INTEREST OF AMICUS CURIAE

The Livery Operators Association was founded for the purpose of providing a forum for the exchange and collection of information that informs, educates and promotes the livery industry in Nevada. LOA members employ approximately 2,000 Nevadans and operate a fleet of approximately 1,700 vehicles. LOA works to inform members of issues concerning commercial transportation and, similarly, promotes the interests of its membership at the local, state and federal level. The proposed brief, offered simultaneously herewith, addresses the adverse impact upon the business climate that would result if a civil litigant is permitted to recover for damages that were never incurred. It also addresses the impact of actions taken during the recently concluded 2011 session of the Nevada Legislature. The brief offers rational alternatives to those raised by this Court's now vacated unpublished order for the trial court's handling of questions relating to damages never incurred.

LOA therefore requests this Court grant this Motion and accept as filed its proposed brief as *amicus curiae*.
