*ORDER DENYING MOTION TO EXPEDITE DECISION  
AND FOREGO ORAL ARGUMENT*

This is an appeal from a district court order dismissing four consolidated challenges to an initiative petition.

On September 16, 2024, respondents Kate Feldman and Stop Predatory Lending NV (collectively hereinafter, Feldman) filed a motion to expedite decision and forego oral argument. Having considered the motion, the oppositions thereto and the reply, this court is not convinced that further expediting of this appeal is warranted. As this court indicated in its

previous July 11, 2024, Order Regarding Motions, nothing prevented Feldman from gathering signatures during the pendency of this appeal. Accordingly, this court reiterates that it will only expedite its consideration of this matter to the extent that its docket permits. And again, as previously noted, this court will decide whether to schedule the matter for oral argument at a later date, once briefing is completed and the matter is reviewed on the merits.<sup>1</sup>

It is so ORDERED.
