

ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO SUBSTITUTE COUNSEL AND EXTEND DEADLINE TO FILE OPENING BRIEF

Counsel for appellant has filed a motion to partially withdraw as attorney of record and for an extension of time to file the opening brief and appendix. This court construes the motion to withdraw as a substitution of attorneys and approves the substitution as follows. The clerk shall remove attorney Glenn F. Meier of Greenberg Traurig, LLP as counsel for appellant and add Alayne Opie of Greenberg Traurig, LLP as counsel for appellant in his place. Appellant will continue to be represented by Elliot T. Anderson of Greenberg Traurig, LLP.

Cause appearing, appellant's motion requesting a second extension of time to file the opening brief is granted. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Appellant shall have until April 26, 2024, to file and serve the opening brief and appendix. No further extensions of time shall be permitted absent demonstration of extraordinary circumstances and extreme need. *Id.* Counsel's caseload normally will not be deemed such a circumstance. *Cf. Varnum v. Grady*, 90 Nev. 374, 528 P.2d 1027 (1974). Failure to timely file

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA the opening brief and appendix may result in the imposition of sanctions, including dismissal of this appeal. NRAP 31(d).
