*ORDER*

This appeal has been referred to the Pro Bono Committee of the State Bar of Nevada's Appellate Litigation Section for the selection of pro bono counsel to represent appellant in this appeal. A response from the committee or notice of appearance of counsel is due October 22, 2021. Appellant has filed several documents in this court.

Pursuant to appellant's notice filed September 2, 2021, providing a district court order, the clerk of this court shall amend the caption of this appeal to reflect the decedent's name as Marilyn Weeks Sweet, as appears on the caption of this order. This court's docket already reflects appellant's name as Christy Kay Sweet; thus this court takes no action regarding the notice to change appellant's name.

Appellant has filed a letter informing this court of her concern that proceedings are continuing in the district court. *See* NRS 155.195. This court takes no action regarding the letter, but notes that appellant is free to seek a stay in the district court pursuant to applicable statutes or court rules. *See, e.g.,* NRAP 8(a), (c); NRS 155.195.

Appellant, who is proceeding in forma pauperis, has filed a transcript request form pursuant to NRAP 9(b). At this stage of the

proceedings, this court is unable to determine which transcripts, if any, are necessary for this court's review on appeal, *see* NRAP 9(b)(1)(C), and therefore, this court declines to order the preparation of the requested transcripts at this time. However, as this appeal proceeds, this court will consider the necessity of transcripts and may order their preparation at a later date.

The deadlines for filing documents in this court remain suspended pending further order of this court.

It is so ORDERED.
