MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

Rule 30(d) of the Nevada Rules of Appellate Procedure allows an appellant to include copies of relevant and necessary exhibits in the appendix. However, if an exhibit is not able to be reproduced,

the parties may file a motion requesting the Supreme Court to direct the district court clerk to transmit the original exhibits. The Supreme Court will not permit the transmittal of original exhibits except upon a showing that the exhibits are relevant to the issues raised on appeal, and that the Supreme Court's review of the original exhibits is necessary to the determination of the issues.

NRAP 30(d).

Appellant asks that this Court direct the District Court Clerk's office to transmit State's Exhibits 79 and 80 to this Honorable Court. State's Exhibit 79 (identified in Appellant's Appendix at V: 1087) is a recording of Metro Police's phone call to Stephanie Newman on July 22, 2011, made shortly before the incident in question. State's Exhibit 80 (identified in Appellant's Appendix at V: 1088) is a recording of Aneka Grimes' 911 call to Metro Police, also made shortly before the incident in question. On the 911 tapes, Aneka and her mother can be heard yelling at Bennett Grimes, while he sobs and pleads for Aneka to take him back. (V: 1087-88). The content of these tapes are relevant to two of the issues raised in Appellant's Fast Track Statement: (1) whether there was sufficient evidence to support an inference of self defense to warrant a self defense instruction; and (2) whether Bennett possessed the necessary criminal intent for a

burglary when he entered his wife's apartment, begging and pleading for her to take him back.
