The Law Office of Daniel S. Simon and Daniel S. Simon (hereinafter "Simon") hereby moves for an additional 30-day extension of time for filing an Answering Brief. The first extension was requested in conjunction with Simon's motion to consolidate the subject appeal with the related writ proceeding (case # 86467). The motion to consolidate was denied on January 5, 2024. The related writ proceeding now stands as submitted for a decision without oral argument. (January 26, 2024, Order Submitting for Decision Without Oral Argument, Case # 86467.)

Pursuant to NRAP 26(b), Simon requests an extension of time from February 4, 2024, up to and including March 5, 2024, (30 days) in which to file the Answering Brief.

comply with NRAP 30(g). Although the work is not anticipated to take the full 30 days requested, 30 days are requested in an abundance of caution.

It is respectfully submitted that the above provides a demonstration of good cause for an extension of time. This request is not an attempt to delay or prolong the appellate proceedings and will not cause undue delay.

Therefore, the Answering Brief would then be due on or before March 5, 2024. As such, Simon respectfully requests that this motion be granted.
