ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER:
MARCH 17, 2020

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9 WHEREAS, On March 12, 2020, Governor Steve Sisolak declared a state of emergency
10 in Nevada in response to the recent outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19). Given the
11 severity of the risk posed to the public by COVID-19, the Chief Judge of the Henderson Justice
12 Court has determined that the following changes are necessary for the protection of the
13 community; and therefore,

14 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, effective March 17, 2020, the Henderson Justice Court
15 will continue to accept filings and manage cases within the parameters set forth in this Order;

16 1. All criminal out-of-custody hearings, excepting out-of-custody preliminary hearings,
17 will be continued for a period of sixty (60) days. Individuals with attorneys for criminal cases are
18 encouraged to contact their attorneys. Attorneys may appear in Court but must communicate with
19 the Court via email (preferred) or phone the morning of the court appearance. A listing of all
20 emails and phone numbers will be listed on the Court's website page;

21 2. All 2:00 p.m., traffic pre-trial matters shall be suspended for the next sixty (60) days;

22 3. The clerk's office will continue to accept and process motions to quash bench warrants
23 consistent with ordinary practice, and general civil filings unless otherwise stated below.
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26 ¹ As used in this Administrative Order, a "Traffic" offense is an offense that has a demerit point value of four (4) or
27 less as determined by the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles. Offenses with higher point values, such as DUI,
28 are not considered Traffic Offenses under this Administrative Order.

1 At this time, essential case types and hearings will continue to be heard through in-person
2 appearances, although appearance by alternative means under Nevada Supreme Court Rule Part
3 IX is encouraged when possible. Essential case types and hearings include the following:

- 4 1. All in-custody proceedings for criminal matters;
- 5 2. Bail motion hearings, motions to quash bench warrants, and motions for own
6 recognizance walk-through on arrest warrants, until arrangements can be made to hear
7 these matters by alternative means;
- 8 3. Civil temporary or extended protection orders;
- 9 4. Unlawful Towing cases;
- 10 5. Objections to Claims of Exemption.

11 All currently scheduled non-essential Henderson Justice Court hearings are ordered to be
12 conducted by video or telephonic means; decided on the papers; or rescheduled in accordance with
13 the preference of the individual judicial department.

14 Small Claims trials, Small Claims motion hearings, and Small Claims examinations of
15 judgment debtor are deemed non-essential. All Small Claims trials, Small Claims motions, and
16 Small Claims examinations currently set will be continued to a future date. Notifications to Small
17 Claims litigants of the new date will be made via mail and/or email if an email address is available.

18 All jury trials, civil and criminal, scheduled in Henderson Justice Court for the next sixty
19 (60) days will be rescheduled to a new date as the court calendar allows. No summonsed
20 prospective jurors are to appear.

21 Per Nevada Supreme Court directive, effective March 17, 2020, all deadline and default
22 provisions contained in NRS Chapter 40 concerning eviction and unlawful detainer proceedings
23 are suspended and stayed until further notice.

24 The following is suspended for sixty (60) days, subject to change:

25 1) the issuing of Defaults on all civil actions. Applications for Default Judgments in cases
26 where a Default has already been issued will still be processed.

27 2) the issuing orders for the examination of a judgment debtor.

28 3) the issuance of all Writs of Execution. Additionally, all currently issued Writs of
Execution are hereby stayed until April 20, 2020. Please follow the guidance in NRS 21.112 with
respect to any property garnished or attached prior to March 17, 2020.

1 In order to practice social distancing as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control
2 and Prevention (CDC), Henderson Justice Court is encouraging the use of electronic
3 communication for the resolution of cases, status checks, and/or negotiations. A list of emails for
4 each department will be on the Henderson Justice Court's website at clarkcountynv.gov/hjc.
5 Parties may also contact Henderson Justice Court at (702) 455-7951.

6 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that this Administrative Order shall be reviewed no later
7 than every thirty (30) days and shall continue until modified or rescinded by a subsequent order.
