ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-06

WHEREAS, the Nevada Constitution expressly recognizes the chief as the administrative head of the court system. Nev. Const. art. VI, ss 19. By expressly identifying the chief judge as the court system's administrative leader, the chief judge has "inherent power to take actions reasonably necessary to administer justice efficiently, fairly, and economically " Halverson v. Hardcastle, 123 Nev. 245, 260, 163 P. 3d 428, 439 (2007) (internal quotation marks and citation omitted);

WHEREAS, Title 5 of the Nevada Revised Statutes and NRS 3.223 vest jurisdiction over juvenile matters with the Second Judicial District Court;

WHEREAS, Presiding Judge Bridget Robb currently serves as the judge of the juvenile court pursuant to NRS 62B.010;

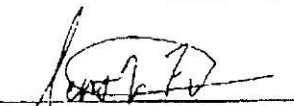
1 WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Steve Sisolak declared a state of
2 emergency in Nevada in response to the recent outbreak of the 2019 Coronavirus Disease
3 (COVID-19) and requested all Nevadans to stay home to implement social distancing.

4 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that visitation of juveniles committed at the Juvenile Detention
5 Center is suspended until further notice; and

7 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or his designee
8 have the authorization to release a juvenile from custody at the Juvenile Detention Center for
9 that juvenile's own health and welfare or the health and welfare of others in the facility. When
10 such releases occur, the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or her designee is required to notify all
11 parties in the case, parents, or designated guardians. Releases can include the use of temporary
12 release order (TRO), electronic monitoring, house arrest and own recognizance to parent,
13 guardian or treatment facility or any other appropriate placement; and

14 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Administrative Order will be reviewed in thirty (30)
15 days.

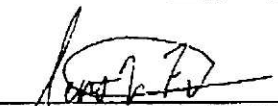
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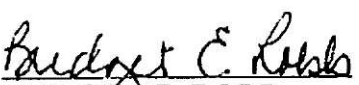
