



ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

This is an appeal from a June 21, 2023, district court order granting a motion to set aside a divorce decree and/or for a new trial and setting child support and alimony retroactively, and from a July 25, 2023, district court order awarding attorney fees and costs. Initial review of the docketing statement and documents before this court reveals potential jurisdictional defects.

First, it appears the notice of appeal was untimely filed with respect to the June 21, 2023, order. The notice of appeal was due to be filed in the district court within 30 days after service of notice of entry of the order on June 29, 2023. *See* NRAP 4(a)(1). However, the notice of appeal was not filed in the district court until August 15, 2023, well after expiration of the appeal period. Appellant indicates in his docketing statement that the appeal is timely pursuant to NRAP 4(a)(4)(C), which governs the time to file a notice of appeal after the filing of a timely motion to alter or amend a judgment. But it does not appear that any motion to alter or amend was filed with respect to the June 21, 2023, order.

It also appears that appellant is not aggrieved by the June 21, 2023, order to the extent that order retroactively modifies child support

because appellant agreed to the modification and the amount of arrearages payments.

Accordingly, appellant shall have 30 days from the date of this order to show cause why this appeal should not be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. Respondent may file any reply within 14 days of service of appellant's response. Failure to demonstrate that this court has jurisdiction may result in the dismissal of this appeal.

The motion to extend time to file the transcript request form is granted. The clerk shall detach the transcript request form from the motion filed on December 11, 2023, and file it separately. The deadlines to file documents in this appeal are suspended pending further order of this court.

It is so ORDERED.
