although Dr.

Omalu addressed the issue very briefly, counsel did not follow up, and Dr. Omalu
did not qualify as a drug expert.

C. Judaism and Suicide

Testimony that Harry would not have committed suicide because he was Jewish came in at trial, without rebuttal (*Trial Transcript, January 30, 2015; pp. 13-14*), but the record includes multiple references to his suicidal tendencies and

threats, and also statements that he would not consider suicide because of his

Jewish faith. Counsel failed to retain or call a psychological or psychiatric expert

to address the complexities of suicidal ideation, including the risks associated with
repeated threats of suicide, bullying, and previous suicide attempts. It is expected
that an expert would address the prevalence of suicide in our society, suicide rates
amongst members of the Jewish community, the face that Jewish doctrine has
evolved to accept suicide and an issue of mental health rather than as a forbidden
sin, the predictability or unpredictability of suicide based on prior attempts or
threats, and information on planned versus spontaneous suicides.

D. Blood Spatter

Counsel failed to retain or call an expert in blood spatter analysis. It is expected that such an expert would testify that you would expect to see high-velocity blood spatter on an assailant who had fired into a victim at the ranges alleged in this case. The absence of blood spatter would also certainly be information that a trier of fact would need to understand in determining whether or not Tatiana had committed a killing as alleged by the State. Moreover, the absence

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of blood spatter would also tend to exonerate her, and failure to test the evidence could result in a jury instruction regarding spoliation.

E. Humanizing Tatiana

Given that Tatiana declined to testify in her own defense, trial counsel needed to humanize her for the jury. Trial counsel failed to present any witness who could tell the jury who Tatiana was. Tatiana's daughter Chaya-Anna would have been an excellent witness for this purpose, as reflected in her letters to the court. (See attached Exhibit D.) She could have let the jury see Tatiana as a loving mother and wife, as a supportive partner, as a loved member of her community. The failure to create a person for the jury to relate to left them alienated.

III. Failure to Challenge Testimony and Evidence

As noted above, not only is it defense counsel's job to introduce evidence favorable to her client, assuming it exists, but at the very least, counsel must challenge inculpatory and inadmissible evidence that the prosecution tries to introduce. Here, counsel failed repeatedly to object to inadmissible evidence, and furthermore failed to cross-examine witnesses effectively.

A. Trajectory, "mechanics," and the gun

Counsel failed to effectively challenge Noedel's testimony on gunshot residue, his methodology, measurements, notes, or raw data. The defense theory was that Harry could have shot himself. It was therefore incumbent on the defense to give the jury a basis for agreeing with that conclusion. Noedel's conclusion that it was more likely that Harry had been shot was speculative. It was paramount that the defense give the jury a way to understand an alternative explanation. The defense therefore needed both to challenge Noedel's testimony, and to present countervailing evidence, including evidence regarding the mechanics of the weapon, explanations for the location of the bullet holes in the couch and the wall, the movement of the couch, holes in Harry's robe, possibilities of ricochet, and accident. Trial counsel should have called a ballistics expert to testify to these issues and provide clarity for the jury.

B. Unexpected Testimony that Sharon Oren Told Harry Tatiana Would Kill Him

Counsel failed to move to prevent Sharon Oren from testifying. He testified that he "was afraid for [Harry's] life" and that he told Harry he thought Tatiana would kill him. *Trial Transcript*, *January 30, 2015; pp. 37-38*. Nothing in Oren's

statement to Douglas County investigators indicates that he would say anything so dramatic. (See attached Exhibit E.) If the defense knew Oren would testify this way, they should have sought to preclude him; if his statements were unexpected and there was a discovery violation, they should have challenged him immediately and called for a mistrial. Counsel's relevance objection was an insufficient and ineffective response to this highly prejudicial statement.

C. Improper "Scientific" Testimony by Lay Responders

Counsel failed to prevent or object to Douglas County Fire Department responders offering scientific and medico-legal testimony beyond their areas of knowledge, without having qualified as experts – including on questions such as how long Harry had been dead, blood clotting, rigor mortis, gunshot odors, the temperature of Harry's body, and what the holes in the couch and the wall might have meant in terms of how the bullets traveled. *See Trial Transcript, February 2, 2015; pp. 26, 28, 31-34, 35.* While Dr. Omalu addressed some of these issues in his testimony, counsel failed to challenge the admission of the statements from first responders that were arguably inadmissible pursuant to NRS 50.275 and .285.

D. Irrelevant and Prejudicial Testimony Regarding Arguments

Counsel failed to object to or move to prevent the Leibels' neighbor, Lawrence Kearney, from testifying that he overheard Tatiana and Harry arguing "every now and then" between July and October of the year before Harry's death in February 2014. Such testimony was completely irrelevant under NRS 48.015; nothing about it has any "tendency to make the existence of any fact that is of consequence to the determination of the action more or less probable than it would be without the evidence." And, such testimony is far more prejudicial than it is probative of anything and is inadmissible pursuant to NRS 48.035(1).

[The] litigant has a right to objective consideration of all proper evidence by triers of fact without violations of any substantial rights he may have as a litigant. He is entitled not to a trial free of all possible error but to a trial free of harmful error . . . [Where] error is so forceful as to leave its mark on the judgment, the trial itself is contaminated. An appellant whose right to a fair trial has been violated should be accorded that right anew. Retrial is a small price to pay for insuring the right to a fair trial.

Weakland v. State, 615 P.2d 252 (1980) (quoting R.J. Traynor, The Riddle of Harmless Error, 20, 22 (1970)).

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Postconviction counsel is not saying simply that trial counsel could have been better; the list of issues presented in this brief is not exhaustive. Experts should have been consulted, retained, and called; cross-exam should have been better; motions in limine should have been filed. Postconviction counsel has focused on the most glaring mistakes that rise to a constitutional level regarding Tatiana Leibel's sixth amendment right to counsel.

CUMULATIVE ERROR REQUIRES THIS COURT REVERSE THE CONVCITION AND GRANT TATIANA A NEW TRIAL

Although the Nevada Supreme Court has not specifically addressed the issue in a published opinion, it has relied on federal jurisprudence in analyzing claims of cumulative error in habeas cases. And the United States Supreme Court has clearly established that the combined effect of multiple trial court errors violates due process where it renders the resulting criminal trial fundamentally unfair.

Chambers v. Mississippi, 410 U.S. 284, 289 (1973) (holding that the combined effect of individual errors "denied [Chambers] a trial in accord with traditional and fundamental standards of due process" and "deprived Chambers of a fair trial").

The same analysis applies to multiple failures of counsel to provide adequate and reasonable assistance. See Harris by and through Ramseyer v. Wood, 64 F.3d

1432, 1438 (9th Cir. 1995) (concluding that prejudice may result from cumulative effect of multiple counsel deficiencies); *State v. Thiel*, 665 N.W.2d 305, 322 (Wis. 2003) (concluding that multiple incidents of deficient performance may be aggregated in determining prejudice under *Strickland*). Numerous small failures that individually would not be grounds for reversal can, in cumulation, render a representation ineffective.

Under traditional due process principles, cumulative error warrants habeas relief only where the errors have "so infected the trial with unfairness as to make the resulting conviction a denial of due process." See Donnelly v. DeChristoforo, 416 U.S. 637, 643 (1974). Such "infection" occurs where the combined effect of the errors had a "substantial and injurious effect or influence on the jury's verdict." Brecht v. Abrahamson, 507 U.S. 619, 637 (1993) (internal quotations omitted); see also Thomas v. Warden, 273 F.3d 1164, 1179–81 (9th Cir. 2002) (noting similarity between Donnelly and Brecht standards and concluding that "a Donnelly violation necessarily meets the requirements of Brecht"). In simpler terms, where the combined effect of individually harmless errors renders a criminal defense "far less persuasive than it might [otherwise] have been," the resulting conviction violates

due process. *Chambers*, 410 U.S. at 294, 302–03, 93 S.Ct. 1038; *Parle v. Runnels*, 505 F.3d 922, 927 (9th Cir. 2007). Here, the evidence of homicide was not strong. Trial counsel's errors were therefore all the more damaging to the defense.

Trial counsel failed to ensure communication with her client, failed to secure the admission of critical expert witness testimony that counsel knew was profoundly important to the defense, failed to retain necessary experts in drug use, mental health, blood spatter, and gunshot mechanics. Counsel failed to effectively cross-examine, object to, or move to prevent testimony and evidence of opinions of lay responders. This testimony and evidence was highly prejudicial, in clear violation of Nevada's rules of evidence and principals of fundamental fairness.

This court need not decide whether each of the specific deficiencies alone meets the prejudice standard under *Strickland*, because the errors, considered cumulatively, demonstrate the ineffectiveness of trial counsel. *See Mak v. Blodgett*, 970 F.2d 614, 622 (9th Cir. 1992); *United States v. Tucker*, 716 F.2d 576, 595 (9th Cir.1983) ("a court may find unfairness-and thus prejudice-from the totality of counsel's errors and omissions"); *Ewing v. Williams*, 596 F.2d 391, 395 (9th Cir.1979) ("prejudice may result from the cumulative impact of multiple

deficiencies") (quoting Cooper v. Fitzharris, 586 F.2d 1325, 1333 (9th Cir.1978) (en banc), cert. denied, 440 U.S. 974, 99 S.Ct. 1542, 59 L.Ed.2d 793 (1979)).

This court should not hesitate to conclude that there is a reasonable probability that, absent the deficiencies of trial counsel, the outcome of the trial might well have been different. See Strickland, 466 U.S. at 695, 104 S.Ct. at 2068. Indeed, the plethora and gravity of counsel's deficiencies rendered the proceeding fundamentally unfair. See id. at 696, 104 S.Ct. at 2069 (the "ultimate focus of inquiry must be on fundamental fairness of the proceeding whose result is being challenged").

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CONCLUSION

A habeas petitioner is entitled to a postconviction evidentiary hearing when she asserts claims supported by specific factual allegations not belied by the record that, if true, would entitle her to relief. *See Hargrove v. State*, 100 Nev. 498, 686 P.2d 222 (1984). Tatiana respectfully submits that she has done so in this petition and that she is entitled to an evidentiary hearing. Ultimately, Tatiana submits that she is entitled to a new trial.

Chris Headrick Interview:

At about 1300 hours, I interviewed Chris in the Interview Room in the investigations office at the Lake Station. The interview was recorded with video and audio format and downloaded to DVD and booked into the Douglas County evidence system. The following is a summary of Chris's interview.

Chris said he met Harry and Tatiana while he was dating LeeAnn Brooks. Chris said they dated for about five years. Chris said he met LeeAnn about a year after her divorce. Chris said he frequently had dinner with them and visited with them quite often.

Chris described Harmy as being very picky and very particular about everything. Chris said that Harry got along with all animals and was an overall general nice. guy however he did have an irritable side. Chris also described Harry as a "lonely guy" and added that he did not know why Harry would be so lonely.

Chris described Tatiana as subdued and did not know if Harry was controlling over her. Chris added that he never saw an argument between them. Chris said he never observed Harry being controlling and based has perception of Tatiana from her demeanor. Chris said that the majority of the time Harry was pleasant towards Tatiana and said he just had a feeling that maybe Harry was controlling her? Chris said he talked with LeeAnn about this and LeeAnn told him that taltama had been involved in a serious automobile accident and she had been heavily medicated for years prior LeeAnn told him that that might have something to do with Tatiana and her behavior. Chris said he did believe that Tatiana truly loved Harry and took very good care of him.

I asked Chris what he knew about Tatiana. Chris said he knew and talked with her

brother, Igor, and would do things with him and Harry. I asked Chris what he knew about Tatiana from before she came to the United States. Chris said Tatiana was very quiet and he never got into any conversations with her regarding her past.

Chris said he and Harry talked a lot and it was usually about how things are going with Chris and the work he does. Chris said that Harry would always try to steer him into another line of work other than cutting firewood and delivering it. Chris said Harry never talked about his personal life on his financial status with him. Chris said when you were at Harry's house 95% of the time Harry "had the floor".

I asked Chris if Tatiana worked. Chris said Tatiana was working on some type of high-tech software. Chris added that Harry really helped Tatiana on this venture. Chris said that Tatiana was working in Reno and possibly through the Gov.'s office or with a State Senator, and added that she was working some really strange hours. Chris said the past six months before the incident he would come over and visit Harry and Tatiana would not be at home. Chris said he'd ask Harry were Tatiana was and he would tell her that she worked all night and was sleeping. Chris said that Harry was putting a lot of money into the business that Tatiana was running and seemed to be stressed about it. Chris said that he had conversations with Harry were he believed Harry was irritated about the business that Tatiana was running.

Chris said that Harry was irritated by the late hours that Tatiana was working, but added at the same time he was happy that she was doing the business. Chris added that previously Tatiana got ripped off by the Russians. Chris said he was told that she had a multimillion dollar business deal with the Russian government because she worked for the Russians. Chris was told that Tatiana had a software program that she was trying to sell to the Russians through Oracle, but Oracle took her idea and cut her out of the deal. Chris said he believed the new company Tatiana was running was to get back at Oracle and develop new software.

Chris said at one point he thought Harry was about to talk to him about some financial issues, but then he would smoke marijuana and the subject changed. Chris said that if Harry didn't have his marijuana every day he is extremely irritable.

Chris said there was a time he provided Harry with marijuana and added that Harry talked him into being a grower in California. Chris said Harry had some serious digestive issues and that's why he smoked marijuana.

I told Chris that after reviewing the text messages between him and Harry it appeared that Harry was very demanding. I told Chris that it also appeared that he would not respond to Harry's texts. Chris said at times he didn't respond because with Harry it was always about Harry and added that he drives a lot and that's also why he wouldn't respond to Harry's messages.

Chris said when their opportunities to go to San Diego or Los Angeles that Harry would never go, it was always Tatiana. Chris said when Tatiana would go she would be gone for three or four days. I asked Chris how Harry dealt with that. Chris told me that Harry didn't like it. Chris said that Harry was capable of taking care of himself but he would rather have Tatiana there to take care of things for him. Chris added that sometimes he got the feeling that Harry liked

it when Tatiana wasn't there, and added it was kind of like a break for Harry.

Chris said he knew Chaya-Anna because she was still living at the house at the time when he met Harry. Chris said he met Lana a couple of times at functions. Chris added that Harry never spoke much about Tatiana's kids or even his kids. I asked Chris if Harry had an issue with Lana marrying a black man. Chris said no, and added that the issue he had was that Lana's husband was lazy. I asked Chris if he knew Harry's children and he said he knew who they were and met them at several functions as well. Chris said he got the sense that Harry wasn't too close with the children. I asked Chris if he knew if Harry had an issue with Cheron's husband, who is also black. Chris said no, he did not think Harry had an issue with black people at all.

I asked Chris about a text he had sent to Harry's phone on 02-24-2014. I read the following portion of the text to Chris.

"Harry my friend you have left me without saying goodbye? The good moments we've had and your truths of life and people that we have in our universe good and bad. I knew a month ago something wasn't right and felt you were going to be on your journey to another world." Chris said because Harry had talked about dying, which he had never done before. Chris said he thought Harry was into astrology and he talked about graduating from seven different lifetimes. Harry said he was on the top of his game on graduating into the next life which was the afterlife. Chris further explained that Harry talked about being in the last stage of life and that he was going into the next stage which was the eternal life. Chris said he thought harry wanted to be there because he was in so much pain. Chris said he wasn't sure where this ideology came from.

I asked Chris what he believed Harry meant when they talked about this ideology. Chris said he believed Harry had done everything and was ready to move on to the next stage. I told Chris it sounded to me like Harry had just come to terms with his own mortality and Chris agreed.

I asked Chris if he ever knew Harry to be depressed. Chris struggled to find an answer and then ultimately said yes that he had felt some depression in Harry. Chris said Harry had done everything, he was rich and he could do anything he wanted. Chris said the weekend Harry died he knew Harry was mad because Chris had not brought him any marijuana. Chris said he did not like transporting the marijuana into NV. Chris said according to Tatiana if Harry didn't get his marijuana he was extremely irritable. I asked Chris if Harry not having his marijuana would have pushed him to the point of taking his own life. Chris said no, he can't see Harry killing himself.

Chris said he was in Tahoe on the day of the incident and added that he had drove past the house and saw the yellow Sheriff's tape up and decided to keep on driving because he had marijuana in the car for Harry.

Chris said the part about good and bad people was that some people and things irritated Harry.

Chris said he remembers thinking he was going to have dinner with Harry on the night before he died but did not make. Chris said the next morning, Sunday 02-23-2014, he was worried because he had attempted to call Harry in the morning but Harry never answered the phone. Chris said that Harry would always answer his phone and that was the cause of his worry. Chris said he thinks he called the house phone and left the messages for Harry. Chris said he believes he tried

to call Harry between 9 and 11 AM that day.

2000 - Cheek phone records I asked Chris if he would be willing to allow me to extract data from a cell phone to see if I can verify what time he called Harry. Chris agreed.

I told Chris that Darla and Cheron had told me that Harry had a sharp tongue and could cut you up verbally with his words. Chris said he never witnessed any of that. Chris added that when Harry would smoke marijuana he would be less picky, less irritable and able to tolerate situations. Chris added that he could see Harry getting Tatiana "so pissed off", but he couldn't see her grabbing a gun and shooting him but may be throwing a pot at him. Chris said if Harry doesn't get his way he's a spoiled little brat. Chris added, "It's his way or the highway." Chris said that was only part about Harry that he didn't care for.

I asked Chris about another part of the text that was sent on 02-24-2014, that read, "This world wasn't right for your souI i couldn't say why? But I did see it." Chris said that he just didn't think Harry was happy. I asked Chris if that was the entire time with Harry or had it progress over time. Chris told me it. had progressed over time. I asked Chris when he started noticing that Harry wasn't happy. Chris said it was no more than a year ago.

I asked Chris if Harry ever talk to him about his medical issues. Chris said he talked a lot about his stomach issues and that he was in a lot of pain. I asked Chris if he thought the amount of pain Harry was in would cause him to take his own life, Chris said no. I asked Chris if Harry ever talked about the pain being too much for him to handle and Harry talking about taking his own life, Chris said no. I asked Chris if Harry ever talked about suicide in general terms,

I asked Chris since he knew Harry so well what it would take for Harry to take his own life. Chris said if Harry got news that he was terminally ill, he believes Harry may do something at that point to not prolong the pain. Chris said because Harry dealt with major pain. I asked Chris if based on Harry's religious belief if he still thought Harry would take his own life if he thought he was terminally ill. Chris said from what he's been taught about all religions is you will never make it to heaven if you commit suicide. Chris said with that in mind he believes Harry wouldn't take his own life and would deal with the suffering.

Chris told me that he was familiar with all of Harry's firearms. I asked Chris if Harry had a favorite firearm. Chris said that Harry loved his rifles. I asked Chris which one. Chris said the one hanging on the wall in the living room. I asked Chris if it was the AR style rifle and he said no the smaller caliber one. I asked Chris if Tatiana had a favorite firearm and he said she liked the pistols. I asked Chris if he knew if Harry kept his guns loaded or unloaded. Chris was adamant that Harry kept the guns loaded. Chris added especially the guns in the bedroom were kept loaded and said he had several spots in the bedroom where he had placed guns.

I asked Chris if he was familiar with the Circuit Judge. Chris originally said no but after I describe it to him he said he was familiar with it. Chris said Harry had showed him that weapon several times. I asked Chris if he knew where Harry kept it and Chris said he wasn't sure.

Dear Honorable Judge Young,

On the morning of Sunday, February 23, 2014, I received a phone call that scarred me for a lifetime. My mother called me hysterically crying, unable to make out any words that I could understand. After continuously asking her what had happened, but not being able to understand what she was saying, a deputy took over and told me that my father had taken his life and was found dead on the scene. I dropped to the floor, unable to comprehend what was just said to me. After hearing that I had lost my father, I came home to Lake Tahoe the next day to be with my mother. I arrived early the next morning and I was surprised to find my mother still being questioned at the sheriff's station. When she was finally released from questioning, for the first time since that horrific phone call, I was able to finally hug my mother. I was finally able to cry with her from the terrible loss of my father. We both could not understand how my father's death happened and were just in shock. For the rest of the day, my mother tried to make arrangements for his funeral since in the Jewish faith, my father's body needed to be buried within a certain time frame. Her actions did not mirror those of someone who had just shot her husband. Her actions were those of a loving wife who had just witnessed her husband committing suicide.

After being able to be in my mother's arms for that entire day, the next morning we were told to go to our home by Deputy Garren. We were told that our home was going to be released to us. However, Deputy Garren lied and tricked us in order to get us there. Once we arrived at the house, Garren pulled my mother out of the car and put her in handcuffs. Deputy Garren was taking my mother away after I had just lost my father two mornings before. Now both of my parents had been stripped from my life, and the second time, I actually had to witness it happen. At that moment, I had become an orphan. I was a child at 19 years old who had not only lost her father, but had witnessed her mother being ripped away from her life.

Since that day, I have had to grieve my father's death on my own. Since that day, I have had to cry myself to sleep without having my mother's arms wrapped around me. It has been terrible and torturous enough that my father has not been in my life, but my mother has been held in jail and I have not been able to grieve with her. I have been alone through the loss of my dad and my mom too. My parents and I were extremely close. Even though I left for college and live in San Diego, I visited home every break and holiday. I talked to my parents on the phone everyday or every other day. Unfortunately for the past year I have had no one to visit, and no one to call. Somehow I have managed to stay in school, but after every good grade I get on a test, there has been no one to tell. My mom calls me from jail every day, but I can't call her, it is not even close to being the same. We get a fifteen-minute time limit a day and then I am left alone again till the next phone call.

The loss of both my parents from my life has been extremely hard, but what has made it even harder are the lies and facades that Cheron Bartee and Justin Liebel have painted for the court. I have read both of their letters and although there are no direct lies, there are definitely misconceptions that I would like the court to be aware of. To begin, both of their letters have pictures of my father with them, however those pictures were taken many years ago. As much as Cheron and Justin

would have liked to have been close with their father, they were not, especially Cheron. Just so you are aware, Harry was initially my stepfather. Before him, there was no man who I ever considered calling my dad. He came into my life when I was eight years old and married my mother a year later. After that, I considered him to be my daddy as I was his little girl. Together, he and my mother raised me from a young girl to an adult. Cheron however stopped speaking to her father five years before his death. She sent him a hateful and mean letter telling him that she no longer considered him her father and that he was not part of her life anymore. It hurt him dearly, but they did not speak even once since that letter was given to him which would now be six years ago. In Cheron's letter, she stated Harry would not be a part of his grandchildren's lives. The only reason my father knew that Cheron had her first child was because I saw a picture on Facebook. After telling him that she gave birth to a little girl, he said that he did not care to even know his granddaughter's name because Cheron was not her daughter and that was not his grandchild. As sad as that was, Cheron should not be painting this picture of her and Harry being close at all since they were the exact opposite.


Since my father's death, Cheron has given away or sold all of his personal things. She had no care for any of his things that are sentimental to me, they were just tossed away to strangers, I wasn't even asked. Cheron may have been close to her father when she was younger, but the truth is that they had not spoken one word to each other for over five years. Cheron definitely has the right to be emotional about her father's death, but she does not have the right to be able to paint these misconceptions to the courtroom. In regards to Justin Leibel, he was still occasionally present in Harry's life even though Cheron was not. Once a year, twice if stretching it, he would visit our home in Lake Tahoe and stay for a short period of time. In court, he told the courtroom that they spoke about once a month. To me this does not resemble a close child and parent relationship, definitely not like the one I had with my parents. The last time I remember seeing Cheron was when I was in middle school, I am now a junior in college. As for Justin, I saw him twice when I was in high school and when he visited after Cheron gave birth to her first child, he tried telling my father about it but my dad refused to listen. Cheron and Justin are asking to have my mother, the only parent I have left, to be sentenced to life because they believe she took their father's life even though they barely spoke to each other. Instead of acting like my siblings, they have shut me out completely, turning everyone against my mother, and have tossed away all of my parents things. My mom's jewelry, her fur coats, all are gone. These were Mom's personal things not part of "Harry's estate." Cheron was appointed the executor of the estate without the court knowing the truth about her nonexistent relationship with her father and she chose to give away all of our family's possessions. Even though she took away my parents things, she cannot take away the memories I have with my father, the memories that she never made with him. On top of losing both my parents, Cheron and Justin have made this past year unbearable for me.

My mother is the most loving, sweet, kind-hearted woman that I have been so lucky enough to have in my life. Unfortunately this nurturing mother has been wrongly accused and has been sentenced to prison. I cannot even put into words on how terrible this makes me feel. My mom did not kill my dad!

This past year, I lost my father, my mother was been taken away from me, and my home has been left an empty place of memories, so I beg you Judge Young, please do not leave me with a life of feeling like an orphan. Do not sentence my mother with the highest sentencing. I already bear the hard loss of not ever having my father be at my college graduation, or my wedding, or seeing him hold his future grandchildren. Please do not let those moments be left without my mother being there as well. My mother already has three grandchildren that she will miss years of seeing them grow older, please do not take away from her being a part of their lives too. Please do not leave me with the absent memories of my mother not being a part of my adulthood. I haven't even turned 21 yet and I already have to deal with losing them both, please do not let me go on living my life without my mother. I beg of you to please give my mother the lowest sentencing possible. Since day one she has claimed her innocence because she has been wrongly accused of my father's murder. My parents loved each other. This has been the hardest year for me; please do not have me keep living through terrible ones for the rest of my life alone. Please let me know what it feels like again to be in my mother's arms and to at least have one parents present in my life.

INTERVIEW OF SHARON OREN:

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Sharon said he's known Harry for about three and half years. Sharon said he met Harry at one of the local gun shows. Sharon said Harry has visited him at his house, he's visited Harry at his house and they would spend time in the summer at the lake on the boat. Sharon said he knew Tatiana as well.

Sharon said when he first met Harry and Tatiana they had a good relationship. Sharon said he had suspicions about the true meaning of their relationship. I asked Sharon what gave him those suspicions. Sharon said based on his background, working with the Israeli Secret Service, and his wife's background, as a clinical psychologist. Sharon said with Harry and Tatiana it seemed too good to be true. Sharon said also the story of Tatiana's background. Sharon said Tatiana's story about being a business woman of her age from Moscow, being Jewish, with two young children, being divorced and moving to Los Angeles during the political regime in Russia at that time, Sharon said there's no such thing. Sharon said he lived in those parts of the world for quite some time and being stationed there and working with those governments, he believed her story didn't make sense unless you're some sort of government agent. Sharon said Tatiana said she had businesses and property in Moscow.

Sharon said about two years ago things started going downhill and fast. Sharon said it mostly involved Tatiana's older daughter. Sharon said the older daughter lived in Los Angeles and was involved with a man that Harry disapproved of, both of them were involved in drugs and having a problem getting money. Sharon said Tatiana didn't have her own money, that Harry was, "the money". Sharon said things were disappearing from the house and being pawned. Sharon said there was also money missing from accounts and possible embezzlement of funds from a scholarship or grant that Tatiana was working on. Sharon said the grant had some

to do with the state of NV, University NV and possibly NV energy. Sharon added that there were checks that were stolen and faked. Sharon said this was all stuff Harry told him about.

Sharon said Harry told him about checks of his that were stolen where his signature was forged by Tatiana. Sharon said Harry told him the bank, which he believed was Wells Fargo, was looking into that as well as credit card embezzlement too. Sharon said Harry was trying to delay the investigation with the bank because he wanted to see where things were going to end with Tatiana before it got out of hand.

Sharon said he met the older daughter twice, and even tried to help them find a place to live in Reno. Sharon said things did not work out in finding them a place, plus Harry had said no, that's it, and the older daughter ended up moving back to Los Angeles. I asked Sharon what he meant when he said Harry said, "That's it", what did Harry mean. Sharon said he thinks that's when Harry officially cut the daughter off financially. Sharon said during the same time Tatiana stayed in Reno working for about a week. Sharon said on a few occasions Tatiana would come by and ask his wife if she could borrow some money. Sharon said all this happened within the past 8 to 12 months, he thinks.

Sharon added that based on Tatiana's appearance and behavior he believed she could possibly be using methamphetamine.

Sharon said he tried to include him in things because Harry was always alone at the Lake. Sharon said in his opinion being alone was one of Harry's biggest fears. I asked Sharon if being alone was Harry's biggest fear, at what point did he think Harry would do something about being alone. Sharon said, "Nothing. Harry is too proud, too stubborn, and had it too good to kill himself." Sharon said Harry would never have committed suicide. I asked Sharon if Harry ever got to the point where he was depressed to the point that he talked about suicide. Sharon said never.

Sharon described Harry as, "One stubborn Jew." I asked Sharon what Harry's religious beliefs were when it came to death, the afterlife, and suicide. Sharon said in the Jewish faith if you commit suicide you're not allowed to be buried with your fellow Jews. Sharon said it's considered being expelled, so it's a very big deal in the Jewish community. Sharon added that you commit suicide you don't get the full Jewish ceremony and you're being buried what they consider "outside the wall". Sharon said it's a huge shame. Sharon added that based on his knowledge and friendship of Harry he was adamant that Harry would not have committed suicide.

Sharon said Harry's relationship with Cheron and Justin was painful. Sharon said the issues with Cheron and Harry troubled him and he was also trying to rebuild the relationship with Justin, because it was a real nasty divorce with their mother. Sharon said Harry was away from his grandkids, away from his daughter, who he had a lot of pride for because she worked for LAPD. Sharon told me the estrangement between Harry and Cheron was not because she married a black man. Sharon said Harry didn't approve of him as an individual.

I asked Sharon what was last time he spoke to Harry. Sharon said Harry was in the shop about a month and a half ago, but Sharon didn't see him at the shop, he spoke to him on the phone.

Sharon told me he believed Tatiana's brother visited twice within the past year

from Moscow. Sharon said he thought this was odd because Tatiana and Harry's relationship wasn't very good and Tatiana's brother visits twice in the same year.

I told Sharon he told me that Harry had stopped giving Lana money, and I asked him if Harry ever talked about also stopping giving money to Chaya-Anna or Tatiana. Sharon said Harry said for Tatiana yes but for Chaya Anna no because she was always special to him. I asked Sharon when Harry talked to him about no longer giving Tatiana money. Sharon said about eight months to year ago when the embezzlement stuff with the bank came up. Sharon said Harry told them he gave her an ultimatum to come up with the money to pay him back or Harry would let the bank go after her. Sharon said he believed it was in the neighborhood of about \$170,000. Sharon said what he understood was that the bank was waiting for Harry to press charges against Tatiana. Sharon said everything the bank was ready however Harry kept giving Tatiana more chances but it never happened.

I was finally able to cry with her from the terrible loss of my father. We both could not understand how my father's death happened and were just in shock. For the rest of the day, my mother tried to make arrangements for his funeral since in the Jewish faith, my father's body needed to be buried within a certain time frame. Her actions did not mirror those of someone who had just shot her husband. Her actions were those of a loving wife who had just witnessed her husband committing suicide.

After being able to be in my mother's arms for that entire day, the next morning we were told to go to our home by Deputy Garren. We were told that our home was going to be released to us. However, Deputy Garren lied and tricked us in order to get us there. Once we arrived at the house, Garren pulled my mother out of the car and put her in handcuffs. Deputy Garren was taking my mother away after I had just lost my father two mornings before. Now both of my parents had been stripped from my life, and the second time, I actually had to witness it happen. At that moment, I had become an orphan. I was a child at 19 years old who had not only lost her father, but had witnessed her mother being ripped away from her life.

Since that day, I have had to grieve my father's death on my own. Since that day, I have had to cry myself to sleep without having my mother's arms wrapped around me. It has been terrible and torturous enough that my father has not been in my life, but my mother has been held in jail and I have not been able to grieve with her. I have been alone through the loss of my dad and my mom too. My parents and I were extremely close. Even though I left for college and live in San Diego, I visited home every break and holiday. I talked to my parents on the phone everyday or every other day. Unfortunately for the past year I have had no one to visit, and no one to call. Somehow I have managed to stay in school, but after every good grade I get on a test, there has been no one to tell. My mom calls me from jail every day, but I can't call her, it is not even close to being the same. We get a fifteen-minute time limit a day and then I am left alone again till the next phone call.

The loss of both my parents from my life has been extremely hard, but what has made it even harder are the lies and facades that Cheron Bartee and Justin Liebel have painted for the court. I have read both of their letters and although there are no direct lies, there are definitely misconceptions that I would like the court to be aware of. To begin, both of their letters have pictures of my father with them, however those pictures were taken many years ago. As much as Cheron and Justin

would have liked to have been close with their father, they were not, especially Cheron. Just so you are aware, Harry was initially my stepfather. Before him, there was no man who I ever considered calling my dad. He came into my life when I was eight years old and married my mother a year later. After that, I considered him to be my daddy as I was his little girl. Together, he and my mother raised me from a young girl to an adult. Cheron however stopped speaking to her father five years before his death. She sent him a hateful and mean letter telling him that she no longer considered him her father and that he was not part of her life anymore. It hurt him dearly, but they did not speak even once since that letter was given to him which would now be six years ago. In Cheron's letter, she stated Harry would not be a part of his grandchildren's lives. The only reason my father knew that Cheron had her first child was because I saw a picture on Facebook. After telling him that she gave birth to a little girl, he said that he did not care to even know his granddaughter's name because Cheron was not her daughter and that was not his grandchild. As sad as that was, Cheron should not be painting this picture of her and Harry being close at all since they were the exact opposite.

Since my father's death, Cheron has given away or sold all of his personal things. She had no care for any of his things that are sentimental to me, they were just tossed away to strangers, I wasn't even asked. Cheron may have been close to her father when she was younger, but the truth is that they had not spoken one word to each other for over five years. Cheron definitely has the right to be emotional about her father's death, but she does not have the right to be able to paint these misconceptions to the courtroom. In regards to Justin Leibel, he was still occasionally present in Harry's life even though Cheron was not. Once a year, twice if stretching it, he would visit our home in Lake Tahoe and stay for a short period of time. In court, he told the courtroom that they spoke about once a month. To me this does not resemble a close child and parent relationship, definitely not like the one I had with my parents. The last time I remember seeing Cheron was when I was in middle school, I am now a junior in college. As for Justin, I saw him twice when I was in high school and when he visited after Cheron gave birth to her first child, he tried telling my father about it but my dad refused to listen. Cheron and Justin are asking to have my mother, the only parent I have left, to be sentenced to life because they believe she took their father's life even though they barely spoke to each other. Instead of acting like my siblings, they have shut me out completely, turning everyone against my mother, and have tossed away all of my parents things. My mom's jewelry, her fur coats, all are gone. These were Mom's personal things not part of "Harry's estate." Cheron was appointed the executor of the estate without the court knowing the truth about her nonexistent relationship with her father and she chose to give away all of our family's possessions. Even though she took away my parents things, she cannot take away the memories I have with my father, the memories that she never made with him. On top of losing both my parents, Cheron and Justin have made this past year unbearable for me.



That's ... that's crazy.

LEIBEL

I never see why this matter ... so she called me (unintelligible)

messages.

CHRZANOWSKI

So she called you today?

LEIBEL

No, no, no. She called me before.

CHRZANOWSKI

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

Friday. She said Mommy, please visit me, and blah, blah, blah. And I

said to her yes of course, you know ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... you need help. If daughter need it. I talk to Harry. He like ... again

you going (unintelligible). Yesterday I start ... I can't talk to him

because texting with Lana ... she said ... what ...

CHRZANOWSKI

So I just want to make sure I'm understanding why you're looking for

that. So on Friday Lana called you or texted you and said basically

please come visit me, I need help.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you started talking to Harry on Friday a little bit ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and he kind of gave you a hard time about going.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you started talking to him again yesterday about it.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yes. Yeah, and I said to her ... I said ... I sent yesterday a message

... if you look ...

CHRZANOWSKI Sure.

LEIBEL

Yesterday message ... I said to her okay I coming ten o'clock

evening. Uh ... yeah ten o'clock evning. She said okay. And

yesterday make reservation hotel ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... three days.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Three days ... come on.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

And ... so make reservation. I said I coming morning. Take keys.

Going to do small shopping until hotel open ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... you know next day. This is means today ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... I must be already Los Angeles. So yesterday start talking. He make me hard time. No, I kill myself if you going again. And I am alone. Nobody help me and la, la, la. And this ... how to ... revolver.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

This revolver always stay (unintelligible) our bed. And he sleep here.

I sleep here.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

And he always keep it here. Revolver.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. In like the bedside table?

LEIBEL

Huh?

CHRZANOWSKI

Is it in a table next to the bed?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. And ... and yesterday night he put the revolver together with

him. You know, scare me. I think ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... with my thinking ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... scare me. And I said to Lana ... I said Lana, I'm sorry, I have

uncomfortable situation. I talk to you later.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

She of course upset.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

Mommy, you not saying me true. You don't want coming. No, no,

no. no.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know I ... you know I said to ... so all night back and forth. I am

not sleepy because I'm worried something's happen this gun. He sleep together like ... like baby, you know. And our ... our doggie

always sleep together with us ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... our bed.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

A Doberman ... big Doberman (laughing).

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL Our ... our baby (laughing). So you know I said maybe this Bo ...

when he sleeping ... many times he (unintelligible) ... sleeping in

(unintelligible) ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL ... you know in our bed like ... like this.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL You know? And I am start worry if something happen this ... what he

doing?

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL You know? So I go in kitchen. I come back. I go in kitchen. I come

back. I'm ... my head already I ... I'm not remembering the names (unintelligible) so ... so ... and yeah. And after he woke up, he ... shave. He quiet. And I think myself how I tell him I need going ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL So he shave. I said to him ... I said ... he said I going take shower. I

said okay. I said before shower do you want to eat breakfast. He said oh that is good idea. Quiet. Sit couch. You know ... and he still

hold this ... you know ... like scare me.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL Like scare me ... hold it ... this gun. And ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right, okay. So he's still holding the revolver?

LEIBEL Yeah, he finish ... he finish his breakfast. And start T.V. pool table.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL Like finals ... somebody ... one guy Canada and another American

guy ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... play pool table. He like this (unintelligible) because he make pool

table not long time ago ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... our house.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Our house have pool ... poolroom ...

CHRZANOWSKI

That he made?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

He had poolroom, yeah. So I said okay maybe I say now I'm going to Los Angeles. So I said Harry I need going to ... because Lana again

...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... send me message. And I said Harry I need going to Los Angeles. He said I tell you you're not going anywhere and ... and starts screaming. I said oh my God, I am moving from ... from living room because I stay like this. He sit couch. And you know I moving kitchen. Open the refrigerator. I need drink. You know I take this drink. And I hear ... when I open refrigerator and I am not understand this ... "boom". I'm like ... what ... what is this? I'm running to living room. Just like short ... short moment. Kitchen

and living room are together.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, okay.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible) I am living room and I am like Harry what you doing. (unintelligible) and I come and he kind of hold ... hold like this. I (unintelligible) this way and I said Harry what you doing. And another "boom" shot. And I coming to him ... Harry, Harry. And I

running to with my first ... first think ... I call 9-1-1.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL But this woman ... when I talk to him ... this woman ... I can't

breathe. I can't breathe, I can't breathe. So I running to ... I call 9-1-

1. He like give me instruction. Take him from couch to floor.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL I think myself how I take him couch to floor. Because here couch.

This small table ... this is ... this is another table.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL And I need from here ... put him this floor.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL No, because this is hurt him maybe ... this is hurt. I don't know. And

... and when I pull him couch like this.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL You know ... so I think myself ... if I pull again, couch going to ... to

us ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL ... you know ... so I ... I again ... and I said to this 9-1-1 ... I said I

can't move him, I can't move him. He said okay, okay, calm down, calm down. Take this and pull him down. So I pull him down and

this falling ... not gun ... how call ... gun or ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL Gun?

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL Yeah. Gun going to floor. Pull him to floor and ... because this table

... glass ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL

... glass table.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

It is glass table. And ... and gun down here. And I pull him and his

head going to gun.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

So I take this gun and like ... like ... pull him like this. I don't know how I do this. I focus to Harry. So ... and the ... the instructor said pull him this and pull him this. Push, I push, I push. Somebody call

... I said he breathing, he breathing, he breathing.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

I think ... I think ... he like scare me. Because (crying) he scare me.

CHRZANOWSKI

He scared you? You think he was trying to scare you?

LEIBEL

I think because he always did ... he had ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

(crying) I think this is maybe accident. He would ... he scare me.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So you think ... what I'm hearing from you ... I don't ... I want to make sure I'm right. What I'm hearing from you is you think that you ... he might have been trying to scare you and maybe didn't mean to shoot himself or kill himself? Is that what I'm hearing

from you?

LEIBEL

But ... but hear ... by night said ... I kill myself (unintelligible).

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

But ...

CHRZANOWSKI

That was the night ... that was Saturday night, right?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

But to the morning I ... when I said to him I going to Los Angeles and

my voice probably more tougher ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... probably.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

I said I going Los Angeles.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know like make statement to him.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

You know ... so maybe he under ...

CHRZANOWSKI

To understand.

LEIBEL

Yeah, I going to Los Angeles but ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

But this is not ... person kill himself.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

I don't know.

CHRZANOWSKI

Has he ever talked about killing himself before other than last night

or before? Has he ever made those types of threats before?

LEIBEL

Sweetie, all the time.

CHRZANOWSKI

All the time?

LEIBEL

Because 2005 he have cancer.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Twelve hours operation I together with him.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

One month I am together with him inside hospital. I sleep couch. He

survive. He survive ... and this is Los Angeles operation.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He survive. Coming to here ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... and this Bob ... real estate ... find home ... home for us.

(knock on door)

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. Come in.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Can I join you?

CHRZANOWSKI

Yeah, come on in. Tatiana, this is my partner Brian. Brian, this is

Tatiana.

LEIBEL

Hi Brian.

HUBKEY

Hi.

LEIBEL

Hi.

HUBKEY

How are you?

LEIBEL

I'm ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so ...

LEIBEL

(unintelligible) what happen.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. What ... just so he can get caught up, I'm going to repeat back

to you what we've talked about so far.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

I want make sure I am understanding you ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... perfectly.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And then correct me if anything is wrong ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... okay? So on Friday night ... or Friday ... Lana called you and said Mommy I need help. Basically she just had two twin boys and I need

your help.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So on Friday night you started talking to Harry about going to Los

Angeles to help her out and he was not happy about it.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

He didn't want you to go. He told you you couldn't go ...

LEIBEL

I even tell Lana ... I said one second Harry become crazy ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... so need calm down.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So then you kind of let it go for Friday because he got upset.

So Saturday Lana texted you again. I need you ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... you're never for me.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Kind of trying to make you feel guilty.

LEIBEL

And her messages

CHRZANOWSKI

And I'll read them.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So again you start talking to Harry about ... I need to go to Los

Angeles to help ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... my daughter and he says if you go to Los Angles he's going to kill

himself because they'll be nobody to help him ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and you'll be leaving him alone ...

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and those things.

LEIBEL

Yeah (unintelligible)

CHRZANOWSKI

So you told Lana, you know, that Harry is freaking out ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and that you weren't sure if you're going to be able to come so

she got upset.

LEIBEL

Yeah she upset, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And so ... and you had actually made plans to go to Los Angeles by

booking the reservation so you could ...

LEIBEL

Yeah booking ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... so you could leave today ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... to go down there.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So last night when you guys were going to bed, Harry slept with a

gun

LEIBEL

Yeah. Like scare me ... I think like scare me.

CHRZANOWSKI

To try to scare you you thought.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. But he slept with it ... holding it kind of like ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... (unintelligible) while you're sleeping.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So he got up again this morning. You guys were in the kitchen and the living room. He was sitting on the couch. You were walking

around the kitchen. He still had the gun at that time.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So again you a little tougher told him that you're going to Los

Angeles to help Lana ...

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and he said I told you you're not going. You guys get into an

argument.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

You go to get something to drink out of the refrigerator.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And you hear the first shot.

LÈIBEL

Yeah, uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you go into the living room ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and you see him holding the gun ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... like this ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... with one hand out ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... one hand here.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. You say Harry what are you doing. And then you hear the

second shot.

LEIBEL

(crying) Yeah, but I'm close ... I say Harry what you doing.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right. Okay, and so the second shot ... so then you kind of panic

and you're having a hard time breathing. You call 9-1-1.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So they tell you to put him on the floor.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you try to get him onto the floor and you can't very easily.

LEIBEL

Yeah, he heavy.

CHRZANOWSKI

Because he's heavy.

LEIBEL He heavy. I can't get ... I try ... I can't. And he said no, put him ... put

him floor.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL And I take ... I think robe ... he have black robe ... I take robe and pull

him and couch come to us.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL You know ...

CHRZANOWSKI So you pulled him by his robe. Okay, okay.

LEIBEL (unintelligible) and I hold him ... and I put ... this is gun ... I take this

•••

CHRZANOWSKI So the gun was by his head. And you picked up the gun and moved

it.

LEIBEL I take this gun ... not like ... I take gun like this. (unintelligible) like

this slink ...

CHRZANOWSKI A sling?

LEIBEL No, slink. Gun have what name?

HUBKEY Sling?

LEIBEL Sling.

HUBKEY Okay. What does the gun look like?

LEIBEL Um ... one second ... like revolver. Like revolver, but big. Big, big

revolver.

CHRZANOWSKI Like how big? Can you show me how big with your hands? Is it this

big?

LEIBEL No, no, no. This is revolver. This is ... how say English ... okay if

you imagine revolver ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... imagine revolver ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... so this is like this.

HUBKEY

Okay.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so a big gun.

LEIBEL

Like this ... and this is revolver.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

This is not like (unintelligible) or whatever.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

This is revolver.

HUBKEY

Okay. First off, I'm sure ... I don't know if you've asked ... I'm going

to ask ...

LEIBEL

And he says this is my best ...

HUBKEY

Do you ... you speak ...

LEIBEL

... my best revolver.

HUBKEY

... Russian?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay. Do you understand everything that she's asking you?

LEIBEL

Yes, yes.

HUBKEY

Okay ...

LEIBEL

I ... I think ...

HUBKEY

... well because at the scene I guess there was a lot of ...

LEIBEL

I live here twenty-five years.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I finish UNR.

HUBKEY

You're what?

LEIBEL

I'm graduate ...

CHRZANOWSKI

She graduated from UNR.

HUBKEY

Okay. I just want to make sure that ... that you're ...

LEIBEL

I'm (unintelligible) ...

CHRZANOWSKI

She does. She understands English perfectly.

LEIBEL

Yeah, I ... too much emotional now. So my English going like this

and like this. So I'm sorry.

HUBKEY

Okay. You ...

LEIBEL

But I understood ...

HUBKEY

... you don't need ... you don't need an interpreter?

LEIBEL

No. No.

HUBKEY

Okay. I just want to make sure because there was ... there was some

concern.

LEIBEL

No, I understand.

CHRZANOWSKI

No, she ... she's good.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you did touch the gun. Did you touch the gun itself, or did you

touch just the sling?

LEIBEL

The sling and I put ... put this way.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Couch. I pull here floor. And ... and gun down here so I am worry he put his head to gun. So I take this ... all ... take this thing and put

this one and (unintelligible).

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. And then you focused on Harry after that.

LEIBEL

And ...

CHRZANOWSKI

You tried to do the CPR.

LEIBEL

... yeah ... and instructor said push him here. So I push like this.

And ... and the call ... people emergency coming can call ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... call door. So I running to door. My doggie ... oh and my doggie. Do you think somebody take care of my doggie? He need pee-pee

please.

CHRZANOWSKI

I'm sure they will.

HUBKEY

The dog is in the garage.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

The garage?

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

What garage? Why you put garage him?

HUBKEY

That's where the dog is. I was told the dog was in some kind of

garage or a room.

LEIBEL

No. He sleep together with us all ... always bed. He always

inside home. Why you put him garage?

HUBKEY

Because Harry's in the house right now. The dog can't be in the

house with Harry.

LEIBEL

No, I put ... I put guest room.

HUBKEY

Okay, then he's in the guest room.

LEIBEL

Oh, you scare me.

HUBKEY

I'm sorry. I'm sorry. I was told garage.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

No, garage different.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

No him go in heart attack (crying) ... he have heart attack.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. Does anybody else live with you and Harry?

LEIBEL

No.

CHRZANOWSKI

No, just the two of you. How long have you guys lived at that house?

LEIBEL

(crying) one moment ... one moment.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

HUBKEY

When did they get married?

CHRZANOWSKI

In 2004. Specifically August 16th, '04.

LEIBEL

Harry good to me. I am good to him. We have ... have never ... have

never (unintelligible)

(Chrzanowski and Hubkey in discussion ... unintelligible)

LEIBEL

(unintelligible) everything fine (unintelligible)

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, I understand.

HUBKEY

Okay, why don't you just take a minute. And my partner and I are

going to step outside real quick.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Take a deep breath.

HUBKEY

You take a couple of deep breaths.

CHRZANOWSKI

Can I look at your phone while I'm out there with him and look at the

texts from Lana?

LEIBEL

Yeah ... from Lana.

CHRZANOWSKI

Yeah, thank you. Just take a second and breathe, okay?

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

CHRZANOWSKI

Alright, thank you.

(Chrzanowski and Hubkey exit. Several minutes pass.)

(Hubkey re-enters)

HUBKEY

You feeling better? You need some water or anything like that?

LEIBEL

Yes, please.

HUBKEY

Would you like some water?

LEIBEL (

Yes, please.

HUBKEY

Okay, let me get you some. Give me just one second, okay?

(Hubkey exits)

(Chrzanowski and Hubkey re-enter)

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, you're feeling a little bit better? Okay. Before we continue, I don't know if you are aware of your rights, but I want to make sure that you're aware of your rights, okay? So can you read English?

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. And ... and I know you graduated from UNR. I'm not trying to

be insulting at all. I just ... I'm going to cross this out because you're not a juvenile. Okay? So you have the right to remain silent. Do you

understand that right?

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. Anything you say can and will be used against you in a court

of law. Do you understand that?

LEIBEL Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI You have the right to talk to a lawyer and have him or her present

with you while you're being questioned. Do you understand that?

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. And if you cannot afford to hire a lawyer, one will be

appointed to represent you for any questioning if you wish. Do you

understand those?

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI And you understand each of those rights I explained to you. And

having those rights in mind, are you still okay with talking with me

and Brian?

LEIBEL Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. If you could just initial each one of those. Don't worry about

those. And then there. And then just sign down here at the bottom,

okay?

LEIBEL Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI That way ... you know it can't be alleged that I forced you to talk to

me or anything like that, okay? Cool. And then just go ahead and sign down there. Perfect, thank you. Okay, so to continue ... so when you ... so your statement is that you picked up the ... the gun

by the sling and kind of moved it out of the way.

LEIBEL Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI So is there any reason that the gun itself would have your

fingerprints on it? Have you ever touched that gun?

LEIBEL I not remember. This gun always stay our bedroom.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay, it's always in your bedroom on Harry's side.

LEIBEL Yeah, Harry's side.

CHRZANOWSKI Did he ever take you out to the range to shoot ...

LEIBEL Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI ... or did he teach you to shoot?

LEIBEL Yeah ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay ...

LEIBEL ... of course.

CHRZANOWSKI ... so you have shot that gun before?

LEIBEL Yeah ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI So it would be reasonable that your fingerprints would be on the

gun?

LEIBEL (unintelligible) I don't know.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. Well, if I touch ...

LEIBEL You know why ...

CHRZANOWSKI ... I touch ...

LEIBEL ... you know why? Because he always come back to ... from

shooting ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... range ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... this Carson City ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL ... range ... he always clean guns.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah. He always clean guns.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL But, you know, this ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right, cleaning it ...

LEIBEL Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. So what I'm asking you is you ... you've touched the guns in

the house before because you guys go shooting?

LEIBEL Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. So do you know how to handle firearms? Did Harry teach you

how to hold ...

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI ... a gun and how to shoot a gun ...

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI ... and all that kind of stuff?

LEIBEL Of course, yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Are you good at it? Are you not good at it?

LEIBEL Yeah. I have a ... Harry and I and Harry friends from Reno going to

study ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... to make testing. And I have even ... Harry and I have ... what ...

bench ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... bench ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... bench name?

HUBKEY Shooting bench?

CHRZANOWSKI License?

LEIBEL How call this? I don't know.

CHRZANOWSKI Like a license to shoot the guns? Or a ...

LEIBEL Like allowed ... oh ... like allowed ...

HUBKEY CCW?

LEIBEL ... hold it. Like allowed hold it. Public, but not ... not University. Not

allowed University.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay, so ... oh you have a concealed weapons permit?

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL Yes. But this ... this ...

CHRZANOWSKI You and Harry both have one?

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

Other than the revolver that he was sleeping with and that was

involved ...

LEIBEL

He loved ... he loved ... he loved this. It's like his favorite.

CHRZANOWSKI

His favorite gun?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Do you guys have any other guns in the house?

LEIBEL

Yes, a lot.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, where do you keep those?

LEIBEL

Garage. Up ... he put inside safe.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Many ... like maybe fifteen pistols, guns, and one have gold.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He ... and ... and living room he have ... he put maybe seven guns

like this.

CHRZANOWSKI

On the wall?

LEIBEL

On the wall.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Then he one like ... he (unintelligible). When I (unintelligible) give me

(unintelligible) he give me present ... Magnum .22.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so he bought you a Magnum?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Beautiful ... beautiful revolver.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you both own guns? You guys collectively have several guns in

the house?

LEIBEL -

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

A lot, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And the ... the big revolver type rifle is always on Harry's side of the

bed?

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

When is the last time that you guys went to the range to shoot?

LEIBEL

Actually ... this is so funny ... I'm sorry ... actually morning he tell me

... maybe going gunshot ... range. And I stupid me I said no.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so was that this morning that he asked you to go to the range?

Okay. And you said no?

LEIBEL

Of course ... I am planning going to Los Angeles.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, okay. Was that before he ... did he ask you to go to the range

today before or after you told him you were going to Los Angeles?

LEIBEL

Before.

CHRZANOWSKI

Before. Okay, and you said no? Okay.

HUBKEY

So you've shot this gun before?

LEIBEL

Um ...

HUBKEY

Harry's favorite gun?

LEIBEL

... yeah. Um ... Harry always bring ... he have a lot guns ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... but he bring like for example (unintelligible) this one,

(unintelligible) this one, (unintelligible) this one. I took about pistol

or revolver or guns or you know a lot ...

HUBKEY

Okay, but you shot this gun specifically?

LEIBEL

Before, yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay, can you tell me how it works?

LEIBEL

Like revolver. This is like revolver.

HUBKEY

Okay, explain how you load it.

LEIBEL

I load it ...

HUBKEY

I'm curious. How do you load it?

LEIBEL

... like ... like revolver. Have ... have this one ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

You load it ... each ... load it.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And after you push this one, then shot like revolver.

HUBKEY

Okay, so the hammer.

LEIBEL

Hammer?

HUBKEY

Do you understand hammer?

LEIBEL

Hammer.

HUBKEY Well on that revolver there's a hammer that hits the bullet ... the

primer ... to cause it to shoot, right?

LEIBEL Okay.

HUBKEY You understand what I'm talking about?

LEIBEL No.

HUBKEY When you shoot the gun ...

LEIBEL Okay.

HUBKEY ... how does it work? Do you pull the trigger and the hammer comes

back and goes forward? Or do you cock it?

LEIBEL I think cock it ... revolver.

HUBKEY Okay, can you pull the trigger and just fire it?

LEIBEL Yeah, if you cock it you pull trigger, yeah.

HUBKEY Okay. So can you shoot it without cocking it?

LEIBEL You shooting cock in it. I don't know but Harry told me if you push a

lot ...

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... you shoot. But I never try this. This is for me very, very hard.

HUBKEY What's hard?

LEIBEL You know you said ... you talk about revolver ... you push cock ...

cock it you call ...

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... cock it ... and you push, yeah?

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL

But if you not cock it, Harry told me you push too much.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But I never do this.

HUBKEY

Okay, so how do you shoot it?

LEIBEL

Of course cock it.

HUBKEY

You always cock it?

LEIBEL

Yeah, always cock it.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Like revolver.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Because that makes it easier to shoot? It's not so hard?

LEIBEL

This is what I am not understand. Because revolver always need

cock it.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

This is my ... my opinion, yeah?

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, okay.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I think ... and ...

CHRZANOWSKI

So that's how you would shoot a revolver, or that's how you would

shoot this gun, is you would cock it first and then pull the trigger?

You wouldn't try and just pull the trigger without cocking it?

LEIBEL

Harry never do this.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay, so he ... you were always taught and you always shot that gun

by cocking it first ...

LEIBEL Because he ... he teach me like this and he do this like the same.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. So he shoots the same as you?

LEIBEL Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI You both cock it first, then pull the trigger?

LEIBEL Yes, because this is a revolver you know.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. And so what I think you were trying to tell me is that you have

a hard time ... it's too hard for you to pull the trigger if it ... if your

hand is not strong enough to do it without ...

LEIBEL What Harry told me. I never do this.

CHRZANOWSKI Oh, you've never tried it?

LEIBEL No ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... I've never tried it.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL Harry told me.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL Because his friend from Reno ... she buy revolver38 revolver ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL 38 revolver ... and she not have cock it. You know?

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL And she pull very hard.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

She even show me ... I said oh my gosh ... why you buy like this ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... revolver you know.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

So Harry revolver ... he always buy himself ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... you know. Harry revolver always ... how you call ... cock it.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, okay. That makes sense to me.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Who's Harry's friend in Reno?

LEIBEL

Huh?

HUBKEY

Who's the friend in Reno?

LEIBEL

Uh ... okay ... um ... Carrie and Joe.

HUBKEY

Joe?

LEIBEL

Joe. He pilot.

HUBKEY

Do you know Joe ... the last name?

LEIBEL

He pilot ... oh very complicated his last name. You know if you go into his ... if you go into his phone ... you find down Carrie

and Joe.

CHRZANOWSKI

Carrie and Joe?

LEIBEL

Carrie and Joe.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Uh ... he pilot. And she ... I don't know ... she not work yet. Her parents live California. This is very good friend. Always shoot together and make test together of shooting ... test together ... yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So this morning when you and Harry started talking about you going to Los Angeles and he told you you weren't going, how did that make you feel?

LEIBEL

Terrible because ... because my daughter already going nuts. You know ... she said I am not believe you anymore and ... my heart broken, you know? She has three kids you understand? One and a half and two boys.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know.

CHRZANOWSKI

Now Harry didn't want you ... and I just want to make sure I understand you ... Harry didn't want you to go because he doesn't agree with the fact that Lana is married to a black man ...

LEIBEL

He ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... and ...

LEIBEL

... he never like Lana.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

And he never like his first daughter.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He never contact.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, because they married black men and then Lana had children

with a black guy?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. He doesn't care this children.

CHRZANOWSKI

Is that the main issue why he doesn't want you to go see Lana is he

has a problem with that?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Is that the issue?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Well this bigger issue ... this is even ... he have cousin ... San

Francisco ... and he even fighting to her about his daughter because daughter marry black guy. So much ... even you call her ... I don't

know. Cousin ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... San Francisco ...

CHRZANOWSKI

So it sounds to me to like Harry had a problem with inter-racial

marriage.

LEIBEL

I think ... no he had emotional problem I think.

CHRZANOWSKI

So back to ...

LEIBEL

So after ... after operation he very change.

CHRZANOWSKI

So back to what we were talking about when Brian walked in ... so in 2000 ... so he's threatened suicide and threatened to kill himself a lot. Specifically after he had cancer in 2005, had surgery, from that

point ...

LEIBEL

In 2007 he have operation too.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, and what was ...

LEIBEL

2007 already here ... here ... Carson City.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, and what was that operation for?

LEIBEL

Operation ... he ... he's stuck and ... remove some things and ... he

have two operation.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

You ... you check.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so then after he had this operation in 2007 ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... he became ...

LEIBEL

What happen ...

CHRZANOWSKI

.... different.

LEIBEL

... yeah ... I explain you little bit. In 2005 he have operation. He have

insurance because his mom buy long term insurance ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... and ... yeah ... and he have insurance. So insurance covered this

operation ... this very big operation in 2005. Twelve hours. Children

coming.

CHRZANOWSKI

That's when he had cancer, right?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah, and wait and ... lobby ... and after twelve hours finish doctor said he survive ... survive ... and I stay this hospital like one month ... take care of him. I sleep couch. One time remove ... put us ... he one ... one person inside room after two person inside room. Two ...

two men ...

CHRZANOWSKI-

Right.

LEIBEL

... and then like uncomfortable, uncomfortable, but I still stay.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL You know ... so ... I remember one nurse she try change some

things and I said this is not right. Because another room somebody die and I ... so ... so scared my husband die. I said you not try do this ... and ... nurse she ... nurse she coming ... I said no this is not

right. And apologize to me. If he have hole here ...

CHRZANOWSKI Uh-huh.

LEIBEL ... he have two hole here and here.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL And here make injection I hear ... make some things. So I see

another nurse (unintelligible) yeah? And she make ... try make

injection here. I hear something different. So ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL ... so ... she change. She knew probably ... I don't know.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL And if she do this person die.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL You know ... so I start screaming ... what are you doing ... this is not

right. So take care of this problem.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL I stay one month 2005. 2007 he not have insurance. Why? Because

I'm coming to Lake Tahoe, this company insurance calls and said you not ... he tried call another insurance company. And another insurance company not insure him because he had precondition

cancer.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL So nobody insure him. He very sad. He start, you know, emotional

going through and, you know, not have insurance. So 2007 he have

operation. Doctor Steve Brook recommend doctor operation. And because Steve ... doctor Steve Brook ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... Harry doctor ... physical doctor ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... and ... and Carson City make him operation and what happen is because not have insurance he pay his money. You know and this is ... another emotional ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... you know. So he still pay it now.

CHRZANOWSKI

He's still paying ... you guys are still paying for it?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So he was upset because it costs a lot of money ...

LEIBEL

Everything, you know, everything coming ... so he emotional himself you know ... so ...

CHRZANOWSKI

And what about you?

LEIBEL

He good to me always. He always good to me. I am never fighting. I try not fighting together with him. Because I know him personality ... oooo. No, he screaming to his daughter. He screaming to his son. You know like very tough ... he like control person ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... you know. And even his ... his cousin from San Francisco ... she said Tatiana he very control you. I said ... but you know children gone and I ... that's okay control me.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

(Unintelligible) ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL

You know ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... what this means control. Person ... person not feel good, you know, and I take care of ... he ... he already used to I am 24 hours ... used to. And I'm going to UNR ... he call me many, many times. When you coming, what time you coming. You know ... student already ... stop, stop talking.

CHRZANOWSKI

Yeah. So he ... he was controlling but you were ...

LEIBEL

Controlling ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... to a degree you were okay with it.

LEIBEL

... too much.

CHRZANOWSKI

Too much.

LEIBEL

Everybody said he control me.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right. So it sounds like ... sounds like today ... yesterday ... Friday

... he was being his controlling Harry self ...

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and telling you you couldn't go see your daughter.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah ... I said no, I said I going.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Now, to me it sounds like ... is it ... do you have a problem with going against what he says or do you just do what you want? Or are you afraid to do what you want? How do you feel about it when

Harry starts ...

LEIBEL

I think ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... to control like that?

LEIBEL

... no ... I ... I think ... I think he like play ... not doing ... of course I am not even thinking he doing this, you know? Like he play me. You're not going or I kill myself, you know. But I scared because ... because this not first time. This is before when he have kidney stone ... this bad and this ... if you open he have like ... I don't know like maybe seven, eight stones ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

He pee ... pee ... and his stones but one stone is going through to his (unintelligible) and he very painful.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

Very painful. He screaming. He so screaming. Unbelievable. And he smoke a lot ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... with the pot.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

He always smoke.

CHRZANOWSKI

He smoked pot?

LEIBEL

He full ... full of his ... he smoke.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I'm ... I'm okay ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... because when he smoke, he calm.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know ... he talk too much but stay calm. But he calm.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

This is (unintelligible).

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

For example many times he would ... my friend told this ... when finish and couple days he not have it ... oh my gosh ... better not talk

to him. Better not (unintelligible).

CHRZANOWSKI

Right. He got used to it, okay.

LEIBEL

Oh my gosh ... it's like crazy person.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know.

CHRZANOWSKI

So this morning when he's telling you you can't go, what is his attitude like? Is he being this crazy person, or is he calm and just telling you if you go I'm going to kill my ... was he talking like you and I are talking right now? Just kind of calm?

LEIBEL

No, no, no. Already ... already more ... more not ... like voice a little bit up.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay, so he was upset.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. And so he ... and what exactly did he say to you this

morning? You said I am going to Los Angeles. You basically make a

statement. You don't ask for permission.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You just tell him you're going.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

What ... what did he say to you?

LEIBEL He said no, you're not going. You're not going.

CHRZANOWSKI And what did you do after that?

LEIBEL I go into kitchen, drink. Open refrigerator and drink this time.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. Go ahead.

HUBKEY Just back up a little bit. Just so I get some clarification.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY What time did you guys get up this morning?

LEIBEL My husband always wake up 4:00 o'clock or 3:00 o'clock morning.

After he have sleep, he go into computer. So today he woke up 5:00

o'clock ... 5:00 o'clock.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah. He put ... he put this rifle bedroom first.

HUBKEY Did you wake up also?

LEIBEL Yes, I did not sleep all night. I told you I couldn't ... crazy ... because

he hold this gun.

HUBKEY So was he like laying in bed with it?

LEIBEL No, maybe ... maybe I sleep. I'm like ... like this all the time ... like

this all the time. So ...

HUBKEY Uh-huh. So you both got up at 5:00 A.M.?

LEIBEL No, he wake up 5:00 ... 5:00 ... and he going to computer.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Little bit after going to shave. He shave himself. And I think I little

bit to ... together with my doggie. Doggie always sleep together our

bed.

HUBKEY Okay. What time did you get out of bed?

LEIBEL

Me and doggie I think like 7:00 o'clock. Yes ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... 7:00 o'clock morning. I coming and ... then Harry try be good to me this morning and yesterday too. He put cups and make my tea hot and ... and ... you know so I make tea. And I tell him thank you. He said to me welcome. So and after I take my doggie outside ... doggie pee pee. Going upstairs again. This is like maybe 8:00 o'clock. So I think ... yeah I give him breakfast ... I make breakfast.

HUBKEY

What time?

LEIBEL

What time? I don't know. Maybe 9:00 o'clock.

HUBKEY

What did you make?

LEIBEL

I make ... what name ... today going crazy ... I'm sleepy ... carson ... I

make open to carson. Carson?

HUBKEY

No.

LEIBEL

Okay.

CHRZANOWSKI

Like a sandwich?

LEIBEL

No, have bread like this ... how call?

CHRZANOWSKI

Toast?

LEIBEL

No, no. Cro ... cros ...

CHRZANOWSKI

A croissant?

LEIBEL

Croissants.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Croissants. I open to croissants. Put the cheese ... mustard cheese

and put oven. Our oven not working because old ... our oven old.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL So I wait ... I don't know ... for a while wait. I always wait ... more

instead good oven. So I open ... I smoke and he smoke too. I smoke

normal cigarette. So I go ...

HUBKEY What did he smoke?

LEIBEL He smoke pot.

HUBKEY Okay. This morning?

LEIBEL Yeah, he always smoke ...

HUBKEY How does he smoke it?

LEIBEL How he smoke? How he smoke ...

HUBKEY How ... how?

LEIBEL ... how he smoke? Okay. Before he smoke ... make cigarette. And

now ... I don't know ... he smoke cigarette or he smoke pot.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Glass ... glass beautiful.

HUBKEY Okay, so you made him breakfast. Then you guys smoked.

You had two croissants for dinner ... breakfast?

LEIBEL No, no, no. One second. He sit couch ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL He always ... if I'm making breakfast or lunch he always sit couch

and I need bring food. He eat. I take kitchen. This is his routine. He already used to ... to morning. And ... and yeah, he ... he here ... eat

breakfast and did you see my house ... upstairs?

HUBKEY Go ahead.

LEIBEL No do you see my house?

HUBKEY No.

LEIBEL Okay. So I sleep in (unintelligible) and have (unintelligible) ... I have

(unintelligible) in this dining room.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Dining room have balcony. So ... and have table, chairs, balcony.

So Harry and I always ... if I going to sit this chair, open balcony. Or

he open balcony, sit chairs and smoke.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL (unintelligible) smoke. So ... yeah I smoke. He finish breakfast and

he said oh, they want watch ... have pool ... pool table.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Final Canada guy and American guy play pool table like very crazy ...

shooting.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Shooting. So he ... he like this because our house have pool table ...

table.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL This is my daughter when she three years ago going to San Diego,

he said well she not coming to us anymore. Last year she coming only two times. And spring and winter (unintelligible). Yeah, so he said she not need this room and he make this room pool room. He make beautiful pool room. If you put ... he make T.V., pictures, guns,

pool tables. Beautiful. See picture ...

HUBKEY Okay, after you guys ... did you watch pool with him?

LEIBEL | watch what?

HUBKEY Did you watch T.V. with him?

LEIBEL Yes.

HUBKEY And what time did that start?

LEIBEL

I think 9:00 ... between 9:00, 10:00.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Sometime like this.

HUBKEY

So you guys are sitting on the couch watching pool?

LEIBEL

How should I ... okay ... here couch (unintelligible) ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... couch ... small tables ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Glass tables. Glass table ... glass table here.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Couch here. Separate couch ... and separate couch here. And he

have (unintelligible) fire place and T.V.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay. So now you have picture. So he sit here couch. Doggie always together here. And I sit couch here. Okay. So when become ... I remember when become commercial I sit couch here and I put

my phone ... where my phone?

CHRZANOWSKI

It's out there.

LEIBEL

Okay. I put my phone here. So when start commercial I open my mouth again. I said Harry I think I going. No tough (unintelligible) I think I going. He said no you're not going anywhere. So I stand up ... I stand up. He sit couch here. I stand up and look at him. I say Harry ... this is what I make statement ... I said Harry no I am going because Lana sent me message again. And I said no I am going. He said no ... no you're not going anywhere. (unintelligible) and I go in kitchen this time. And I'm so tired ... I don't know ...

HUBKEY

What were you trying to show when you were just standing there?

LEIBEL

Oh, (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

No, you stood up and said he went like this.

LEIBEL

Oh, this gun. He hold this gun.

CHRZANOWSKI

He was holding the gun?

HUBKEY

Like this? Like up and down? Like this?

LEIBEL

Yeah. He ... he sleep all night ... it's like baby.

HUBKEY

So then you went ...

LEIBEL

He said nobody take care of me. I am alone. Nobody take care of

me.

HUBKEY

Okay. So then you went into the kitchen?

LEIBEL

Yeah, I go in kitchen.

HUBKEY

Okay. What happened while you were in the kitchen?

LEIBEL

When I go in kitchen going to drink. Because he so upset to me when he said to me like this. You know I'm like okay and I go into kitchen, open ... open the refrigerator. And I take ... I want take drink. And this time "boom". I am not understand ... from beginning I am not understand what happened. I'm not even thinking this is happen. No, I am not even thinking this is happen. So I ... I close refrigerator. I running. And he hold this gun. And I like Harry what you doing.

HUBKEY

How was he holding it?

LEIBEL

I don't know ... he hold it ...

HUBKEY

Do we have a ruler?

LEIBEL

... second ... second he hold it kind of like this I think. Like this.

HUBKEY

So you have the butt ...

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

... and you have the barrel.

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Right?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Where was the butt, where was barrel, when you came into the

room?

LEIBEL

Oh, his ... pull ... bullet going to ... barrel?

HUBKEY

Barrel ... bullets come out of barrel.

LEIBEL

Yeah, it was barrel. Barrel like this.

HUBKEY

So barrel was which way?

LEIBEL

This way.

HUBKEY

So he was ... I don't understand.

CHRZANOWSKI

The barrel was pointing at him.

LEIBEL

Pointing like ... like pointing like here.

HUBKEY

So where was the butt?

LEIBEL

Butt up.

HUBKEY

Okay, so he's holding the butt like this?

LEIBEL

No, not kind of like this. Like this kind of.

HUBKEY

And he had the ...

LEIBEL

He ... he already ... when ... when I coming I already see his ...

something's here.

HUBKEY

So did he shoot himself?

LEIBEL

Yeah, this is what ... he shoot himself, yeah.

HUBKEY

You hear one boom, you come into the kitchen, and he's holding the

gun like this. Is that right?

LEIBEL

Yeah, kind of like this, yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay. And the barrel's down here by his abdomen ... lower

abdomen?

LEIBEL

Kind of ... kind of here.

HUBKEY

Here.

CHRZANOWSKI

She's showing her side.

LEIBEL

Kind of here, yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay. So ... that doesn't make sense. Do you have something long

like a 3-foot ruler or something like that?

CHRZANOWSKI

I can look and see what we have.

(Chrzanowski exits)

HUBKEY

I'll be back. I just want make sure we understand what's happening,

okay?

LEIBEL

Yes, of course.

HUBKEY

So let me ... let's just get something real quick.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

(Hubkey exits and then re-enters a short time later)

HUBKEY

Okay, we've got us a problem.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

(unintelligible) but I just kind of want you to ... so he's sitting in the

couch ... let's say this is the couch, right?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

So is this ... would we be able to say this is the couch he's sitting in?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay, could you sit there for me?

LEIBEL

I sit?

HUBKEY

Please.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

And I'm going to be you.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

So you come in there. He's sitting on the couch holding the gun.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Could you show me how he's holding the gun?

LEIBEL

I don't know ... I'm not ...

HUBKEY

So this ...

LEIBEL

... I am so ... (unintelligible) ... I said what you doing Harry.

HUBKEY

Okay, this is the butt ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... you put to your shoulder, alright? Revolver, barrel.

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay, could you kind of show me how he's holding it? Because I

just want to make sure I understand.

LEIBEL

Kind ... kind of like this. I don't know.

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay ...

LEIBEL

Like this. I am not remember ... I am not remember.

HUBKEY

Okay. Now that barrel is not touching your body. Is it ...

LEIBEL

No. Maybe like this. I don't know.

HUBKEY

Okay, but both of his hands were on the gun?

LEIBEL

I think so. I remember like ... like this.

HUBKEY

And it's pointed down at his ... you're pointing right here.

LEIBEL

Somewhere ... I don't know. Kind of like this.

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay. So you ... okay. So what happened?

LEIBEL

I was (unintelligible) and I ... and I see (unintelligible). And I said Harry what you doing. And I close my eyes and this moment shot again. The second when I am like this ... and the second shot again.

HUBKEY

Okay. So you see him. What is ... does he say anything?

LEIBEL

No, he ... like this.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I coming to him ... Harry, Harry, Harry. And I go in kitchen because kitchen have a phone ... home, home, kitchen, home. I don't know. I am not thinking because a cell phone I go in kitchen ... phone ... home. So I call 9-1-1. And after I make instruction what this ... this guy said.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay. So I guess I'm confused about some things so I want to

clarify.

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY He's holding the gun like this. Is this how you're holding it? Is that

reasonable?

LEIBEL Would ... you know ... do anything to me but I am not remember. I

remember kind of ... I don't know. Just like one moment. I don't

know. This picture.

HUBKEY Okay, I understand. It's very, very difficult. Okay, I understand.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY It's a very traumatic thing.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY But I just need to know as much as you know.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY So I want you to take your time and thing about okay?

LEIBEL Yeah, yeah.

HUBKEY Because you said he's holding the gun like this. Something like this.

LEIBEL Something ... I don't know. Something like this but

little bit low I think.

HUBKEY Like this?

LEIBEL (unintelligible)

HUBKEY Maybe like that?

LEIBEL Maybe like that.

HUBKEY Okay. And ... and you ... you come in and he's holding like ...

ohhhh. Like he'd shot himself?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Okay, and then you cover your face.

LEIBEL

Yeah. And the second shot coming.

HUBKEY

Okay, and then you go like this.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

What do you see?

LEIBEL

I see him open ... open mouth, open eyes, and ah, ah, ah, you know. And I ... Harry, Harry. And this moment I going to call 9-1-1. And I said he not breathing. He said put him on floor. This is time I pull him floor and start ... start doing this massage.

HUBKEY

Okay. Did he shoot himself once or twice?

LEIBEL

I hear two, two shot.

HUBKEY

Okay. But you gave him CPR, right?

LEIBEL

Huh?

HUBKEY

You gave him CPR.

LEIBEL

Yes, yes.

HUBKEY

What did you see?

LEIBEL

I see something here ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And ... and I see when I pull him I see couch go out here.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But I am not (unintelligible) him. Because I am so ... I don't know

even where second bullet coming.

HUBKEY

Do you know where the first one went?

LEIBEL

l am not even clue.

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay, go ahead.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So I'm going to walk back through your day, Tatiana, okay?

The reason I repeat it back ...

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

... to you is I want to make sure that I'm hearing you right.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

So Harry got up about 5:00 o'clock this morning.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

When he woke up this morning he had left the rifle ... revolver rifle in

the bedroom.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

Went into the computer room ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and did whatever on the computer for a while.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You and the dog woke up around 7:00 o'clock.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You went out. You made him some tea. Took the dog outside to go to the bathroom. Came back in and asked Harry if he wanted some breakfast. And so you made him breakfast around 9:00 o'clock. You

had croissants with cheese.

LEIBEL

He ... he make shave.

CHRZANOWSKI

Oh, that's right. And he was ... he was shaving ...

LEIBEL

Shaving.

CHRZANOWSKI

... while you were making breakfast.

LEIBEL

And when ... when he finish shaving he ... our bathroom ... and our

bedroom ... bedroom here and bathroom here ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... and computer another office room.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

So when he finish shaving and he pass at the bedroom he take the ...

this gun and sit couch (unintelligible).

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So he woke up, left the gun in the room. Went to the

computer room.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Came back to the bathroom to shave.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

After shaving, went back into the bedroom, grabbed the rifle ...

revolver ... came out to the living room and sat on the couch with the

gun.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

HUBKEY

Will you excuse me Nadine?

(Hubkey exits)

CHRZANOWSKI

You made him some tea. Had breakfast. He sat on the couch and

ate his breakfast. You sat on the little balcony and ate ...

LEIBEL .

Smoked cigarette.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and smoked your cigarette while he ate his breakfast.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

After breakfast he asked you if you wanted to watch the ... the pool

competition ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... between the American and the Canadian ...

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

... on T.V.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

You said sure so he sat on his couch, you sat on the other couch. While you guys were watching television a commercial comes on. He ... you ... on this commercial you start ... you start to talk to him again about going to Los Angeles and he says no, you're not going. And so then you stand up and you say I am going. And you make

your statement and he again says no you're not going.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And ... so you say okay because you know he's getting upset. You walk into the kitchen. You open the refrigerator. You hear a shot. You go back into the living room, you see him holding the gun and

looking kind of like ... you know ...

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

... shocked or whatever it is. So you believe he had been shot.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You say ... you cover your face. You say Harry what are you doing.

You hear another shot.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You open your eyes. When you open your eyes the second time, did

the gun look different the second time than the first time? So

remember you come from the kitchen.

LEIBEL

Yeah ... gun ...

CHRZANOWSKI

He has it here.

LEIBEL

... gun kind of like this but down afterwards.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so it's down after?

LEIBEL

Because ... because couch not like this.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

He always couch make like this.

CHRZANOWSKI

Oh, his feet are up?

LEIBEL

Feet is up.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so ...

LEIBEL

When I pull him ... when I pull him you know I ...

CHRZANOWSKI

It comes forward.

LEIBEL

... I make couch ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Come ... okay ... right, okay.

LEIBEL

... come ... yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So he's sitting here the second time ... so you covered your eyes.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

When you opened your eyes again after ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... the second shot ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... the gun is laying across his lap.

LEIBEL

Yeah, like this, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Like this, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. And then ... so the gun looked different the second time than

the first time.

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

It was in a different spot.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So it's laying across. You go ... you run to the kitchen. You call 9-1-

1. The ... the man gives you instructions.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

You say he's not breathing. He gives you instructions to pull him off

the couch.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Remind me how ... how did you pull him off the couch?

LEIBEL

Okay, first I start pulling. You know take his ... kind of up the leg.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He very heavy.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

So I tell this instruction ... I said I can't do this. He said no you must

put his floor ... try it. So I take robe ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right, his robe, okay.

LEIBEL

... I take robe and I pull him and couch make like this ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

... so I'm like very, very, very ... you know I hold him ... I hold him ...

head ...

CHRZANOWSKI

His head, right, okay.

LEIBEL

... because with gun ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so when you ...

LEIBEL

And I take this gun ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... so when you pulled him off the couch from his robe the gun fell to

the floor ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and when you put him on the floor it was right next to Harry's

head.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you pick up the gun by ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... the sling and move the gun away from his head ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... and then you start CPR because the man was giving you

instructions to push on his chest.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. Between that time when you picked up the gun and moved it,

did you touch the gun again after that? Or did ... did police come

and ... and paramedics come?

LEIBEL

No, I not touch gun, no.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, so that was the last time you touched it when you picked it up

•••

LEIBEL

Yeah ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... and moved it?

LEIBEL

... yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Now ... when ... after the first shot, when you came in and you're ...

Harry what are you doing ... did he say anything to you? Did he say

any words?

LEIBEL

Not any words.

CHRZANOWSKI

No words?

LEIBEL

No words.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. And then you have your eyes closed. Second shot. You open

them. His feet are still in the recline position. The gun is laying

across his lap.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI Does ... is he talking then or is he not breathing or what's going on

then?

LEIBEL The second time?

CHRZANOWSKI Yeah, after the second time.

LEIBEL No, second time he open mouth and like ... ah, ah, ah ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... like this.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. But no ... he wasn't saying any words to you or you weren't

able to talk to him?

LEIBEL No.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. So what is the ...

LEIBEL (unintelligible)

CHRZANOWSKI ... what is the ... and I know this is difficult ... what is the very last

thing Harry said to you? What did Harry ... what is the last thing he

said to you?

LEIBEL What he said you not going.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. I'm going to ask you a question.

LEIBEL Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI Please don't be offended by it but I have to ask you.

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay?

LEIBEL Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI Because of the ... it's kind of a strange spot

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... on Harry's body where these bullets are ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

... okay? Did ... did you shoot Harry?

LEIBEL

No. I never do this my life. I am ... I am never do this my life.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

HUBKEY

Never do what?

LEIBEL

Shoot people.

HUBKEY

Well just because you haven't doesn't mean you may not have today.

LEIBEL

I never shoot people.

CHRZANOWSKI

Well Tatiana, here's ... here's what I'm thinking ... and the reason I'm asking you is because Harry was being mean to you. Harry was keeping you away from your daughter, and I have a daughter.

LEIBEL

Oh, this is not ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Just hear me out, okay? Try and understand where I'm coming from

okay?

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

CHRZANOWSKI

I'm pretty sure I would be very upset if my husband said I couldn't go see my daughter and she needed me and I might ... I might become angry. So sometimes when people get angry, they do things that they normally wouldn't do. And so that's why ...

LEIBEL

But this is not ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... right, and that's why I'm asking you.

LEIBEL

... reason kill person. This is not reason kill person.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

This is not reason.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. So in your mind that's not a reason to kill Harry?

LEIBEL

This is not ... this is not reason kill person.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

This is absolutely no.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

How you kill person if you ... this is not first time argue about

children, you know?

CHRZANOWSKI

So you were used to arguing ...

LEIBEL

Yeah ... used to ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... with Harry over the children?

LEIBEL

Yeah, I always ... I said no Sharon ... this his daughter ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... no, you need to call her. No I am not call her. You know ... always

conversation about children.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

Because he and me and our doggie already (unintelligible) ... already

three years you know so you kind of you know ...

CHRZANOWSKI

So it's ... it's normal for you guys to have ...

LEIBEL

This is ...

CHRZANOWSKI

... an argument like this?

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Is it normal for him to sit on the couch with a gun like that?

LEIBEL

No, not normal. Not normal.

HUBKEY

Well I can tell you ...

LEIBEL

He make ...

HUBKEY

... there's nothing normal about it.

LEIBEL

... no he make before. He make many times before. But I think this

like scare me. And this time I ... I think again he play to me, you

know?

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

Like take my emotional. No I am dying, I am kill myself, I am dying.

This is always like this.

CHRZANOWSKI

So he always ...

LEIBEL

After operation.

CHRZANOWSKI

... says stuff like this? Okay.

LEIBEL

The operation, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

So he always says

LEIBEL

I already used to.

CHRZANOWSKI

So you used to him saying he's going to kill himself?

LEIBEL

Oh yeah, yeah. Just like he ... he always play together with me.

CHRZANOWSKI

So he always says these things to make you emotional and to try and

bother you ... to upset you?

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Does it work? Does it upset you when he says stuff like that?

LEIBEL

In many times I not even pay attention ...

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL ... you know.

CHRZANOWSKI Okay. Has he ever act ... I know he's said that he's going to kill

himself a lot.

LEIBEL But Harry ...

CHRZANOWSKI Has he ever tried?

LEIBEL ... Harry ... Harry and I never like fighting, hating each other. No, not

this one.

CHRZANOWSKI Right.

LEIBEL Not..

CHRZANOWSKI Just verbal.

LEIBEL Verbal and never ... never ...

CHRZANOWSKI So there's never any physical violence? You guys don't beat each

other up or ...

LEIBEL No.

CHRZANOWSKI ... or slap each other or push ...

LEIBEL Never, never.

CHRZANOWSKI Nothing like that?

LEIBEL No ...

CHRZANOWSKI Okay.

LEIBEL ... no, never.

CHRZANOWSKI So my next question, Tatiana, is so ...

LEIBEL I think ... because of ... our doggie ... I think what ... what I think ... I

don't know ... because doggie always sit together with Harry ... okay

... and my ... my opinion with first shot start doggie going crazy you know? He like ... you know ... I see Bo going to crazy you know. So maybe this is moment ... I don't know ... doggie make him moving or something. I don't know, you know. Something what ... what like this.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay. He said that he's going to kill himself before. Has he ever

tried to kill himself before?

LEIBEL

Yes.

CHRZANOWSKI

And how did he try to do that?

LEIBEL

He try him ... one time ... I don't know ... this is ... he fight with Sharon. Even my daughter said ... one time she ... said ... I going to this ball game. I said ... Chaya-Anna said Dad you okay? Like you know ... he play.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know ... who even thinking.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

You know ... like this ... when ... when he fight ... (unintelligible) daughter Sharon ... very emotional. He not sleepy. He going to crazy and ... you know ... all the time. Come on ... going to shooting. I said no I'm not going today shooting. Many times I said I'm not going. Because he want going. He always make ... (crying) ... sorry ...

CHRZANOWSKI

No, that's okay.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible) ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... (unintelligible) ... so ... he make shoot ... to shoot ...

CHRZANOWSKI

A target?

LEIBEL

Target. And he give present to ... to Reno couple. Make present his . (unintelligible) doctor. He give to present him. He kind of more ...

more focusing last ... I don't know ... maybe last year. I know what this happening when he start buying ... very crazy buying guns. You know like ... I don't know maybe this is what ... after Obama said no guns ...

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

LEIBEL

... and blah, blah, blah ... so people start buy guns. And he always

going to show, you know.

CHRZANOWSKI

Uh-huh, the gun show.

LEIBEL

Gun show Reno. Last time he buy another gun.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay.

LEIBEL

He ... he ... he like more focus guns ... guns, shooting. Because he

retired. He not work.

CHRZANOWSKI

Right.

HUBKEY

When is the last time he worked?

LEIBEL

Last time he work ... I never remember he work.

HUBKEY

How long have you guys been together?

LEIBEL

Already ten years.

HUBKEY

And how did you meet?

LEIBEL

Meet ... my girlfriend have wedding ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... Los Angeles. And my girlfriend friend to him. She invite him to

wedding.

HUBKEY

So you ... were you already in America?

LEIBEL

Yeah. Long time ago.

HUBKEY

How long ago?

CHRZANOWSKI It's been twenty-five years.

LEIBEL From ... first time I coming United States 1992.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Now I am already have green card and this year I'm thinking have

American passport. Just kind of ...

CHRZANOWSKI So you've been here a long time?

LEIBEL Long time. Already twenty-five years.

HUBKEY Where does he get his money from?

LEIBEL This is what good question because his mom and dad coming United

States long ago. Because he marriage ... he ... he ... he parents from

Poland.

HUBKEY Okay. So is he Polish?

LEIBEL No, because ... what ... what how he explain to me ... Poland and

Germany have some things ...

HUBKEY So he's Polish or German?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah, kind of German more.

HUBKEY Was he ...

LEIBEL I don't know what he ...

HUBKEY ... born in Germany?

LEIBEL Born in Germany.

HUBKEY Okay, when did he come here?

LEIBEL When he have two years old.

HUBKEY Okay, are his parents here?

LEIBEL Together with parents ... Los Angeles.

HUBKEY Okay. Are they still alive?

LEIBEL No, already passed away. Mom 94 ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL ... and Dad long time ago.

HUBKEY Okay, so ...

LEIBEL So parents when passed away ... already long time ago ... before me

... give ... give him two buildings. He have two buildings.

HUBKEY He owns two buildings?

LEIBEL Yeah, he owns two buildings.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL So what he do after this 2005 operation, what he do ... he said to me

do you want to visit Lake Tahoe. I said yes sure. So summertime his son Justin, and my daughter Chaya-Anna, and I and he take car and visit Lake Tahoe. So he told me he already coming Lake Tahoe every summer thirty-nine years and he dreaming live Lake Tahoe. He tired Los Angeles and blah, blah, blah. I said yeah why not. You know, Lake Tahoe very nice and even after operation doctor told me he

need more air ... kind of like this you know.

HUBKEY So is his source of income the two buildings?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY So he has two commercial buildings that ...

LEIBEL Two commercial apartment buildings.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL

And what he do he sell first building ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... and pay fifty percent our mortgage.

HUBKEY

Okay, so is that your guys' main source of income?

LEIBEL

What?

HUBKEY

Is that your main source of income?

LEIBEL

No, no, no. And he ... he ... he sell ... he sell another buildings ... more bigger. But he sell private. And this person ... company ... it's not person ... big company ... pay him certain amount money every month.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So kind of percentage.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And he said ... Harry said to me ... another five years ... and after five years maybe company ask him ... another three years and after give him full amount.

Ĭ

HUBKEY

Okay. And what is your source of income?

LEIBEL

My sources ... I finish ... graduate Lake Tahoe Community College.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I am going to UNR and graduate UNR. So after UNR ... and same ... same time when I study UNR ... I open company called (unintelligible) and work together with Microsoft so kind of I have a patent ... my patent.

HUBKEY

Okay. How much do you make a month?

LEIBEL

Uh ...

HUBKEY Do you have a monthly income, or how does that work?

LEIBEL ... no ... monthly income.

HUBKEY What is your monthly income.

LEIBEL My monthly income not have yet because this is ... Harry ... Harry

tried support me beginning ... this company ... because he inside

company too.

HUBKEY Okay, so right now you have no monthly income?

LEIBEL For me, no.

HUBKEY Okay. Now does Harry have a will?

LEIBEL He make will when he going first time operation 2005.

HUBKEY Okay. Has been updated recently?

LEIBEL He not told me but I am not know about this.

HUBKEY Well you're his wife.

LEIBEL But he not ... if he not told me this is means he not update.

HUBKEY Okay, okay. So what did the will say in 2005?

LEIBEL 2005 said ... I remember ... said after he ... he give everything me

and after ... if after four months I am die ... this going to our children ... four children ... twenty-five percent in children. If this is children

die after four months give to our friend.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL This is what will like ...

HUBKEY So how much money does he have right now?

LEIBEL No, he have five thousand or four something (unintelligible) every

month.

HUBKEY Okay, so he has an income of four or five thousand every month.

LEIBEL

Yeah, he pay mortgage.

HUBKEY

Okay. How much does he have in the bank?

LEIBEL

I am not know.

HUBKEY

I mean if he dies today, what are you going to get?

LEIBEL

I am not have idea. Maybe zero. Because ... because he ...

HUBKEY

Is there life insurance?

LEIBEL

... he (unintelligible) ... I am not know.

HUBKEY

How do you not know?

LEIBEL

He not told me about life insurance. And I am never make my life

insurance too.

HÜBKEY

So you don't have any ...

LEIBEL

I am not ...

HUBKEY

... and you don't know that he has any?

LEIBEL

No.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

About life insurance me and he never talk about this.

HUBKEY

What do you guys talk about? Sounds like you have a pretty crappy

marriage.

LEIBEL

What this means?

HUBKEY

Um ...

LEIBEL

Very wonderful marriage.

HUBKEY

... it seems ...

LEIBEL Always ... always together. Watch movies together you know.

HUBKEY But the way you talk it sounds like he's a very possessive person

who doesn't let you do anything.

LEIBEL No, he controlling.

HUBKEY So he is controlling?

LEIBEL He controlling.

HUBKEY Do you ... do you ... how does that make you feel?

LEIBEL I am okay.

HUBKEY You're okay with that?

LEIBEL I already live ten years. I am okay. He not control ... beat me or

control ... no. His personality control.

HUBKEY Uh-huh. He's manipulative.

LEIBEL Manip ... but uh ... everything he play ... from yesterday to

today ... play.

HUBKEY Play what?

LEIBEL Guns.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL No manipulate me. You understand?

HUBKEY What do you mean manipulate you?

LEIBEL Like ... like ... l kill myself, don't going.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL And I say okay, I am not going because I am worry he kill himself.

HUBKEY Okay, but ultimately you decided to go.

LEIBEL

Yeah, and ... and ... and afterwards I make statement I going.

HUBKEY

Knowing that he might kill himself.

LEIBEL

Because I am not ... saying that even think he kill himself.

HUBKEY

But he said he would.

LEIBEL

But this is playing. This not like first time.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

No normal person do you thinking person kill himself ... normal

person.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I am not even thinking about this.

HUBKEY

Okay. You need some more water? (speaking to Chrzanowski) - I've

got to call Preston. He keeps ringing my phone.

(Hubkey exits)

CHRZANOWSKI

I'm going to get you more water anyway, okay?

LEIBEL

Thanks.

CHRZANOWSKI

You're welcome. (unintelligible) okay? You okay? You doing okay?

Alright, I'll be right back okay?

LEIBEL

I need my medicine ... need smoke.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, hold on one second.

(Chrzanowski exits)

(Chrzanowski enters)

CHRZANOWSKI

Hi. You okay? Alright, real quick ... they ... what we would like to do

is take a look at your house to ... to look for anything that will help

us understand what happened today.

LEIBEL

Okay.

CHRZANOWSKI

Anything that's kind of ... of relevance to today's incident. Are you

okay with that?

LEIBEL

Yeah, please.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay, that's what I figured. If I could just get you to write your name right here and then sign and date it. Sure ... go ahead and write your name there. Okay, and then sign it right there where that "X" is at. And what it says is it's giving you permission ... me permission to search your residence. Here's the address ... 452 Kent Way, Zephyr

Cove.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

By me or any other law enforcement officer here in Douglas County.

LEIBEL

Yes, of course.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

And then if you could just date it. Today's date is ... sorry ... that's a good question ... today is the 23rd of February. And then it's 2014.

Yeah, that's okay. It's '14.

LEIBEL

I'm sorry.

CHRZANOWSKI

No, that's okay. That's okay. Alright, and then I'm just going to sign

as the witness, okay, that I saw you sign it.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Okay?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

CHRZANOWSKI

Perfect, thank you.

LEIBEL

I'm (unintelligible) ...

CHRZANOWSKI

No, I know.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

CHRZANOWSKI

No, I understand. Okay? Thank you. Alright, I'll be right back, okay?

(Chrzanowski exits)

(Chrzanowski enters)

CHRZANOWSKI

I'll be back in just a second, okay?

(Chrzanowski exits)

(Hubkey enters)

HUBKEY

Hey Tatiana?

LEIBEL

Yes?

HUBKEY

Do you need to use the bathroom?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay, come on.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Huh?

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Let me go ... let's go this way.

(Leibel and Hubkey exit)

(Hubkey and Leibel enter)

LEIBEL

Policeman said going outside.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I'm like this and I didn't have shoes.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And after somebody bring me ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Do you smoke?

HUBKEY

I don't. If I had a cigarette I'd give it to you. Um ... okay ... so before we start talking I'm going to read you your Miranda Rights again. Is

that okay?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay. Do you remember what they are?

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

These right here. Here, bring your chair over here.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Can you read these?

LEIBEL

Yeah. You have the right to remain silent.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

What this is means you put me in jail some ... some ...

HUBKEY

No, it's just because we don't know what's going on exactly yet. We're still trying to figure it out. So because we're unsure of what's

going on ...

LEIBEL

Yeah ...

HUBKEY

... we ... we ... your Constitutional Rights ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... as an American citizen state you have to know these.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay?

LEIBEL

Yeah, I understand this ...

HUBKEY

So ...

LEIBEL

... yeah.

HUBKEY

... so just until we know for sure what's happening ... okay ... they

haven't even looked in your house yet.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

Okay? They're waiting.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Um ... so because they don't know what happened, I don't know

what happened other than what you've said.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

So I want to make sure that you understand these.

LEIBEL

Yes, I understand this.

HUBKEY

Okay, so I wanted you to read them again ...

LEIBEL

Yeah, okay ...

HUBKEY

... before ...

LEIBEL

... if you want.

HUBKEY

... because we just ... we just separated and we didn't talk for ten

minutes ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... I just want to make sure you understand these.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

HUBKEY

Um ...

LEIBEL

Anything you say can and will be used against you in a court.

HUBKEY

Yeah, we're required to do this by law.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

So do you want me to read them to you?

LEIBEL

Yes, please.

HUBKEY

Okay. It says you have the right to remain silent.

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

It says anything you say can and will be used against you in a court of law. You have the right to talk to a lawyer and have them present with you while you are being questioned. If you cannot afford to hire a lawyer, one will be represented to represent before any questioning if you wish. You have the right ... no, that's a juvenile thing. Um ... do you understand each of these rights as I have explained them to you?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay. Yes or no?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Yes. Having these rights in mind, do you wish to talk to me now?

LEIBEL

I wish talk to you now.

HUBKEY

You have to say yes or no.

LEIBEL

Yes.

LEIBEL

I have apartment. Wonderful apartment. Have pool. Beautiful

apartment.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Together with my daughter.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So ...

HUBKEY

How old is your ... now do you two have any children together?

LEIBEL

He have ... no, together, no.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But he ...

HUBKEY

Do you have any children?

LEIBEL

Who, me?

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

I told you. I have two daughter.

HUBKEY

Okay. Oh, I only heard one.

LEIBEL

Oh no, no, no. I have thirty years old who I want visit to Los Angeles.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay? And I have nineteen years old who started San Diego.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay, yeah. Chaya-Anna. So Chaya-Anna... nineteen years old. When she have eight years old... Harrt (unintelligible) and very

funny when Harry (unintelligible).

(loud sound)

HUBKEY

Sorry.

LEIBEL

When he divorce first time ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... he divorce first time ... his daughter, Sharon ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... this time have eight years old.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So when he meet me and I have daughter eight years old, he kind of

think you know I continue grow this child.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And he very good to her. And she love him and he love her.

HUBKEY

Was he a good dad?

LEIBEL

Very good dad.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But very strong.

HUBKEY

Okay, what do you mean strong?

LEIBEL

Oh ... like you know ... don't doing.

HUBKEY

So didn't put up with any ...

LEIBEL

No, no, like normal.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But he very like controlling. His personality controlling.

HUBKEY

Okay.

speak to daughter or son he very tough talk.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Very tough talk.

HUBKEY

Are they good kids?

LEIBEL

Very good kids. His daughter what I told (unintelligible) ... his

daughter police woman.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And his husband ... her husband police woman ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... police guy. I think what ... what Highway police.

HUBKEY

Highway Patrol?

LEIBEL

Yeah, Highway ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... policeman, yeah. And ... but he black.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And this is what problem is.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Because my daughter ... I'm sorry ... my daughter ...

HUBKEY

So his daughter is a Highway Patrolman or your daughter?

LEIBEL

His daughter.

HUBKEY

And she's married to a black guy?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay. And he doesn't like that.

LEIBEL

Because his parents don't like it.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

His parents very religion.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Jewish.

HUBKEY

Okay. Is he Jewish?

LEIBEL

He Jewish.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And I keep (unintelligible) Shabbos every Friday.

HUBKEY

What's that?

LEIBEL

Shabbos ... called Shabbos.

HUBKEY

What is that?

LEIBEL

Okay, Friday ... every Friday ... when sun going down ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... you make candle.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And you make food and (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah, this is every Friday.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Are you ... are you Jewish?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So every Friday I do this.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So he very happy. So this Friday probably. So my daughter married

to black guy too.

HUBKEY

Okay, how does that make you feel?

LEIBEL

Seems like you know ... I don't know. I am not prejudice.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I very normal you know.

HUBKEY

So no big deal?

LEIBEL

No big deal.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

No. And 2000 ... wait a second ... 2012 ... I think 2012 ... my oldest

daughter get with husband and get with one child ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... coming to Reno ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... and he finish Academy ... Fire Academy.

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HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Fire Academy. So (unintelligible) and he ask I come visit her.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

She really need me. Because she have two ... two twins ... twins ...

two boys.

HUBKEY

When were they born?

LEIBEL

Born ... well cut stomach. One boy born 11:59, 24 June. At 12:00

o'clock 25 June, born another.

HUBKEY

So they have separate birthdays?

LEIBEL

Separate birthday. And one little bit darkness and another little bit

whiteness.

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay.

LEIBEL

So for Harry children doesn't matter. He not take no name his

daughter children.

HUBKEY

Wow, so he's really upset about that.

LEIBEL

Not even my daughter give ... um ... Facebook ... Facebook. She said Mommy look Sharon ... (unintelligible) Facebook (unintelligible) Facebook. And I come to ... come to him. I said Harry do you want to see your grandchildren? No, I'm not even once looking. I said do

you know even names? No, I don't want even hear about this.

HUBKEY

So he's very racist.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

So have you been down to see them?

LEIBEL

By who?

HUBKEY

Have you gone to L.A. to see your grandchildren?

LEIBEL

Sum ... yes summertime, yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay. And how did Harry feel about that?

LEIBEL

He call me every moment ... when you come back, when you come

back, when you come back.

HUBKEY

How long were you gone?

LEIBEL

I think four ... four days, five days, something like this.

HUBKEY

Only once?

LEIBEL

When children born ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... June. And when other? And when I visit Chaya-Anna San Diego

University. This is her birthday.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

September 30th ... her birthday.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And I visit Chaya-Anna and I stop Lana house one night.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I drive all morning ... like 4:00 o'clock morning I drive to home.

HUBKEY

Okay, so you've been gone twice?

LEIBEL

Yeah, even police stop me and give me ticket.

HUBKEY

(laughing) Okay. So how did Harry feel when you left those times?

LEIBEL

He didn't like it.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

He ... he call me every day ... every moment. Even ask my children.

HUBKEY

He what?

LEIBEL

Even ask my ... my daughter. He call me every moment ... when you coming, when you coming. And this time ... I think second time when ... when I start to little bit drive faster because he send me messages I am dying, I am so dying, I am so dying. I drive like crazy. Oh my gosh.

HUBKEY

What did he mean he's dying?

LEIBEL

Because he have ... what name ... how can I forget ... one second ... coming. Stone, stone. He have stone.

HUBKEY

Kidney stone.

LEIBEL

Kidney stone. Kidney stone \dots and he said this is very hurt me and I said going to doctor. So he not going to doctor. He need me. So \dots

HUBKEY

So you're very responsible for him.

LEIBEL

Very responsible.

HUBKEY

You're ... you're kind of his ... his ...

LEIBEL

Routine.

HUBKEY

His what?

LEIBEL

He want his routine, yeah?

HUBKEY

His roots?

LEIBEL

Routine, routine.

HUBKEY

Routine, okay.

LEIBEL

Not roots.

HUBKEY And you're part of his routine.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY And he doesn't like you being gone.

LEIBEL No.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL He want I do ... I told you when ... when he have hospital the

time I told 24 hours I am sleep couch. He not ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL ... stay together.

HUBKEY Does he want you there?

LEIBEL Yeah, he ...

HUBKEY Or do you want to be there?

LEIBEL No, he want I stay together.

HUBKEY He wants you there?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Okay. Now, is he currently ill?

LEIBEL Yes.

HUBKEY What is his medical condition?

LEIBEL He have ... what happen is 2005 Los Angeles operation.

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL He have insurance.

HUBKEY Yes, I heard that.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

And then 2007 ...

LEIBEL

2007 when coming here ...

HUBKEY

Okay, but that was seven years ago.

LEIBEL

No, no, no. His operation 2007.

HUBKEY

Yes.

LEIBEL -

But how 2005 ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... 2006 ... 2006 ... and he have operation.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

So he not have insurance.

HUBKEY

Correct.

LEIBEL

You imagine?

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

So he many money give to hospital from first building.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay, but is he ...

LEIBEL

He (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Okay, does he have cancer today?

LEIBEL

Uh ... he not check. Doctor told ... told him going to cut and he have

operation nose ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... because find cancer ...

HUBKEY

Skin?

LEIBEL

Skin ... skin cancer.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Cut ... cut like this.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And this one and this one. Like him ... like this ... so this one cancer. After he have now big bone ... not remember this one ... or this one ... I not remember ... uh big bone ... and he said I think this is cancer. I said going to doctor. He said no I am not have insurance. I said going to retirement ... you have already ... he already 65 ... November. I said go into retirement and make this ... what ... medical whatever what have ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... you know. So yeah, yeah, I'm going, I'm going. Every day ... I'm going, I'm going. You know how this ...

HUBKEY

Yeah, yeah. But do you know of any illness right now?

LEIBEL

No.

HUBKEY

He doesn't have cancer, right?

LEIBEL

No, he have ... he says he have cancer.

HUBKEY

He says he does?

LEIBEL

He says he have cancer. But I ... he said I am ... I am not going to

again cut my ... cut me he said.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL I am not going to cut me again. I'm tired already doctor cut me, cut

me. You know ... (unintelligible).

HUBKEY Okay. But he hasn't been in the hospital since 2007?

LEIBEL No ... uh no ... after 2007 he have nose problem.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Nose problem.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL He went to Carson City. I don't know what this is year. I don't

remember. This is after already 2007. Ask Doctor Steve Brook. He

... he give you full information about him.

HUBKEY Doctor who?

LEIBEL Doctor Steve Brook.

HUBKEY Steve?

LEIBEL He ... he here.

HUBKEY Where at?

LEIBEL What ... where I am right now? I am not even see where I am right

now.

HUBKEY You are at ...

LEIBEL No, no, no ...

HUBKEY ... Stateline. Steve Brooks?

LEIBEL Steve Brooks. You spell Steve like this?

HUBKEY Well you can also spell it ...

LEIBEL I...

HUBKEY ... S-T ... or I'm sorry ... S-T-E-P-H-E-N. Stephen?

LEIBEL

No, Steve.

HUBKEY

Steve is his ...

LEIBEL

S-T-1?

HUBKEY

S-T-E-V-E, Steve.

LEIBEL

Okay, okay. Brooks.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Dr. Brooks.

HUBKEY

What hospital?

LEIBEL

Not hospital. Here ... here ... this is physical doctor.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

You know ...

HUBKEY

Right next door?

LEIBEL

Not a ...

HUBKEY

Across from Lakeside Inn?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. Go in and find ...

HUBKEY

Stateline Medical.

LEIBEL

Yeah. We not (unintelligible) his medical condition.

HUBKEY

When did he last see him?

LEIBEL

Long time ago. Maybe one year.

HUBKEY

One year ago, okay.

LEIBEL

But he ... maybe six months ... I don't know.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And after he see ... last doctor he see ... (unintelligible) ...

(unintelligible) ... (unintelligible) and this is (unintelligible)

him (unintelligible) because with kidney ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... so much hurt him. And after he said to him going to skin doctor.

HUBKEY

So cancer, kidney stones ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

And skin ... skin ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... whatever it ... skin ...

HUBKEY

Any cancer in the body?

LEIBEL

No, he not told me about ...

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Um ...

LEIBEL

Some things grow ... grow ...

HUBKEY

Okay. How is his head?

LEIBEL

What ... hospital send this one and this one ...

HUBKEY

No, I guess what I'm asking is ...

give

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

... um ... in his ... in his head is he stable?

LEIBEL

He normal.

HUBKEY

He's normal? No ... no bipolar?

LEIBEL

What this mean bipolar?

HUBKEY

Um ... crazy.

LEIBEL

No, sometimes, yeah.

HUBKEY

Sometimes?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Hold on real quick. I think somebody might be knocking. I'm not

sure.

(Hubkey talks to someone outside the room)

HUBKEY

I'm sorry ... um ... so you say he's a little crazy?

LEIBEL

I don't know how explain to you crazy because maybe you think

crazy different. I looks crazy different. I don't know ...

HUBKEY

What do you believe?

LEIBEL

No, after hospital of course he sometime emotional.

HUBKEY

Okay. Like crying emotional?

LEIBEL

Crying and sometimes crazy like angry.

HUBKEY

Angry?

LEIBEL

Yeah. Beat ...

HUBKEY

Punch walls?

LEIBEL

... punch walls.

HUBKEY

Okay. Did he punch you?

LEIBEL

No, never.

HUBKEY

Never?

LEIBEL

Never. Not even ...

HUBKEY

Grab you?

LEIBEL

No. never.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Not even thinking.

HUBKEY

Okay, that's good.

LEIBEL

No, this is wonderful.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. I bless ... have good husband.

HUBKEY

Okay. So ...

LEIBEL

(crying) I have good husband. Take care of me good. Good

husband.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

He's a good ... good man.

LEIBEL

Good man.

HUBKEY

Okay. Why do you think this happened today?

LEIBEL

I don't know. Something ... something emotional problem. Because

I told you how before emotional problem.

HUBKEY

So he has an emotional problem.

LEIBEL

Emotional problem.

HUBKEY

Let's talk about that. Tell me about his emotional problem.

LEIBEL

Well sometimes ... for example ... before he try (unintelligible) with

his favor gun.

HUBKEY

His what?

LEIBEL

Favor gun. Favor.

HUBKEY

Feather?

LEIBEL

No. Favor.

HUBKEY

Favorite.

LEIBEL

Favorite.

HUBKEY

Favorite.

LEIBEL

Favorite. Thank you.

HUBKEY

Okay. His favorite gun.

LEIBEL

Favorite gun.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay. So he try this one. He hold it all the time this gun. Not ... not ... not good. Another time he buy it ... oh this is my favor. He put table. He ... you know ... I am not even pay attention or he put couch. It's like gun down everywhere.

HUBKEY

Why did he carry a gun?

LEIBEL

This is a good question.

HUBKEY

Okay. Did it bother you?

LEIBEL

No, actually, I am not even thinking nothing ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... happen.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Normal person ...

HUBKEY

Well ...

LEIBEL

... collection gun.

HUBKEY

... I'm normal ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... I think. I don't carry a gun all around the house.

LEIBEL

Yeah, this not normal.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

I mean and I have a gun ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... but I don't carry it all over the house with me.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

So why do you think he ...

LEIBEL

But if you ...

HUBKEY

... why do you think he did that?

LEIBEL

... if you come into my home guns everywhere.

HUBKEY

Okay. Was he paranoid?

LEIBEL

Paranoid.

HUBKEY

He was paranoid?

LEIBEL

Yeah, paranoid, because he always said if somebody coming to our

house ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... um ... I don't know if ... did somebody check my house now?

HUBKEY

Not yet.

LEIBEL

Not yet.

HUBKEY

Not that I know of.

LEIBEL

So he even buy special watch.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

When you open and have guns inside ... you not even know.

HUBKEY

A safe?

LEIBEL

No, not ... like wood ... wood beautiful and watch ... clock.

HUBKEY

Oh, you open the clock?

LEIBEL

You open clock and you have guns.

HUBKEY

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

Okay. So like this. For example ... yes he put now safe.

HUBKEY

Is there a safe number or ...

LEIBEL

No, no, no.

HUBKEY

Just pull the clock?

LEIBEL

Just pull the box and he always keep guns ready.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

He pull already bullets.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Aiready ready.

HUBKEY

Okay. Where is this clock at?

LEIBEL

Clock ... kitchen ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... in dining room.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Clock.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But I don't know ... uh ... because sometimes going to shooting ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... and he take this guns shooting. After coming home and he clean.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And after sometimes put, sometimes not put, sometimes put safe.

And safe ... oh ... have bedroom like this ... wood, yeah?

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And have pictures. Like wood pictures.

HUBKEY

Is there guns behind the pictures?

LEIBEL

And when you open have gun. Like Army gun.

HUBKEY

LEIBEL Yeah. So last time he buy like Army gun.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Like Army gun.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Not like toot, toot, toot, but very powerful gun.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Okay. So why did he carry ... he was paranoid?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY What was he ... what was he paranoid about?

LEIBEL No would ... he ... he think somebody coming ... always

somebody coming.

HUBKEY Always somebody coming.

LEIBEL Always somebody coming. He, for example, I coming to home and I

need close two times. I said Harry this is silly.

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL Two times. No, you need close two times. Not like one time key.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Like inside ... inside go "boom", "boom". Two times. Very paranoid.

And he keep ... I don't know who told ... who told him ... I think ... I think Ray his friend ... he said oh you have ... you keep everywhere. So what ... what ... what Harry ... Harry ... and he show everybody.

He show friends ...

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... where he keep his guns.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

You know ... he keep here ... already loading ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... where he's sleeping.

HUBKEY

In the night stand?

LEIBEL

... night stand ...

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

... loading. Then here loading. Here already take care of you know.

So um ...

HUBKEY

Did something ever happen that made him keep all these guns or to

believe that somebody was going to come after him?

LEIBEL

Somebody come out and like ... come out and grab.

HUBKEY

Has that ... has that ever happened?

LEIBEL

No.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

No.

HUBKEY

So was there any basis or reason to be paranoid?

LEIBEL

No, he always told me ... you know if somethings has happened to

our planet ... or United State ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... if Arab coming to you ...

HUBKEY

Arab?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

To ... to our, you know, United State ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And people ... resident people start of course shooting ...

(unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Okay. Is he a prepper?

LEIBEL

What this means?

HUBKEY

Prepper. Um ... lots of food stored, water ...

LEIBEL

Yeah. Before, yeah. After, no. This is what ... I think 2011 ...

HUBKEY

Lots of food, water, guns.

LEIBEL

Enough to (unintelligible). Come on Harry what you doing. Come

on.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

He said ... eh ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... maybe not.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay. So what do you ... what do you think was going on in

his head today that caused him to do what he did?

LEIBEL

I think he think I am gone and something's happened to him if he die

... with my ... my opinion.

HUBKEY

ls it ...

LEIBEL

And I am not ...

HUBKEY

... he ...

LEIBEL

... together with him. You understand?

HUBKEY

... if you're not with him he's going to die?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

So why shoot himself?

LEIBEL

I think because if he shoot himself ... with ... with my opinion ... he not thinking about this. I don't know but he ... he must ... I must together with him all the time.

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay.

LEIBEL

Even ask doctor Steve when ...

HUBKEY

Was ... was he on any type of like anti-anxiety meds or anti-

psychotic type medications?

LEIBEL

No, he not ... he not ... how is it to you ... uh ...

HUBKEY

Medication for paranoia?

LEIBEL

No. Because nobody said he paranoia.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I am not said nobody. He not said nobody. Not ...not going nowhere

•••

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... who know have paranoid.

HUBKEY

Okay. Well you believe he was paranoid.

LEIBEL

No, because he would do this ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

HUBKEY And you have a right to an opinion ...

LEIBEL Okay.

HUBKEY and ...and that's ... I don't know him. I don't know you.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY So your opinion ...

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY ... about him is very important to me.

LEIBEL Okay.

HUBKEY Okay?

LEIBEL Yeah, but I am not tell ... tell for example you he ... he bad. He very

good person.

HUBKEY Yeah.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Yeah, okay. But you think ... you think that today he shot himself?

LEIBEL I don't know. I still think he like ... he like maybe shot and he not die

for example.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL And I am stay crying and I going to hospital and stay ... stay together

with him.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL And I said to him oh Harry what you doing ... what you doing.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Maybe he thinking like this. I don't know ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... you know. I don't know what he thinking this.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay. You know ... has he ever tried to hurt himself before?

LEIBEL

Yeah he ... no. How ... how hurt? He always ... I told you he always try find favor gun and he play together with him like you know like

this, like this, like this.

HUBKEY

Did he ever point it at his head?

LEIBEL

Yeah, always. Even ... I said careful, what you doing.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Even last time ...

HUBKEY

When was last time?

LEIBEL

Last time ... no, I talk about last time his friend coming ... Chris ... and Harry show him this gun.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

Exactly with this gun ... shoot (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And ... and Chris hold it and have inside bullet.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

I said be careful, what you doing. Like ... you know ...

HUBKEY

But has he ... has he pointed the gun at himself before?

LEIBEL

Oh yeah. But all ... I always see this is like you know nothing

happen.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Like ... how he thinking.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Not ... not (unintelligible) like ... you know ...

HUBKEY

Is it always loaded or unloaded?

LEIBEL

Always loaded.

HUBKEY

Always loaded.

LEIBEL

This is what always scare me all the time you know.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

Even with us his friend Chris.

HUBKEY

Chris who?

LEIBEL

Oh geez ... I am not remember last name.

HUBKEY

Do you have his phone number?

LEIBEL

He have inside his phone number ... inside his phone.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

If you see Chris you find that Chris, yeah.

HUBKEY

Chris will tell me about the gun?

LEIBEL

Of course he (unintelligible) ... why he not told me about gun.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Um ...he want to visit today I'm sure.

HUBKEY

With what?

LEIBEL

With Chris. He ... he think ... Harry told me Chris maybe visit today.

HUBKEY

LEIBEL

I don't know if he visit or not visit.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

He sell wood. Wood for fireplace.

HUBKEY

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah, yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

He together ... together with girlfriend.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. And then before coming I make lunch all the time. (unintelligible) I don't know what happened this time. I (unintelligible) (crying).

HUBKEY

Do you blame yourself?

LEIBEL

I blame myself.

HUBKEY

You shouldn't.

LEIBEL

But if I ... if I am not saying I going he never ... he never do this.

HUBKEY

Do you need a minute?

LEIBEL

(crying) Huh?

HUBKEY

Do you need a minute?

LEIBEL

I'm okay. I have (unintelligible) when I ... when I see him I can (unintelligible) (crying).

HUBKEY

Okay, let's take a minute, okay?

LEIBEL

Uh-huh.

HUBKEY

Why don't you relax a minute.

LEIBEL

That's okay, that's okay. (unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Now how come you don't have a wedding ring on?

LEIBEL

Because I am take now medicine because menopause. You know

menopause?

HUBKEY

Menopause?

LEIBEL

Menopause.

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

Doctor give me medicine.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And I am now become fat. And everything fat. Everything fat.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Look at me. Before I ...

HUBKEY

You're not ...

LEIBEL

... no, no, before I ... before I am ...

HUBKEY

Very skinny?

LEIBEL

... very skinny like this.

HUBKEY

Oh, okay.

LEIBEL

And my ... my finger skinny.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Not ...

HUBKEY

So your ring doesn't fit no more?

LEIBEL

No, no everything fat. I am fat now.

HUBKEY

I think you look fine.

LEIBEL

No I am fat. I need to ...

HUBKEY

(laughing)

LEIBEL

... (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

So it sounds like all in all your marriage was pretty decent.

LEIBEL

Normal.

HUBKEY

Normal.

LEIBEL

I think normal.

HUBKEY

Okay. Have you been married before?

LEIBEL

Yes, of course.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I married before because I got two children ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... before him.

HUBKEY

What happened to that marriage?

LEIBEL

Uh ... I am divorce ... divorce. With my first daughter born Moscow.

HUBKEY

What?

LEIBEL

Okay. I live Moscow.

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

Russia ... Mosčow.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And my first daughter born Moscow.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay. So I divorce my first husband.

HUBKEY

In Moscow.

LEIBEL

-In-Moscow.

HUBKEY

How come?

LEIBEL

Uh ... he drinking a lot.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And have many uncomfortable situation. So I ...

HUBKEY

Women?

LEIBEL

Huh?

HUBKEY

Women?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Not only woman ... prostitute.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

But you know uh ...

HUBKEY

Is he still alive?

LEIBEL

No, actually. He problem ... he have problem leg ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... and doctors make operation and somethings forget inside. And he coming home ... stay home after I don't know couple of days or

whatever ... his leg become gangrene.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Gangrene. And going to second time operation. Now the second

time operation he die.

HUBKEY

Okay. When was that?

LEIBEL

When was that? Let me think. Oh ... when he die, yeah?

HUBKEY

Yeah, when.

LEIBEL

Yeah ... I think 2000.

HUBKEY

2000.

LEIBEL

2001, something ...

HUBKEY

Okay. When did you guys divorce?

LEIBEL

Oh long time ago.

HUBKEY

What year?

LEIBEL

Oh ... um ... '90?

HUBKEY

Okay, so you divorced in 1990. And then he died in 2000.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I already not live together with him.

HUBKEY

Huh?

LEIBEL

Yeah I not live together.

HUBKEY

Okay, when did you move to America?

LEIBEL

America ... I have ... I open company when I divorce him.

HUBKEY

LEIBEL

I open company. Company going very well. And I coming United

State 1992.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Visit, look around. I have money. A lot money.

HUBKEY

More than now?

LEIBEL

Oh all of my ... now I live like for example if you live Moscow you like

live I don't know (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Live Moscow you make a lot of money.

HUBKEY

In Moscow?

LEIBEL

In Moscow.

HUBKEY

Lots of money?

LEIBEL

Lot of money.

HUBKEY

How come?

LEIBEL

Uh because he not have money and not have friends.

HUBKEY

Ah, okay.

LEIBEL

This is mentality.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And here ... doesn't matter.

HUBKEY

LEIBEL

You know ... you have home. You have live ... what ...what you have

live. (Unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

But not Moscow.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah, crazy, crazy.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. So I look around. I have business visa. Uh ... 1992 ... I stay

like two weeks. And after 1993, I come back and 1997 ... 1997 I

marry that one guy. Terrible guy. Terrible.

HUBKEY

So '97 you married somebody in the U.S.?

LEIBEL

On U.S., yeah, U.S., yeah.

HUBKEY

And who was that?

LEIBEL

Jim Landes.

HUBKEY

Jim Anders?

LEIBEL

Landes.

HUBKEY

How do you spell that?

LEIBEL

Landes?

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

L-A-N-D-I-A-S.

HUBKEY

A-S?

LEIBEL

No, no, no. Not A, not A. Yeah, Landis ...

HUBKEY

LEIBEL

Landis ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Landis.

HUBKEY

Is he ... where does he live?

LEIBEL

Oh how I know?

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I am ... I am so hard divorce him.

HUBKEY -

And why did you divorce him?

LEIBEL

Oh, terrible person. Terrible ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... person. Terrible person.

HUBKEY

Like how? Physically?

LEIBEL

Uh ... he have ... he need woman every day in different home. How I

know?

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

You know ... I am not know married to him.

HUBKEY

Okay. So is he ...

LEIBEL

He very nice.

HUBKEY

... he was cheating?

LEIBEL

Oh ... not this question cheating. This is like terrible.

HUBKEY

Okay. When did you divorce him?

LEIBEL

Uh ... yeah ... uh I am separate 19 ... 1999 I think separate. Or 1998.

I am not remember now.

HUBKEY

Divorced?

LEIBEL

No, separate.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Separate. And start going to court ... and start become divorce.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible) he talk about me ... my (unintelligible) ...

HUBKEY

Yeah, yeah, yeah.

LEIBEL

... you know.

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

Going back and forth, back and forth. And judge ... they give him

pay me ... my lawyer, you know, and my apartment.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

So he refuse. But he pay some things and I think ... I think 2001 ... no, no, no ... I think beginning 2002 ... can't remember ... because this is Los Angeles. Not have seasons.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

And very hard remember (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

So somewhere in 2001 you divorced him?

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

I divorce him.

HUBKEY

Okay, and ...

LEIBEL

Uh ... 2001 ... 2002 ... beginning 2002 I think I divorce him.

HUBKEY Okay, and then you married him in 2004?

LEIBEL So I divorce him. And 2002, this another girlfriend ... I remember this

I think fall ... (unintelligible).

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL Fall ... fall? Spring ... after summer?

HUBKEY Fall.

LEIBEL Fall. My girlfriend have wedding.

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL She ... she have ... she have wedding. And of course she invite me.

And she invite Harry.

HUBKEY Uh-huh.

LEIBEL And this time I see him and that's it.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL He see me and after ... and after he always tell people story of he see

me and this is like vision on a woman who's psychic until he

(unintelligible) meet your ...your girl. Fair, small, skinny,

(unintelligible), whatever, he always tell the story. And he said when

I see her I start to ... I know this is ... this is ...

HUBKEY Okay. Had he ever been married before?

LEIBEL Yes, of course. (unintelligible)

HUBKEY Who was he married to?

LEIBEL (unintelligible)

HUBKEY What was her name?

LEIBEL Who?

uglas County Sheriff's Departme

HUBKEY Was he married?

LEIBEL He married before.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah, her name Susan. Her name Susan. (unintelligible) question

emotional for me. I think ... I don't know ... what time is it?

HUBKEY Let me look. 4:30.

LEIBEL 4:30. Because ... I don't know ... my phone ... you take my phone.

HUBKEY Do you need it?

LEIBEL My daughter ... younger daughter ... she said she coming.

HUBKEY Call you?

LEIBEL She ... she tell me ... message ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL ... voicemail. She said she coming. She ...

HUBKEY Oh, she's coming up here? Okay. She won't be here till late ... 10:00

o'clock tonight?

LEIBEL What you think?

HUBKEY Well it's about a ... from L.A.?

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY It's about an eight hour drive.

LEIBEL No, don't drive ... fly.

HUBKEY Oh.

LEIBEL She fly one hour.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Okay. Well if we ... if we hear from her, we will bring her here, okay?

LEIBEL

Here?

HUBKEY

Yeah.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

Okay?

LEIBEL

Okay, because not a lot going inside home.

HUBKEY

Not right now, not yet.

LEIBEL

Okay. Please tell somebody.

HUBKEY

If we need to, we could put you up in a hotel.

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

Across the street if we have to?

LEIBEL

That's okay.

HUBKEY

Okay. We'll work on that. So your daughter's on her way?

LEIBEL

Yes.

HUBKEY

Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

And this is very emotional for me because I know how she become

cry.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Okay.

HUBKEY

So you called her and told her what happened?

LEIBEL

Yes.

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HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Because what police told me okay.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL Yeah.

HUBKEY Okay, okay.

LEIBEL And I told my older daughter ... I give information about my ... his ...

his ... his children.

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL And I sent to his phone ... my phone numbers ... everybody ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL ... so police said doing ...

HUBKEY Okay.

LEIBEL .. (unintelligible). Yeah.

HUBKEY Good, good. So who is Susan?

LEIBEL Susan ... this is first wife.

HUBKEY And what is her last name?

LEIBEL Oh how! know?

HUBKEY (laughing)

LEIBEL She married now different guy.

HUBKEY Okay. So when did you move to Tahoe?

LEIBEL I see her first time ... where I see first time ... when his daughter

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

LEIBEL

I am third wife.

HUBKEY

Third wife.

LEIBEL

I am third wife.

HUBKEY

Okay, so there's Susan, and who else?

LEIBEL

Susan and ... I think ... he said ... he said Susan think he not normal.

But he ...

HUBKEY

Susan said who's not normal?

LEIBEL

Harry not normal.

HUBKEY

Harry's not normal. Okay, okay.

LEIBEL

What ... what Harry told me.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Yeah. He said she blame me this, and she blame me this. And so he

divorce long time ago.

HUBKEY

Okay. And when you and Harry got together in 2004 ...

LEIBEL

Yeah.

HUBKEY

... and when did you move to Tahoe?

LEIBEL

Married 2004.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

And move ... married 2004 ... and move 2005.

HUBKEY

To here?

LEIBEL

One second, one second. Married summer ... summer ... August.

And I think fall 2004 ... yes fall.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Fall time. (unintelligible) but ... coming here ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... and take house ... not house actually ... what ... what name ...

area? Where you driving to ... from ... from here for example. You

driving ... you pass Safeway here ...

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

... and you see after you pass liquor store.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Right side.

HUBKEY

That's where you live now?

LEIBEL

(unintelligible)

HUBKEY

Is that where you live now?

LEIBEL

No, I live by Safeway ... behind Safeway.

HUBKEY

Yes.

LEIBEL

Yeah? But if you can see me drive Highway 50 ... right ... right side

have liquor store and left side have ... have homes.

HUBKEY

Okay. When did you move into that house?

LEIBEL

What I tell you?

HUBKEY

2004.

LEIBEL

2004. (unintelligible) one year.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

This is what real estate ...

HUBKEY

Now do you own it?

LEIBEL

Huh?

HUBKEY

Do you own it or rent it?

LEIBEL

No, first one rent it.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Another ... another house.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Because we look around ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... here. You can't buy right away.

HUBKEY

Uh-huh.

LEIBEL

(unintelligible). So look area ... like it and la, la, and Chaya-Anna

going to school at the same time. And real estate Bob um ...

(unintelligible) ... he die cancer.

HUBKEY

Who died?

LEIBEL

His friend. Uh ... real estate ... Bob.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

So this is what very emotional because this is good friend Bob and by cancer ... die cancer. Very funny ... when Harry in 2007 down Carson City hospital. And Bob come to him like ... come on friend ... my friend. Bob not know he cancer. And after he have cancer ... liver ... liver ...

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

... and he die I think two years ago.

HUBKEY

Okay. Harry didn't handle that well?

LEIBEL

He (unintelligible).

HUBKEY

Okay. Okay.

LEIBEL

And ... and he start saying him about die cancer ... I am cancer and

...

HUBKEY

Okay. So do you guys own that house, or do you rent?

LEIBEL

No, this house mortgage. Own. Own.

HUBKEY

Own own? Or do you pay a mortgage?

LEIBEL

Mortgage.

HUBKEY

Okay.

LEIBEL

Pay like fifty percent.

HUBKEY

How much do you pay a month? Do you know what the house

payment is?

LEIBEL

Yeah. Around three thousand, six hundred ... something,

something.

HUBKEY

Thirty-six hundred a month.

140
