

ORDER GRANTING MOTION

Extraordinary and compelling circumstances having been shown, appellant's motion requesting a fourth extension of time to file the opening brief is granted. NRAP 26(b)(1)(B), NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Appellant shall have until April 4, 2022, to file and serve the opening brief and appendix. Any additional extensions will be granted only on showing of extraordinary and compelling circumstances. *Id.* Counsel's caseload normally will not be deemed such a circumstance. *Cf. Varnum v. Grady*, 90 Nev. 374, 528 P.2d 1027 (1974). Failure to timely file the opening brief and appendix may result in the imposition of sanctions.
