






O R D E R

SCR 210(2) requires attorneys to obtain continuing legal education credit in the area of substance abuse, addictive disorders and/or mental health issues that impair professional competence. There appears to be a deficiency in currently available continuing legal education programs to assist attorneys in recognizing the symptoms of substance abuse or addictive disorders and to provide guidance regarding reporting or assisting attorneys with those issues. Therefore, we direct the Continuing Legal Education Committee of the State Bar of Nevada and the Nevada Board of Continuing Legal Education to formulate a curriculum specifically designed to assist attorneys in recognizing the symptoms of substance abuse or addictive disorders and the steps be


taken in reporting or assisting attorneys with those issues. The curriculum shall be formulated within 60 days from the date of this order.


It is so ORDERED.




